OAKLAND ATHLETICS (16-10) VS. BALTIMORE ORIOLES (11-14)

ABOUT THE A'S: Split a four-game series at Tampa Bay to start the week and are now 2-3 over the last five games after winning 13 in a row...are 16-4 over the last 20 games after starting the season 0-6...are 16-10 (.625) overall, which is tied with the Red Sox for the second best record in the American League (Royals, 15-8)...it matches the second best record by an A's team after 26 games over the last 30 years...the only better record was 18-8 last year ...went from sole possession of last place in the American League West on April 11 to sole possession of first on April 21 and have held at least a share of first place for each of the last 10 days...currently have a season-high tying two-game lead after being a season-high 5½ games out of first on April 8... have spent eight days alone in first place this year, two days tied for first, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth...had a season-high 13-game winning streak snapped last Sunday at Baltimore...the streak was third longest in Oakland history, tied for fifth longest in Athletics history and the longest by a Major League team since Cleveland won 22 straight from Aug. 24-Sept. 14, 2017.

CLOSE CALLS: Scored once in the top of the ninth yesterday to defeat Tampa Bay 3-2 and improve to 4-0 in games decided in the last at bat...three of the A's four games against the Rays were decided by one run and the other was decided by two runs...the A's are now 6-1 (.857) in one-run games, which matches the Royals for the best record in the majors...are 9-2 (.818) in games decided by three runs or fewer, which is the best record in the majors...the 11 games are the fewest in the American League...are 2-0 in extra innings and are now 8-1 in extra innings over the last two years...have three walk-off wins, which are the most in the majors...are 10-0 when leading after six innings after going 25-0 last year...have now won 47 consecutive games when leading after six innings dating back to Sept. 7, 2019, which matches the longest such streak in Athletics history (47, July 21, 1927 to May 16, 1928).

IN APRIL: The A's have clinched a winning record in April as they are 16-10 entering the final game today...will have their best record in April since 2014 when they went 18-9...A's pitchers have set an Athletics record for strikeouts in April with 225...A's batters have set Athletics records for April in hit by pitches (19) and strikeouts (234)...are batting .216, which is fourth lowest in Oakland history in April and the lowest since 2012 (.211)...have 18 stolen bases, which are the A's most in April since 2014 (19) and the most in any month since May of 2015 (also 18).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin their longest homestand of the season tonight, a 10-game stand against Baltimore (three games), Toronto (four games) and Tampa Bay (three games)...went 7-0 on the last homestand against Detroit (4-0) and Minnesota (3-0)...it was the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have gone undefeated on a homestand of more than six games, all of which have been 7-0...the other three were Sept. 10-16, 1992 (Seattle 4, Minnesota 3), Sept. 3-10, 2001 (Baltimore 3, Tampa Bay 3, Texas 1) and Aug. 23-29, 2004 (Baltimore 4, Tampa Bay 3)...have won each of their last eight home games after dropping each of the first six...the longest home winning streak last year was nine (Aug. 4-21)...went 4-3 on the last road trip to Baltimore (2-1) and Tampa Bay (2-2) and are now 8-4 (.667) on the road.

OFFENSE: The A's hit .196 on the last road trip and scored just 19 runs in the seven games (2.7 per game)...however, finished with a 4-3 record...are batting .216 overall, which is fifth lowest in the American League...lead the league in hit by pitches (19), rank second in walks (89), tied for second in stolen bases (18), third in triples (5) and tied for third in home runs (31)...A's pinch hitters are 8-for-23 (.348) with a home run, five RBI and a walk...the eight pinch hits are the most in the AL and more than eight National League teams...also lead the AL in pinch RBI and plate appearances (24) and have one of two pinch home runs...the A's are 3-for-18 (.167) with the bases loaded, which is the second lowest batting average in the AL (Cleveland, .100).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.35 ERA (29 er in 111.0 ip) over the last 13 games dating back to April 16 after logging a 5.85 ERA over the first 13 contests...have a 4.14 ERA overall, which is fifth highest in the American League...however, are tied for the league lead with four shutouts...have the second highest opponents batting average (.255) and the third highest OPS (.735), on-base percentage (.321) and slugging percentage (.414)...have allowed 13 home runs over the last 18 games after surrendering 16 over the first eight.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 1-3 with a 3.34 ERA (11 er in 29.2 ip) over the last five games...however, are 10-3 with a 3.03 ERA (32 er in 95.0 ip) over the last 17 games after going 0-8 with a 7.05 ERA over the first nine contests...are 10-10 with a 4.32 ERA overall...rank second in the American League in wins and tied for second in losses...have walked two batters or fewer in each of the last 15 games (17 bb in 84.0 ip, 1.82 per nine innings)... lead the league in innings pitched (139.2) but have tossed seven innings or

