ABOUT THE A'S: Extended their winning streak to 11 games on Wednesday against Minnesota by scoring once in the bottom of the ninth to tie the game and three times in the 10th after the Twins scored twice in the top of the inning...the A's are now 12-1 over the last 13 games after starting the year 0-6...are 12-7 (.632) overall, with is tied with the Mariners and Giants for the second best record in the majors (Dodgers, 14-5)...have gone from sole possession of last place in the American League West on April 11 to a tie for first place with Seattle...were a season-high 5½ games out of first on April 8...were alone in first at the conclusion of play on Wednesday...have spent one day alone in first place this year, two days tied for first, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

11-GAME WINNING STREAK: The A's have an 11-game winning streak, which matches the longest in the majors over the last three years...the other 11-game streak was also by the A's (May 16-27, 2019)...the last team to win more than 11 straight is Houston, which had a 12-game winning streak from June 6-18, 2018...the 11-game winning streak is tied for third longest in Oakland history and tied for eighth longest in Athletics history...have outscored the opposition 71-33 (+38) during the streak...the pitching staff has compiled a 2.91 ERA (31 er in 96.0 ip) and .225 (82-for-364) opponents batting average and has walked just 22 batters in 96.0 innings (2.1 per nine innings)...the offense is batting .259 (92-for-355) with 71 runs (6.5 per game), 22 home runs and 13 stolen bases.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's defeated Minnesota 13-12 in 10 innings on Wednesday...it was the fifth time in Oakland history the A's allowed at least 12 runs in a game and won...the last time was on July 20, 2009 when they overcame a 12-2 deficit to defeat the Twins 14-13...improved to 2-0 in extra inning games with the win and are now 8-1 in extra innings over the last two years...have won each of the last two games by one run and are 4-0 in one-run decisions...are one of three teams without a one-run loss (Cubs, Royals) and are tied for third in most one-run wins...are 6-0 in games decided by three runs or fewer...the six games are tied with the Astros for the fewest in the majors and the A's are the only team without a loss...have three walk-off wins, which are the most in the majors...each of the last two walk-offs have come on an error...the A's are 7-0 when leading after six innings after going 25-0 last year...have now won 44 consecutive games when leading after six innings dating back to Sept. 7, 2019, which is tied for the second longest such winning streak in Oakland history...had a 45-game streak from April 22-Aug. 12, 1992.

THE SEVENTH INNING OR LATER: The A's are batting .278 (54-for-194) with 39 runs scored and 10 home runs in the seventh inning or later compared to .196 (81-for-414) with 51 runs scored and 15 home runs over innings 1-6...lead the American League in runs in the seventh inning or later, are tied for the lead in home runs and rank second in batting.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin their second road trip of the season tonight, a seven-game trip to Baltimore (three games) and Tampa Bay (four games)...went 4-1 on the first road trip to Houston (2-1) and Arizona (2-0)...lost the first game but then won each of the final four, which matches the A's longest road winning streak from last year (Aug. 12-16)...went 7-0 on the last homestand against Detroit (4-0) and Minnesota (3-0)...it was the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have gone undefeated on a homestand of more than six games, all of which have been 7-0...the other three were Sept. 10-16, 1992 (Seattle 4, Minnesota 3), Sept. 3-10, 2001 (Baltimore 3, Tampa Bay 3, Texas 1) and Aug. 23-29, 2004 (Baltimore 4, Tampa Bay 3)...have won each of their last eight home games after dropping each of the first six...the longest home winning streak last year was nine (Aug. 4-21).

THE LONG BALL: The A's hit a season-high tying three home runs on Wednesday and now have 22 home runs over the last 11 games...allowed a season-high four home runs Wednesday and won for the first time this year when being outhomered (1-7)...are 10-0 when out-homering their opponent...have now hit 25 home runs, which is second most in the American League to the Angels (26)...have allowed 23, which is tied for third most.

OFFENSE: The A's had season highs in runs (13) and hits (13) on Wednesday...now have 90 runs for the season, which is third most in the American League...lead the league in hit by pitches (16), are tied for the lead in triples (5), rank second in walks (71) and tied for third in extra base hits (54)...A's pinch hitters are 5-for-16 (.313) with a home run, four RBI and a walk...lead the AL in pinch hits and RBI, are tied for the lead in home runs and tied for second in plate appearances (17).

