OAKLAND ATHLETICS (7-7) VS. DETROIT TIGERS (6-8)

SATURDAY, APRIL 17, 2021 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 1:07 PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won six straight and seven of the last eight games after starting the year 0-6...are 7-7 overall, which marks the first time the A's have been at the .500 level this year...have a six-game winning streak and a six-game losing streak over the first 14 games...the six-game season-opening losing streak matched the longest such streak in Athletics history (1916)...the A's reached the playoffs 10 times over the previous 20 seasons and were at least six games under .500 at some point during five of those seasons (2001, 02, 06, 12, 19)...are in third place in the American League West for the first time this year and trail first place Seattle by two games...were as many as 5½ games back at the conclusion of play on April 8...have spent one day in third place, two days in fourth place, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

FIRST SIX, LAST EIGHT: The A's are 7-1 over the last eight games after starting the season 0-6...have outscored the opposition 46-28 (+18) over the last eight games after being outscored 50-13 (-37) over the first six...the A's pitching staff has compiled a 3.50 ERA (28 er in 72.0 ip) and .225 (61-for-271) opponents batting average over the last eight games after logging an 8.00 ERA and .321 opponents average over the first six contests...have allowed six home runs over the last eight games after surrendering 13 over the first six...starting pitchers are 4-1 with a 3.61 ERA (17 er in 42.1 ip) over the last eight games after going 0-6 with a 9.00 ERA over the first six games...are batting .248 (68-for-274) with 13 home runs and 46 runs scored over the last eight games (6.0 runs per game) after hitting .169 with two home runs and 13 runs scored over the first six contests (2.2 per game).

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 2-0 in this seven-game stretch against American League Central teams that begins with this four-game series with Detroit and concludes with a three-game series with Minnesota...went 25-8 against the AL Central in 2019 after going 26-8 in 2018...are now 67-20 (.770) against AL Central foes dating back to June 23, 2017.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .271 (57-for-210) with 40 runs scored and 12 home runs over the last six games after hitting .170 with 19 runs scored and three home runs over the first eight contests...overall, have the second lowest batting average in the American League (.216)...are tied for the league lead in triples (3), rank second in walks (54), tied for second in fewest grounded into double plays (6) and tied for third in hit by pitches (9)...A's pinch hitters are 5-for-14 (.357) with a home run, four RBI and a walk...lead the AL in pinch hits and RBI, are tied for the lead in home runs and rank second in plate appearances (15).

PITCHING: The A's had their first shutout of the season last night to drop their ERA to a season-low 5.43...that is still the highest ERA in the American League and second highest in the majors (Cardinals, 5.45)...also have the highest opponents batting average (.269), slugging percentage (.453) and OPS (.794) in the AL and the second highest on-base percentage (.341)...are tied for the second fewest strikeouts (110).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one run or fewer three times in the last six games and two runs twice...are 4-0 with a 3.13 ERA (11 er in 31.2 ip) over that span after going 0-7 with a 7.91 ERA over the first eight contests...are 4-7 with a 5.76 ERA (45 er in 70.1 ip) for the season...have the highest ERA and opponents batting average (.277) in the American League, the second highest OPS (.811) and third highest on-base percentage (.346) and slugging percentage (.465)...are tied for the most losses.

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has a 3.31 ERA (12 er in 32.2 ip) over the last eight games after logging a 7.43 ERA over the first five contests...has converted each of its two save opportunities over the last three games after having no save chances over the first 11 contests...the A's and the Yankees are the only American League teams without a blown save...first batters faced are hitting .419 (18-for-43) with eight walks and two hit by pitches (.528 on-base percentage)...the bullpen has the highest first batter batting average, on-base percentage and slugging percentage (.884) in the majors...lead the majors in most first batter home runs (4) and are tied for the lead in walks (8)...are tied with the Marlins for the most runs allowed in the ninth inning (15).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed two errors over the last nine games and have five for the season, which is the fewest in the American League...lead the AL in fielding percentage (.990) and are tied with Houston for the fewest unearned runs (2).