fewer in all 26 games...now have a streak of 94 consecutive games of seven innings or fewer, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history...the last A's starter to toss more than seven innings is Mike Fiers on Sept. 20, 2019 (8.0 ip)...also have an Athletics record streak of 202 games of eight innings or fewer and have not had a pitcher toss more than eight innings since Frankie on May 17, 2019 at Detroit (8.2).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has compiled a 1.80 ERA (9 er in 45.0 ip) and .199 (33-for-166) opponents batting average over the A's last 15 games and has yielded just two home runs...posted a 6.02 ERA and .275 opponents average over the first 11 contests and surrendered seven home runs...has converted each of its six save opportunities and the A's and Yankees are the only teams in the majors without a blown save...has a 6-0 record and Oakland is the only team in the majors without a loss from its bullpen...has allowed 14-of-35 (40.0%) inherited runners to score, which is tied for the third highest percentage in the American League...has the highest batting average (.315), on-base percentage (.419) and slugging percentage (.644) against first batters faced.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed seven errors in the last nine games after a season-best six-game errorless streak...have 12 errors for the season, which is tied for third fewest in the American League...rank third in fielding percentage (.987)...however, have -13 defensive runs saved, which is second lowest in the majors to the Cubs (-15).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 13-0 when out-homering the opposition and 1-9 when they are out-homered...although Oakland is tied for the second best record in the American League, they have been out-scored 112-109 for a run differential of -3...only five teams in the AL have out-scored their opponents...have an average time of game of 2:53 over the last 13 games after averaging 3:22 over the first 13.

THE SCHEDULE: Starting tonight, the A's are scheduled to play 20 of their next 29 games at home and 35 of their next 44 in the Pacific Time Zone...began a stretch of 17 consecutive days without a scheduled day off a week ago today are 4-3 over the first seven games...also began a stretch of 20 consecutive games against American League East competition a week ago today.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list seven times this year and currently have four players on the IL (Pinder, Puk, Rosenthal, Smith)...used the IL just eight times all last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4)...used it 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest in the majors.

A's vs. ORIOLES: The A's lead the season series 2-1 after taking two of three in Baltimore last weekend...lost last Sunday to snap an eight-game winning streak and are now 13-3 over the last four years...have a seven-game winning streak in the Coliseum and are 31-12 (.721) against Baltimore at home dating back to 2008...won the season series in 2019, 6-1...went 3-0 in Oakland and 3-1 in Baltimore...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 276-268 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 139-135 in Oakland and 137-133 in Baltimore...are 70-59 at Camden Yards...are 1012-948 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...the only other of the other seven original American League franchises that the A's have a winning record against is the Twins/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha leads the American League with 24 runs scored, which are tied for the most in Athletics history in the month of April (Crisp, 2013)... *Jake Diekman* has not allowed a run in his last eight games (8.2 ip, 3 h, 2 bb, 10 so)...*Matt Olson* ranks eighth in the American League in slugging percentage (.580) and tied for eighth in home runs (6)...*Yusmeiro Petit* has a seven-game, 9.0-inning scoreless streak and not allowed a run in 10 of his last 11 games (13.0 ip, 7 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 10 so, 0.69 ERA).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1937** Duke All-American football star Ace Parker hits a pinch hit home run in his first major league at bat...he would later be elected to the Football Hall of Fame...in **1969** Rick Monday's third inning grand slam at California gives him at least one RBI in a club record 10 consecutive games...he finishes with five RBI on the day and drives in 18 runs during the streak... in **2000** Adam Piatt ties an Oakland record with two triples in the A's 8-2 win at Minnesota...he also connects for his first major league home run... in **2005** Mark Kotsay ties an Oakland record with five hits, including the game winning RBI single in the bottom of the 10th inning of the A's 6-5 win over Seattle.

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated form the injured list Monday and was available in the bullpen for the series at Tampa Bay but did not pitch...is scheduled to make his first appearance and start of the season ... was placed on the 10-day IL April 1 retroactive to March 29 with a lumbar strain...this is his 11th season in the majors and is with his fourth team...has pitched for Milwaukee (2011-15), Houston (2015-17), Detroit (2018) and Oakland (2018-present).

WITH THE A's: Is 26-9 with a 4.00 ERA (132 er in 296.2 ip) in 54 games, including 53 starts...the wins

are tied for fifth in the majors dating back to his first start with the A's on Aug. 6, 2018...his .743 winning percentage with Oakland is the best in Athletics history among pitchers with 30 or more decisions...is 15-4 with a 3.39 ERA (69 er in 183.0 ip) and .230 (154-for-669) opponents batting average in 32 career games, including 31 starts, in the Coliseum, including 14-2 with a 3.10 ERA (53 er in 153.2 ip) and .226 (127-for-562) opponents batting average in 26 starts as an Athletic.

