OAKLAND ATHLETICS (15-10) VS. TAMPA BAY RAYS (13-12)

WEDNESDAY, APRIL 28, 2021 — TROPICANA FIELD — 1:10 EDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three of the last four games after winning 13 in a row...are 15-4 over the last 19 games after starting the season 0-6...are 15-10 (.600) overall, which is the third best record in the American League... it matches the third best record by an A's team after 25 games over the last 31 years...went from sole possession of last place in the American League West on April 11 to sole possession of first on April 21 and have held at least a share of first place for each of the last nine days...currently have a 1.5 game lead after being a season-high 5½ games out of first on April 8...have spent seven days alone in first place this year, two days tied for first, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth...had a season-high 13-game winning streak snapped Sunday at Baltimore...the streak was third longest in Oakland history, tied for fifth longest in Athletics history and the longest by a Major League team since Cleveland won 22 straight from Aug. 24-Sept. 14, 2017.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost their first one-run game of the season Tuesday night...are now 5-1 (.833) in one-run games, which is the second best record in the American League to the Royals (6-1, .857)...are 8-2 (.800) in games decided by three runs or fewer, which is the best record in the majors...however, the 10 games are tied with the Mets and Nationals for the fewest in the majors...are 2-0 in extra innings and are now 8-1 in extra innings over the last two years...have three walk-off wins, which are the most in the majors... are 10-0 when leading after six innings after going 25-0 last year...have now won 47 consecutive games when leading after six innings dating back to Sept. 7, 2019, which matches the longest such streak in Athletics history (47, July 21, 1927 to May 16, 1928).

THE LONG BALL: The A's homered in six straight games from April 21-27 and 15 of the last 17 games and now have 27 home runs in the last 17 games after homering just three times over the first eight contests...have 30 home runs for the season, which is tied with Cleveland (30) for third most in the American League to the Yankees (32) and Angels (32)...are 13-0 when outhomering the opposition and 1-9 when they are out-homered...A's pitchers have allowed 12 home runs over the last 17 games after surrendering 16 over the first eight.

OFFENSE: The A's are hitting .192 (37-for-193) with 16 runs scored over the first six games of the road trip but have won three of the games...are batting .216 overall, which is fifth lowest in the American League...lead the league in hit by pitches (19), rank second in walks (88) and have the seventh best on-base percentage (.306) and eighth best OPS (.684)...rank second in stolen bases (18) and third in triples (5)...A's pinch hitters are 8-for-22 (.364) with a home run, five RBI and a walk...the eight pinch hits are the most in the AL and more than eight National League teams...also lead the AL in pinch RBI and plate appearances (23) and are tied for the lead in home runs...the A's are 3-for-18 (.167) with the bases loaded, which is the second lowest batting average in the AL (Cleveland, .100).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.38 ERA (27 er in 102.0 ip) over the last 12 games after logging a 5.85 ERA over the first 13 contests...have a 4.23 ERA overall, which is fifth highest in the American League...however, are tied for the league lead with four shutouts...have the second highest opponents batting average (.259) and OPS (.740) and the third highest on-base percentage (.323) and slugging percentage (.417).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 10-3 with a 2.83 ERA (28 er in 89.0 ip) over the last 16 games after going 0-8 with a 7.05 ERA over the first nine contests...are 10-10 with a 4.38 ERA overall...the wins are second to the Red Sox (16) for the most in the American League but the losses are tied for third most...lead the AL in innings pitched (133.2)...have the second highest opponents batting average in the AL (.270)...have walked two batters or fewer in each of the last 14 games (16 bb in 80.0 ip, 1.80 per nine innings).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has compiled a 1.93 ERA (9 er in 42.0 ip) and .205 (32-for-156) opponents batting average over its last 13 games after posting a 6.02 ERA and .275 opponents average over the first 11 contests...has allowed just two home runs over its last 16 games...has converted each of its five save opportunities and the A's and Yankees are the only teams in the majors without a blown save...has a 5-0 record and Oakland is the only team in the majors without a loss from its bullpen...has allowed 14-of-35 (40.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the third highest percentage in the American League...has the highest on-base percentage (.422) against first batters faced in the majors and the second highest batting average (.324) and slugging percentage (.662).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed seven errors in the last eight games after a season-best six-game errorless streak...have 12 errors for the