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in 10-of-11 (90.9%) stole attempts...are tied for second in the American League in stolen bases and rank third in stolen base percentage...have four steals of third base, which is the most in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-0 on this seven-game homestand against Detroit (2-0) and Minnesota (three games) and are now 3-6 (.333) at home...went 1-6 on the first homestand against Houston (0-4) and Los Angeles-NL (1-2), which was the A's worst record on a homestand of more than three games since they went 1-8 on the first homestand of the 2001 season (1-2 vs. Anaheim, 0-3 vs. Seattle, 0-3 vs. Texas)...went 4-1 on the first road trip this year to Houston (2-1) and Arizona (2-0)...lost the first game but then won each of the final four, which matches the A's longest road winning streak from last year (Aug. 12-16).

THE SEVENTH INNING OR LATER: The A's have scored 31 of their 59 runs (52.5%) in the seventh inning or later...lead the majors in runs scored and home runs (9) in seventh inning or later and have a .299 (49-for-164) batting average, which is second best to the Mets (.306)...are batting .171 (51-for-299) with 28 runs scored and six home runs over innings one through six.

MELVIN, LA RUSSA AND MACK: Today will be Bob Melvin's 1,470th game as manager of the Oakland A's...tomorrow, he will tie Tony La Russa's Oakland record for most games managed (1,471)...Melvin would need to manage the A's through the 2057 season to catch Connie Mack for the most games managed in Athletics history (7,396)...Melvin has 774 wins, which is 24 away from La Russa's Oakland record of 798...Mack won 3,582 games as manager of the Philadelphia A's from 1901-50.

THIS AND THAT: The A's played their quickest game of the season last night at two hours and 31 minutes...have played at least 3 hours and 10 minutes in 12 of the first 14 games and are averaging 3:19 per game, which is fourth longest in the American League...are 7-0 when out-homer their opponent, 0-7 when they are out-homered...are 3-0 in games decided by three runs or fewer and the three games are the fewest in the majors...the average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 29.92 years, which is the oldest A's Opening Day roster since 2004 (30.16)...the A's posted a winning record for the third consecutive spring as they finished 16-10-2...the wins tied with Kansas City, Toronto and Boston for the most in the majors...led the majors in on-base percentage (.357), OPS (.833), runs (161) and doubles (67) this spring.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have placed four players on the injured list since the start of the season and currently have six players on the IL (Fiers, Guduan, Pinder, Puk, Rosenthal, Smith)...that is their most at one point since Aug. 2, 2019 when they also had six...have now used the IL seven times this year after using it just eight times all last year...that was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4)...used it 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest in the majors.

A's vs. TIGERS: The A's have won the first two meetings of 2021 after winning the season series in 2019, 6-1...went 2-0 in Oakland and 4-1 in Detroit...have now won 20 of the last 21 games and are 26-6 (.813) dating back to June 2, 2015...have won four straight and nine of the last 10 in Oakland...currently have an 11-game winning streak at Comerica Park, which is second longest in Athletics history for a road ballpark (12, Kauffman Stadium, May 31, 2003-April 30, 2006)...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 272-248 against the Tigers...that includes 149-112 in Oakland, 121-134 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...are 45-28 (.616) at Comerica Park, which is the best winning percentage by any team...all-time, the A's are 940-1001 against the Tigers.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha leads the American League and ranks second in the majors with 14 runs scored (Acuña, ATL 18)...**Ramón Laureano** leads the majors with eight stolen bases...that is double the next closest players and is more than 22 teams...**Jed Lowrie** has six straight multiple hit games (12-for-26, .462), which is the longest such streak of his career...it matches the longest by an Athletic over the last 22 years (last: Danny Valencia, Aug. 14-20, 2016)...**Lou Trivino** recorded his second save of the season and the sixth of his career last night...now has an 8.0-inning scoreless streak.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1968** the A's play their first game in Oakland but lose to Baltimore 4-1...Dave McNally limits the A's to two hits, including a pinch hit single by Tony La Russa in his first at bat a member of the Oakland A's...in **2018**, 50 years after their first game in Oakland, the A's celebrate with a free admission game...Lew Krausse, who was the starting pitcher in 1968, threw out the ceremonial first pitch and the A's defeated the Chicago White Sox, 10-2.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (0-2, 7.45 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...it is the 22nd appearance and sixth start of his career...has taken the loss in each of his first two starts, both against Houston, and now has a career-high four-game losing streak dating back to May 22, 2019...his last win came on May 17, 2019 against Colorado...begins his third season in the majors and is on his second consecutive Opening Day roster...was the Phillies fifth round selection in the 2016 First-Year Player Draft and made his Major League debut with Philadelphia in 2019...was traded to the A's for cash considerations on Jan. 30, 2021.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-1 loss to Houston on April 3 in Oakland...it was his first start since May 22, 2019 with Philadelphia at Chicago (NL)...tossed 4.1 innings, which was the shortest start of his career...allowed a RBI single to Tucker in the first but the A's came back to tie the game with a run in the bottom of the first...then allowed a RBI single to Altuve in the second...was relieved by Trivino with runners on first and second and one out in the fifth and Trivino allowed a three-run home run.

