



## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (14-8) VS. TAMPA BAY RAYS (11-11)

MONDAY, APRIL 26, 2021 — TROPICANA FIELD — 7:10 EDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Had their 13-game winning streak snapped yesterday at Baltimore...are now 14-2 over the last 16 games after starting the year 0-6...are 14-8 (.636) overall, which is the second best record in the American League (Royals, 13-7) and tied with the Giants for third best in the majors (Dodgers, 15-7)...have gone from sole possession of last place in the American League West on April 11 to a one-game lead...were a season-high 5½ games out of first on April 8...have spent four days alone in first place this year, two days tied for first, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

**13-GAME WINNING STREAK:** The A's 13-game winning streak was third longest in Oakland history, tied for fifth longest in Athletics history and the longest by a Major League team since Cleveland won 22 straight from Aug. 24-Sept. 14, 2017...had a 1-7 record, were in fifth place in the American League West and trailed by 5½ games entering play on April 9 when the streak began with a 6-2 win at Houston...extended the streak to 13 games on Saturday, which put the A's in first with a one-game lead...outscored the opposition 81-36 (+45) during the streak...compiled a 2.68 ERA and .233 opponents batting average and walked just 24 batters in 114.0 innings (1.9 per nine innings)...batted .254 with 81 runs (6.2 per game), 24 home runs and 13 stolen bases.

**THE LONG BALL:** The A's are 12-0 when out-homer the opposition and 1-8 when they are out-homered...have homered in 13 of the last 14 games and have 25 home runs total over that span...now have 28 for the season, which is second most in the American League to the Angels (29)...A's pitchers have not allowed a home run in seven of the last nine games but have yielded seven home runs over that stretch (four last Wednesday against Minnesota, three yesterday at Baltimore)...have surrendered 26 home runs for the season, which is tied for fourth most in the AL

**OFFENSE:** In addition to ranking second in the American League in home runs (28), the A's lead the league in hit by pitches (17), are tied for the lead in triples (5), rank second in walks (81) and fifth in runs (101)...A's pinch hitters are 5-for-18 (.278) with a home run, four RBI and a walk...lead the AL in pinch hits and RBI, are tied for the lead in home runs and rank second in plate appearances (19)...the A's are 3-for-17 (.176) with the bases loaded, which is the second lowest batting average in the AL (Cleveland, .111).

**PITCHING:** The A's have allowed two runs or fewer in seven of the last nine games and have a 2.34 ERA (20 er in 77.0 ip) over that span...have walked just 17 over that stretch (1.99 per nine innings), seven of which came yesterday at Baltimore...lead the American League and are tied for third in the majors in shutouts (4)...however, have the fourth highest ERA in the AL (4.45)...have the second highest opponents batting average (.260), on-base percentage (.324), slugging percentage (.420) and OPS (.744)

**STARTING PITCHING:** Jesús Luzardo was charged with the loss yesterday, which was the first loss by an A's starting pitcher since April 8...it snapped a nine-game winning streak dating back to April 10, during which starters compiled a 2.89 ERA, .246 opponents batting average and .649 OPS...starters were 0-7 over the first nine games and are now 9-8 with a 4.55 ERA (59 er in 116.2 ip) for the season...the nine wins are tied with the Red Sox for the most in the American League and the eight losses are tied for third most...have the highest opponents OPS (.763) and the fourth highest ERA...lead the AL and rank third in the majors in innings pitched (116.2)...have walked two batters or fewer in each of the last 11 games (11 bb in 61.0 ip, 1.62 per nine innings).

**BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen has not allowed a run in seven of its last 10 games and has a 2.12 ERA (8 er in 34.0 ip) and .198 (25-for-126) opponents batting average over that span...has converted each of its four save opportunities and the A's and Yankees are the only teams in the majors without a blown save...however, the four saves are tied for second fewest in the American League...has a 5-0 record and Oakland is the only team in the majors without a loss from its bullpen...has allowed 14-of-35 (40.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the third highest percentage in the AL...has the highest slugging percentage (.703) and on-base percentage (.447) against first batters faced in the majors and the second highest batting average (.344).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed five errors in the last five games after a season-best six-game errorless streak...have 10 errors for the season, which is tied with the Astros for second fewest in the American League to the Rays (9)...rank second in fielding percentage (.987).

