## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (11-7) VS. MINNESOTA TWINS (6-10)

WEDNESDAY, APRIL 21, 2021 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 12:37 PDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Swept the doubleheader from Minnesota yesterday for just their second doubleheader sweep over the last 23 years (Sept. 9, 2017 against Houston)...the sweep extended the A's winning streak to 10 games and Oakland is now 11-1 over the last 12 games after starting the year 0-6... the sweep coupled with a Seattle loss moved the A's into a tie for first place in the American League West...were in sole possession of last place in the West as recently as April 11 and were a season-high 5½ games out of first on April 8...have spent one day tied for first, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth... are now a season-high four games over .500 at 11-7 (.611), which is tied for the second best record in the AL and tied for fourth best in the majors...however, have a run differential of -3.

**10-GAME WINNING STREAK:** The A's have a 10-game winning streak, which matches the longest in the majors over the last two years (Yankees, Sept. 9-19, 2020)...the last team to win more than 10 in a row is the A's, who won 11 straight from May 16-27, 2019...this is the ninth winning streak of 10 or more games in Oakland history...have outscored the opposition 58-21 during the streak...the pitching staff has compiled a 2.20 ERA (21 er in 86.0 ip) and .203 (64-for-315) opponents batting average and has surrendered just three home runs...the offense is batting .252 (79-for-314) with 58 runs (5.8 per game) and 19 home runs and 11 total bases...have committed just two errors.

**BACK-TO-BACK SHUTOUTS, AGAIN:** The A's shutout the Twins in both games of the doubleheader yesterday after blanking the Tigers in consecutive games on Friday and Saturday...this marks the first time the A's have recorded four shutouts over a five-game stretch since the Philadelphia A's did it from May 12-18, 1909...the doubleheader shutout of the Twins was the third in Oakland history (June 4, 1972 at Baltimore and Sept. 9, 1974 vs. Kansas City)...have not allowed a run in 40 of the last 41 innings (allowed two in the sixth inning on Sunday against Detroit) and have a 0.44 ERA (2 er in 41.0 ip) over that five-game stretch...opponents are 23-for-145 (.159) with one extra base hit (Garver double in game 1 yesterday) and six walks over the last five games...lead the American League and are tied for second in the majors with four shutouts...however, have the second highest opponents batting average (.249).

**AGAINST THE CENTRAL:** The A's are 6-0 in this seven-game stretch against American League Central teams that began with a four-game series with Detroit and concludes with this three-game series with Minnesota...went 25-8 against the AL Central in 2019 after going 26-8 in 2018...are now 71-20 (.780) against AL Central foes dating back to June 23, 2017.

**THE LONG BALL:** The A's did not homer in the second game of the doubleheader yesterday, snapping their streak of nine consecutive games with a home run...now have 19 home runs over the last 10 games after homering just three times over the first eight contests...the A's 22 home runs are tied for second most in the American League to Cleveland's 23...are 9-0 when out-homering their opponent, 0-7 when they are out-homered

**OFFENSE:** The A's had 22 plate appearances in the 1-0, seven-inning win in the second game of the doubleheader yesterday...those were the fewest plate appearances in an A's victory since the Kansas City A's defeated the New York Yankees 1-0 on July 30, 1958 in a game called after the top of the fifth inning (also 22)...the A's lead the AL in walks (68), hit by pitches (14) and triples (5) and are tied for fourth in extra base hits (49)...are batting .286 (52-for-182) with 35 runs scored and 10 home runs in the seventh inning or later compared to .182 (70-for-385) with 42 runs scored and 12 home runs over innings 1-6...A's pinch hitters are 5-for-15 (.333) with a home run, four RBI and a walk...lead the AL in pinch hits and RBI, are tied for the lead in home runs and tied for second in plate appearances (16).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in nine of the 10 games during the winning streak and are 7-0 with a 2.09 ERA (13 er in 56.0 ip) over that span after going 0-7 with a 7.91 ERA over the first eight contests...are 7-7 with a 4.47 ERA (47 er in 94.2 ip) for the season...are tied for second in the American League in both wins and losses by starters... have the most innings pitched (94.2).

**BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen has not allowed a run in its last four games (10.2 ip) and five of the last six (2 er in 20.0 ip, 0.90 ERA)...has stranded all four of its inherited runners over its last six games...has converted each of its three save opportunities over its last six games after having no save chances over the first 11 contests...the A's and the Yankees are the only Major League teams without a blown save...the bullpen has a 4-0 record and is the only pen in the majors without a loss from the bullpen...however, has the highest

first batter batting average (.380), on-base percentage (.492) and slugging percentage (.780) in the majors and is tied for the most first batter home runs (4)...is tied with the Marlins for the most runs allowed in the ninth inning (15).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's had their season-high six-game errorless streak snapped in the second game of the doubleheader yesterday and have now committed three errors over the last 13 games...have six errors for the season, which is tied with Houston for the fewest in the American League...lead the AL in fielding percentage (.990) and are tied with Houston for the fewest unearned runs (2).

**ON THE BASES:** The A's stole four base in the first game of the doubleheader yesterday, which were their most in a game since Aug. 5, 2017 at Los Angeles (AL) when they also had four...have been successful in 16-of-18 (88.9%) stole attempts and are tied with the Padres for the most stolen bases in the majors.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 6-0 on this seven-game homestand against Detroit (4-0) and Minnesota (2-0)...have gone undefeated on a homestand of more than six games three times in Oakland history...went 7-0 from Sept. 10-16, 1992 (Seattle 4, Minnesota 3), 7-0 from Sept. 3-10, 2001 (Baltimore 3, Tampa Bay 3, Texas 1) and Aug. 23-29, 2004 (Baltimore 4, Tampa Bay 3)... have won each of their last seven home games after dropping each of the first six...went 1-6 on the first homestand against Houston (0-4) and Los Angeles-NL (1-2), which was the A's worst record on a homestand of more than three games since they went 1-8 on the first homestand of the 2001 season (1-2 vs. Anaheim, 0-3 vs. Seattle, 0-3 vs. Texas)...leave following the game today for the second road trip of the season, a seven-game trip to Baltimore (three games) and Tampa Bay (four games) that begins on Friday...went 4-1 on the first road trip to Houston (2-1) and Arizona (2-0)...lost the first game but then won each of the final four, which matches the A's longest road winning streak from last year (Aug. 12-16).

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's improved to 3-0 in one-run decisions with a 1-0 win in game two yesterday...are one of four teams without a one-run loss (Cubs, Mets, Royals)...are now 5-0 in games decided by three runs or fewer...the five games are tied for the fewest in the majors and the A's are the only team without a loss...the A's are 7-0 when leading after six innings after going 25-0 last year...have now won 44 consecutive games when leading after six innings dating back to Sept. 7, 2019, which is tied for the second longest such winning streak in Oakland history...had a 45-game streak from April 22-Aug. 12, 1992...had their second walk-off win of the season on Sunday, which is tied for the most in the majors.

**A's vs. TWINS:** The A's lead the season series 2-0 after sweeping a doubleheader yesterday...it was the A's first doubleheader sweep of the Twins since Aug. 10, 1986 (6-2, 6-5)...Oakland won the season series in 2019, 4-3...split four games in Minnesota and won two of three in Oakland...the A's have won five season series, lost one and split one over the previous seven seasons and are 33-16 (.673) against the Twins dating back to 2013, which includes a 20-5 (.800) record in Oakland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 311-305 against Minnesota...that includes 174-131 in Oakland and 137-174 in Minnesota...are 20-19 at Target Field...are 368-374 all-time against the Twins and have a 1015-1010 record against the Twins/Senators...the 1015 are the A's most against any franchise.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Mark Canha** leads the American League in runs (19), is tied for second in walks (13) and hit by pitches (4), tied for fifth in steals (3) and ranks ninth in on-base percentage (.407)...**Ramón Laureano** leads the majors with eight stolen bases, which is more than 16 teams...the stolen bases match the most by an Athletic over the first 18 games over the last 28 years (Davis, 2010)...**Lou Trivino** has a 9.2-inning scoreless streak.

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1956** Art Ditmar tosses a one-hitter in the A's 15-1 win over the Chicago White Sox...in **1958** Frank House scores two runs as a pinch hitter in an eight-run 8<sup>th</sup> inning as the A's defeat Cleveland, 9-4...the two runs scored by a pinch hitter ties a major league record...in **1981** Steve McCatty goes the distance in the A's 4-3, 10 inning win over Minnesota...Tony Armas drives in the winning run with a RBI single...in **2002** Greg Myers hits a pinch hit three-run home run in the bottom of the ninth to give manager Art Howe his 900<sup>th</sup> career victory in a 6-5 win over Anaheim...in **2018** Sean Manaea tosses the seventh no-hitter in Oakland history and the 12th in Athletics history in a 3-0 win over Boston...he walks two and strikes out 10.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (2-1, 4.91 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season...has allowed just one run on eight hits and two walks in 12.0 innings over his last two starts, both wins, after yielding seven runs on seven hits and three walks in 2.2 innings in his first start, a loss...begins his sixth season in the majors and is on his fourth Opening Day roster (2017, 19-21)...was the A's Opening Day starter last year after beginning the 2019 season in the fourth spot in the rotation.

