### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (9-7) VS. MINNESOTA TWINS (6-8)

TUESDAY, APRIL 20, 2021 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 3:30 PDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Swept a four-game series from Detroit to open the homestand and extend their winning streak to eight games...the winning streak is the longest active streak in the majors and tied for second longest overall to Boston's nine-game streak from April 5-14...it is third longest by an A's team over the last three years...won nine in a row last year from Aug. 1-9 and 11 straight in 2019 from May 16-27...the four-game sweep of the Tigers was the A's first four-game sweep against any team since May 16-19, 2019 at Detroit and the first in the Coliseum since Sept. 8-10, 2017 against Houston...have now won nine of the last 10 games after starting the year 0-6...are a seasonhigh two games over .500 at 9-7 (.563), which is the fifth best record in the American League...however, have the second worst run differential (-11)... are tied for second place in the AL West and trail first place Seattle by 1½ games...were as many as 5½ games back at the conclusion of play on April 8...have spent one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

*MELVIN, LA RUSSA AND MACK:* Bob Melvin will set the Oakland record for most games managed in the first game of the doubleheader today...it will be his 1,472nd game at the helm of the A's, breaking Tony La Russa's record of 1471...Melvin would need to manage the A's through the 2057 season to catch Connie Mack for the most games managed in Athletics history (7,396)...Melvin has 776 wins, which is 22 away from La Russa's Oakland record of 798...Mack won 3,582 games as manager of the Philadelphia A's from 1901-50.

**DOUBLEHEADERS:** The A's and Twins will square off in a doubleheader for the first time since May 26, 2001 at Minnesota...both games went 10 innings, with the A's winning the first game 5-4 and losing the second, 7-6...the last time Oakland hosted Minnesota in a twin-bill was Aug. 14, 1993 (lost 5-1 and 6-2)...are 7-14-13 in doubleheaders with the Twins, including 4-4-3 in Oakland...the A's played five seven-inning doubleheaders last year...split the two games on Sept. 8 vs. Houston, Sept. 12 at Texas and Sept. 14 at Seattle and were swept on Aug. 29 at Houston and Sept. 26 vs. Seattle...have played 22 doubleheaders over the last 23 years and have swept just one of those, Sept. 9, 2017 against Houston.

**CLOSE AND LATE:** The A's had their second walk-off win of the season on Sunday, which is tied for the most in the majors...defeated the Tigers 3-2 to improve to 2-0 in one-run games...are 4-0 in games decided by three runs or fewer and the four games are the fewest in the majors...have scored 35 of their 69 runs (50.7%) in the seventh inning or later...lead the majors in runs scored and home runs (10) in the seventh inning or later and rank fourth in batting (.286, 52-for-182)...are hitting .179 (61-for-341) with 34 runs scored and nine home runs over innings one through six.

*FIRST SIX, LAST 10:* The A's are 9-1 over the last 10 games after starting the season 0-6...have outscored the opposition 56-30 (+26) over the last 10 games after being outscored 50-13 (-37) over the first six...the A's pitching staff has compiled a 3.00 ERA (30 er in 90.0 ip) and .214 (72-for-336) opponents batting average over the last 10 games after logging an 8.00 ERA and .321 opponents average over the first six contests...have allowed six home runs over the last 10 games after surrendering 13 over the first six...starting pitchers are 5-1 with a 3.15 ERA (19 er in 54.1 ip) over the last 10 games after going 0-6 with a 9.00 ERA over the first six games...are batting .243 (81-for-334) with 17 home runs and 56 runs scored over the last 10 games (5.6 runs per game) after hitting .169 with two home runs and 13 runs scored over the first six contests (2.2 per game).

**AGAINST THE CENTRAL:** The A's are 4-0 in this seven-game stretch against American League Central teams that began with a four-game series with Detroit and concludes with this three-game series with Minnesota...went 25-8 against the AL Central in 2019 after going 26-8 in 2018...are now 69-20 (.776) against AL Central foes dating back to June 23, 2017.

*OFFENSE:* The A's have homered in each of the last eight games (16 home runs total) after homering just three times over the first eight contests...are tied for fourth in the American League in home runs (19)...are 8-0 when outhomering their opponent, 0-7 when they are out-homered...have tripled in back-to-back games and have five triples overall, which is second most in the majors to the Rockies (6)...lead the AL in hit by pitches (13) and rank second in walks (60)...have been successful in 12-of-14 (85.7%) stole attempts and rank third in the AL in steals...A's pinch hitters are 5-for-15 (.333) with a home run, four RBI and a walk...lead the AL in pinch hits and RBI, are tied for the lead in home runs and tied for second in plate appearances (16).

