OAKLAND ATHLETICS (16-11) VS. BALTIMORE ORIOLES (12-14)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost four of the last six games after winning 13 in a row...are 16-5 over the last 21 games after starting the season 0-6...are 16-11 (.593) overall, which is the third best record in the American League...went from sole possession of last place in the AL West on April 11 to sole possession of first on April 21 and have held at least a share of first place for each of the last 11 days...currently have a one-game lead, which is one short of the season high of two...have spent nine days alone in first place this year, two days tied for first, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth...had a season-high 13-game winning streak snapped last Sunday at Baltimore...the streak was third longest in Oakland history, tied for fifth longest in Athletics history and the longest by a Major League team since Cleveland won 22 straight from Aug. 24-Sept. 14, 2017.

CLOSE CALLS: Lost 3-2 last night and each of the A's last five games have been decided by two runs or fewer...four of those games have been one-run decisions and Oakland is now 6-2 (.750) in one-run games, which is tied with the Pirates for the second best record in the majors to the Royals (6-1, .857)...are 9-3 (.750) in games decided by three runs or fewer, which is second best to Kansas City (10-3, .769)...are 2-0 in extra innings and are now 8-1 in extra innings over the last two years...have three walk-off wins, which are tied with the Nationals for the most in the majors...are 4-0 in games decided in the last at bat...are 10-0 when leading after six innings after going 25-0 last year...have now won 47 consecutive games when leading after six innings dating back to Sept. 7, 2019, which matches the longest such streak in Athletics history (47, July 21, 1927 to May 16, 1928).

IN APRIL: The A's finished April with a 16-11 record, which was their best mark in April since 2014 when they went 18-9...A's pitchers set an Athletics record for strikeouts in April with 233...A's batters set Athletics records for hit by pitches (19) and strikeouts (244)...hit .214, which was fourth lowest in Oakland history in April and the lowest since 2012 (.211)...stole 19 bases, which were the A's most in any month since April of 2014 when they also had 19.

OFFENSE: The A's have scored three runs or fewer in each of the last six games and are batting .176 (33-for-187) with 14 walks (.240 on-base percentage) and 11 runs scored over that span...are now batting .214 for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...have the fifth lowest on-base percentage (.301)...lead the league in hit by pitches (19), are tied for second in stolen bases (19), rank third in walks (92) and triples (5) and tied for third in home runs (33)...A's pinch hitters are 8-for-24 (.333) with a home run, five RBI and a walk...the eight pinch hits are the most in the AL and more than eight National League teams...also lead the AL in pinch RBI and plate appearances (25) and have one of two pinch home runs...the A's are 3-for-18 (.167) with the bases loaded, which is the lowest batting average in the AL and third lowest in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.40 ERA (32 er in 120.0 ip) over the last 14 games dating back to April 16 after logging a 5.85 ERA over the first 13 contests...are tied for the American League lead in shutouts (4) but have the second highest opponents batting average (.255), third highest slugging percentage (.416) and fourth highest OPS (.735) and on-base percentage (.320).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 1-4 with a 3.53 ERA (14 er in 35.2 ip) over the last six games...however, are 10-4 with a 3.12 ERA (35 er in 101.0 ip) over the last 18 games after going 0-8 with a 7.05 ERA over the first nine contests...are 10-11 with a 4.32 ERA overall...rank second in the American League in both wins and losses and have the most innings pitched (145.2)...have walked two batters or fewer in each of the last 16 games (19 bb in 90.0 ip, 1.90 per nine innings)...have tossed seven innings or fewer in each game and six innings or fewer in 25 of 27 games...now have a streak of 95 consecutive games of seven innings or fewer, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history...the last A's starter to toss more than seven innings is Mike Fiers on Sept. 20, 2019 (8.0 ip)...also have an Athletics record streak of 203 games of eight innings or fewer and have not had a pitcher toss more than eight innings since Frankie Montas on May 17, 2019 at Detroit (8.2).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has allowed just one run in the last five games (14.0 ip, 0.64 ERA)...has compiled a 1.69 ERA (9 er in 48.0 ip) and .199 (35-for-176) opponents batting average over the A's last 16 games and has yielded just two home runs...posted a 6.02 ERA and .275 opponents average over the first 11 contests and surrendered seven home runs...has converted each of its six save opportunities and the A's and Yankees are the only teams in the majors without a blown save...has a 6-0 record and Oakland is the only team in the majors without a loss from its bullpen...has allowed 14-of-35 (40.0%) inherited runners to score, which is tied for the third highest percentage in