APRIL, SEPTEMBER AND IN BETWEEN: Is 5-9 with a 5.68 ERA (76 er in 120.1 ip) and .311 (156-for-502) opponents batting average in 25 career appearances in the month of April and 11-16 with a 5.46 ERA and .274 opponents batting average in 41 games in September...is 58-36 with a 3.45 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in 148 games from May 1 through Aug. 31.

2020 RECAP: Won a team-leading six games and ranks among the Major League leaders in wins since he was acquired by the A's after the 2018 trading deadline...went 6-3 with a 4.58 ERA in 11 starts last year and is now 26-9 with a 4.00 ERA (132 er in 296.2 ip) in 54 games, including 53 starts, as an Athletic...tied for seventh in the majors in wins in 2020 and his 26 wins from Aug. 6, 2018 through the end of the 2020 season tied for fourth in the majors...his .743 winning percentage in two-plus seasons with Oakland is the best in Athletics history among pitchers with 30 or more decisions...led the A's in wins for the second consecutive season (had 15 in 2019)...also led the club in most hits allowed (65) and tied for the team lead in games started... the A's went 8-3 (.727) in his starting assignments and are 38-15 (.717) when he starts in his career...went 1-1 with a 6.86 ERA and six home runs allowed over his first four starts but was 5-2 with a 3.43 ERA and three home runs over his final seven starts...had 37 strikeouts in 59.0 innings and his average of 5.64 strikeouts per nine was a career-low (6.04 in 2013) and fourth lowest in the majors among pitchers with at least 50 innings.

2020 OPPONENTS BATTING: His .275 opponents batting average broke down to .244 (29-for-119) with a .730 OPS against left-handed hitters compared to .308 (36-for-117) with an .806 OPS against right-handers...issued 11 of his 16 walks to lefties...held the opposition to a .196 batting average with runners in scoring position, including .091 with RISP and two outs...now has a .186 (77-for-414) opponents average with RISP and two outs in his career.. had a .209 opponents batting average and one home run allowed the first time through the lineup, .317 with eight home runs after that...opponents hit .333 when leading off an inning but he walked just three...allowed a .337 batting average and seven of his nine home runs with no outs, .278 with one out and .197 with two outs...the opponents number three hitter went 5-for-29 (.172) but the clean-up hitter was 11-for-27 (.407).

2020 HOME AND AWAY: Went 2-1 with a 6.20 ERA in four starts in Oakland and 4-2 with a 3.72 ERA in seven starts on the road...tied for the third most road wins in the majors...however, since joining the A's on Aug. 6, 2018, he is 14-2 with a 3.10 ERA (53 er in 153.2 ip) and .226 (127-for-562) opponents batting average in 26 starts in the Coliseum compared to 12-7 with a 4.97 ERA (79 er in 143.0 ip) and .269 (149-for-554) opponent average in 28 games at all other ballparks...is 15-4 with a 3.39 ERA (69 er in 183.0 ip) and .230 (154-for-669) opponents batting average in 32 career games, including 31 starts, in the Coliseum...the 15 wins are his most in any ballpark.

2020 BY INNING: Allowed two runs in the first inning and one in the second and had a 1.23 ERA and .167 opponents batting average over the first two innings of a game...yielded 11 of his 31 runs in the third inning and had a 6.57 ERA and .329 opponents average from the third inning on.

2020 BY DIVISION: Went 2-2 with a 3.27 ERA in four interleague starts compared to 4-1 with a 5.35 ERA in seven starts against the American League West...is now 4-2 with a 2.14 ERA (10 er in 42.0 ip) in seven career interleague starts with the A's and is 9-7 with a 2.87 ERA (45 er in 141.1 ip) and .223 (115for-515) opponents average in 26 career interleague appearances...is 18-16 with a 5.52 ERA (200 er in 326.1 ip) in 62 career appearances against AL West teams compared to 57-46 with a 3.46 ERA (313 er in 815.1 ip) in 154 games against all other opponents.

2020 THIS AND THAT: Was 6-1 with a 4.38 ERA in seven starts on four days rest, 0-2 with a 4.95 ERA in four starts on five days rest or more...had a run support average of 7.02, which ranked eighth highest in the majors among pitchers with 50 or more innings...induced just one double play and his av erage of 0.15 GIDP per nine innings was third lowest...tossed six innings or fewer in all 11 of his starts and struck out four or fewer nine times.

