OAKLAND ATHLETICS (8-7) VS. DETROIT TIGERS (6-9)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won the first three games of this series to extend their winning streak to seven games...have not swept a four-game series since May 16-19, 2019 at Detroit and each of the A's last four-game sweeps have come on the road...have not swept a four-game set in the Coliseum since Sept. 8-10, 2017 against Houston...this is the A's third consecutive season with a winning streak of at least seven games...won nine in a row last year from Aug. 1-9 and 11 straight in 2019 from May 16-27...have now won eight of the last nine games after starting the year 0-6...are 8-7 overall, which marks the first time the A's have been over .500 this year...are in third place in the American League West for the second consecutive day and trail first place Los Angeles and Seattle by one game...were as many as 5½ games back at the conclusion of play on April 8...have spent two days in third place, two days in fourth place, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

MELVIN, LA RUSSA AND MACK: Today will be Bob Melvin's 1,471st game as manager of the Oakland A's, which ties Tony La Russa's Oakland record for most games managed...Melvin would need to manage the A's through the 2057 season to catch Connie Mack for the most games managed in Athletics history (7,396)...Melvin has 775 wins, which is 23 away from La Russa's Oakland record of 798...Mack won 3,582 games as manager of the Philadelphia A's from 1901-50.

BACK-TO-BACK SHUTOUTS: The A's have tossed back-to-back shutouts for the first time since Sept. 18-19 of last year against San Francisco...it is the first time they have shut out the Tigers in consecutive games since June 9-10, 1973 (Holtzman two-hitter, Hunter three hitter)...the shutouts have dropped the A's ERA to a season-low 5.07, which is second highest in the American League to Detroit...have the highest opponents batting average in the AL (.262), the second highest OPS (.767) and third highest on-base percentage (.332) and slugging percentage (.435)...are tied for the second fewest strikeouts (120).

FIRST SIX, LAST NINE: The A's are 8-1 over the last nine games after starting the season 0-6...have outscored the opposition 53-28 (+25) over the last nine games after being outscored 50-13 (-37) over the first six...the A's pitching staff has compiled a 3.11 ERA (28 er in 81.0 ip) and .218 (66-for-303) opponents batting average over the last nine games after logging an 8.00 ERA and .321 opponents average over the first six contests...have allowed six home runs over the last nine games after surrendering 13 over the first six...starting pitchers are 5-1 with a 3.17 ERA (17 er in 48.1 ip) over the last nine games after going 0-6 with a 9.00 ERA over the first six games...are batting .250 (76-for-304) with 16 home runs and 53 runs scored over the last nine games (5.9 runs per game) after hitting .169 with two home runs and 13 runs scored over the first six contests (2.2 per game).

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 3-0 in this seven-game stretch against American League Central teams that begins with this four-game series with Detroit and concludes with a three-game series with Minnesota...went 25-8 against the AL Central in 2019 after going 26-8 in 2018...are now 68-20 (.773) against AL Central foes dating back to June 23, 2017.

OFFENSE: The A's hit a season-high tying three home runs yesterday and have now homered in each of the last seven games (15 home runs total)...had just three home runs over the first eight contests...are batting .271 (65-for-240) with 47 runs scored over the last seven games after hitting .170 with 19 runs scored over the first eight contests...overall, the A's lead the American League in triples (4), rank second in walks (58) and hit by pitches (11) and tied for third in fewest grounded into double plays (7)...A's pinch hitters are 5-for-14 (.357) with a home run, four RBI and a walk...lead the AL in pinch hits and RBI, are tied for the lead in home runs and rank third in plate appearances (15).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in six of the last seven games and are 5-0 with a 2.63 ERA (11 er in 37.2 ip) over that span after going 0-7 with a 7.91 ERA over the first eight contests...are 5-7 with a 5.31 ERA (45 er in 76.1 ip) for the season...have the highest ERA in the American League, the second highest opponents batting average (.270) and on-base percentage (.337) and third highest OPS (.781)...have the second most losses and the third most innings (76.1).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has not allowed a run in three of the last four games and now has a 3.03 ERA (12 er in 35.2 ip) over the last nine games after logging a 7.43 ERA over the first five contests...has converted each of its two save opportunities over the last four games after having no save chances over the first 11 contests...the A's and the Yankees are the only American League teams without a blown save and the A's and Cardinals are the only Major League teams without a loss from the bullpen...first batters faced are hitting .391 (18-for-46) with eight walks and two hit by pitches (.500 on-

base percentage)...the bullpen has the highest first batter batting average, on-base percentage and slugging percentage (.826) in the majors...are tied for the lead in most first batter home runs (4) and walks (8)...are tied with the Marlins for the most runs allowed in the ninth inning (15).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have a season-best four-game errorless streak and have committed just two errors over the last 10 games...have five for the season, which is the fewest in the American League and tied for third fewest in the majors...lead the AL in fielding percentage (.991) and are tied with Houston for the fewest unearned runs (2).

