OAKLAND ATHLETICS (15-8) VS. TAMPA BAY RAYS (11-12)

TUESDAY, APRIL 27, 2021 — TROPICANA FIELD — 7:10 EDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won 14 of the last 15 games and 15 of the 17 after starting the year 0-6...are 15-8 (.652) overall, which is tied with the Dodgers and Giants for the second best record in the majors to the Royals (14-7)...over the last 31 years, the only time the A's had a better record after 23 games was last year when they were 16-7 (lost game 24)...went from sole possession of last place in the American League West on April 11 to sole possession of first on April 21 and have held at least a share of first place for each of the last seven days...currently have a season-high two-game lead after being a season-high 5½ games out of first on April 8...have spent five days alone in first place this year, two days tied for first, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth...had a season-high 13-game winning streak snapped Sunday at Baltimore...the streak was third longest in Oakland history, tied for fifth longest in Athletics history and the longest by a Major League team since Cleveland won 22 straight from Aug. 24-Sept. 14, 2017.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's improved to 5-0 in one-run games with the win yesterday and are one of two teams in the majors without a one-run loss (Royals, 6-0)...are 8-0 in games decided by three runs or fewer... are the only team with no losses in those games but the eight games are tied with the Mets for the fewest in the majors...are 2-0 in extra innings and are now 8-1 in extra innings over the last two years...have three walk-off wins, which are the most in the majors...are 10-0 when leading after six innings after going 25-0 last year...have now won 47 consecutive games when leading after six innings dating back to Sept. 7, 2019, which matches the longest such streak in Athletics history (47, July 21, 1927 to May 16, 1928).

THE LONG BALL: The A's are 13-0 when out-homer the opposition and 1-8 when they are out-homered...have homered in 14 of the last 15 games and have 26 home runs total over that span...now have 29 for the season, which is second most in the American League to the Angels (32)...A's pitchers have not allowed a home run in eight of the last 10 games but have yielded seven home runs over that stretch (four last Wednesday against Minnesota, three Sunday at Baltimore).

OFFENSE: The A's collected three hits and won yesterday, which are their fewest hits in a win since April 2, 2019 against Boston when they had three hits in a 1-0 win...are hitting .175 (22-for-126) with 13 runs scored over the first four games of the road trip but have won three of the games...were hit by a pitch twice yesterday and lead the American League with 19...rank second with 85 walks...A's pinch hitters are 6-for-18 (.333) with a home run, five RBI and a walk...lead the AL in pinch hits and RBI, are tied for the lead in home runs and rank second in plate appearances (19)...the A's are 3-for-17 (.176) with the bases loaded, which is the second lowest batting average in the AL (Cleveland, .111).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed two runs or fewer in eight of the last 10 games and have a 2.20 ERA (21 er in 86.0 ip) over that span...logged a 5.85 ERA over the first 13 contests and have a 4.30 ERA for the season, which is fourth highest in the American League...however, lead the league with four shutouts...have the second highest opponents batting average (.258) and third highest on-base percentage (.322), slugging percentage (.411) and OPS (.733).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 10-1 with a 2.92 ERA (25 er in 77.0 ip) over the last 14 games after going 0-8 with a 7.05 ERA over the first nine contests...the 10 wins are second most in the majors to the Dodgers (11) but the eight losses are tied for third most in the American League...lead the AL and rank third in the majors in innings pitched (121.2)...have the highest opponents batting average in the AL (.270)...have walked two batters or fewer in each of the last 12 games (13 bb in 66.0 ip, 1.77 per nine innings).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has not allowed a run in eight of its last 11 games and has a 1.89 ERA (8 er in 38.0 ip) and .193 (27-for-140) opponents batting average over that span...has allowed just two home run over its last 14 game...has converted each of its five save opportunities and the A's and Yankees are the only teams in the majors without a blown save...has a 5-0 record and Oakland is the only team in the majors without a loss from its bullpen...has allowed 14-of-35 (40.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the third highest percentage in the American League...has the highest batting average (.328), slugging percentage (.672) and on-base percentage (.430) against first batters faced in the majors.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed five errors in the last six games after a season-best six-game errorless streak...have 10 errors for the season, which is third fewest in the American League to the Rays and Astros (9)...rank third in fielding percentage (.988)...however, have a -14 defensive runs saved, which is second worst in the AL to Texas (-15).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 18-for-22 (81.8%) in stolen base attempts and rank second in the American League in steals...the stolen bases are the A's most in a month since May of 2015 when they also had 18...they are the most in April since they had 19 in April of 2014.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-1 on their second road trip of the season, a seven-game trip to Baltimore (2-1) and Tampa Bay (1-0)...went 4-1 on the first road trip to Houston (2-1) and Arizona (2-0) and are 7-2 (.778) for the season, which is the second best road record in the American League to the Red Sox (6-1, .857)...had their six-game road winning streak snapped on Sunday, which was their longest road winning streak over the last two years...return home following the game Thursday for a season-long 10-game homestand against Baltimore (three games), Toronto (four games) and Tampa Bay (three games)...went 7-0 on the last homestand against Detroit (4-0) and Minnesota (3-0)...it was the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have gone undefeated on a homestand of more than six games, all of which have been 7-0...the other three were Sept. 10-16, 1992 (Seattle 4, Minnesota 3), Sept. 3-10, 2001 (Baltimore 3, Tampa Bay 3, Texas 1) and Aug. 23-29, 2004 (Baltimore 4, Tampa Bay 3)...have won each of their last eight home games after dropping each of the first six...the longest home winning streak last year was nine (Aug. 4-21).