**ON THE BASES:** The A's are 18-for-21 (85.7%) in stolen base attempts and rank second in the American League in steals...the stolen bases are the A's most

in a month since May of 2015 when they also had 18...they are the most in April since they had 19 in April of 2014.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's had their six-game road winning streak snapped on Sunday, which was their longest road winning streak over the last two years...are 2-1 on their second road trip of the season, a seven-game trip to Baltimore (2-1) and Tampa Bay (four games)...went 4-1 on the first road trip to Houston (2-1) and Arizona (2-0) and are 6-2 (.750) for the season, which is the second best road record in the American League to the Red Sox (6-1, .857)...return home following the game Thursday for a season-long 10-game homestand against Baltimore (three games), Toronto (four games) and Tampa Bay (three games)...went 7-0 on the last homestand against Detroit (4-0) and Minnesota (3-0)...it was the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have gone undefeated on a homestand of more than six games, all of which have been 7-0...the other three were Sept. 10-16, 1992 (Seattle 4, Minnesota 3), Sept. 3-10, 2001 (Baltimore 3, Tampa Bay 3, Texas 1) and Aug. 23-29, 2004 (Baltimore 4, Tampa Bay 3)...have won each of their last eight home games after dropping each of the first six...the longest home winning streak last year was nine (Aug. 4-21).

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's are 4-0 in one-run games and are one of two teams in the majors without a one-run loss (Royals, 5-0)...however, only two teams have played fewer than four one-run games (Cardinals and Pirates, 3)...are 7-0 in games decided by three runs or fewer...are the only team with no losses in those games but the seven games are the fewest...are 2-0 in extra innings and are now 8-1 in extra innings over the last two years...have three walk-off wins, which are the most in the majors...each of the last two walk-offs have come on an error...the A's are 9-0 when leading after six innings after going 25-0 last year...have now won 46 consecutive games when leading after six innings dating back to Sept. 7, 2019, which is the longest such winning streak in Oakland history and second longest in Athletics history to a 47-game streak by the Philadelphia A's from July 21, 1927 to May 16, 1928.

**TAXI SQUAD:** The A's taxi squad for the second road trip includes pitcher James Kaprielian, catcher Austin Allen, infielder Pete Kozma and outfielder Luis Barrera...Kozma is not on the 40-man roster...Mike Fiers started the trip on the taxi squad but was reinstated from the IL today...Adam Kolarek, who was optioned to the A's alternate site today, will remain on the taxi squad for the rest of the trip...in addition, Tommy Everidge joins the A's for the second consecutive trip as an extra coach.

**THE INJURED LIST:** The A's have used the injured list seven times this year and currently have four players on the IL (Pinder, Puk, Rosenthal, Smith)...used the IL just eight times all last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4)...used it 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest in the majors.

**A's vs. RAYS:** The two clubs will meet for the first time since June 23, 2019, a span of 673 days...the A's won the season series in 2019, 4-3...it was their first season series win since 2016 (5-2)...split four games in Oakland and went 2-1 in Tampa Bay...are 28-28 against the Rays dating back to 2012...all-time, are 109-76 (.589), which is their best record against any American League team...are 60-32 in Oakland and 49-44 at Tropicana Field...the mark in the Coliseum is the A's best record against any AL team.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Mark Canha** leads the American League with 23 runs scored, which is tied for second most in Athletics history in the month of April to Coco Crisp's 24 runs scored in April of 2013...**Jake Diekman** has not allowed a run in his last six games (6.2 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 8 so)...**Matt Olson** is tied for fourth in the American League in home runs (6), ranks sixth in slugging (.638) and OPS (1.030) and tied for sixth in RBI (17)...**Yusmeiro Petit** has not allowed a run in eight of his last nine games (10.0 ip, 7 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 7 so, 0.90 ERA) and has stranded all four of his inherited runner over that span.

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1901** Nap Lajoie has three hits in the first game in Athletics history...he would go on to set a franchise record with a .426 batting average...in **1990** Walt Weiss homers in the fourth inning of a 6-4 A's victory at Baltimore...he would not homer again as an Athletic, setting an Oakland record with an 837-at bat homerless streak...in **1997** Mark McGwire ties an Oakland record by walking five times in the A's 7-6, 11 inning win against Kansas City...three of the walks were intentional...in **2001** the A's tie an Oakland record with 11 extra base hits in a 16-6 win at Chicago...Johnny Damon and Frank Menechino have two doubles each and Eric Chavez homers twice as the A's collect seven doubles and four home runs.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (2-1, 3.04 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...is 2-0 with a 1.42 ERA (3 er in 19.0 ip) over his last three starts after allowing five runs on six hits in 4.2 innings in his first start, a loss...the A's are 3-1 (.750) in his starting assignments and are 14-6 (.700) when he starts over the last three years.

