



OAKLAND ATHLETICS (14-7) VS. BALTIMORE ORIOLES (8-12)

ABOUT THE A'S: Extended their winning streak to 13 games last night in a 7-2 in the second game of this three-game set against Baltimore...the A's are now 14-1 over the last 15 games after starting the year 0-6...are 14-7 (.667) overall, with is the second best record in the majors (Dodgers, 15-6)...have gone from sole possession of last place in the American League West on April 11 to sole possession of first...were a season-high 5½ games out of first on April 8...were alone in first at the conclusion of play on Wednesday...have spent three days alone in first place this year, two days tied for first, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

13-GAME WINNING STREAK: The A's have a 13-game winning streak, which is the longest in the majors over the last three years...the last team to win more than 11 straight is Houston, which had a 12-game winning streak from June 6-18, 2018...the 13-game winning streak is third longest in Oakland history...have outscored the opposition 81-36 (+45) during the streak...the pitching staff has compiled a 2.68 ERA (34 er in 114.0 ip) and .233 (102-for-437) opponents batting average and has walked just 24 batters in 114.0 innings (1.89 per nine innings)...the offense is batting .254 (108-for-425) with 81 runs (6.23 per game), 24 home runs and 13 stolen bases...no team in baseball has scored more runs or allowed fewer runs (36) than the A's during the streak.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's defeated Minnesota 13-12 in 10 innings on Wednesday...it was the fifth time in Oakland history the A's allowed at least 12 runs in a game and won...the last time was on July 20, 2009 when they overcame a 12-2 deficit to defeat the Twins 14-13...improved to 2-0 in extra inning games with the win and are now 8-1 in extra innings over the last two years...have won two of the last four games by one run and are 4-0 in one-run decisions...are 7-0 in games decided by three runs or fewer...have three walk-off wins, which are the most in the majors...each of the last two walk-offs have come on an error...the A's are 9-0 when leading after six innings after going 26-0 last year...have now won 46 consecutive games when leading after six innings dating back to Sept. 7, 2019, which is the second longest such winning streak in Oakland history...had a 45-game streak from April 22-Aug. 12, 1992.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's continue their second road trip of the season tonight, a seven-game trip to Baltimore (2-0) and Tampa Bay (four games)...went 4-1 on the first road trip to Houston (2-1) and Arizona (2-0)...lost the first game but then won each of the final four, which matches the A's longest road winning streak from last year (Aug. 12-16)...went 7-0 on the last homestand against Detroit (4-0) and Minnesota (3-0)...it was the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have gone undefeated on a homestand of more than six games, all of which have been 7-0...the other three were Sept. 10-16, 1992 (Seattle 4, Minnesota 3), Sept. 3-10, 2001 (Baltimore 3, Tampa Bay 3, Texas 1) and Aug. 23-29, 2004 (Baltimore 4, Tampa Bay 3)...have won each of their last eight home games after dropping each of the first six...the longest home winning streak last year was nine (Aug. 4-21).

THE LONG BALL: The A's hit one home run last night and hit a season-high tying three home runs on Wednesday and now have 24 home runs over the last 13 games, which is the most in the Majors...allowed a season-high four home runs Wednesday and won for the first time this year when being out-homered (1-7)...are 12-0 when out-homering their opponent...have now hit 27 home runs, which is second most in the American League with the Angels and Red Sox.

OFFENSE: The A's had season highs in runs (13) and hits (13) on Wednesday...after scoring seven times last night, now have 100 runs for the season, which is tied for fourth most in the American League...lead the league in hit by pitches (17), are tied for the lead in triples (5), rank second in walks (78) and tied for fourth in extra base hits (58)...A's pinch hitters are 5-for-16 (.313) with a home run, four RBI and a walk...lead the American League in pinch hits and RBI, are tied for the lead in home runs and tied for second in plate appearances (17).

