OAKLAND ATHLETICS (13-7) VS. BALTIMORE ORIOLES (8-11)

SATURDAY, APRIL 24, 2021 - ORIOLE PARK AT CAMDEN YARDS - 7:05 EDT

RHP CHRIS BASSITT (1-2, 4.43) VS. LHP WADE LEBLANC (0-0, 5.40) NBCSCA - A'S CAST ON IHEART RADIO - A'S RADIO NETWORK (960 AM, 103.7 FM HD2, 1140 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Extended their winning streak to 12 games last night in a 3-1 in in the first game of this three-game set against Baltimore...won their 11th straight game on Wednesday against Minnesota by scoring once in the bot-tom of the ninth to tie the game and three times in the 10th after the Twins scored twice in the top of the inning...the A's are now 13-1 over the last 14 games after starting the year 0-6...are 13-7 (.650) overall, with is tied with the Giants for the second best record in the majors (Dodgers, 14-6)...have gone from sole possession of last place in the American League West on April 11 to sole posession of first...were a season-high 5½ games out of first on April 8...were alone in first at the conclusion of play on Wednesday...have spent two days alone in first place this year, two days tied for first, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

12-GAME WINNING STREAK: The A's have a 12game winning streak, which is the longest in the majors over the last three years...the previous 11-game streak was also by the A's (May 16-27, 2019)...the last team to win more than 11 straight is Houston, which had a 12-game winning streak from June 6-18, 2018...the 12-game winning streak is third longest in Oakland history...have outscored the opposition 74-34 (+40) during the streak...the pitching staff has compiled a 2.74 ERA



(32 er in 105.0 ip) and .229 (92-for-401) opponents batting average and has walked just 23 batters in 105.0 innings (1.97 per nine innings)...the offense is batting .254 (99-for-389) with 74 runs (6.2 per game), 23 home runs and 13 stolen bases.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's defeated Minnesota 13-12 in 10 innings on Wednesday...it was the fifth time in Oakland history the A's allowed at least 12 runs in a game and won...the last time was on July 20, 2009 when they overcame a 12-2 deficit to defeat the Twins 14-13...improved to 2-0 in extra inning games with the win and are now 8-1 in extra innings over the last two years...have won two of the last three games by one run and are 4-0 in one-run decisions...are one of three teams without a one-run loss (Cubs, Royals) and are tied for third in most one-run wins...are 7-0 in games decided by three runs or fewer...have three walk-off wins, which are the most in the majors...each of the last two walk-offs have come on an error...the A's are 8-0 when leading after six innings after going 26-0 last year...have now won 45 consecutive games when leading after six innings dating back to Sept. 7, 2019, which is tied for the second longest such winning streak in Oakland history...had a 45-game streak from April 22-Aug. 12, 1992.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's continue their second road trip of the season tonight, a seven-game trip to Baltimore (1-0) and Tampa Bay (four games)... went 4-1 on the first road trip to Houston (2-1) and Arizona (2-0)...lost the first game but then won each of the final four, which matches the A's longest road winning streak from last year (Aug. 12-16)...went 7-0 on the last homestand against Detroit (4-0) and Minnesota (3-0)...it was the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have gone undefeated on a homestand of more than six games, all of which have been 7-0...the other three were Sept. 10-16, 1992 (Seattle 4, Minnesota 3), Sept. 3-10, 2001 (Baltimore 3, Tampa Bay 3, Texas 1) and Aug. 23-29, 2004 (Baltimore 4, Tampa Bay 3)...have won each of their last eight home games after dropping each of the first six...the longest home winning streak last year was nine (Aug. 4-21).

THE LONG BALL: The A's hit one home run last night and hit a season-high tying three home runs on Wednesday and now have 23 home runs over the last 12 games...allowed a season-high four home runs Wednesday and won for the first time this year when being outhomered (1-7) ... are 11-0 when out-homering their opponent...have now hit 26 home runs, which is tied for most in the American League with the Angels and Red Sox...have allowed 23, which is fifth most.