THE SCHEDULE: The A's are in a stretch of 17 consecutive days without a scheduled day off...the stretch began on Friday in Baltimore and Oakland is 3-1 over the first four games...Friday's game also began a stretch of 20 consecutive games against American League East competition...return home Friday to start a string where they will play 20 of 29 games at home.

TAXI SQUAD: The A's taxi squad for the second road trip includes pitcher James Kaprielian, catcher Austin Allen, infielder Pete Kozma and outfielder Luis Barrera...Kozma is not on the 40-man roster...Mike Fiers started the trip on the taxi squad but was reinstated from the IL yesterday...Adam Kolarek, who was optioned to the A's alternate site yesterday, will remain on the taxi squad for the rest of the trip...in addition, Tommy Everidge joins the A's for the second consecutive trip as an extra coach.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list seven times this year and currently have four players on the IL (Pinder, Puk, Rosenthal, Smith)...used the IL just eight times all last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4)...used it 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest in the majors.

IT'S NOW A WALK-OFF HIT: Major League Baseball has made a scoring change on the final play of the A's vs. Tigers game on April 18...Jeimer Candelario was originally charged with an error on Mitch Moreland's ninth inning ground ball that scored Matt Olson with the winning run...that has been changed to a single, which also gives Moreland an RBI and makes the run earned.

A's vs. RAYS: The A's won the first meeting of 2021 last night...won the season series in 2019, 4-3...it was their first season series win since 2016 (5-2)...split four games in Oakland and went 2-1 in Tampa Bay...are 29-28 against the Rays dating back to 2012...all-time, are 110-76 (.591), which is their best record against any American League team...are 60-32 in Oakland and 50-44 at Tropicana Field...the mark in the Coliseum is the A's best record against any AL team.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha leads the American League with 23 runs scored, which is tied for second most in Athletics history in the month of April to Coco Crisp's 24 runs scored in April of 2013...**Jake Diekman** has not allowed a run in his last seven games (7.2 ip, 3 h, 2 bb, 9 so)...**Matt Olson** is tied for fourth in the American League in home runs (6), ranks sixth in slugging (.603), tied for eighth in RBI (17) and ninth in OPS (.976)...**Yusmeiro Petit** has a six-game, 8.0-inning scoreless streak and not allowed a run in nine of his last 10 games (12.0 ip, 7 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 9 so, 0.75 ERA).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1968** Jim "Catfish" Hunter records his first win in an Oakland uniform in the A's 6-3 victory at California...he would go on to win an Oakland record 131 games which does not include 30 wins while pitching for the Kansas City A's...in **1981** former Athletic Don Baylor, playing for the California Angels, hits into a triple play, the fourth in Oakland history...in **2002** the A's tie a franchise record by hitting four home runs in the third inning...Scott Hatteberg, Terrence Long, Carlos Pena and Frank Menechino connect for the home runs...in **2010** Cliff Pennington and Adam Rosales collect four hits each, marking the first time in Athletics history both middle infielders had at least four hits in the same game.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (2-1, 6.75 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...allowed six runs in 4.0 innings in his last start (no decision), seven runs in 2.2 innings in his first start (loss), and one run in 12.0 innings in two starts in between (both wins)...the A's are 3-1 (.750) in his starting assignments.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-3 loss to Los Angeles (NL) on April 5 in Oakland...tossed 90 pitches in 2.2 innings, which were the most by an A's pitcher in an outing of fewer than three innings since pitch counts were tracked beginning in 1988...allowed four runs in the second inning on a McKinstry sacrifice fly and a three-run double by Seager...yielded three more runs in the third on a Smith home run, a McKinstry RBI single and a wild pitch.