PITCHING: The A's allowed two runs on 10 hits yesterday...yielded 12 runs on 18 hits on Wednesday after allowing two runs on 23 hits over the previous five games...allowed eight extra base hits on Wednesday after yielding just one over the previous five...had four shutouts over a five-game stretch from April 16-20, which is the first time an A's team has done that since May 12-18, 1909...have walked three batters or fewer in each of the last nine

games (11 bb in 78.0 ip, 1.27 per nine innings)...lead the American League and are tied for third in the majors with four shutouts...however, have the highest opponents batting average in the AL (.260) and the fourth highest ERA (4.40), and third highest slugging percentage (.415), and have the fourth highest OPS (.733).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in 11 of the 13 games during the winning streak and are 9-0 with a 2.78 ERA (22 er in 71.1 ip) over that span after going 0-7 with a 7.91 ERA over the first eight contests...have walked just seven batters over the last nine games (51.2 ip, 1.22 per nine innings)...are 9-7 with a 4.58 ERA (56 er in 110.0 ip) for the season...the 2.78 ERA during the streak is the best over that stretch in the American League and the 16 walks the starting staff has issues are the fewest.

BULLPEN: The bullpen is 3-0 with four saves, a 1.65 ERA (6 er in 32.2 ip) and .193 (23-for-119) opponents batting average over the A's last 10 games...had no save opportunities, a 6.02 ERA and .275 opponents average over the first 11 contests...the A's and the Yankees are the only Major League teams without a blown save...the bullpen has a 5-0 record and Oakland is the only team in the majors without a loss from its bullpen...however, has the highest first batter batting average (.344), on-base percentage (.452) and slugging percentage (.672) in the American League.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed no errors last night after committing four errors in the last three games...that followed a season-best six-game errorless streak...have nine errors for the season, which is tied for fewest in the American League...rank second in fielding percentage (.988)...Matt Chapman leads Major League third basemen in assists (51), putouts (31), double plays (9), total chances (83), and fielding percentage among those with at least 45 chances (.988).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 18-for-21 (85.7%) in stolen base attempts...tied for the American League lead and rank tied for second in the majors to the Padres (26) in steals...the 18 stolen bases are the A's most in a month since May of 2015 when they also had 18...they are the most in April since they had 19 in April of 2014.

TAXI SQUAD: The A's taxi squad for the second road trip includes pitchers Mike Fiers and James Kaprielian, catcher Austin Allen, infielder Pete Kozma and outfielder Luis Barrera...Kozma is not on the 40-man roster...in addition, Tommy Everidge joins the A's for the second consecutive trip as an extra coach.

A's vs. ORIOLES: The A's won last night by a score of 7-2...the two clubs are meeting for the first time since June 19, 2019, a span of 674 days...the A's won the season series in 2019, 6-1...went 3-0 in Oakland and 3-1 in Baltimore...have won eight straight and 13 of their last 15 games against the Orioles...have a seven-game winning streak in the Coliseum and are 31-12 (.721) against Baltimore at home dating back to 2008...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 276-267 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 139-135 in Oakland and 137-132 in Baltimore...are 70-58 at Camden Yards...are 1012-947 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...of the other seven original American League franchises, the A's have a winning record against only the Twins/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha leads the Majors in runs (23), is tied for first in hit by pitches (5), tied for fifth in the American League in walks (15) and stolen bases (4), and ranks seventh in on-base percentage (.424)...**Ramón Laureano** leads the majors with eight stolen bases, which is more than 15 teams...**Matt Olson** has a nine-game hitting streak and is 15-for-34 (.441) with five home runs and 11 RBI during the streak...is tied for second in the AL in home runs (6), ranks fourth in slugging (.677), and tied for fourth in RBI (17)...**J.B. Wendelken** leads the American League and is tied for the Major League lead with 13 games pitched...**Lou Trivino** and **Yusmeiro Petit** are tied for second in the American League, and fifth in the Majors, with 11 games pitched...no other pitcher in the American League has more than 10 games pitched.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1987** Dennis Eckersley pitches the final 2 1/3 innings of the A's 7-3 win over Seattle for his first save in an Oakland uniform...he would go on to save an Oakland record 320 games...in **2002** Miguel Tejada hits his 100th career home run in the A's 6-2 win over New York.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: **Jesús Luzardo (1-1, 5.89 ERA)**

