



OAKLAND ATHLETICS (13-7) VS. BALTIMORE ORIOLES (8-11)

ABOUT THE A'S: Extended their winning streak to 12 games last night in a 3-1 in the first game of this three-game set against Baltimore...won their 11th straight game on Wednesday against Minnesota by scoring once in the bottom of the ninth to tie the game and three times in the 10th after the Twins scored twice in the top of the inning...the A's are now 13-1 over the last 14 games after starting the year 0-6...are 13-7 (.650) overall, with is tied with the Giants for the second best record in the majors (Dodgers, 14-6)...have gone from sole possession of last place in the American League West on April 11 to sole possession of first...were a season-high 5½ games out of first on April 8...were alone in first at the conclusion of play on Wednesday...have spent two days alone in first place this year, two days tied for first, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

12-GAME WINNING STREAK: The A's have a 12-game winning streak, which is the longest in the majors over the last three years...the previous 11-game streak was also by the A's (May 16-27, 2019)...the last team to win more than 11 straight is Houston, which had a 12-game winning streak from June 6-18, 2018...the 12-game winning streak is third longest in Oakland history...have outscored the opposition 74-34 (+40) during the streak...the pitching staff has compiled a 2.74 ERA (32 er in 105.0 ip) and .229 (92-for-401) opponents batting average and has walked just 23 batters in 105.0 innings (1.97 per nine innings)...the offense is batting .254 (99-for-389) with 74 runs (6.2 per game), 23 home runs and 13 stolen bases.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's defeated Minnesota 13-12 in 10 innings on Wednesday...it was the fifth time in Oakland history the A's allowed at least 12 runs in a game and won...the last time was on July 20, 2009 when they overcame a 12-2 deficit to defeat the Twins 14-13...improved to 2-0 in extra inning games with the win and are now 8-1 in extra innings over the last two years...have won two of the last three games by one run and are 4-0 in one-run decisions...are one of three teams without a one-run loss (Cubs, Royals) and are tied for third in most one-run wins...are 7-0 in games decided by three runs or fewer...have three walk-off wins, which are the most in the majors...each of the last two walk-offs have come on an error...the A's are 8-0 when leading after six innings after going 26-0 last year...have now won 45 consecutive games when leading after six innings dating back to Sept. 7, 2019, which is tied for the second longest such winning streak in Oakland history...had a 45-game streak from April 22-Aug. 12, 1992.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's continue their second road trip of the season tonight, a seven-game trip to Baltimore (1-0) and Tampa Bay (four games)...went 4-1 on the first road trip to Houston (2-1) and Arizona (2-0)...lost the first game but then won each of the final four, which matches the A's longest road winning streak from last year (Aug. 12-16)...went 7-0 on the last homestand against Detroit (4-0) and Minnesota (3-0)...it was the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have gone undefeated on a homestand of more than six games, all of which have been 7-0...the other three were Sept. 10-16, 1992 (Seattle 4, Minnesota 3), Sept. 3-10, 2001 (Baltimore 3, Tampa Bay 3, Texas 1) and Aug. 23-29, 2004 (Baltimore 4, Tampa Bay 3)...have won each of their last eight home games after dropping each of the first six...the longest home winning streak last year was nine (Aug. 4-21).

THE LONG BALL: The A's hit one home run last night and hit a season-high tying three home runs on Wednesday and now have 23 home runs over the last 12 games...allowed a season-high four home runs Wednesday and won for the first time this year when being out homered (1-7)...are 11-0 when out-homer their opponent...have now hit 26 home runs, which is tied for most in the American League with the Angels and Red Sox...have allowed 23, which is fifth most.

OFFENSE: The A's had season highs in runs (13) and hits (13) on Wednesday...after scoring three times last night, now have 93 runs for the season, which is fourth most in the American League...lead the league in hit by pitches (16), are tied for the lead in triples (5), rank tied for second in walks (73) and tied for fourth in extra base hits (55)...A's pinch hitters are 5-for-16 (.313) with a home run, four RBI and a walk...lead the American League in pinch hits and RBI, are tied for the lead in home runs and tied for second in plate appearances (17).