**FIRST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-3 loss to Los Angeles (NL) on April 5 in Oakland...tossed 90 pitches in 2.2 innings, which were the most by an A's pitcher in an outing of fewer than three innings since pitch counts were tracked beginning in 1988...allowed four runs in the second inning on a McKinstry sacrifice fly and a three-run double by Seager...yielded three more runs in the third on a Smith home run, a McKinstry RBI single and a wild pitch.

**SECOND START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-3 win at Houston on April 10...it snapped a career-high three-game losing streak dating back to Sept. 13, 2020...shut out the Astros on five hits and a walk over the first six innings before allowing his only run on a leadoff home run to Tucker in the seventh...was relieved by Romo following the home run with the A's leading 6-0.

**LAST START:** He won his second consecutive start when he combined with three A's relievers on a four-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win over Detroit last Friday in Oakland...tossed six of the innings and allowed two of the hits (Grossman single in the third, Reyes single in the sixth)...also walked Castro in the first but did not allow a runners to advance past first base.

**2020 RECAP:** Was off to a strong start as he was 2-1 with a 1.57 ERA, .175 opponents batting average and no home runs over his first four starts...was scratched from his scheduled start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness and went 1-4 with an 8.70 ERA, .321 opponents average and 10 home runs over his final seven starts...went 3-5 with a 5.60 ERA in 11 starts overall...his ERA was eighth highest in the majors among pitchers with at least 50 innings pitched...had career highs in losses (5) and earned runs (33) and matched his high in home runs (10), runs (35) and walks (23)...led the A's in strikeouts (60), losses, runs, home runs and walks.

**2020 OPPONENTS BATTING:** His opponents batting average broke down to .198 (22-for-111) against right-handed hitters compared to .350 (35-for-100) against left-handers...surrendered six of his 10 home runs and issued 15 of his 23 walks to lefties for a 1.061 OPS (.572 against right-handers)...had a .306 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .264 the second time and .205 after that...allowed a .133 average with two strikes and has a .168 career opponents average in that situation.

### FRIDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**LHP Cole Irvin (1-2, 4.60 ERA):** Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season...it is the 23rd appearance and seventh start of his career...picked up the win his last start to snap a career-high four-game losing streak dating back to May 22, 2019...begins his third season in the majors and is on his second consecutive Opening Day roster...combined with Wendelken, Guerra and Weems on a five-hit shutout in his last start, a 7-0 win over Detroit last Saturday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 4 h, 0 r, 0 er, 0 bb, 6 so)...has never faced the Orioles in his career...went 1-1 with a 1.00 ERA and .169 opponents batting average in five spring appearances, including three starts...walked just three batters in 18.0 innings and struck out 18...had two stints with Philadelphia last year and was 0-1 with a 17.18 ERA in three relief appearances...opponents went 11-for-21 (.524) but he walked just one and struck out four in 3.2 innings

**2020 HOME AND AWAY:** Was 2-1 with a 2.56 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in six starts in Oakland, 1-4 with a 10.13 ERA and .330 opponents average in five starts on the road...surrendered just two home runs in 31.2 innings in Oakland compared to eight in 21.1 innings on the road...over the last three years, he is 7-2 with a 3.28 ERA (30 er in 82.1 ip) and five home runs in 82.1 innings over 15 starts in Oakland, 7-6 with a 4.32 ERA (39 er in 81.1 ip) and 14 home runs in 81.1 innings over 15 starts on the road.

**2020 NIGHT AND DAY:** Made eight of his 11 starts during the day, which tied for the most in the majors...was 2-4 with a 6.16 ERA during the day, 1-1 with a 4.20 ERA at night...his career numbers are 8-9 with a 4.82 ERA (62 er in 115.2 ip) in 31 games during the day, 12-6 with a 3.83 ERA (68 er in 160.0 ip) in 42 contests at night.