season, which is tied for third fewest in the American League...rank third in fielding percentage (.986)...however, have -11 defensive runs saved, which is second worst in the AL to Texas (-12).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-3 on the second road trip of the season, a seven-game trip to Baltimore (2-1) and Tampa Bay (1-2)...went 4-1 on the first road trip to Houston (2-1) and Arizona (2-0) and are 7-4 (.636) for the season, which is tied with the Orioles for the third best road record in the American League to the Red Sox (8-1, .889) and Royals (7-3, .700)...had their six-game road winning streak snapped on Sunday, which was their longest road winning streak over the last two years...return home following the game tomorrow for a season-long 10-game homestand against Baltimore (three games), Toronto (four games) and Tampa Bay (three games)...went 7-0 on the last homestand against Detroit (4-0) and Minnesota (3-0)...it was the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have gone undefeated on a homestand of more than six games, all of which have been 7-0...the other three were Sept. 10-16, 1992 (Seattle 4, Minnesota 3), Sept. 3-10, 2001 (Baltimore 3, Tampa Bay 3)... have won each of their last eight home games after dropping each of the first six...the longest home winning streak last year was nine (Aug. 4-21).

IN APRIL: The A's have clinched a winning record in April as they are 15-10 with two games remaining...will have their best record in April since 2014 when they went 18-9...A's batters have been hit by a pitch 19 times, which is the most in Athletics history in April (previous: 15 in 2018)...have 18 stolen bases, which are the A's most in April since 2014 (19) and the most in any month since May of 2015 (also 18)...A's pitchers have 213 strikeouts, which is tied for second most in April in Athletics history (220 in 2014, 213 in 2019).

THE SCHEDULE: The A's are in a stretch of 17 consecutive days without a scheduled day off...the stretch began on Friday in Baltimore and Oakland is 3-3 over the first six games...Friday's game also began a stretch of 20 consecutive games against American League East competition...return home Friday to start a string where they will play 20 of 29 games at home.

TAXI SQUAD: The A's taxi squad for the second road trip includes pitcher James Kaprielian, catcher Austin Allen, infielder Pete Kozma and outfielder Luis Barrera...Kozma is not on the 40-man roster...Mike Fiers started the trip on the taxi squad but was reinstated from the IL Monday...Adam Kolarek, who was optioned to the A's alternate site Monday, will remain on the taxi squad for the rest of the trip...in addition, Tommy Everidge joins the A's for the second consecutive trip as an extra coach.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list seven times this year and currently have four players on the IL (Pinder, Puk, Rosenthal, Smith)...used the IL just eight times all last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4)...used it 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest in the majors.

A's vs. RAYS: The Rays lead the season series 1-2...the A's won the season series in 2019, 4-3...it was their first season series win since 2016 (5-2)...split four games in Oakland and went 2-1 in Tampa Bay...are 29-30 against the Rays dating back to 2012...all-time, are 110-78 (.585), which is their best record against any American League team...are 60-32 in Oakland and 50-46 at Tropicana Field...the mark in the Coliseum is the A's best record against any AL team.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha leads the American League with 23 runs scored, which is tied for second most in Athletics history in the month of April to Coco Crisp's 24 runs scored in April of 2013..*Jake Diekman* has not allowed a run in his last seven games (7.2 ip, 3 h, 2 bb, 9 so)...*Matt Olson* ranks ninth in the American League in slugging (.580) and 11th in OPS (.943), tied for eighth in home runs (6) and tied for 10th in RBI (17)...*Yusmeiro Petit* has a sixgame, 8.0-inning scoreless streak and not allowed a run in nine of his last 10 games (12.0 ip, 7 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 9 so, 0.75 ERA).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1998** Ben Grieve ties an Oakland record by going a perfect 5 for 5 with four runs scored in the A's 11-4 win at Cleveland...in **2000** Grieve hits his first career grand slam in the 10th inning of a 6-2 A's win at Minnesota... in **2013** the A's defeat the Angels 10-8 in a 19-inning game that lasts an Oakland record 6 hours and 32 minutes...the A's overcome a five-run deficit in the game and Brandon Moss ends it with a two-run home run in the bottom of the 19th inning.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season ... is 2-0 with a 3.18 ERA (6 er in 17.0 ip) and .234 (15-for-64) opponents batting average over his last three starts after going 0-2 with a 5.56 ERA and .289 opponents average over his first two starts...did not pitch in the majors in 2017 following May 6, 2016 "Tommy