PITCHING: The A's allowed one run on 10 hits yesterday...yielded 12 runs on 18 hits on Wednesday after allowing two runs on 23 hits over the previous

five games...allowed eight extra base hits on Wednesday after yielding just one over the previous five...had four shutouts over a five-game stretch from April 16-20, which is the first time an A's team has done that since May 12-18, 1909...have walked three batters or fewer in each of the last eight games (10 bb in 69.0 ip, 1.30 per nine innings)...lead the American League and are third in the majors with four shutouts...however, have the highest opponents batting average in the AL (.259) and the fourth highest ERA (4.53), and third highest slugging percentage (.415) and OPS (.737).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in 10 of the 1s games during the winning streak and are 8-0 with a 2.76 ERA (20 er in 65.1 ip) over that span after going 0-7 with a 7.91 ERA over the first eight contests...have walked just six batters over the last eight games (45.2 ip, 1.18 per nine innings)...are 8-7 with a 4.67 ERA (54 er in 104.0 ip) for the season.

BULLPEN: The bullpen is 3-0 with four saves, a 1.82 ERA (6 er in 29.2 ip) and .194 (21-for-108) opponents batting average over the A's last nine games...had no save opportunities, a 6.02 ERA and .275 opponents average over the first 11 contests...the A's and the Yankees are the only Major League teams without a blown save...the bullpen has a 5-0 record and Oakland is the only team in the majors without a loss from its bullpen...however, has the highest first batter batting average (.362), on-base percentage (.471) and slugging percentage (.707) in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed one error last night after committing a season-high two errors on Wednesday and now have four errors in the last three games after a season-best six-game errorless streak...have nine errors for the season, which is tied for second fewest in the American League...rank second in fielding percentage (.987).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 18-for-21 (85.7%) in stolen base attempts...tied for the American League lead and rank tied for second in the majors to the Padres (20) in steals...the 18 stolen bases are the A's most in a month since May of 2015 when they also had 18...they are the most in April since they had 19 in April of 2014.

TAXI SQUAD: The A's taxi squad for the second road trip includes pitchers Mike Fiers and James Kaprielian, catcher Austin Allen, infielder Pete Kozma and outfielder Luis Barrera...Kozma is not on the 40-man roster...in addition, Tommy Everidge joins the A's for the second consecutive trip as an extra coach.

A's vs. ORIOLES: The A's won last night by a score of 3-1...the two clubs are meeting for the first time since June 19, 2019, a span of 674 days...the A's won the season series in 2019, 6-1...went 3-0 in Oakland and 3-1 in Baltimore...have won seven straight and 12 of their last 14 games against the Orioles...have a seven-game winning streak in the Coliseum and are 31-12 (.721) against Baltimore at home dating back to 2008...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 275-267 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 139-135 in Oakland and 136-132 in Baltimore...are 69-58 at Camden Yards...are 1011-947 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...of the other seven original American League franchises, the A's have a winning record against the Twins/Senators.

Mark Canha leads the American League in runs (20), is tied for second in hit by pitches (4), tied for fifth in walks (14), tied for third in stolen bases (4), and ranks eighth in on-base percentage (.414)...**Deolis Guerra** has retired each of the last 13 batters he has faced...opponents are 2-for-21 (.095) with no walks...**Ramón Laureano** leads the majors with eight stolen bases, which is more than 15 teams...**Matt Olson** has an eight-game hitting streak and is 13-for-30 (.433) with five home runs and nine RBI during the streak...is tied for second in the AL in home runs (6), ranks fifth in slugging (.672) and tied for seventh in RBI (15)...**J.B. Wendelken** leads the American League with 12 games pitched...**Lou Trivino** and **Yusmeiro Petit** are tied for second in the AL with 11 games pitched...no other reliever in the AL has more than 10 games pitched.

- Has not allowed a run in his last six games (6.2 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 8 so) after yielding four runs over his first three contests.
- Has yielded a .100 (2-for-20) average against right-handed hitters compared to .357 (5-for-14) against left-handers.
- Has not allowed a run in three day games (3.1 ip) and has not allowed a run during the day since Sept. 1, 2019 vs. New York (AL)...has a 17-game, 17.2-inning scoreless streak during the day.
- Has six career appearances against Baltimore (5.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 3 so, 2.25 ERA).
- Recorded his first save of the season and the eighth of his career in the second game of the doubleheader against Minnesota on Tuesday...it was his first save since June 20, 2018 for Texas against Kansas City...also earned the save last night, the ninth of his career.

Last Year: Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and allowed eight runs on nine hits in 2.2 innings over three appearances before he was placed on the 10-day injured list April 6 with a sprained left thumb sustained while covering first base...was reinstated on Tuesday but has not pitched since then.
- Has allowed a hit to the first batter he has faced in all three of his appearances.
- Has faced the Orioles twice in his career (1.1 ip, 1 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 2 so, 1 hr, 13.50 ERA).
- Was signed to a minor league contract Dec. 4 and was a non-roster invitee...compiled a 0.96 ERA in nine relief appearances this spring...opponents were 3-for-29 (.103) with one walk in 9.1 innings.