**2020 THE WEST AND THE REST:** Was 3-2 with a 3.61 ERA and .236 opponents batting average in eight starts against American League West competition, 0-3 with a 13.50 ERA and .391 opponents average in three interleague starts...is now 11-5 with a 3.61 ERA (56 er in 139.2 ip) in 34 career appearances against AL West competition, 9-10 with a 4.90 ERA (74 er in 136.0 ip) in 39 games against all other teams...is 2-5 with an 8.38 ERA (36 er in 38.2 ip) in 11 career interleague appearances.

**2020 THIS AND THAT:** The A's were 6-5 (.545) in his starting assignments... had two starts of seven innings and five starts of fewer than five innings... went 2-2 with a 2.83 ERA in six starts on four days rest, 1-3 with an 11.00 ERA in five starts on five days rest or more...received two runs of support or fewer in nine of his 11 starts...had 10 of his 28 runs of support in one start on Aug. 3 at Seattle and had a 4.75 RSA for the season...won both of his starts with support of three or more runs and is now 13-1 in 16 career starts with at least three runs of support.

**2020 HIGHLIGHTS:** Was the A's Opening Day starting pitcher and had a no decision in a 7-3, 10-inning win over Los Angeles (AL)...it was his first career Opening Day start and he became the A's 13th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 15 years...was just the second foreign-born Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Ariel Prieto, April 2, 1997)...allowed just one run in 4.0 innings...took the loss in his second start on July 29 against Colorado, snapping a career-high five-game winning streak dating back to May 17, 2019...then picked up the win in back-to-back starts on Aug. 3 at Seattle and Aug. 8 against Houston for his only winning streak of the season...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings in each start...was named American League Player of the Week for the week of Aug. 3-9 after going 2-0 with a 0.64 ERA in two starts...struck out 14, walked four and allowed six hits in 14.0 innings...it was his first career Player of the Week honor...was 2-1 with a 1.57 ERA in four starts when he was scratched from his scheduled start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness...allowed a career-high nine runs in 1.2 innings in his next start on Aug. 18 at Arizona, which was his shortest career outing as a starter...that began a season-ending stretch where he went 1-4 with a 8.70 ERA in six starts...lost his second consecutive decision in the second game of the Aug. 29 doubleheader at Houston, snapping a seven-game winning streak against AL West competition...was placed on the paternity list on Sept. 14...was reinstated Sept. 17 and allowed three home runs in a game for the first time in his career in his next start on Sept. 22 at Los Angeles (NL)...started the A's final game of the season on Sept. 27 against Seattle and struck out a career-high 13 batters on a career-high 113 pitches in 6.0 innings...the strikeouts were the most by an A's pitcher since Todd Stottlemyre had 15 on June 16, 1995 against Kansas City and they tied for the seventh best single game performance in Oakland history...they matched the most in Athletics history by a pitcher with six innings or fewer...Vida Blue also had 13 in 6.0 innings on April 9, 1971 against Kansas City...it was his third career 10-strikeout game...was 1-1 with a 9.53 ERA and .346 opponents batting average in two games, including one start, in his postseason debut...picked up the win in relief in the A's series-clinching, 6-4 victory over Chicago in Game 3 of the ALWC (2.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 so)...then took the loss in the deciding Game 4 of the ALDS against Houston at Dodger Stadium, an 11-6 A's loss (3.2 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 3 so, 2 hr).

- Begins his 10th season in the majors and is on his seventh Opening Day roster (2014-16, 18-21).
- Struck out his 500th career batter (Yordan Alvarez) on April 2.
- Walked the first batter he faced during the spring but then retired each of the final 18 batters he faced...opponents went 0-for-18 in his six appearances and he did not allow a run in 6.0 innings.
- Is 0-2 with a 9.35 ERA (9 er in 8.2 ip) with 10 strikeouts and five walks in 11 career outings against the Twins.
- Did not allow a run during the day last year and, after Sunday's outing, now has a 15-game, 16.0 ip scoreless streak over the last two seasons.

*Last Year: Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)*

- Was signed to a minor league contract Dec. 4 and was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas April 1.
- Was reinstated from the injured list today after being placed on the IL on April 6 with a sprained left thumb sustained while covering first base.
- Had three wild pitches in the ninth inning April 3 to tie the Oakland record for most wild pitches in a game by a reliever (Fernando Arroyo, July 4, 1982 vs. Texas).
- Begins his fourth season in the majors and is on his first Opening Day roster...spent the first three seasons of his career with Houston (2017-19)...was originally signed by the Astros as a non-drafted free agent on Sept. 22, 2009 and spent the first 10 seasons of his professional career in the Astros farm system before signing a minor league deal with the Dodgers last year.