OFFENSE: The A's had season highs in runs (13) and hits (13) on Wednesday... after scoring three times last night, now have 93 runs for the season, which is fourth most in the American League...lead the league in hit by pitches (16), are tied for the lead in triples (5), rank tied for second in walks (73) and tied for fourth in extra base hits (55)...A's pinch hitters are 5-for-16 (.313) with a home run, four RBI and a walk...lead the American League in pinch hits and RBI, are tied for the lead in home runs and tied for second in plate appearances (17).

PITCHING: The A's allowed one run on 10 hits yesterday...yielded 12 runs on 18 hits on Wednesday after allowing two runs on 23 hits over the previous five games...allowed eight extra base hits on Wednesday after yielding just one over the previous five...had four shutouts over a five-game stretch from April 16-20, which is the first time an A's team has done that since May 12-18. 1909...have walked three batters or fewer in each of the last eight games (10 bb in 69.0 ip, 1.30 per nine innings)...lead the American League and aree third in the majors with four shutouts...however, have the highest opponents batting average in the AL (.259) and the fourth highest ERA (4.53), and third highest slugging percentage (.415) and OPS (.737).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in 10 of the 1s games during the winning streak and are 8-0 with a 2.76 ERA (20 er in 65.1 ip) over that span after going 0-7 with a 7.91 ERA over the first eight contests...have walked just six batters over the last eight games (45.2 ip, 1.18 per nine innings)...are 8-7 with a 4.67 ERA (54 er in 104.0 ip) for the season

BULLPEN: The bullpen is 3-0 with four saves, a 1.82 ERA (6 er in 29.2 ip) and .194 (21-for-108) opponents batting average over the A's last nine games... had no save opportunities, a 6.02 ERA and .275 opponents average over the first 11 contests...the A's and the Yankees are the only Major League teams without a blown save...the bullpen has a 5-0 record and Oakland is the only team in the majors without a loss from its bullpen...however, has the highest first batter batting average (.362), on-base percentage (.471) and slugging percentage (.707) in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed one error last night after committing a season-high two errors on Wednesday and now have four errors in the last three games after a season-best six-game errorless streak...have nine errors for the season, which is tied for second fewest in the American League...rank second in fielding percentage (.987).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 18-for-21 (85.7%) in stolen base attempts...tied for the American League lead and rank tied for second in the majors to the Padres (20) in steals...the 18 stolen bases are the A's most in a month since May of 2015 when they also had 18...they are the most in April since they had 19 in April of 2014.

TAXI SQUAD: The A's taxi squad for the second road trip includes pitchers Mike Fiers and James Kaprielian, catcher Austin Allen, infielder Pete Kozma and outfielder Luis Barrera...Kozma is not on the 40-man roster...in addition, Tommy Everidge joins the A's for the second consecutive trip as an extra coach.

A's vs. ORIOLES: The A's won last night by a score of 3-1...the two clubs are meeting for the first time since June 19, 2019, a span of 674 days...the A's won the season series in 2019, 6-1 ... went 3-0 in Oakland and 3-1 in Baltimore...have won seven straight and 12 of their last 14 games against the Orioles...have a seven-game winning streak in the Coliseum and are 31-12 (.721) against Baltimore at home dating back to 2008...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 275-267 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 139-135 in Oakland and 136-132 in Baltimore...are 69-58 at Camden Yards... are 1011-947 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...of the other seven original American League franchises, the A's have a winning record against the Twins/Senators