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...has a 5.89 ERA over his first four starts but the A's are 3-1 (.750) in his starting assignments...are now 9-4 (.692) when he starts in his career.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in each of his four starts and has four runs of support in 18.1 innings overall (1.96 RSA)...last year, he received no run support in three of his starts and had two runs of support or fewer in six of his nine starts...had 22 runs of support in 12 games and 59.0 innings overall...his season run support average of 3.36 was ninth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 50 or more innings pitched.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-5 loss to Houston on April 2 in Oakland...struck out a career-high eight batters...allowed a three-run home run to Bregman in the third inning and surrendered two more runs in the fourth on a Gurriel home run and a Brantley RBI double.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 10-inning win over Los Angeles (NL) in Oakland on April 7...tossed a career-high 104 pitches and issued a career-high four walks...allowed a RBI single to Pollock in the first inning but then retired 12 of 13 hitters at one point from the second through sixth innings...was relieved by Kolarek with runners on first and second and one out in the sixth with the score tied 1-1 and Kolarek allowed one of the runs to score.

THIRD START: He had his second consecutive no decision in an A's win, a 7-5 victory at Arizona on April 13...retired the side in order in the first inning but then allowed three runs in the second and two more in the third and lasted just 2.2 innings...it was the shortest start of his career...allowed a three-run home run to Kelly in the second and a RBI double to Cabrera and a RBI groundout by Peralta in the third...left trailing 5-0 but the A's scored seven unanswered runs for the win.

LAST START: He combined with Trivino and Diekman on a two-hit shutout in the A's 1-0 win over Minnesota in the second game of the doubleheader last Tuesday in Oakland...tossed 5.1 innings and allowed two of the hits while walking just one...allowed a one-out single to Donaldson in the first and then retired 11 straight before Polanco singled with one out in the fifth...did not allow a base runner past first base while he was in the game.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Was 1-1 with a 4.22 ERA in three starts this spring...allowed a .205 opponents batting average but issued four walks in 10.2 innings...did not allow a run in two of his three starts...is now 4-1 with a 1.82 ERA (7 er in 34.2 ip) and .195 (24-for-123) opponents batting average in 13 career spring training appearances (10 starts).

2020 RECAP: Went 3-2 with a 4.12 ERA in 12 games, including nine starts, in his rookie campaign...ranked second among Major League rookies in strikeouts (59) and innings pitched (59.0), tied for fifth in games and tied for ninth in wins and games started...walked just 17 batters in 59.0 innings (2.59 per nine innings) and now has 28 walks in 89.1 career innings (2.82 per nine innings)...walked two batters or fewer in 11 of his 12 appearances in 2020 and 20 of 22 in his career...however, surrendered nine home runs, which tied for fifth most among ML rookies.

2020 OPPONENTS BATTING: Had a .257 opponents batting average, which broke down to .256 (45-for-176) against right-handed hitters compared to .260 (13-for-50) against left-handers...surrendered eight of his nine home runs and issued 15 of his 17 walks to righties...has allowed 12 of his 13 career home runs against righties...six of his nine home runs were solo shots...his opponents average increased to .317 with runners in scoring position, including .421 with RISP and two outs...opponents hit .322 when leading off an inning but he walked just three...has walked just seven batters to lead off

an inning in his career...had a .228 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .280 with six of his nine home runs after that.

2020 HOME AND AWAY: Went 3-1 with a 2.40 ERA, .215 opponents batting average and .595 OPS in eight games, six starts, at home compared to 0-1 with an 8.15 ERA, .338 opponents average and 1.032 OPS in four games, three starts, on the road...allowed three home runs in 41.1 innings at home, six in 17.2 innings on the road...is now 4-2 with a 2.79 ERA (18 er in 58.0 ip) in 12 career appearances in the Coliseum, 0-1 with a 6.60 ERA (23 er in 31.1 ip) in 10 games on the road.