**PITCHING:** The A's pitching staff has not allowed an extra base hit in the last three games, which is tied for the longest such streak in Oakland history (ninth time, last: July 11-13, 2003)...opponents are 15-for-95 (.158) over

the last three games and the A's have allowed just two runs in 27.0 innings (0.67 ERA)...still have the highest opponents batting average in the American League (.257)...have the second highest ERA (4.88), opponents on-base percentage (.328) and OPS (.747) and third highest slugging percentage (.420).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in seven of the last eight games and are 5-0 with a 2.68 ERA (13 er in 43.2 ip) over that span after going 0-7 with a 7.91 ERA over the first eight contests... are 5-7 with a 5.14 ERA (47 er in 82.1 ip) for the season...the ERA is second highest in the American League to the Angels (5.53) and the losses are tied for second most to the Tigers (8).

**BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen has not allowed a run in the last three games (9.0 ip) or four of the last five (2 er in 18.1 ip, 0.98 ERA)...has stranded all three of its inherited runners over the last five games...has converted each of its two save opportunities over the last five games after having no save chances over the first 11 contests...the A's and the Yankees are the only American League teams without a blown save...has a 4-0 record and the A's and Cardinals are the only Major League teams without a loss from the bullpen...however, has the highest first batter batting average (.388), on-base percentage (.492) and slugging percentage (.792) in the majors and is tied for the most first batter home runs (4)...is tied with the Marlins for the most runs allowed in the ninth inning (15).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have a season-best five-game errorless streak and have committed just two errors over the last 11 games...have five errors for the season, which is the fewest in the American League and tied for third fewest in the majors...lead the AL in fielding percentage (.991) and are tied with Houston for the fewest unearned runs (2).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 4-0 on this seven-game homestand against Detroit (4-0) and Minnesota (three games)...have won each of their last five home games after dropping each of the first six...went 1-6 on the first homestand against Houston (0-4) and Los Angeles-NL (1-2), which was the A's worst record on a homestand of more than three games since they went 1-8 on the first homestand of the 2001 season (1-2 vs. Anaheim, 0-3 vs. Seattle, 0-3 vs. Texas)...leave following the game tomorrow for the second road trip of the season, a seven-game trip to Baltimore (three games) and Tampa Bay (four games) that begins on Friday...went 4-1 on the first road trip to Houston (2-1) and Arizona (2-0)...lost the first game but then won each of the final four, which matches the A's longest road winning streak from last year (Aug. 12-16).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list seven times this year and currently have five players on the IL (Fiers, Pinder, Puk, Rosenthal, Smith)... used the IL just eight times all last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4)...used it 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest in the majors.

*A's vs. TWINS*: The A's and Twins will meet for the first time since July 21, 2019 at Minnesota, a span of 639 days...the A's won the season series in 2019, 4-3...split four games in Minnesota and won two of three in Oakland...the A's have won five season series, lost one and split one over the previous seven seasons and are 31-16 (.660) against the Twins dating back to 2013, which includes an 18-5 (.783) record in Oakland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 309-305 against Minnesota...that includes 172-131 in Oakland and 137-174 in Minnesota...are 20-19 at Target Field...are 366-374 all-time against the Twins and have a 1013-1010 record against the Twins/Senators... the 1013 are the A's most against any franchise.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

*Mark Canha* has 18 runs scored, which ranks second in the majors and matches the most in Oakland history over the first 16 games of the season...*Ramón Laureano* leads the majors with eight stolen bases, which is more than 18 teams...had his first assist of the season on Sunday and now has 22 assists since making his Major League debut on Aug. 3, 2018, which are the most in the majors among outfielders over that span...*Lou Trivino* has a 9.0-inning scoreless streak.

#### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1969** Dick Green triples twice in the first game of a doubleheader at Kansas City...Green drives in three of the A's runs in a 5-1 victory in game one and combines for four hits in the doubleheader...in **1971** Jim Hunter tosses a three-hit shutout as the A's win at California, 4-0...Sal Bando homers twice and singles while driving in three runs...in **1982** Dan Meyer's two-out RBI single in the bottom of the 16th inning lifts the A's to a 4-3 victory over Minnesota.

