OAKLAND ATHLETICS (15-9) VS. TAMPA BAY RAYS (12-12)

TUESDAY, APRIL 27, 2021 — TROPICANA FIELD — 7:10 EDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two of the last three games after winning 13 in a row...are 15-3 over the last 18 games after starting the season 0-6...are 15-9 (.625) overall, which is tied for the second best record in the American League...it matches the second best record by an A's team after 24 games over the last 31 years...the only better record over the first 24 games was 16-8 last year (won game 25)...went from sole possession of last place in the American League West on April 11 to sole possession of first on April 21 and have held at least a share of first place for each of the last eight days...currently have a season-high two-game lead for the second consecutive day after being a season-high 5½ games out of first on April 8...have spent six days alone in first place this year, two days tied for first, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth...had a season-high 13-game winning streak snapped Sunday at Baltimore...the streak was third longest in Oakland history, tied for fifth longest in Athletics history and the longest by a Major League team since Cleveland won 22 straight from Aug. 24-Sept. 14, 2017.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost their first one-run game of the season last night...are now 5-1 (.833) in one-run games, which is the second best record in the American League to the Royals (6-1, .857)...are 8-1 (.889) in games decided by three runs or fewer, which is the best record in the majors...however, the nine games are tied with the Mets for the fewest in the majors...are 2-0 in extra innings and are now 8-1 in extra innings over the last two years...have three walk-off wins, which are the most in the majors...are 10-0 when leading after six innings after going 25-0 last year...have now won 47 consecutive games when leading after six innings dating back to Sept. 7, 2019, which matches the longest such streak in Athletics history (47, July 21, 1927 to May 16, 1928).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have homered in six straight and 15 of the last 16 games and now have 27 home runs in the last 16 games after homering just three times over the first eight contests...have 30 home runs for the season, which is second most in the American League to the Angels (32)...are 13-0 when out-homering the opposition and 1-8 when they are out-homered...A's pitchers have allowed 11 home runs over the last 16 games after surrendering 16 over the first eight.

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .188 (30-for-160) with 16 runs scored over the first five games of the road trip but have won three of the games...are batting .216 overall, which is fifth lowest in the American League...lead the league in hit by pitches (19), rank second in walks (86) and have the fifth best on-base percentage (.308) and OPS (.691)...rank second in stolen bases (18) and third in triples (5)...A's pinch hitters are 7-for-20 (.350) with a home run, five RBI and a walk...the seven pinch hits are the most in the AL and more than seven National League teams...also lead the AL in pinch RBI, are tied for the lead in home runs and rank second in plate appearances (21)...the A's are 3-for-18 (.167) with the bases loaded, which is the second lowest batting average in the AL (Cleveland, .100).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.39 ERA (25 er in 94.0 ip) over the last 11 games after logging a 5.85 ERA over the first 13 contests...have a 4.31 ERA overall, which is fifth highest in the American League...however, lead the league with four shutouts...have the second highest opponents batting average (.259) and OPS (.739) and the third highest on-base percentage (.322) and slugging percentage (.416).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 10-2 with a 3.04 ERA (28 er in 83.0 ip) over the last 15 games after going 0-8 with a 7.05 ERA over the first nine contests...are 10-9 with a 4.44 ERA overall...the wins are tied with the Red Sox for the most in the American League but the losses are third most...rank second in innings pitched (127.2)...have the highest opponents batting average in the AL (.268)...have walked two batters or fewer in each of the last 13 games (15 bb in 72.0 ip, 1.88 per nine innings).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has compiled a 2.03 ERA (9 er in 40.0 ip) and .208 (31-for-149) opponents batting average over its last 12 games after posting a 6.02 ERA and .275 opponents average over the first 11 contests...has allowed just two home run over its last 15 games...has converted each of its five save opportunities and the A's and Yankees are the only teams in the majors without a blown save...has a 5-0 record and Oakland is the only team in the majors without a loss from its bullpen...has allowed 14-of-35 (40.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the third highest percentage in the American League...has the highest on-base percentage (.432) against first batters faced in the majors and the second highest batting average (.333) and slugging percentage (.681).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed seven errors in the last seven games after a season-best six-game errorless streak...have 12 errors for the

season, which is tied for third fewest in the American League...rank third in fielding percentage (.986)...however, have -9 defensive runs saved, which is second worst in the AL to Texas (-12).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-2 on the second road trip of the season, a seven-game trip to Baltimore (2-1) and Tampa Bay (1-1)...went 4-1 on the first road trip to Houston (2-1) and Arizona (2-0) and are 7-3 (.700) for the season, which is the second best road record in the American League to the Red Sox (7-1, .875)...had their six-game road winning streak snapped on Sunday, which was their longest road winning streak over the last two years...return home following the game tomorrow for a season-long 10-game homestand against Baltimore (three games), Toronto (four games) and Tampa Bay (three games)...went 7-0 on the last homestand against Detroit (4-0) and Minnesota (3-0)...it was the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have gone undefeated on a homestand of more than six games, all of which have been 7-0...the other three were Sept. 10-16, 1992 (Seattle 4, Minnesota 3), Sept. 3-10, 2001 (Baltimore 3, Tampa Bay 3, Texas 1) and Aug. 23-29, 2004 (Baltimore 4, Tampa Bay 3)...have won each of their last eight home games after dropping each of the first six...the longest home winning streak last year was nine (Aug. 4-21).