LAST START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 6-2 loss at Houston on April 8...allowed a leadoff home run to Correa in the second, a RBI double to Correa in the fourth and a solo home run to Alvarez in the sixth...walked the next batter (Correa) and was relieved by Wendelken with a runner on first and one out in the sixth with the A's trailing 3-0...Wendelken allowed Correa to score plus a run of his own.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 1-1 with a 1.00 ERA and .169 opponents batting average in five spring appearances, including three starts...walked just three batters in 18.0 innings and struck out 18...10 of the strikeouts came in his final start on March 26 at Los Angeles (NL)...those were the most in a single game by an A's pitcher in the MLB Spring Training database, which dates back to 2006...finished the spring with an 11.0-inning scoreless streak...allowed one run twice and no runs three times...tied for the team-lead in innings pitched.

2020 RECAP: Had two stints with Philadelphia and was 0-1 with a 17.18 ERA in three relief appearances...opponents went 11-for-21 (.524) but he walked just one and struck out four in 3.2 innings...allowed a .438 (7-for-16) average against right-handed hitters compared to .800 (4-for-5) against left-handers...was 2-0 with a 4.50 ERA in four spring training appearances...was optioned to Lehigh Valley March 26 but was recalled on July 23 and was on the Phillies Opening Day roster...made his 2020 debut on July 26 against Miami and allowed four runs on five hits in an inning of relief and was the losing pitcher in an 11-6 decision...tossed a scoreless inning of relief Aug. 9 against Atlanta but was optioned to Philadelphia's alternate site on Aug. 9...was recalled for a second time Aug. 20, pitched the next day at Atlanta (1.2 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 3 so) and was optioned Aug. 22...did not pitch the remainder of the season.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Chris Bassitt (1-2, 4.96 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season...opponents are batting .324 with the bases empty but that mark drops to .148 with runners on base...has allowed a .182 average against left-handed hitters compared to .321 against right-handers...went 5-0 with a 2.23 ERA against AL Central teams in 2019...now has a six-game winning streak against the Central and has a 1.80 ERA and .203 opponents average over that span...picked up his first win of the season in his last start, a 9-5 A's win at Arizona on Monday (5.0 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 5 bb, 4 so)...is 4-2 with a 3.35 ERA (37.2 ip, 37 h, 14 r, 14 er, 15 bb, 35 so, 1 hr) in six career starts against Detroit...went 2-0 with a 1.29 ERA in two starts in 2019...was 2-0 with a 1.74 ERA and .179 opponents batting average in three spring training starts...went 5-2 with a 2.29 ERA in 11 starts last year...his ERA ranked second among pitchers in the West divisions and sixth in the majors

35 LHP JAKE DIEKMAN

Inherited Runners/Scored: 2/1 **First Hitters:** 2-5, bb

- Begins his 10th season in the majors and is on his seventh Opening Day roster (2014-16, 18-21).
- Struck out his 500th career batter (Yordan Alvarez) on April 2.
- Walked the first batter he faced during the spring but then retired each of the final 18 batters he faced...opponents went 0-for-18 in his six appearances and he did not allow a run in 6.0 innings.
- Has posted a 1.84 ERA (3 er in 14.2 ip) with 20 strikeouts over 16 career outings against the Tigers.
- Previously faced Detroit twice on Sept. 6, 2019, when he appeared in the completion of a suspended game from May 19, 2019, and also pitched in the regularly scheduled game...as a result, statistically speaking, Diekman pitched for two teams in two different cities on May 19 (also against Los Angeles-AL for Kansas City).
- Did not allow a run during the day last year and after Saturday's outing, and now has a 14-game, 15.0 ip scoreless streak over the last two seasons.