John" surgery...is 19-12 with a 3.37 ERA (106 er in 283.0 ip) and is averaging 8.40 strikeouts per nine innings (264 so in 283.0 ip) in 55 games (48 starts) since the surgery...was 2-11 with a 4.13 ERA and 6.77 strikeouts per nine innings in 29 games (23 starts) before the surgery.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-0 with a 3.27 ERA (4 er in 11.0 ip) in two starts on the road compared to 0-2 with a 4.67 ERA (9 er in 17.1 ip) in three starts at home...has surrendered both of his home runs at home...last year, he went 2-1 with a 0.72 ERA, .207 opponents batting average and .512 OPS in five starts in Oakland last year compared to 3-1 with a 4.56 ERA, .270 opponents average and .683 OPS in five starts on the road...his home ERA was second lowest in the majors (Keller, KC 0.27) and second lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 30 innings (Treinen, 0.63 in 2018)...did not allow a home run in 37.1 innings in Oakland...is 9-12 with a 2.63 ERA (60 er in 205.2 ip) in 38 career games in the Coliseum, 12-11 with a 4.56 ERA (112 er in 221.0 ip) in 46 games in all other ballparks...has yielded just 13 home runs in 205.2 career innings in Oakland (0.57 per nine innings).

THIS AND THAT: Has not allowed a run in the first inning...last year, he allowed six of his 18 runs in the first inning...had a 4.91 ERA in the first inning, a 1.73 ERA from the second inning on...has received one run of support or fewer in three of his five starts this year and is 0-2 in those starts...is 17-1 in 27 career starts with three runs of support or more. 4-22 in 44 starts with two runs of support or fewer...opponents are 6-for-30 (.200) with runners in scoring position.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-1 loss to Houston on Opening Day, April 1 in Oakland...became the A's 14th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 16 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill, Graveman twice, Fiers, Montas)... blanked the Astros on one hit over the first three innings before allowing a run in the fourth when Altuve walked, went to third on a Brantley double and scored on a Bregman ground out...the run snapped a 16.2-inning scoreless streak during the regular season and a 27.1-inning home scoreless streak, which was ninth longest in Oakland history...was relieved by Petit with one out in the sixth inning, runners on first and second and the A's trailing 1-0...Petit allowed both runners to score.

SECOND START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 5-1 loss to Los Angeles (NL) on April 6 in Oakland...allowed nine hits, which were his most since April 28, 2016 at Detroit when he yielded a career-high 10...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed a RBI double to Barnes in the second... then allowed three more runs in the third on a two-run home run by Muncy and a solo home run by Rios...the home runs were the first he allowed in the Coliseum since Aug. 24, 2019, snapping a 10-game, 55.1-inning, 229-batter homerless streak

THIRD START: He picked up his first win of the season in the A's 9-5 win at Arizona on April 12...allowed just two hits in 5.0 innings, which matched his fewest hits ever in a start...however, issued five walks...had a 3-0 lead when he issued consecutive one-out walks in the third...Calhoun followed with a RBI single and Cabrera added a sacrifice fly...those were the only two runs he would allow in five innings of work.

FOURTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win over Detroit on April 18 in Oakland...loaded the bases with one out in the first inning but then retired each of the next 10 batters and 14 of the next 15...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a two-out, two-run single to Harold Castro in the sixth... was relieved by Diekman to start the seventh inning with the A's trailing 2-1 but Oakland scored once in the eighth to get him off the hook and once in the ninth for the win.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-2 victory at Baltimore last Saturday...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed a RBI double to Sisco in the second inning...retired the side in order in the third and fourth inning and had a 7-1 lead when he allowed a RBI double to Mancini in the fifth.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Was 2-0 with a 1.74 ERA (10.1 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 12 so, 1 hr) in three spring training starts...also pitched in simulated games allowed a .179 opponents batting average and issued just two walks in 10.1 innings...struck out 12.