**DON'T WALK:** Has walked one batter or fewer in each of his last three starts (2 bb in 19.0 ip) after issuing three free passes in his first start...over the last four years, he has walked one batter or fewer in 34 of his 47 starts...has 52 walks in 268.0 innings over that span, an average of 1.75 per nine innings.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has held left-handed hitters to a .143 (3-for-21) batting average compared to .282 (20-for-71) by right-handers...two of the three hits by lefties are home runs...opponents are 2-for-16 (.125) with runners in scoring position after hitting .375 with RISP last year.

**FIRST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-2 loss to Houston on April 4 in Oakland...allowed a solo home run to Tucker in the first inning but the A's came back to tie the game in the bottom of the first...then allowed a two-run home run to Castro in the second and a two-run double to Gurriel in the third.

**SECOND START:** He had a no decision in the A's 6-2 win at Houston on April 9...blanked the Astros on three hits over the first three innings and allowed his only run in the fourth when Gurriel walked, went to third on a Correa single and scored on a Tucker ground out...was relieved by Petit to start the seventh inning with the score tied 1-1.

**THIRD START:** He picked up his first win of the season in the A's 8-4 victory over Detroit on April 15 in Oakland...it was the 100th game of his career...blanked the Tigers on two hits over the first three innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a RBI double to Castro in the fourth...Oakland built a 3-1 lead before he allowed his final run on a leadoff home run to Goodrum in the sixth...was relieved by Petit to start the seventh with the A's leading 7-2.

**LAST START:** He tossed a six-hit, seven-inning shutout in the A's 7-0 win over Minnesota in the first game of the doubleheader last Tuesday in Oakland...it was the 11th complete game shutout of fewer than eight innings in Oakland history (last: Mike Minor, Sept. 14, 2020 at Seattle)...it was his second career complete game and shutout, with the other being his no-hitter on April 21, 2018 against Boston...the start was the 100th of his career and he became the 25th pitcher in Oakland history to make 100 starts...did not walk a batter and struck out seven.

**MANAEA vs. TAMPA BAY:** Is 1-1 with a 2.70 ERA (20.0 ip, 16 h, 6 r, 6 er, 3 bb, 15 so, 2 hr) in three career starts...is 0-1 with a 2.77 ERA (4 er in 13.0 ip) in two starts in the Coliseum and 1-0 with a 2.57 ERA (2 er in 7.0 ip) in one start at Tropicana Field...has not faced the Rays since 2018 when he took the loss in his only start, a 6-0 As loss in Oakland on May 30...allowed RBI double to Fields in the second and a three-run home run to Refsnyder in the third...was relieved by Ramirez to start the sixth with the A's trailing 4-0.

**2020 RECAP:** Went 4-3 with a 4.50 ERA in 11 starts...the ERA was the highest of his career as was his .270 opponents batting average...his .427 slugging percentage matched his high...went 4-1 with a 2.65 ERA and .234 opponents batting average over his final six starts dating back to Aug. 20...the wins tied for fourth most in the majors over that span...went 0-2 with a 7.65 ERA and .325 opponents average over his first five starts...tied for the team lead in starts...walked just eight batters in 54.0 innings, an average of 1.33 walks per nine innings...that was the lowest mark of his career and was sixth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 50 or more innings pitched...struck out 45 for a career-best 5.63 strikeout-to-walk ratio...had five starts without a walk, five with one and three in his other.

**2020 THE FIRST THREE INNINGS:** Had a 2.56 ERA and .233 opponents batting average over the first three innings of his starts compared to a 7.59 ERA and .319 opponents average from the fourth inning on...in 20 starts over the last three seasons, he has a 2.11 ERA (14 er in 59.2 ip) and .222 (48-for-216) opponents batting average over innings 1-3 and a 4.72 ERA (25 er in 47.2 ip) and .257 (48-for-187) opponents average from the fourth inning on.