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha leads the American League in runs (20), is tied for second in hit by pitches (4), tied for fifth in walks (14), tied for third in stolen bas es (4), and ranks eighth in on-base percentage (.414)...Deolis Guerra has retired each of the last 13 batters he has faced ... opponents are 2-for-21 (.095) with no walks...Ramón Laureano leads the majors with eight stolen bases, which is more than 15 teams...*Matt Olson* has an eight-game hitting streak and is 13-for-30 (.433) with five home runs and nine RBI during the streak...is tied for second in the AL in home runs (6), ranks fifth in slugging (.672) and tied for seventh in RBI (15)...J.B. Wendelken leads the American League with 12 games pitched...Lou Trivino and Yusmeiro Petit are tied for second in the AL with 11 games pitched...no other releiver in the AL has more than 10 games pitched.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1969 Rick Monday establishes a club record with three doubles in the A's 6-4 win at Minnesota...in 1986 Jose Rijo strikes out 14 Seattle Mariners after fanning a club record 16 batters in his previous start, but the A's lose 3-1...in 2003 Mark Mulder tosses a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Detroit.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season ... is 1-0 with a 3.27 ERA (4 er in 11.0 ip) and .179 (7-for-39) opponents batting average over his last two starts after going 0-2 with a 5.56 ERA and .289 opponents average over his first two starts...did not pitch in the majors in 2017 following May 6, 2016 "Tommy

John" surgery...is 18-12 with a 3.38 ERA (104 er in 277.0 ip) and is averaging 8.32 strikeouts per nine innings (256 so in 277.0 ip) in 54 games (47 starts) since the surgery...was 2-11 with a 4.13 ERA and 6.77 strikeouts per nine innings in 29 games (23 starts) before the surgery.

THIS AND THAT: Has not allowed a run in the first inning...last year, he allowed six of his 18 runs in the first inning...had a 4.91 ERA in the first inning, a 1.73 ERA from the second inning on...has received one run of support or fewer in three of his four starts this year and is 0-2 in those starts...is 16-1 in 26 career starts with three runs of support or more, 4-22 in 44 starts with two runs of support or fewer...opponents are 4-for-23 (.174) with runners in scoring position...has held left-handed hitters to a .200 (10-for-50) batting average compared to .294 (10-for-34) against right-handers...has yielded both of his home runs to lefties.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-1 loss to Houston on Opening Day, April 1 in Oakland...became the A's 14th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 16 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill, Graveman twice, Fiers, Montas)... blanked the Astros on one hit over the first three innings before allowing a run in the fourth when Altuve walked, went to third on a Brantley double and scored on a Bregman ground out...the run snapped a 16.2-inning scoreless streak during the regular season and a 27.1-inning home scoreless streak, which was ninth longest in Oakland history...was relieved by Petit with one out in the sixth inning, runners on first and second and the A's trailing 1-0...Petit allowed both runners to score.

SECOND START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 5-1 loss to Los Angeles (NL) on April 6 in Oakland...allowed nine hits, which were his most since April 28, 2016 at Detroit when he yielded a career-high 10...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed a RBI double to Barnes in the second... then allowed three more runs in the third on a two-run home run by Muncy and a solo home run by Rios...the home runs were the first he allowed in the Coliseum since Aug. 24, 2019, snapping a 10-game, 55.1-inning, 229-batter homerless streak.

THIRD START: He picked up his first win of the season in the A's 9-5 win at Arizona on April 12...allowed just two hits in 5.0 innings, which matched his fewest hits ever in a start...however, issued five walks...had a 3-0 lead when he issued consecutive one-out walks in the third...Calhoun followed with a RBI single and Cabrera added a sacrifice fly...those were the only two runs he would allow in five innings of work.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win over Detroit last Sunday in Oakland...loaded the bases with one out in the first inning but then retired each of the next 10 batters and 14 of the next 15...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a two-out, two-run single to Harold Castro in the sixth...was relieved by Diekman to start the seventh inning with the A's trailing 2-1 but Oakland scored once in the eighth to get him off the hook and once in the ninth for the win.

2020 RECAP: Spent the entire season on the active roster for the first time in his six-year career and went 5-2 with a 2.29 ERA in 11 starts...his ERA ranked second among pitchers in the West divisions (Lamet, SD 2.09) and sixth in the majors...it was fifth lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 10 starts...also tied for fifth in the West divisions in winning percentage (.714), ranked seventh in opponents OPS (.659), batting average (.233) and slugging percentage (.371), tied for seventh in wins and eighth in on-base percentage (.288)...had career lows in ERA and opponents on-base percentage...walked 17 batters in 63.0 innings for a career-low 2.43 walks per nine innings...struck out 55 for a career-best 3.24 strikeout-to-walk ratio...led the A's in innings pitched and tied for the lead in games started...received five votes (two third, one fourth, two fifth) in American League Cy Young balloting...went 1-0 with a 1.08 ERA over his first three starts, 1-2 with a 5.95 ERA over his next four starts from Aug. 12-29 and 3-0 with a 0.34 ERA over his final four starts.