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in 11-of-12 (91.7%) stole attempts...rank second in the American League in stolen bases and rank third in stolen base percentage...have four steals of third base, which is the most in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-0 on this seven-game homestand against Detroit (3-0) and Minnesota (three games)...have won each of their last four home games after dropping each of the first six...went 1-6 on the first homestand against Houston (0-4) and Los Angeles-NL (1-2), which was the A's worst record on a homestand of more than three games since they went 1-8 on the first homestand of the 2001 season (1-2 vs. Anaheim, 0-3 vs. Seattle, 0-3 vs. Texas)...went 4-1 on the first road trip this year to Houston (2-1) and Arizona (2-0)...lost the first game but then won each of the final four, which matches the A's longest road winning streak from last year (Aug. 12-16).

THE SEVENTH INNING OR LATER: The A's have scored 33 of their 66 runs (50.0%) in the seventh inning or later...lead the majors in runs scored in the seventh inning or later, are tied for the lead in home runs (9) and rank fourth in batting (.288, 49-for-170)...are hitting .183 (59-for-323) with 33 runs scored and nine home runs over innings one through six.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 8-0 when out-homer their opponent, 0-7 when they are out-homered...are 3-0 in games decided by three runs or fewer and the three games are the fewest in the majors...the average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 29.92 years, which is the oldest A's Opening Day roster since 2004 (30.16)...the A's posted a winning record for the third consecutive spring as they finished 16-10-2...the wins tied with Kansas City, Toronto and Boston for the most in the majors...led the majors in on-base percentage (.357), OPS (.833), runs (161) and doubles (67) this spring.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have placed four players on the injured list since the start of the season and currently have six players on the IL (Fiers, Guduan, Pinder, Puk, Rosenthal, Smith)...that is their most at one point since Aug. 2, 2019 when they also had six...have now used the IL seven times this year after using it just eight times all last year...that was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4)...used it 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest in the majors.

A's vs. TIGERS: The A's have won the first three meetings of 2021 after winning the season series in 2019, 6-1...went 2-0 in Oakland and 4-1 in Detroit...have now won 21 of the last 22 games and are 27-6 (.818) dating back to June 2, 2015...have won five straight and 10 of the last 11 in Oakland...currently have an 11-game winning streak at Comerica Park, which is second longest in Athletics history for a road ballpark (12, Kauffman Stadium, May 31, 2003-April 30, 2006)...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 273-248 against the Tigers...that includes 150-112 in Oakland, 121-134 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...are 45-28 (.616) at Comerica Park, which is the best winning percentage by any team...all-time, the A's are 941-1001 against the Tigers.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha has 17 runs scored, which ranks second in the majors and matches the most in Oakland history over the first 15 games of the season (fourth time, last: Stan Javier in 1994)...**Ramón Laureano** leads the majors with eight stolen bases...that is double the next closest players and is more than 19 teams...**Jed Lowrie** has six straight multiple hit games (12-for-26, .462), which is the longest such streak of his career...it matches the longest by an Athletic over the last 22 years (last: Danny Valencia, Aug. 14-20, 2016)...**Lou Trivino** has an 8.0-inning scoreless streak.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1970** Don Mincher homers twice and drives in all five Oakland runs, but the A's lose 11-5 to Minnesota...in **1981** Brian Kingman tosses a six-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win over Seattle as the A's improve to 10-0...in **2003** Barry Zito tosses a six-hit shutout to defeat Texas, 9-0.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (1-2, 4.96 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season...was the Opening Day starting pitcher and is the A's 14th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 16 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill, Graveman twice, Fiers, Montas)...is in his seventh season in the majors and is on his third Opening Day roster (2016, 2020)...did not pitch in the majors in 2017 following May 6, 2016 "Tommy John" surgery...is 18-12 with a 3.39 ERA (102 er in 271.0 ip) and is averaging 8.24 strikeouts per nine innings (248 so in 271.0 ip) in 53 games (44 starts) since the surgery...was 2-11 with a 4.13 ERA and 6.77 strikeouts per nine innings in 29 games (23 starts) before the surgery...is 16-9 with a 3.47 ERA (86 er in 223.1 ip) in 42 games, including 39 starts, over the last three years.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .324 (11-for-34) with the bases empty but that mark drops to .148 (4-for-27) with runners on base...opponents are 2-for-16 (.125) with runners in scoring position...has allowed a .182 (6-for-33) average against left-handed hitters compared to .321 (9-for-28) against right-handers.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: Went 5-0 with a 2.23 ERA and .224 opponents batting average in seven starts against American League Central teams in 2019...now has a six-game winning streak against the Central dating back to June 27, 2018 and has a 1.80 ERA (11 er in 55.0 ip) and .203 (41-for-202) opponents average over that 10 game, nine-start stretch...his last loss to a Central team was at Chicago on June 22, 2018.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-1 loss to Houston on Opening Day, April 1 in Oakland...blanked the Astros on one hit over the first three innings before allowing a run in the fourth when Altuve walked, went to third on a Brantley double and scored on a Bregman ground out...the run snapped a 16.2-inning scoreless streak during the regular season and a 27.1-inning home scoreless streak, which was ninth longest in Oakland history...was relieved by Petit with one out in the sixth inning, runners on first and second and the A's trailing 1-0...Petit allowed both runners to score.