2020 RECAP: Spent the entire season on the active roster for the first time in his six-year career and went 5-2 with a 2.29 ERA in 11 starts...his ERA ranked second among pitchers in the West divisions (Lamet, SD 2.09) and sixth in the majors...it was fifth lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 10 starts...also tied for fifth in the West divisions in winning percentage (.714), ranked seventh in opponents OPS (.659), batting average (.233) and slugging percentage (.371), tied for seventh in wins and eighth in on-base percentage (.288)...had career lows in ERA and opponents on-base percentage...walked 17 batters in 63.0 innings for a career-low 2.43 walks per nine innings...struck out 55 for a career-best 3.24 strikeout-to-walk ratio...led the A's in innings pitched and tied for the lead in games started...received five votes (two third, one fourth, two fifth) in American League Cy Young balloting...went 1-0 with a 1.08 ERA over his first three starts, 1-2 with a 5.95 ERA over his next four starts and 3-0 with a 0.34 ERA over his final four starts.

2020 OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .233 opponents batting average, which broke down to .223 (31-for-139) with a .590 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .248 (25-for-101) with a .755 OPS against left-handers... yielded four of his six home runs to lefties and has surrendered 20 of his 29 home runs over the last three years to lefties...walked just one batter to lead off an inning and held opponents to a .203 (13-for-64) batting average and .227 on-base percentage in that situation...the on-base percentage was sixth lowest in the majors...five of his six home runs came with the bases empty...had a .244 opponents batting average with runners in scoring posi-tion, but that dropped to .176 with RISP and two outs...had a .130 opponent average with two strikes.

2020 NIGHT AND DAY: Went 3-0 with a 1.15 ERA in six starts at night last year compared to 2-2 with a 4.13 ERA in five starts during the day...his night ERA was the lowest in the majors and in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 30 innings at night.

2020 THIS AND THAT: Was 3-0 with a 1.75 ERA in four starts following an A's loss and is 8-2 with a 2.62 ERA (26 er in 89.1 ip) in 15 starts following a loss over the last three years...went 2-1 with a 3.34 ERA in five starts on four days rest, 3-1 with a 1.35 ERA in six starts on five days rest or more...allowed one run or fewer in seven of his 11 starts, including no runs four times...the A's went 8-3 (.727) in his starting assignments and are 26-15 (.634) when he starts over the last three years.

- Has yielded a .130 (3-for-23) average against right-handed hitters compared to .333 (5-for-15) against left-handers.
- Has not allowed a run in three day games (3.1 ip) and has not allowed a run during the day since Sept. 1, 2019 vs. New York (AL)...has a 17-game, 17.2-inning scoreless streak during the day.
- Faced Tampa Bay five times in 2019 while pitching for Kansas City and did not allow a run (4.0 ip, 1 h, 6 so)...has not allowed a run in four career appearances at Tropicana Field (4.0 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 6 so).

Last Year: Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)

- Was re-signed by the A's as a free agent on Feb. 16 but did not pitch this spring.
- Began the season on the injured list with a lumbar strain and was reinstated from the IL on Monday.
- Has made 216 career appearances, 19 of which have come in relief...is 1-3 with a 5.40 ERA (21 er in 35.0 ip) as a reliever.
- His last relief appearance was on Sept. 28, 2018 at Los Angeles-AL (3.1 ip, 7 h, 6 r, 6 er, 3 so)...that was in relief of "opener" Lou Trivino...made one relief appearance each year from 2015-18 but has not had multiple outings out of the pen since 2014 with Milwaukee when he had four.

• Last faced Tampa Bay on June 22, 2019 and had a no decision in the A's 4-2 win (6.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 2 so)...has never faced the Rays in relief.

Last Year: Went 6-3 with a 4.58 ERA in 11 starts for the A's…led the team in wins for the second consecutive season (had 15 in 2019)…went 1-1 with a 6.86 ERA over his first four starts but was 5-2 with a 3.43 ERA over his final seven starts.