2020 OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .233 opponents batting average, which broke down to .223 (31-for-139) with a .590 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .248 (25-for-101) with a .755 OPS against left-handers... yielded four of his six home runs to lefties and has surrendered 20 of his 29 home runs over the last three years to lefties...walked just one batter to lead off an inning and held opponents to a .203 (13-for-64) batting average and .227 on-base percentage in that situation...the on-base percentage was sixth lowest in the majors...five of his six home runs came with the bases empty.. had a .244 opponents batting average with runners in scoring position, but that dropped to .176 with RISP and two outs...had a .204 opponents batting average and two home runs with zero or one out, a .295 average with four home runs with two outs...had a .130 opponent average with two strikes... surrendered three of his six home runs to the opponent's clean-up hitter.

2020 HOME AND AWAY: Went 2-1 with a 0.72 ERA, .207 opponents batting average and .512 OPS in five starts in Oakland last year compared to 3-1 with a 4.56 ERA, .270 opponents average and .683 OPS in five starts on the road... his home ERA was second lowest in the majors (Keller, KC 0.27) and second lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 30 innings (Treinen, 0.63 in 2018)...did not allow a home run in 37.1 innings in Oakland...is 9-12 with a 2.63 ERA (60 er in 205.2 ip) in 38 career games in the Coliseum, 11-11 with a 4.60 ERA (110 er in 215.0 ip) in 45 games in all other ballparks...has yielded just 13 home runs in 205.2 career innings in Oakland (0.57 per nine innings).

2020 NIGHT AND DAY: Went 3-0 with a 1.15 ERA in six starts at night last year compared to 2-2 with a 4.13 ERA in five starts during the day...his night ERA was the lowest in the majors and in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 30 innings at night.

2020 THIS AND THAT: Received 35 runs of support in his 11 starts for a run support average of 5.00...was 3-0 with a 1.75 ERA in four starts following an A's loss and is 8-2 with a 2.62 ERA (26 er in 89.1 ip) in 15 starts following a loss over the last three years...went 2-1 with a 3.34 ERA in five starts on four days rest, 3-1 with a 1.35 ERA in six starts on five days rest or more...allowed one run or fewer in seven of his 11 starts, including no runs four times...the A's went 8-3 (.727) in his starting assignments and are 25-15 (.625) when he starts over the last three years.

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and allowed eight runs on nine hits in 2.2 innings over three appearances before he was placed on the 10-day injured list April 6 with a sprained left thumb sustained while covering first base...was reinstated on Tuesday but has not pitched since then.
- Has allowed a hit to the first batter he has faced in all three of his appearances.
- Has faced the Orioles twice in his career (1.1 ip, 1 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 2 so, 1 hr, 13.50 ERA).
- Was signed to a minor league contract Dec. 4 and was a non-roster invitee...compiled a 0.96 ERA in nine relief appearances this spring...opponents were 3-for-29 (.103) with one walk in 9.1 innings.

Last Year: Was a non-roster invitee with the Los Angeles Dodgers and had a loss and a 3.00 ERA in six spring training appearances...was not added to the Dodgers 60-man player pool and did not pitch in 2020.

- Retired the only batter he faced Wednesday against Minnesota, an Astudillo pop out to end the 10th inning, but picked up the win...has now retired each of the last 13 batters he has faced.
- Was selected from the A's alternate site April 8 and allowed a home run to the first batter he faced that day at Houston (Altuve)...has not allowed a run since then for a 5.1-inning scoreless streak.
- Opponents are 2-for-21 (.095) and he has not walked a batter in 6.1 innings...his .095 opponents on-base percentage is the lowest among American League relievers.
- Left-handed hitters are 0-for-9 this year and 1-for-22 (.045) over the last two years.