SECOND START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 5-1 loss to Los Angeles (NL) on April 6 in Oakland...allowed nine hits, which were his most since April 28, 2016 at Detroit when he yielded a career-high 10...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed a RBI double to Barnes in the second...then allowed three more runs in the third on a two-run home run by Muncy and a solo home run by Rios...the home runs were the first he allowed in the Coliseum since Aug. 24, 2019, snapping a 10-game, 55.1-inning, 229-batter homerless streak.

LAST START: He picked up his first win of the season in the A's 9-5 win at Arizona on Monday...allowed just two hits in 5.0 innings, which matched his fewest ever in a start...however, issued five walks...had a 3-0 lead when he issued consecutive one-out walks in the third...Calhoun followed with a RBI single and Cabrera added a sacrifice fly...those were the only two runs he would allow in five innings of work.

BASSITT vs. DETROIT: Is 4-2 with a 3.35 ERA (37.2 ip, 37 h, 14 r, 14 er, 15 bb, 35 so, 1 hr) in six career starts...is 3-1 with a 2.49 ERA (7 er in 25.1 ip) in four starts at Comerica Park, 1-0 with a 3.00 ERA (2 er in 6.0 ip) in one start in the Coliseum and 0-1 with a 7.11 ERA (5 er in 6.1 ip) in one start at Guaranteed Rate Field...went 2-0 with a 1.29 ERA (14.0 ip, 12 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 18 so) in two starts in 2019...the first win came in the A's 17-3 victory at Detroit on May 16...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings, did not allow a run, walked two and yielded four hits...allowed just two base runners as far as second base...retired each of the final seven batters of 14 of the final 15...then picked up the win in a 10-2 decision in Oakland on Sept. 7...struck out a career-high 11 and did not walk a batter in 6.0 innings...allowed a two-run single to Castro in the second but those were the only runs he would allow.

2020 RECAP: Spent the entire season on the active roster for the first time in his six-year career and went 5-2 with a 2.29 ERA in 11 starts...his ERA ranked second among pitchers in the West divisions (Lamet, SD 2.09) and sixth in the majors...it was fifth lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 10 starts...also tied for fifth in the West divisions in winning percentage (.714), ranked seventh in opponents OPS (.659), batting average (.233) and slugging percentage (.371), tied for seventh in wins and eighth in on-base percentage (.288)...had career lows in ERA and opponents on-base percentage...walked 17 batters in 63.0 innings for a career-low 2.43 walks per nine innings...struck out 55 for a career-best 3.24 strikeout-to-walk ratio...led the A's in innings pitched and tied for the lead in games started...received five votes (two third, one fourth, two fifth) in American League Cy Young balloting...went 1-0 with a 1.08 ERA over his first three starts, 1-2 with a 5.95 ERA over his next four starts from Aug. 12-29 and 3-0 with a 0.34 ERA over his final four starts.