the American League...has the highest batting average (.316), on-base percentage (.416) and slugging percentage (.632) against first batters faced.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have gone three straight games without an error after making seven errors over the previous seven contests...have 12 errors for the season, which is tied for third fewest in the American League...rank third in fielding percentage (.987)...however, have -14 defensive runs saved, which is second fewest in the majors to the Cubs (-17)...A's pitchers are tied for second in the AL in pickoffs (2)...A's opponents have been successful in just 10-of-14 (71.4%) stole base attempts, which is fourth lowest in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on this season-long 10-game homestand against Baltimore (0-1), Toronto (four games) and Tampa Bay (three games)...had their eight-game home winning streak snapped last night and are now 8-7 (.533) at home for the season...went 4-3 on the last road trip to Baltimore (2-1) and Tampa Bay (2-2) and are now 8-4 (.667) on the road, which is tied with the Orioles for the second best road record in the American League...have compiled a 4.74 ERA (70 er in 133.0 ip) in Oakland compared to 3.29 (38 er in 104.0 ip) on the road...are batting .203 (94-for-462) at home compared to .226 (91-for-403) on the road.

THIS AND THAT: The A's had the first successful replay challenge of the season last night and are now 1-4 in replay challenges...have used the same lineup in back-to-back games for the first time this year...have used 25 different lineups over the first 27 games...are 13-0 when out-homering the opposition and 1-9 when they are out-homered...although Oakland has the third best record in the American League, they have been out-scored 115-111 for a run differential of -4...have an average time of game of 2:51 over the last 14 games after averaging 3:22 over the first 13.

THE SCHEDULE: Last night began a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 20 of 29 games at home and 35 of 44 in the Pacific Time Zone...are 0-1 over that span...began a stretch of 17 consecutive days without a scheduled day off April 23 are 4-4 over the first eight games...also began a stretch of 20 consecutive games against American League East competition April 23.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list seven times this year and currently have four players on the IL (Pinder, Puk, Rosenthal, Smith)...used the IL just eight times all last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4)...used it 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest in the majors.

A's vs. ORIOLES: The season series is even at two games each...the A's lost the first game in Oakland last night after winning two of three in Baltimore last weekend...had their seven-game Coliseum winning streak snapped last night and are now 31-13 (.705) against Baltimore at home dating back to 2008...had their eight-game winning streak against the Orioles snapped last Sunday are 13-4 against Baltimore over the last four years...won the season series in 2019, 6-1...went 3-0 in Oakland and 3-1 in Baltimore...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 276-269 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 139-136 in Oakland and 137-133 in Baltimore...are 70-59 at Camden Yards...are 1013-948 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...the only other of the other seven original American League franchises that the A's have a winning record against is the Twins/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha leads the American League with 24 runs scored, which tied the Athletics record for runs scored in the month of April (Coco Crisp, 2013)...**Matt Chapman** has a 22-game errorless streak and leads Major League third basemen with a .989 fielding percentage...also ranks first in total chances (94), putouts (35), assists (58) and double plays (9)...**Jake Diekman** has not allowed a run in his last eight games (8.2 ip, 3 h, 2 bb, 10 so)...**Matt Olson** ranks ninth in the American League in slugging percentage (.580)...**Yusmeiro Petit** has an eight-game, 10.0-inning scoreless streak and not allowed a run in 11 of his last 12 games (14.0 ip, 9 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 11 so, 0.64 ERA).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1925** Jimmie Foxx makes his major league debut at the age of 17 with a pinch hit single...in **1991** Rickey Henderson become's baseball's all-time stolen base leader with his 939th career steal...he steals third base with a 1-0 count on Jose Canseco in the fourth inning...the steal comes against the New York Yankees, with whom he stole 326 bases...in **1992** Rickey Henderson steals the 1000th base of his career at Detroit, one year after breaking Lou Brock's all-time record...in **1993** Rickey Henderson's third inning single is his 1356th hit as an Athletic which passes Bert Campaneris for first place on the all-time Oakland hit list.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesús Luzardo (1-2, 5.40 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...has a 5.40 ERA over his first five starts but the A's are 3-2 (.600) in his starting assignments...are now 9-5 (.643) when he starts in his career.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-1 with a 4.02 ERA (7 er in 15.2 ip) in three starts at home compared to 0-1 with a 7.71 ERA (8 er in 9.1 ip) in two starts on the road...last year, he went 3-1 with a 2.40 ERA, .215 opponents batting average and .595 OPS in eight games, six starts, at home compared to 0-1 with an 8.15 ERA, .338 opponents average and 1.032 OPS in four games, three starts, on the road...allowed three home runs in 41.1 innings at home, six in 17.2 innings on the road...is now 4-2 with a 2.79 ERA (18 er in 58.0 ip) in 12 career appearances in the Coliseum, 0-2 with a 6.16 ERA (26 er in 38.0 ip) in 11 games on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed five home runs, all to right-handed hitters...has surrendered 14 of his 15 career home runs to right-handers with the only home run by a left-hander coming on Sept. 14, 2020 at Seattle (Marmolejos)...opponents are batting .308 (12-for-39) with runners on base but that mark drops to .211 (4-for-19) with runners in scoring position.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in each of his five starts and has five runs of support in 25.0 innings overall (1.80 RSA)...last year, he received no run support in three of his starts and had two runs of support or fewer in six of his nine starts...had 22 runs of support in 12 games and 59.0 innings overall...his season run support average of 3.36 was ninth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 50 or more innings pitched.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-5 loss to Houston on April 2 in Oakland...struck out a career-high eight batters...allowed a three-run home run to Bregman in the third inning and surrendered two more runs in the fourth on a Gurriel home run and a Brantley RBI double.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 10-inning win over Los Angeles (NL) in Oakland on April 7...tossed a career-high 104 pitches and issued a career-high four walks...allowed a RBI single to Pollock in the first inning but then retired 12 of 13 hitters at one point from the second through sixth innings...was relieved by Kolarek with runners on first and second and one out in the sixth with the scored tied 1-1 and Kolarek allowed one of the runs to score.