IN APRIL: The A's have clinched a winning record in April as they are 15-9 with three games remaining...will have their best record in April since 2014 when they went 18-9...A's batters have been hit by a pitch 19 times, which is the most in Athletics history in April (previous: 15 in 2018)...have 18 stolen bases, which are the A's most in April since 2014 (19) and the most in any month since May of 2015 (also 18)...A's pitchers have 203 strikeouts, which is fourth most in April in Athletics history (220 in 2014, 213 in 2019, 210 in 2013).

THE SCHEDULE: The A's are in a stretch of 17 consecutive days without a scheduled day off...the stretch began on Friday in Baltimore and Oakland is 3-2 over the first five games...Friday's game also began a stretch of 20 consecutive games against American League East competition...return home Friday to start a string where they will play 20 of 29 games at home.

TAXI SQUAD: The A's taxi squad for the second road trip includes pitcher James Kaprielian, catcher Austin Allen, infielder Pete Kozma and outfielder Luis Barrera...Kozma is not on the 40-man roster...Mike Fiers started the trip on the taxi squad but was reinstated on the IL Monday...Adam Kolarek, who was optioned to the A's alternate site Monday, will remain on the taxi squad for the rest of the trip...in addition, Tommy Everidge joins the A's for the second consecutive trip as an extra coach.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list seven times this year and currently have four players on the IL (Pinder, Puk, Rosenthal, Smith)...used the IL just eight times all last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4)...used it 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest in the majors.

A's vs. RAYS: The season series is even at one game each...the A's won the season series in 2019, 4-3...it was their first season series win since 2016 (5-2)...split four games in Oakland and went 2-1 in Tampa Bay...are 29-29 against the Rays dating back to 2012...all-time, are 110-77 (.588), which is their best record against any American League team...are 60-32 in Oakland and 50-45 at Tropicana Field...the mark in the Coliseum is the A's best record against any AL team.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha leads the American League with 23 runs scored, which is tied for second most in Athletics history in the month of April to Coco Crisp's 24 runs scored in April of 2013...**Jake Diekman** has not allowed a run in his last seven games (7.2 ip, 3 h, 2 bb, 9 so)...**Matt Olson** ranks eighth in the American League in slugging (.610) and OPS (.970), tied for eighth in home runs (6) and tied for ninth in RBI (17)...**Yusmeiro Petit** has a six-game, 8.0-inning scoreless streak and not allowed a run in nine of his last 10 games (12.0 ip, 7 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 9 so, 0.75 ERA).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1987** Dennis Eckersley commits an error in the A's 7-1 win over Boston...he would not commit another error for eight years, setting what was then an American League record for pitchers with 470 consecutive errorless games...in **2002** Tim Hudson and Billy Koch combine on a three-hit shutout and Eric Chavez homers and drives in four runs in the A's 10-0 win over Chicago...in **2014** Sonny Gray tosses a two-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win at Texas.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (2-2, 3.86 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...is 2-0 with a 0.79 ERA (1 er in 11.1 ip) over his last two starts after going 0-2 with a 7.45 ERA over his first two...has walked one batter or fewer in each of his four starts this year and six of seven in his career...has walked three batters in 21.0 innings this year (1.29 per nine innings) and 17 in 66.1 career innings (2.31 per nine innings).

THIS AND THAT: Has a .276 opponents batting average, which breaks down to .227 (15-for-66) against right-handed hitters compared to .429 (9-for-21) against left-handers...has issued all three of his walks to righties...his career splits are .250 (48-for-192) against righties, .410 (32-for-78) against lefties...has allowed five of his nine runs in the fifth and six innings (5 er in 5.0 ip, 9.00 ERA)...has a 2.25 ERA (4 er in 16.0 ip) over the first four innings...has a .242 (8-for-33) average against a batter the first time through the order, .229 (8-for-35) the second time and .421 (8-for-19) after that.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-1 loss to Houston on April 3 in Oakland...it was his first start since May 22, 2019 with Philadelphia at Chicago (NL)...tossed 4.1 innings, which was the shortest start of his career...allowed a RBI single to Tucker in the first but the A's came back to tie the game with a run in the bottom of the first...then allowed a RBI single to Altuve in the second...was relieved by Trivino with runners on first and second and one out in the fifth and Trivino allowed a three-run home run.

SECOND START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 6-2 loss at Houston on April 8...allowed a leadoff home run to Correa in the second, a RBI double to Correa in the fourth and a solo home run to Alvarez in the sixth...walked the next batter (Correa) and was relieved by Wendelken with a runner on first and one out in the sixth with the A's trailing 3-0...Wendelken allowed Correa to score plus a run of his own.