2020 HIGHLIGHTS: Started the A's third game of the season on July 26 against Los Angeles (AL) and had a no decision in the A's 6-4 win...did not walk or strikeout a batter in 4.0 innings...it was his first career start with no walks and no strikeouts...allowed a season-high seven hits (first of six times). tossed a season-high 6.0 innings in his second start on Aug. 1 at Seattle, a no decision in a 3-2 A's win...it was his first of six starts of 6.0 innings... had season-highs in runs (5) and home runs (3) and a season-low in innings pitched (3.2) on Aug. 11 at Los Angeles (AL) for his first loss...that gave him a 1-1 record and a 6.86 ERA over his first four starts...then won each of his next three starts from Aug. 16-26 (2.60 ERA)...walked a season-high three batters Aug. 21 against Los Angeles (AL)...struck out a season-high seven Aug. 26 at Texas...finished August 4-1 with a 4.36 ERA in six starts...tied for second in the majors in wins in August...it is the fifth time in his career he has won four games in a month, the fourth time in August (2012, 2014, 2019)...is now 24-10 with a 3.80 ERA in 45 career games in August...has no more than 14 wins in any other month...then went 2-2 with a 4.09 ERA in four starts in September...is now 10-16 with a 5.49 ERA in 40 career games in September... the losses are his most in any month and the ERA is second highest to his 5.68 in April...had his three-game winning streak snapped in the A's 5-3 loss to San Diego on Sept. 6...it also snapped a nine-game home winning streak, which tied for ninth longest in Oakland history...it was the longest by a starting pitcher since Mark Mulder had a 10-game streak from July 31, 2002-June 19, 2003...it was his first loss at home since April 20, 2019 vs. Toronto and he compiled a 2.99 ERA and .227 opponents batting average during the winning streak, which spanned 16 starts from May 7, 2019 to Aug. 21, 2020...then won each of his next two starts, including Sept. 11 at Texas when he tossed a season-high 100 pitches...made his second career postseason appearance and his first start in Game 3 of the ALWCS against Chicago and had a no decision in the A's 6-4 win (1.2 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 2 so)...was on the A's roster for the ALDS against Houston but did not pitch.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Jesús Luzardo (1-2, 5.40 ERA): Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...has a 5.40 ERA over his first five starts but the A's are 3-2 (.600) in his starting assignments...are now 9-5 (.643) when he starts in his career...is 1-1 with a 4.02 ERA in three starts at home compared to 0-1 with a 7.71 ERA in two starts on the road...has allowed five home runs, all to right-handed hitters...has surrendered 14 of his 15 career home runs to right-handers...was the losing pitcher in his last start, an 8-1 A's loss at Baltimore last Sunday (6.2 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 8 so)...it was his first career appearance against the Orioles...was 1-1 with a 4.22 ERA in three starts this spring...allowed a .205 opponents batting average but issued four walks in 10.2 innings...did not allow a run in two of his three starts...went 3-2 with a 4.12 ERA in 12 games, including nine starts, in his rookie campaign last year...ranked second among Major League rookies in strikeouts (59) and innings pitched (59.0).

- Was reinstated from the injured list April 20 and pitched for the first time since his return Tuesday night, tossing a scoreless ninth inning.
- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and allowed eight runs on nine hits in 2.2 innings over three appearances before he was placed on the IL April 6 with a sprained left thumb sustained while covering first base.
- Has allowed a hit to the first batter he has faced in all four of his appearances.
- Has faced Baltimore twice in his career, last in 2019 while with the Astros...has a 13.50 ERA (2 er, 1.1 ip) in those two outings.
- Was signed to a minor league contract Dec. 4 and was a non-roster invitee...compiled a 0.96 ERA in nine relief appearances this spring...opponents were 3-for-29 (.103) with one walk in 9.1 innings.

Last Year: Was a non-roster invitee with the Los Angeles Dodgers and had a loss and a 3.00 ERA in six spring training appearances...was not added to the Dodgers 60-man player pool and did not pitch in 2020.

- Walked a career-high four batters Sunday at Baltimore...had just two career outings with more than one walk prior to that (both two walks)...was charged with five runs (two earned) in 0.2 innings, which were the second most of his career (6, July 30, 2015 at Cincinnati).
- Left-handed hitters are 1-for-15 (.067) this year and are 2-for-28 (.071) over the last two years.
- Had his streak of consecutive batters retired snapped at 15 on Saturday when he allowed a two-out single to Hays in the ninth.
- Has faced Baltimore five times in his career, including twice last week... has a 7.94 ERA (5 er, 5.2 ip) in those five outings.