Last Year: Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)

65 RHP DEOLIS GUERRA

Inherited Runners/Scored: 0/0 **First Hitters:** 1-1

- Was selected from the A's alternate site April 8.
- Begins his fifth season in the majors and is with his fifth team (Pittsburgh, 2015; Los Angeles-AL, 2016-17; Milwaukee, 2019; Philadelphia, 2020)...
- Did not allow a run in 6.2 innings over seven outings this spring...struck out 12 batters and held opponents to a .136 average (3-for-22).
- Tossed 3.0 scoreless innings against Arizona on Tuesday, tied for the longest outing of his career (3 times, also: June 30, 2015 vs. Detroit and July 15, 2015 vs. St. Louis with Pittsburgh).
- Has allowed one run over 5.0 innings against the Tigers in his career but has not faced them since 2017 with the Angels.

Last Year: Was on the Opening Day roster and appeared in nine games for Philadelphia in 2020 and went 1-3 with an 8.59 ERA (7 er in 7.1 ip)...struck out eight batters and walked two.

21 LHP ADAM KOLAREK

Inherited Runners/Scored: 3/1 **First Hitters:** 2-5

- Was acquired from the Los Angeles Dodgers with minor leaguer Cody Thomas on Feb. 12 for Sheldon Neuse and Gus Varland.
- Begins his fifth season in the majors and is with his third team (Tampa Bay, 2017-19; Los Angeles-NL, 2019-20)...is on his third straight Opening Day roster.
- Compiled a 6.75 ERA and .281 opponents batting average in seven outings during the spring.
- Has allowed 2 earned runs over 4.0 innings against Detroit in his career, but two of his three outings were scoreless.

Last Year: Went 3-0 with a 0.95 ERA, .164 opponents batting average and .432 OPS in 20 relief appearances over three stints with the Los Angeles Dodgers...his ERA was second lowest among relievers in the West divisions to the A's Jake Diekman (0.42).

- Begins his 14th season in the majors and is on his 10th Opening Day roster (Arizona, 2008-09; San Francisco, 2014-15; Washington, 2016; Los Angeles-AL, 2017; Oakland, 2018-21).
- Logged a 9.53 ERA and .393 opponents batting average in six spring training appearances...allowed at least one hit in each appearance.
- Has a 3.09 ERA (4 er in 11.2 ip) with 12 strikeouts in nine career outings against Detroit...has an 8.0-inning scoreless streak against the Tigers, dating back to May 13, 2017.
- Leads the Majors with nine games pitched.

Last Year: Compiled a career-low 1.66 ERA in a team-leading 26 relief appearances...opponents hit .232 and he walked just five batters for a .273 on-base percentage...yielded four runs, three of which scored on solo home runs.

- Was signed by the A's as a free agent on Feb. 18.
- Began his 14th season in the majors and the A's are his sixth team (San Francisco, 2008-16; Los Angeles-NL, 2017; Tampa Bay, 2017-18; Miami, 2019; Minnesota, 2019-20).
- Is on his 12th consecutive Opening Day roster.
- Posted a 6.75 ERA and .250 opponents batting average in four spring training appearances...retired each of the six batters he faced over his final two appearances, five by strikeout.
- Is 1-1 with 5 saves and a 3.94 ERA (7 er in 16.0 ip) with 16 strikeouts and two walks in 19 career outings against Detroit.

Last Year: Was 1-2 with five saves, a 4.05 ERA and .211 opponents batting average in 24 relief appearances with Minnesota...had 10 holds, which tied for third most in the majors...was the only reliever in the majors with at least 10 holds and at least five saves.

- Begins his fourth season in the majors and is on his third consecutive Opening Day roster.
- Did not allow a run in seven games during Spring Training (7.0 ip) and opponents were 1-for-23 (.043) with three walks.
- Is 1-0 with two saves and a 1.00 ERA (1 er in 9.0 ip) in nine career outings against Detroit...has not allowed a run to the Tigers since his first appearance against them on June 25, 2018.
- Ranks tied for second in the Majors with eight games pitched.