THIRD START: He combined with Wendelken, Guerra and Weems on a five-hit shutout in the A's 7-0 win over Detroit on April 17 in Oakland...it was his first win since May 17, 2019 against Colorado and it snapped a career-high four-game losing streak...tossed six of the inning and allowed four of the hits for the longest scoreless outing of his career...matched his career high with six strikeouts (May 22, 2019 vs. Chicago-NL) and 93 pitches (May 12, 2019 at Kansas City) and did not walk a batter for the first time as a starter.

LAST START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 3-1 win at Baltimore last Friday...it is the second time in his career he has put together consecutive wins (May 12-17, 2019)...matched his career high with six strikeouts and 93 pitches for the second consecutive start and third time in his career...shut out the Orioles on four hits and a walk over the first five innings before loading the bases on three consecutive singles to start the sixth...struck out the next batter he faced (Mountcastle) before allowing a RBI single to Severino...that snapped a career-high 11.0 inning scoreless streak...was relieved by Petit following the Severino single with the A's leading 3-1.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 1-1 with a 1.00 ERA and .169 opponents batting average in five spring appearances, including three starts...walked just three batters in 18.0 innings and struck out 18...10 of the strikeouts came in his final start on March 26 at Los Angeles (NL)...those were the most in a single game by an A's pitcher in the MLB Spring Training database, which dates back to 2006...finished the spring with an 11.0-inning scoreless streak...allowed one run twice and no runs three times...tied for the team-lead in innings pitched.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Chris Bassitt (2-2, 4.13 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...is 2-0 with a 3.18 ERA (6 er in 17.0 ip) and .234 (15-for-64) opponents batting average over his last three starts after going 0-2 with a 5.56 ERA and .289 opponents average over his first two starts...is 2-0 with a 3.27 ERA in two starts on the road compared to 0-2 with a 4.67 ERA in three starts at home...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 7-2 A's win at Baltimore last Saturday (6.0 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 8 so)...is 0-1 with a 1.86 ERA (9.2 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 6 so, 0 hr) in two career appearances, including one start against Tampa Bay...last pitched in relief on Sept. 15, 2018 in a 7-5 A's loss at Tropicana Field (3.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...was 2-0 with a 1.74 ERA and .179 opponents batting average in three spring training starts...went 5-2 with a 2.29 ERA in 11 starts last year...his ERA ranked second among pitchers in the West divisions and sixth in the majors.

- Has two saves, which are his first since June 20, 2018 for Texas against Kansas City...now has nine saves in his career.
- Has yielded a .130 (3-for-23) average against right-handed hitters compared to .333 (5-for-15) against left-handers.
- Has not allowed a run in three day games (3.1 ip) and has not allowed a run during the day since Sept. 1, 2019 vs. New York (AL)...has a 17-game, 17.2-inning scoreless streak during the day.
- Faced Tampa Bay five times in 2019 while pitching for Kansas City and did not allow a run (4.0 ip, 1 h, 6 so)...has not allowed a run in four career appearances at Tropicana Field (4.0 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 6 so).

Last Year: Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)

- Was re-signed by the A's as a free agent on Feb. 16 but did not pitch this spring.
- Began the season on the injured list with a lumbar strain and was reinstated from the IL on Monday.
- Has made 216 career appearances, 19 of which have come in relief...is 1-3 with a 5.40 ERA (21 er in 35.0 ip) as a reliever.
- His last relief appearance was on Sept. 28, 2018 at Los Angeles-AL (3.1 ip, 7 h, 6 r, 6 er, 3 so)...that was in relief of "opener" Lou Trivino...made one relief appearance each year from 2015-18 but has not had multiple outings out of the pen since 2014 with Milwaukee when he had four.
- Last faced Tampa Bay on June 22, 2019 and had a no decision in the A's 4-2 win (6.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 2 so)...has never faced the Rays in relief.

Last Year: Went 6-3 with a 4.58 ERA in 11 starts for the A's...led the team in wins for the second consecutive season (had 15 in 2019)...went 1-1 with a 6.86 ERA over his first four starts but was 5-2 with a 3.43 ERA over his final seven starts.

- Has allowed a hit to the first batter he has faced in all four of his appearances.

- Left-handed hitters are 1-for-13 (.077) this year and are 2-for-26 (.077) over the last two years.
- Had his streak of consecutive batters retired snapped at 15 on Saturday when he allowed a two-out single to Hays in the ninth.
- Last faced Tampa Bay on May 25, 2017 while pitching for the Angels (2.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb)...has not allowed a run in two career appearances against the Rays (3.1 ip).

- Has stranded all four of his inherited runners over his last 10 games after allowing all four to score over his first two contests.
- Is tied for second in the American League in games pitched (12)...is tied with Kittredge (TB) for the lead among AL relievers in wins (3) and is tied for fourth in innings pitched (14.1).
- Opponents are 7-for-24 (.292) with the bases empty but are just 3-for-27 (.111) with runners on base.
- Has not allowed a run in seven games on zero or one day of rest (7.0 ip).