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-3 win at Houston on April 10...it snapped a career-high three-game losing streak dating back to Sept. 13, 2020...shut out the Astros on five hits and a walk over the first six innings before allowing his only run on a leadoff home run to Tucker in the seventh...was relieved by Romo following the home run with the A's leading 6-0.

THIRD START: He won his second consecutive start when he combined with three A's relievers on a four-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win over Detroit on April 16 in Oakland...tossed six of the innings and allowed two of the hits (Grossman single in the third, Reyes single in the sixth)...also walked Castro in the first but did not allow a runners to advance past first base.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 13-12, 10-inning win over Minnesota last Wednesday in Oakland...allowed three home runs in a start for the second time in his career (Sept. 22, 2020 vs. Los Angeles-NL)...surrendered a solo home run to Donaldson in the first but the A's scored three times in the second...then allowed three runs in the third on a Donaldson RBI single and a Cruz two-run home run...had a 7-4 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Cruz in the fifth...Buxton followed with a single and he was relieved by Wendelken with no outs in the fifth inning and the A's leading 7-5.

a no decision in the A's 5-4 win...shut out the Rays on three hits over the first five innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a solo home run to Pham in the sixth inning...was relieved by Treinen to start the ninth inning with the scored tied 1-1...Treinen allowed three runs in the ninth but the A's came back with four in the bottom of the ninth for the win...his other outing came in relief on Sept. 16, 2018 at Tampa Bay (1.0 ip, 1 h)...pitched the eighth inning with the A's trailing 5-0 and, after allowing a leadoff double to Adames, he retired each of the final three batters.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Cole Irvin (2-2, 3.86 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...is 2-0 with a 0.79 ERA (1 er in 11.1 ip) over his last two starts after going 0-2 with a 7.45 ERA over his first two...has walked one batter or fewer in each of his four starts this year and six of seven in his career...has walked three batters in 21.0 innings this year (1.29 per nine innings) and 17 in 66.1 career innings (2.31 per nine innings)...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 3-1 A's win at Baltimore on Friday (5.1 ip, 8 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 6 so)...has never faced Tampa Bay in his career...went 1-1 with a 1.00 ERA and .169 opponents batting average in five spring appearances, including three starts...walked just three batters in 18.0 innings and struck out 18...had two stints with Philadelphia last year and was 0-1 with a 17.18 ERA in three relief appearances...opponents went 11-for-21 (.524) but he walked just one and struck out four in 3.2 innings.

scratched from his scheduled start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness and went 1-4 with an 8.70 ERA, .321 opponents average and 10 home runs over his final seven starts...went 3-5 with a 5.60 ERA in 11 starts overall...his ERA was eighth highest in the majors among pitchers with at least 50 innings pitched...had career highs in losses (5) and earned runs (33) and matched his high in home runs (10), runs (35) and walks (23)...led the A's in strikeouts (60), losses, runs, home runs and walks.

2020 OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average broke down to .198 (22-for-111) against right-handed hitters compared to .350 (35-for-100) against left-handers...surrendered six of his 10 home runs and issued 15 of his 23 walks to lefties for a 1.061 OPS (.572 against right-handers)...had a .306 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .264 the second time and .205 after that...allowed a .133 average with two strikes and has a .173 career opponents average in that situation.