2020 BY INNING: Allowed 12 of his 27 runs in the fourth and fifth innings...had a 2.67 ERA over the first three innings of a game and a 6.89 ERA in the fourth and fifth...had a 3.86 ERA from the sixth inning on, which includes his relief appearances.

2020 STARTING AND RELIEVING: Pitched in relief in his first two appearances of the season, made nine consecutive starts from Aug. 4 to Sept. 19 and then pitched in relief in his final outing...was 3-2 with a 3.83 ERA in his nine starts, 0-0 with a 5.59 ERA in three relief appearances...the A's were 6-3 (.667) in his starting assignments...first batters faced were 2-for-3 (.667) with a double in his three relief appearances.

2020 AMERICAN LEAGUE AND NATIONAL LEAGUE: Was 1-1 with a 3.09 ERA in six games against the American League West compared to 2-1 with a 5.33 ERA in six games against National League West...the six interleague games were the first of his career...is 2-2 with a 2.98 ERA (18 er in 54.1 ip) in 14 career games against the AL.

2020 HIGHLIGHTS: Began the season pitching out of the bullpen and tossed 3.0 scoreless innings in his first outing on July 25 against Los Angeles (AL)...tossed 3.2 innings in his next relief appearance on July 29 against Colorado...did not allow a run in the sixth or seventh inning before yielding a RBI double to Blackmon in the eighth...that snapped his scoreless streak at a career-high 12.0 innings dating back to Sept. 21, 2019...made his first Major League start Aug. 4 against Texas...tossed 5.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits and two walks, but had a no decision in the A's 5-1 win...at the age of 22 years and 309 days, he was the youngest Athletic pitcher to start a game since Brett Anderson was 22 years, 243 days on Oct. 2, 2010...recorded his first big league win in his second start, a 7-2 A's win over Houston on Aug. 9...at the age of 22 years and 314 days, he was the youngest Athletic pitcher to win a game since Anderson in that Oct. 2, 2010 game...allowed a two-run home run to Gurriel in 5.2 innings of work...allowed a career-high six runs on a career-high nine hits in 3.1 innings at San Francisco on Aug. 14 but had a no decision in the A's 8-7 win in 10 innings...it was the shortest start of his career...was charged with the first two losses of his career in back-to-back starts on Aug. 24 at Texas and Sept. 4 against San Diego...tossed a career-high 7.0 innings against Houston Sept. 9...allowed just two runs but had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win...allowed a career-high three home runs in the first game of the Sept. 14 doubleheader at Seattle...combined with Diekman, Soria and Trivino on a six-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win over San Francisco in his final start on Sept. 19 against San Francisco...then pitched in relief of Mike Fiers on Sept. 24 at Los Angeles (NL) to provide rotation flexibility for the postseason...walked three batters in 3.0 innings of relief, which was the first time he issued more than two free passes in a game...did not strike out a batter for the first time in his career...was 0-1 with a 8.22 ERA in two post-season starts...joins Jarrod Parker (2012) and Sonny Gray (2013) as the only rookie pitchers in Athletics history to make two postseason starts...allowed four home runs, which ties the Athletics record for a single postseason (fifth time, last: Dave Stewart, 1989)...started Game 1 of the ALWCS against Chicago on Sept. 29 and was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss (3.1 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 5 so, 2 hr)...the start came one day before his 23rd birthday, making him eighth youngest pitcher in Athletics history to start a postseason game...was the youngest since Barry Zito started Game 4 of the 2000 ALDS at the age of 22 years, 147 days...then had a no decision in the A's 9-7 win over Houston in Game 3 of the ALDS on Oct. 7 at Dodger Stadium (4.1 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 2 hr).

- Has allowed a hit to the first batter he has faced in all three of his appearances.

- Was selected from the A's alternate site April 8 and allowed a home run to the first batter he faced that day at Houston (Altuve)...has not allowed a run since then for a 6.1-inning scoreless streak.
- Opponents are 4-for-26 (.154) and he has not walked a batter in 7.1 innings...his .154 opponents on-base percentage is tied for sixth among American League relievers.
- Left-handed hitters are 1-for-12 (.083) this year and 2-for-25 (.080) over the last two years.