THIRD START: He had his second consecutive no decision in an A's win, a 7-5 victory at Arizona on April 13...retired the side in order in the first inning but then allowed three runs in the second and two more in the third and lasted just 2.2 innings...it was the shortest start of his career...allowed a three-run home run to Kelly in the second and a RBI double to Cabrera and a RBI groundout by Peralta in the third...left trailing 5-0 but the A's scored seven unanswered runs for the win.

FOURTH START: He combined with Trivino and Diekman on a two-hit shutout in the A's 1-0 win over Minnesota in the second game of the doubleheader April 20 in Oakland...tossed 5.1 innings and allowed two of the hits while walking just one...allowed a one-out single to Donaldson in the first and then retired 11 straight before Polanco singled with one out in the fifth...did not allow a base runner past first base while he was in the game.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-1 loss at Baltimore last Sunday...struck out a career-high tying eight batters in 6.2 innings (also April 2 of this year vs. Houston)...allowed three runs on a solo home run by Hays in the second and a two-run home run by Hays in the fourth...was relieved by Romo with two outs in the seventh inning, runners on first and second, and the A's trailing 3-1.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Was 1-1 with a 4.22 ERA (10.2 ip, 8 h, 6 r, 5 er, 4 bb, 11 so, 1 hr) in three starts this spring...allowed a .205 opponents batting average but issued four walks in 10.2 innings...did not allow a run in two of his three starts...is now 4-1 with a 1.82 ERA (7 er in 34.2 ip) and .195 (24-for-123) opponents batting average in 13 career spring training appearances (10 starts).

2020 RECAP: Went 3-2 with a 4.12 ERA in 12 games, including nine starts, in his rookie campaign...ranked second among Major League rookies in strikeouts (59) and innings pitched (59.0), tied for fifth in games and tied for ninth in wins and games started...walked just 17 batters in 59.0 innings (2.59 per nine innings)...walked two batters or fewer in 11 of his 12 appearances in 2020 and **21 of 23** in his career...however, surrendered nine home runs, which tied for fifth most among ML rookies.

2020 OPPONENTS BATTING: Had a .257 opponents batting average, which broke down to .256 (45-for-176) against right-handed hitters compared to .260 (13-for-50) against left-handers...surrendered eight of his nine home runs and issued 15 of his 17 walks to righties...six of his nine home runs were solo shots...his opponents average increased to .317 with runners in scoring position, including .421 with RISP and two outs...opponents hit .322 when leading off an inning but he walked just three...has walked just **seven** batters to lead off an inning in his career...had a .228 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .280 with six of his nine home runs after that.

2020 BY INNING: Allowed 12 of his 27 runs in the fourth and fifth innings...had a 2.67 ERA over the first three innings of a game and a 6.89 ERA in the fourth and fifth...had a 3.86 ERA from the sixth inning on, which includes his relief appearances.

2020 STARTING AND RELIEVING: Pitched in relief in his first two appearances of the season, made nine consecutive starts from Aug. 4 to Sept. 19 and then pitched in relief in his final outing...was 3-2 with a 3.83 ERA in his nine starts, 0-0 with a 5.59 ERA in three relief appearances...the A's were 6-3 (.667) in his starting assignments...first batters faced were 2-for-3 (.667) with a double in his three relief appearances.