PITCHING: The A's allowed 12 runs on 18 hits on Wednesday after allowing two runs on 23 hits over the previous five games...allowed eight extra base hits on Wednesday after yielding just one over the previous five...had four shutouts over a five-game stretch from April 16-20, which is the first time an A's team has done that since May 12-18, 1909...have walked three batters or fewer in each of the last seven games (9 bb in 60.0 ip, 1.35 per nine innings)...lead the American League and are tied for third in the majors with four shutouts...however, have the second highest opponents batting average in the AL (.258) and the third highest ERA (4.71), slugging percentage (.422) and OPS (.745).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in nine of the 11 games during the winning streak and are 7-0 with a 2.85 ERA (19 er in 60.0 ip) over that span after going 0-7 with a 7.91 ERA over the first eight contests...have walked just five batters over the last seven games (40.1 ip, 1.12 per nine innings)...are 7-7 with a 4.82 ERA (53 er in 98.2 ip) for the season...are tied for second in the American League in wins by starters but are tied for third in most losses...have the second highest ERA.

BULLPEN: The bullpen is 3-0 with three saves, a 2.08 ERA (6 er in 26.0 ip) and .200 (19-for-95) opponents batting average over the A's last eight games...had no save opportunities, a 6.02 ERA and .275 opponents average over the first 11 contests...the A's and the Yankees are the only Major League teams without a blown save...the bullpen has a 5-0 record and Oakland is the only team in the majors without a loss from its bullpen...however, has the highest first batter batting average (.382), on-base percentage (.493) and slugging percentage (.745) in the majors...is tied with the Marlins for the most runs allowed in the ninth inning (15).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed a season-high two errors on Wednesday and now have three errors in the last two games after a season-best six-game errorless streak...have eight errors for the season, which is tied for second fewest in the American League...rank third in fielding percentage (.988).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 18-for-21 (85.7%) in stolen base attempts...lead the American League and rank second in the majors to the Padres (20) in steals...the 18 stolen bases are the A's most in a month since May of 2015 when they also had 18...they are the most in April since they had 19 in April of 2014.

TAXI SQUAD: The A's taxi squad for the second road trip includes pitchers Mike Fiers and James Kaprielian, catcher Austin Allen, infielder Pete Kozma and outfielder Luis Barrera...Kozma is not on the 40-man roster...in addition, Tommy Everidge joins the A's for the second consecutive trip as an extra coach.

A's vs. ORIOLES: The two clubs will meet for the first time since June 19, 2019, a span of 674 days...the A's won the season series in 2019, 6-1...went 3-0 in Oakland and 3-1 in Baltimore...have won six straight and 11 of their last 13 games against the Orioles...have a seven-game winning streak in the Coliseum and are 31-12 (.721) against Baltimore at home dating back to 2008...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 274-267 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 139-135 in Oakland and 135-132 in Baltimore...are 68-58 at Camden Yards...are 1010-947 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...the only other of the other seven original American League franchises that the A's have a winning record against is the Twins/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha leads the American League in runs (20), is tied for second in hit by pitches (4), tied for third in walks (14) and stolen bases (4) and ranks seventh in on-base percentage (.414)...**Deolis Guerra** has retired each of the last 13 batters he has faced...opponents are 2-for-21 (.095) with no walks...**Ramón Laureano** leads the majors with eight stolen bases, which is more than 14 teams...**Matt Olson** has a seven-game hitting streak and is 11-for-26 (.423) with five home runs and nine RBI during the streak...is tied for the AL lead in home runs (6), ranks fourth in slugging (.684) and tied for fifth in RBI (15).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1978** the A's record their second consecutive shutout as John Henry Johnson tosses a six-hit shutout against the Mariners at Seattle in the A's 5-0 win...in **1985** the A's and the Angels combine for 10 home runs, but the A's come out on top 14-9...Mike Davis hits his sixth home run in the A's first 14 games...in **1988** Dave Stewart goes the distance in the A's 3-2, 10 inning win at Chicago to improve to 5-0...Stewart would go on to win his first eight decisions.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (1-2, 4.60 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season...it is the 23rd appearance and seventh start of his career...picked up the win his last start to snap a career-high four-game losing streak dating back to May 22, 2019...begins his third season in the majors and is on his second consecutive Opening Day roster...was the Phillies fifth round selection in the 2016 First-Year Player Draft and made his Major League debut with Philadelphia in 2019...was traded to the A's for cash considerations on Jan. 30, 2021.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-1 loss to Houston on April 3 in Oakland...it was his first start since May 22, 2019 with Philadelphia at Chicago (NL)...tossed 4.1 innings, which was the shortest start of his career...allowed a RBI single to Tucker in the first but the A's came back to tie the game with a run in the bottom of the first...then allowed a RBI single to Altuve in the second...was relieved by Trivino with runners on first and second and one out in the fifth and Trivino allowed a three-run home run.