PITCHING PROBABLES

### TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (1-1, 4.32 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season and the 100th of his career...will become the 25th pitcher in Oakland history to make 100 starts...is in his sixth season in the majors and is on his fourth Opening Day roster (2017-18, 20-21)...started the A's fourth game this year after starting the second game of the season in each of his previous three seasons in which he was on the Opening Day roster.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: Defeated Detroit in his last start to extend his winning streak against American League Central teams to nine games dating back to Aug. 23, 2016...has a 1.68 ERA (12 er in 64.1 ip) and .183 (42-for-229) opponents batting average during the streak, which spans 10 starts...his last loss came on July 5, 2016 at Minnesota...is 10-2 with a 2.43 ERA (22 er in 81.1 ip) in 13 career starts vs. AL Central teams.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has held left-handed hitters to a .118 (2-for-17) batting average compared to .313 (15-for-48) by right-handers...both of the hits by lefties are home runs...opponents are hitting .293 (12-for-41) with the bases empty but that drops to .208 (5-for-24) with runners on base...opponents are 1-for-11 (.091) with runners in scoring position after hitting .375 with RISP last year.

*FIRST START:* He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-2 loss to Houston on April 4 in Oakland...allowed a solo home run to Tucker in the first inning but the A's came back to tie the game in the bottom of the first...then allowed a two-run home run to Castro in the second and a two-run double to Gurriel in the third.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-2 win at Houston on April 9... blanked the Astros on three hits over the first three innings and allowed his only run in the fourth when Gurriel walked, went to third on a Correa single and scored on a Tucker ground out...was relieved by Petit to start the seventh inning with the scored tied 1-1.

LAST START: He picked up his first win of the season in the A's 8-4 victory over Detroit on Thursday in Oakland...it was the 100th game of his career... blanked the Tigers on two hits over the first three innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a RBI double to Castro in the fourth...Oakland built a 3-1 lead before he allowed his final run on a leadoff home run to Goodrum in the sixth...was relieved by Petit to start the seventh with the A's leading 7-2.

MANAEA vs. MINNESOTA: Is 2-1 with a 3.94 ERA (16.0 ip, 17 h, 8 r, 7 er, 7 bb, 14 so, 2 hr) in three career starts... last faced the Twins on Aug. 24, 2018 when was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-1 win at Minnesota...blanked the Twins on one hit and one walk over

the first three innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed an unearned run in the bottom of the fourth when his own error preceded a Sano sacrifice fly...the A's got that run back in the fifth and he was relieved by Trivino with no outs and a runner on first in the bottom of the sixth with the A's leading 2-1...his other two starts came in 2016...had a win in the A's 5-1 victory in Oakland on June 1...shut out the Twins on four hits and a walk over the first five innings...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the sixth inning...then took the loss in an 11-4 decision at Minnesota on July 5...allowed a Suzuki RBI groundout in the bottom of the second, a Suzuki RBI single and a Buxton RBI single in the fourth and a two-run home run to Vargas and a solo home run to Kepler in the fifth.

**2020 RECAP:** Went 4-3 with a 4.50 ERA in 11 starts...the ERA was the highest of his career as was his .270 opponents batting average...his .427 slugging percentage matched his high...went 4-1 with a 2.65 ERA and .234 opponents batting average over his final six starts dating back to Aug. 20...the wins tied for fourth most in the majors over that span...went 0-2 with a 7.65 ERA and .325 opponents average over his first five starts...tied for the team lead in starts...walked just eight batters in 54.0 innings, an average of 1.33 walks per nine innings...that was the lowest mark of his career and was sixth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 50 or more innings pitched...struck out 45 for a career-best 5.63 strikeout-to-walk ratio...had five starts without a walk, five with one and three in his other...has walked just 51 batters in 261.0 innings over the last three years (1.76 per nine innings).

**2020 THE FIRST THREE INNINGS:** Had a 2.56 ERA and .233 opponents batting average over the first three innings of his starts compared to a 7.59 ERA and .319 opponents average from the fourth inning on...in 19 starts over the last three seasons, he has a 2.22 ERA (14 er in 56.2 ip) and .221 (45-for-204) opponents batting average over innings 1-3 and a 5.15 ERA (25 er in 43.2 ip) and .262 (45-for-172) opponents average from the fourth inning on.