**2020 OPPONENTS BATTING:** His .270 opponents batting average broke down to .250 (13-for-52) against left-handed hitters compared to .277 (44-for-159) against right-handers...issued seven of eight walks to righties...had a .204 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .327 with seven of his eight walks after that...had a .281 batting average against batters leading off an inning but issued just one walk (.293 on-base percentage)...yielded a .222 average with the bases empty, .373 with runners on...opponents hit .375 with runners in scoring position and were 7-for-15 (.467) with RISP and two outs...entered the season with a .227 career opponents average with RISP, including .199 with RISP and two outs...allowed a .248 opponents average and four of his seven home runs with two strikes.

**2020 NIGHT AND DAY:** Went 2-1 with a 3.32 ERA and .182 opponents batting average in four starts during the day, 2-2 with a 5.29 ERA and .321 opponent average in seven starts at night...is now 18-6 with a 3.28 ERA (79 er in 217.0 ip) and .215 (173-for-806) opponents batting average in 37 career day games compared to 23-26 with a 4.14 ERA (163 er in 354.1 ip) and .267 (366-for-1373) opponents average in 64 career starts at night.

**2020 HOME AND AWAY:** Was 3-1 with a 3.91 ERA and .232 opponents batting average in five starts in Oakland, 1-2 with a 5.02 ERA and .302 opponents average in five starts on the road...is now 23-14 in his career in the Coliseum compared to 18-18 on the road.

**2020 AL AND NL:** Was 2-1 with a 3.33 ERA in five interleague starts compared to 2-2 with a 5.67 ERA in six starts against the American League...however, is 5-8 with a 4.03 ERA (46 er in 102.2 ip) in 19 career starts against the National League compared to 36-24 with a 3.76 ERA (196 er in 468.2 ip) in 82 games against the AL.

**2020 THIS AND THAT:** Was charged with five unearned runs, which tied for eighth most in the majors...tossed fewer than six innings in nine of his 11 starts...was 0-3 in four starts with two runs of support or fewer, 4-0 in seven starts with three or more...is now 4-30 in 49 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 37-2 in 51 starts with support of three or more.

<b>RHP Frankie Montas (2-1, 6.75 ERA):</b>	Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...allowed six runs in his last start last Wednesday against Minnesota but had a no decision in the A's 13-12 win in 10 innings (4.0 ip, 9 h, 6 r, 6 er, 0 bb, 4 so)...yielded seven runs in his first start but just one run in two starts and 12.0 innings in between...is 0-0 with a 1.00 ERA (9.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 9 so) in two career appearances, including one start, against Tampa Bay...went 0-1 with a 6.75 ERA and .290 opponents batting average in three Spring Training starts...was off to a strong start last year as he was 2-1 with a 1.57 ERA and .175 opponents average over his first four starts...was scratched from his start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness and went 1-4 with an 8.70 ERA and .321 opponents average over his final seven starts.

- Has picked up the save in each of his last two outings...the saves are his first since June 20, 2018 for Texas against Kansas City...now has nine saves in his career.
- Has yielded a .100 (2-for-20) average against right-handed hitters compared to .357 (5-for-14) against left-handers.
- Has not allowed a run in three day games (3.1 ip) and has not allowed a run during the day since Sept. 1, 2019 vs. New York (AL)...has a 17-game, 17.2-inning scoreless streak during the day.
- Faced Tampa Bay five times in 2019 while pitching for Kansas City and did not allow a run (4.0 ip, 1 h, 6 so)...has not allowed a run in three career appearances at Tropicana Field (3.0 ip, 1 h, 5 so).

- Was re-signed by the A's as a free agent on Feb. 16 but did not pitch this spring.
- Began the season on the injured list with a lumbar strain and was reinstated from the IL today.
- Has made 216 career appearances, 19 of which have come in relief...is 1-3 with a 5.40 ERA (21 er in 35.0 ip) as a reliever.
- His last relief appearance was on Sept. 28, 2018 at Los Angeles-AL (3.1 ip, 7 h, 6 r, 6 er, 3 so)...that was in relief of "opener" Lou Trivino...made one relief appearance each year from 2015-18 but has not had multiple outings out of the pen since 2014 with Milwaukee when he had four.
- Last faced Tampa Bay on June 22, 2019 and had a no decision in the A's 4-2 win (6.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 2 so)...has never faced the Rays in relief.

*Last Year: Went 6-3 with a 4.58 ERA in 11 starts for the A's...led the team in wins for the second consecutive season (had 15 in 2019)...went 1-1 with a 6.86 ERA over his first four starts but was 5-2 with a 3.43 ERA over his final seven starts.*