SECOND START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 6-2 loss at Houston on April 8...allowed a leadoff home run to Correa in the second, a RBI double to Correa in the fourth and a solo home run to Alvarez in the sixth...walked the next batter (Correa) and was relieved by Wendelken with a runner on first and one out in the sixth with the A's trailing 3-0...Wendelken allowed Correa to score plus a run of his own.

LAST START: He combined with Wendelken, Guerra and Weems on a five-hit shutout in the A's 7-0 win over Detroit last Saturday in Oakland...it was his first win since May 17, 2019 against Colorado and it snapped a career-high four-game losing streak...tossed six of the inning and allowed four of the hits for the longest scoreless outing of his career...matched his career high with six strikeouts (May 22, 2019 vs. Chicago-NL) and 93 pitches (May 12, 2019 at Kansas City) and did not walk a batter for the first time as a starter.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 1-1 with a 1.00 ERA and .169 opponents batting average in five spring appearances, including three starts...walked just three batters in 18.0 innings and struck out 18...10 of the strikeouts came in his final start on March 26 at Los Angeles (NL)...those were the most in a single game by an A's pitcher in the MLB Spring Training database, which dates back to 2006...finished the spring with an 11.0-inning scoreless streak...allowed one run twice and no runs three times...tied for the team-lead in innings pitched.

2020 RECAP: Had two stints with Philadelphia and was 0-1 with a 17.18 ERA in three relief appearances...opponents went 11-for-21 (.524) but he walked just one and struck out four in 3.2 innings...allowed a .438 (7-for-16) average against right-handed hitters compared to .800 (4-for-5) against left-handers...was 2-0 with a 4.50 ERA in four spring training appearances...was optioned to Lehigh Valley March 26 but was recalled on July 23 and was on the Phillies Opening Day roster...made his 2020 debut on July 26 against Miami and allowed four runs on five hits in an inning of relief and was the losing pitcher in an 11-6 decision...tossed a scoreless inning of relief Aug. 9 against Atlanta but was optioned to Philadelphia's alternate site on Aug. 9...was recalled for a second time Aug. 20, pitched the next day at Atlanta (1.2 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 3 so) and was optioned Aug. 22...did not pitch the remainder of the season.

RHP Chris Bassitt (1-2, 4.43 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...is 1-0 with a 3.27 ERA (4 er in 11.0 ip) and .179 (7-for-39) opponents batting average over his last two starts after going 0-2 with a 5.56 ERA and .289 opponents average over his first two starts...has not allowed a run in the first inning...opponents are 4-for-23 (.174) with runners in scoring position...had a no decision in his last start, a 3-2 A's win over Detroit last Sunday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 8 so)...is 2-0 with a 2.18 ERA (20.2 ip, 12 h, 5 r, 5 er, 6 bb, 19 so, 2 hr) in three career appearances, all starts, against Baltimore...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 8-3 A's win in Oakland on June 19, 2019 (5.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 6 so)...was 2-0 with a 1.74 ERA and .179 opponents batting average in three spring training starts...went 5-2 with a 2.29 ERA in 11 starts last year...his ERA ranked second among pitchers in the West divisions and sixth in the majors.

- Has allowed a hit to the first batter he has faced in all three of his appearances.

- Was selected from the A's alternate site April 8 and allowed a home run to the first batter he faced that day at Houston (Altuve)...has not allowed a run since then for a 5.1-inning scoreless streak.
- Opponents are 2-for-21 (.095) and he has not walked a batter in 6.1 innings...his .095 opponents on-base percentage is the lowest among American League relievers.
- Left-handed hitters are 0-for-9 this year and 1-for-22 (.045) over the last two years.