2020 OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .233 opponents batting average, which broke down to .223 (31-for-139) with a .590 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .248 (25-for-101) with a .755 OPS against left-handers...yielded four of his six home runs to lefties and has surrendered 20 of his 29 home runs over the last three years to lefties...walked just one batter to lead off an inning and held opponents to a .203 (13-for-64) batting average and .227 on-base percentage in that situation...the on-base percentage was sixth lowest in the majors...five of his six home runs came with the bases empty...had a .244 opponents batting average with runners in scoring position, but that dropped to .176 with RISP and two outs...had a .204 opponents batting average and two home runs with zero or one out, a .295 average with four home runs with two outs...had a .130 opponent average with two strikes...surrendered three of his six home runs to the opponent's clean-up hitter.

2020 HOME AND AWAY: Went 2-1 with a 0.72 ERA, .207 opponents batting average and .512 OPS in five starts in Oakland last year compared to 3-1 with a 4.56 ERA, .270 opponents average and .683 OPS in five starts on the road...his home ERA was second lowest in the majors (Keller, KC 0.27) and second lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 30 innings (Treinen, 0.63 in 2018)...did not allow a home run in 37.1 innings in Oakland...is 9-12 with a 2.61 ERA (58 er in 199.2 ip) in 37 career games in the Coliseum, 11-11 with a 4.60 ERA (110 er in 215.0 ip) in 45 games in all other ballparks...has yielded just 13 home runs in 199.2 career innings in Oakland (0.59 per nine innings).

2020 NIGHT AND DAY: Went 3-0 with a 1.15 ERA in six starts at night last year compared to 2-2 with a 4.13 ERA in five starts during the day...his night ERA was the lowest in the majors and in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 30 innings at night.

2020 THIS AND THAT: Received 35 runs of support in his 11 starts for a run support average of 5.00...is 16-1 in 26 career starts with three runs of support or more, 4-22 in 43 starts with two runs of support or fewer...allowed six of his 18 runs in the first inning...had a 4.91 ERA in the first inning, a 1.73 ERA from the second inning on...was 3-0 with a 1.75 ERA in four starts following an A's loss and is 8-2 with a 2.62 ERA (26 er in 89.1 ip) in 15 starts following a loss over the last three years...went 2-1 with a 3.34 ERA in five starts on four days rest, 3-1 with a 1.35 ERA in six starts on five days rest or more...allowed one run or fewer in seven of his 11 starts, including no runs four times...the A's went 8-3 (.727) in his starting assignments and are 24-15 (.615) when he starts over the last three years.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Jesús Luzardo (0-1, 8.31 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season...has an 8.31 ERA over his first three starts but the A's are 2-1 (.667) in his starting assignments...are now 8-4 (.667) when he starts in his career...is in his third season in the majors and is on his second consecutive Opening Day roster...has allowed a .211 average against left-handed hitters compared to .385 against right-handers...had a no decision in his last start, a 7-5 A's win at Arizona last Tuesday (2.2 ip, 6 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 1 so)...has never faced the Twins in his career...was 1-1 with a 4.22 ERA in three starts this spring...allowed a .205 opponents batting average but issued four walks in 10.2 innings...did not allow a run in two of his three starts...went 3-2 with a 4.12 ERA in 12 games, including nine starts, in his rookie campaign last year...ranked second among Major League rookies in strikeouts (59) and innings pitched (59.0).

- Begins his 10th season in the majors and is on his seventh Opening Day roster (2014-16, 18-21).
- Struck out his 500th career batter (Yordan Alvarez) on April 2.
- Walked the first batter he faced during the spring but then retired each of the final 18 batters he faced...opponents went 0-for-18 in his six appearances and he did not allow a run in 6.0 innings.
- Has posted a 1.84 ERA (3 er in 14.2 ip) with 20 strikeouts over 16 career outings against the Tigers.
- Previously faced Detroit twice on Sept. 6, 2019, when he appeared in the completion of a suspended game from May 19, 2019, and also pitched in the regularly scheduled game...as a result, statistically speaking, Diekman pitched for two teams in two different cities on May 19 (also against Los Angeles-AL for Kansas City).