**2020 OPPONENTS BATTING:** His .270 opponents batting average broke down to .250 (13-for-52) against left-handed hitters compared to .277 (44-for-159) against right-handers...issued seven of eight walks to righties...had a .204 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .327 with seven of his eight walks after that...had a .281 batting average against batters leading off an inning but issued just one walk (.293 on-base percentage)...yielded a .222 average with the bases empty, .373 with runners on... opponents hit .375 with runners in scoring position and were 7-for-15 (.467) with RISP and two outs...entered the season with a .227 career opponents average with RISP, including .199 with RISP and two outs...allowed a .248 opponents average and four of his seven home runs with two strikes.

**2020 NIGHT AND DAY:** Went 2-1 with a 3.32 ERA and .182 opponents batting average in four starts during the day, 2-2 with a 5.29 ERA and .321 opponent average in seven starts at night...is now 17-6 with a 3.39 ERA (79 er in 210.0 ip) and .214 (167-for-779) opponents batting average in 36 career day games compared to 23-26 with a 4.14 ERA (163 er in 354.1 ip) and .267 (366-for-1373) opponents average in 64 career starts at night.

**2020 HOME AND AWAY:** Was 3-1 with a 3.91 ERA and .232 opponents batting average in five starts in Oakland, 1-2 with a 5.02 ERA and .302 opponents average in five starts on the road...is now 22-14 in his career in the Coliseum compared to 18-18 on the road.

**2020 AL AND NL:** Was 2-1 with a 3.33 ERA in five interleague starts compared to 2-2 with a 5.67 ERA in six starts against the American League...however, is 5-8 with a 4.03 ERA (46 er in 102.2 ip) in 19 career starts against the National League compared to 35-24 with a 3.82 ERA (196 er in 461.2 ip) in 81 games against the AL.

**2020 THIS AND THAT:** Was charged with five unearned runs, which tied for eighth most in the majors...tossed fewer than six innings in nine of his 11 starts...was 0-3 in four starts with two runs of support or fewer, 4-0 in seven starts with three or more...is now 4-30 in 49 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 36-2 in 50 starts with support of three or more...the A's were 7-4 (.636) in his starting assignments and are 13-6 (.685) when he starts over the last three years.

### TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesús Luzardo (0-1, 8.31 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season...has an 8.31 ERA over his first three starts but the A's are 2-1 (.667) in his starting assignments...are now 8-4 (.667) when he starts in his career...is in his third season in the majors and is on his second consecutive Opening Day roster... begins the season in starting rotation for the first time in his career as his first two outings last year came in relief.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-5 loss to Houston on April 2 in Oakland...struck out a career-high eight batters...allowed a three-run home run to Bregman in the third inning and surrendered two more runs in the fourth on a Gurriel home run an a Brantley RBI double.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 10-inning win over Los Angeles (NL) in Oakland on April 7...tossed a career-high 104 pitches and issued a career-high four walks...allowed a RBI single to Pollock in the first inning but then retired 12 of 13 hitters at one point from the second through sixth innings...was relieved by Kolarek with runners on first and second and one out in the sixth with the scored tied 1-1 and Kolarek allowed one of the runs to score.

LAST START: He had his second consecutive no decision in an A's win, a 7-5 victory at Arizona last Tuesday...retired the side in order in the first inning but then allowed three runs in the second and two more in the third and lasted just 2.2 innings...it was the shortest start of his career...allowed a three-run home run to Kelly in the second and a RBI double to Cabrera and a RBI groundout by Peralta in the third...left trailing 5-0 but the A's scored seven unanswered runs for the win.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Was 1-1 with a 4.22 ERA in three starts this spring... allowed a .205 opponents batting average but issued four walks in 10.2 in-nings...did not allow a run in two of his three starts...is now 4-1 with a 1.82 ERA (7 er in 34.2 ip) and .195 (24-for-123) opponents batting average in 13 career spring training appearances (10 starts).

2020 RECAP: Went 3-2 with a 4.12 ERA in 12 games, including nine starts, in his rookie campaign...ranked second among Major League rookies in strike-outs (59) and innings pitched (59.0), tied for fifth in games and tied for ninth in wins and games started...walked just 17 batters in 59.0 innings (2.59 per nine innings) and now has 27 walks in 84.0 career innings (2.89 per nine innings)...walked two batters or fewer in 11 of his 12 appearances in 2020 and 19 of 21 in his career...however, surrendered nine home runs, which tied for fifth most among ML rookies.