2020 HOME AND AWAY: Was 2-1 with a 2.56 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in six starts in Oakland, 1-4 with a 10.13 ERA and .330 opponents average in five starts on the road...surrendered just two home runs in 31.2 innings in Oakland compared to eight in 21.1 innings on the road...over the last three years, he is 7-2 with a 3.75 ERA (36 er in 86.1 ip) and eight home runs in 86.1 innings over 16 starts in Oakland, 7-6 with a 4.32 ERA (39 er in 81.1 ip) and 14 home runs in 81.1 innings over 15 starts on the road.

2020 NIGHT AND DAY: Made eight of his 11 starts during the day, which tied for the most in the majors...was 2-4 with a 6.16 ERA during the day, 1-1 with a 4.20 ERA at night...his career numbers are 8-9 with a 5.11 ERA (68 er in 119.2 ip) in 32 games during the day, 12-6 with a 3.83 ERA (68 er in 160.0 ip) in 42 contests at night.

2020 THE WEST AND THE REST: Was 3-2 with a 3.61 ERA and .236 opponents batting average in eight starts against American League West competition, 0-3 with a 13.50 ERA and .391 opponents average in three interleague starts...is now 11-5 with a 3.61 ERA (56 er in 139.2 ip) in 34 career appearances against AL West competition, 9-10 with a 5.14 ERA (80 er in 140.0 ip) in 39 games against all other teams...is 2-5 with an 8.38 ERA (36 er in 38.2 ip) in 11 career interleague appearances.

2020 THIS AND THAT: The A's were 6-5 (.545) in his starting assignments... had two starts of seven innings and five starts of fewer than five innings... went 2-2 with a 2.83 ERA in six starts on four days rest, 1-3 with an 11.00 ERA in five starts on five days rest or more...received two runs of support or fewer in nine of his 11 starts...had 10 of his 28 runs of support in one start on Aug. 3 at Seattle and had a 4.75 RSA for the season...won both of his starts with support of three or more runs and is now 13-1 in 17 career starts with at least three runs of support.

2020 HIGHLIGHTS: Was the A's Opening Day starting pitcher and had a no decision in a 7-3, 10-inning win over Los Angeles (AL)...it was his first career Opening Day start and he became the A's 13th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 15 years...was just the second foreign-born Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Ariel Prieto, April 2, 1997)...allowed just one run in 4.0 innings...took the loss in his second start on July 29 against Colorado, snapping a career-high five-game winning streak dating back to May 17, 2019...then picked up the win in back-to-back starts on Aug. 3 at Seattle and Aug. 8 against Houston for his only winning streak of the season...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings in each start...was named American League Player of the Week for the week of Aug. 3-9 after going 2-0 with a 0.64 ERA in two starts...struck out 14, walked four and allowed six hits in 14.0 innings...it was his first career Player of the Week honor...was 2-1 with a 1.57 ERA in four starts when he was scratched from his scheduled start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness...went 1-4 with a 8.70 ERA in six starts...lost his second consecutive decision in the second game of the Aug. 29 doubleheader at Houston, snapping a seven-game winning streak against AL West competition...was placed on the paternity list on Sept. 14... was reinstated Sept. 17...started the A's final game of the season on Sept. 27 against Seattle and struck out a career-high 13 batters on a career-high 113 pitches in 6.0 innings...the strikeouts were the most by an A's pitcher since Todd Stottlemeyer had 15 on June 16, 1995 against Kansas City and they tied for the seventh best single game performance in Oakland history...they matched the most in Athletics history by a pitcher with six innings or fewer... Vida Blue also had 13 in 6.0 innings on April 9, 1971 against Kansas City...it was his third career 10-strikeout game...was 1-1 with a 9.53 ERA and .346 opponents batting average in two games, including one start, in his postseason debut...picked up the win in relief in the A's series-clinching, 6-4 victory over Chicago in Game 3 of the ALWC (2.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 so)...then took the loss in the deciding Game 4 of the ALDS against Houston at Dodger Stadium, an 11-6 A's loss (3.2 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 3 so, 2 hr).