2020 AMERICAN LEAGUE AND NATIONAL LEAGUE: Was 1-1 with a 3.09 ERA in six games against the American League West compared to 2-1 with a 5.33 ERA in six games against National League West...the six interleague games were the first of his career...is 2-3 with a 3.10 ERA (21 er in 61.0 ip) in 15 career games against the AL.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
LHP Sean Manaea (3-1, 2.83 ERA): Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...is 3-0 with a 1.50 ERA (4 er in 24.0 ip) over his last four starts after allowing five runs on six hits in 4.2 innings in his first start, a loss...is tied for seventh in the American League in wins and ranks 10th in ERA (2.83)...has walked two batters or fewer in each of his last four starts and has walked seven in 28.2 innings overall (2.20 per nine innings)...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 2-1 A's win at Tampa Bay last Monday (5.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 6 so)...was the losing pitcher in his only career start against Baltimore, a 12-5 A's loss in Oakland on Aug. 12, 2017 (0.1 ip, 6 h, 6 r, 6 er, 1 bb, 0 so)...went 3-1 with a 5.28 ERA and .250 opponents batting average in four starts this spring...was 4-3 with a 4.50 ERA in 11 starts last year...the ERA was the highest of his career as was his .270 opponents batting average...went 4-1 with a 2.65 ERA and .234 opponents batting average over his final six starts.

- Has not allowed a run in his last eight games (8.2 ip, 3 h, 2 bb, 10 so) after yielding four runs over his first three contests.
- Has two saves, which are his first since June 20, 2018 for Texas against Kansas City...now has nine saves in his career.
- Has yielded a .115 (3-for-26) average against right-handed hitters compared to .333 (5-for-15) against left-handers.
- Has not allowed a run in four day games (4.1 ip) and has not allowed a run during the day since Sept. 1, 2019 vs. New York (AL)...has an 18-game, 18.2-inning scoreless streak during the day.
- Has faced Baltimore six times in his career, and is 1-0 with 1.80 ERA (1 er, 5.0 ip) and a save...the save came last week when he threw a scoreless inning in a 3-1 A's win.

Last Year: Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)

61 LHP REYMIN GUDUAN

Last Outing: 4/27 at Tampa Bay (ND, 1.0 ip, 1 h, 0 r, 0 er, 0 bb, 1 so)

Saves/Opportunities: 0-0

Inherited Runners/Scored: 0/0 **First Hitters:** 4-4

- Was reinstated from the injured list April 20 and pitched for the first time since his return Tuesday night, tossing a scoreless ninth inning.
- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and allowed eight runs on nine hits in 2.2 innings over three appearances before he was placed on the IL April 6 with a sprained left thumb sustained while covering first base.
- Has allowed a hit to the first batter he has faced in all four of his appearances.
- Has faced Baltimore twice in his career, last in 2019 while with the Astros...has a 13.50 ERA (2 er, 1.1 ip) in those two outings.
- Was signed to a minor league contract Dec. 4 and was a non-roster invitee...compiled a 0.96 ERA in nine relief appearances this spring...opponents were 3-for-29 (.103) with one walk in 9.1 innings.

Last Year: Was a non-roster invitee with the Los Angeles Dodgers and had a loss and a 3.00 ERA in six spring training appearances...was not added to the Dodgers 60-man player pool and did not pitch in 2020.

65 RHP DEOLIS GUERRA

Last Outing: 4/30 vs. Baltimore (ND, 1.0 ip, 2 so)

Saves/Opportunities: 0-0

Inherited Runners/Scored: 0/0 **First Hitters:** 3-8

- Walked a career-high four batters Sunday at Baltimore...had just two career outings with more than one walk prior to that (both two walks)...was charged with five runs (two earned) in 0.2 innings, which were the second most of his career (6, July 30, 2015 at Cincinnati).
- Left-handed hitters are 1-for-17 (.059) this year and are 2-for-30 (.067) over the last two years.
- Had his streak of consecutive batters retired snapped at 15 on Saturday when he allowed a two-out single to Hays in the ninth.
- Has faced Baltimore six times in his career, including twice last week...has a 6.75 ERA (5 er, 6.2 ip) in those five outings.
- Was selected from the A's alternate site April 8.

Last Year: Was on the Opening Day roster and appeared in nine games for Philadelphia in 2020 and went 1-3 with an 8.59 ERA (7 er in 7.1 ip)...struck out eight batters and walked two.

36 RHP YUSMEIRO PETIT

Last Outing: 4/30 vs. Baltimore (ND, 1.0 ip, 2 h, so)

Saves/Opportunities: 0-0

Inherited Runners/Scored: 8/4 **First Hitters:** 4-11, 3 bb

- Has an eight-game, 10.0-inning scoreless streak and has not allowed a run in 11 of his last 12 games (14.0 ip, 9 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 11 so, 0.64 ERA).
- Has stranded all four of his inherited runners over his last 12 games after allowing all four to score over his first two contests.
- Is tied for the American League lead in games pitched (14)...is tied with Kittredge (TB) for the lead among AL relievers in wins (3) and is second in innings pitched (16.1).