Last Year: Was a non-roster invitee with the Los Angeles Dodgers and had a loss and a 3.00 ERA in six spring training appearances...was not added to the Dodgers 60-man player pool and did not pitch in 2020.

- Retired the only batter he faced Wednesday against Minnesota, an Astudillo pop out to end the 10th inning, but picked up the win...has now retired each of the last 13 batters he has faced.
- Was selected from the A's alternate site April 8 and allowed a home run to the first batter he faced that day at Houston (Altuve)...has not allowed a run since then for a 5.1-inning scoreless streak.
- Opponents are 2-for-21 (.095) and he has not walked a batter in 6.1 innings...his .095 opponents on-base percentage is the lowest among American League relievers.
- Left-handed hitters are 0-for-9 this year and 1-for-22 (.045) over the last two years.
- Faced the Orioles once last year on Aug. 11 while pitching for Philadelphia (1.0 ip, 1 h, 2 r, 1 er).
- Was signed to a minor league contract on Jan. 28 and was a non-roster invitee...did not allow a run in 6.2 innings over seven outings this spring...struck out 12 batters and held opponents to a .136 average (3-for-22).

Last Year: Was on the Opening Day roster and appeared in nine games for Philadelphia in 2020 and went 1-3 with an 8.59 ERA (7 er in 7.1 ip)...struck out eight batters and walked two.

- Left-handed hitters are 2-for-11 (.182) against him but right-handers are 5-for-8 (.625).
- Last faced the Orioles on Sept. 12, 2019 while pitching for the Dodgers (0.1 ip)...has a 3.60 ERA (4 er in 10.0 ip) in nine career outings against Baltimore.
- Was acquired from Los Angeles (NL) with minor leaguer Cody Thomas on Feb. 12 for Sheldon Neuse and Gus Varland...compiled a 6.75 ERA and .281 opponents batting average in seven outings during the spring.

- Has not allowed a run in eight of his last nine games (10.0 ip, 7 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 7 so) and has stranded all four inherited runners over that span...allowed a run in 2.1 innings over his first two contests and allowed all four of his inherited runners to score.
- Opponents are 7-for-18 (.389) with the bases empty but are just 3-for-27 (.111) with runners on base.
- Is tied for second in the Majors among all pitchers in wins (3) and is tied for second in the American League in games pitched (11)...is tied for third among AL relievers in innings pitched (12.1 ip).
- Has stranded all 11 of his inherited runners in his career against the Orioles.

Last Year: Compiled a career-low 1.66 ERA in a team-leading 26 relief appearances...opponents hit .232 and he walked just five batters for a .273 on-base percentage...yielded four runs, three of which scored on solo home runs.

- Opponents are 2-for-17 (.118) with runners on base.
- Is tied for the American League lead in games pitched (11)...leads AL relievers in innings pitched (13.0) and is tied for fifth in strikeouts (15).

- All 10 of his starts have come in games started by a right-handed pitcher as have 27 of his 28 career starts...is 1-for-3 (.333) against left-handers this year, which are his only at bats against southpaws over the last two years.
- Is in his third season in the majors.
- Hit .226 with three doubles, three home runs, seven RBI and seven walks (.359 on-base percentage) in 23 games this spring before he was optioned to the A's alternate site March 28.

- Leads the American League and ranks second in the majors in runs scored (20)...is tied for fifth in the AL in walks (14), tied for second in hit by pitches (4), tied for third in steals (4) and ranks eighth in on-base percentage (.414).
- Has a .395 on-base percentage over the last three years, which is seventh best in the majors (min. 750 PA).
- Is hitting .213 (10-for-47) with the bases empty, .364 (8-for-22) with runners on base.
- Has batted leadoff in 19 of the A's first 20 games...had never started a game in the leadoff spot prior to this year.
- Is one of three Athletics to start each of the first 19 games (Andrus, Chapman) and those starts have come at four different positions (13 in left field, three in center field, two in right field, one at designated hitter)...has started at least one game at all three outfield positions in each of the last five seasons.

Last Year: Batted .246 in 59 games but walked 37 times and was hit by a pitch 10 times for a .387 on-base percentage...tied for fourth in the majors in hit by pitches, tied for 12th in walks and ranked 15th in on-base percentage.
