## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (16-12) VS. BALTIMORE ORIOLES (13-14)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have lost two straight and four of the last five games and are now 2-5 since winning 13 consecutive games...are 16-6 over the last 22 games after starting the season 0-6...are 16-12 (.571) overall, which is the fourth best record in the American League...went from sole possession of last place in the AL West on April 11 to sole possession of first on April 21 and have held at least a share of first place for each of the last 12 days... have spent 10 days alone in first place this year, two days tied for first, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth...had a season-high 13-game winning streak snapped a week ago today at Baltimore...the streak was third longest in Oakland history, tied for fifth longest in Athletics history and the longest by a Major League team since Cleveland won 22 straight from Aug. 24-Sept. 14, 2017.

**OFFENSE:** The A's have scored four runs or fewer in each of the last seven games and are batting .185 (41-for-222) with 19 walks (.254 on-base percentage) and 15 runs scored over that span...are now batting .214 for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...have the fifth lowest on-base percentage (.302)...lead the league in hit by pitches (19), rank second in stolen bases (20), third in walks (97) and triples (5) and fourth in home runs (35)...A's pinch hitters are 8-for-25 (.320) with a home run, five RBI and a walk...the eight pinch hits are the most in the AL and more than eight National League teams...also lead the AL in pinch RBI and plate appearances (26) and have one of two pinch home runs...the A's are 3-for-18 (.167) with the bases loaded, which is the second lowest batting average in the majors to the Padres (.143).

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 2.58 ERA (37 er in 129.0 ip) over the last 15 games dating back to April 16 after logging a 5.85 ERA over the first 13 contests...are tied for the American League lead in shutouts (4) but have the second highest opponents batting average (.256), third highest OPS (.735) and on-base percentage (.321) and fourth highest slugging percentage (.414).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 0-4 with a 4.33 ERA (13 er in 27.0 ip) over the last five games...went 0-7 with a 7.91 ERA over the first eight games and were 10-1 with a 2.82 ERA in 15 games in between...are 10-12 with a 4.42 ERA overall...have the second most losses in the American League but are tied for the second most wins...have the second highest OPS (.768)...lead the AL and rank fourth in the majors in innings pitched (148.2)... have walked two batters or fewer in each of the last 17 games (21 bb in 93.0 ip, 2.03 per nine innings)...have tossed seven innings or fewer in each game and six innings or fewer in 26 of 28 games...now have a streak of 96 consecutive games of seven innings or fewer, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history...the last A's starter to toss more than seven innings is Mike Fiers on Sept. 20, 2019 (8.0 ip)...also have an Athletics record streak of 204 games of eight innings or fewer and have not had a pitcher toss more than eight innings since Frankie Montas on May 17, 2019 at Detroit (8.2).

**BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen has compiled a 1.83 ERA (11 er in 54.0 ip) and .202 (40-for-198) opponents batting average over the A's last 17 games and has yielded just three home runs...posted a 6.02 ERA and .275 opponents average over the first 11 contests and surrendered seven home runs...has converted each of its six save opportunities and the A's and Yankees are the only teams in the majors without a blown save...has a 6-0 record and Oakland is the only team in the majors without a loss from its bullpen...has allowed 14-of-35 (40.0%) inherited runners to score, which is tied for the third highest percentage in the American League...has the highest batting average (.300), on-base percentage (.398) and slugging percentage (.600) against first batters faced.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's committed a season-high tying two errors yesterday and now have nine errors over the last 11 games...have 14 errors for the season, which is tied for fourth fewest in the American League...rank third in fielding percentage (.986)...however, have -18 defensive runs saved, which is the fewest in the majors (Cubs, -17)...A's pitchers are tied for third in the AL in pickoffs (2)...A's opponents have been successful in just 10-of-14 (71.4%) stole base attempts, which is fifth lowest in the AL.

**CLOSE CALLS:** Four of the A's last six games have been decided by one-run... are 2-2 in those games and 6-2 (.750) in one-run games for the season, which is the second best record in the American League (Royals, 6-1)...are 9-3 (.750) in games decided by three runs or fewer, which is also second best to Kansas City (10-3, .769)...are 2-0 in extra innings and are now 8-1 in extra innings over the last two years...have three walk-off wins, which are tied with the Nationals for the most in the majors...are 4-0 in games decided in the last at

bat...are 10-0 when leading after six innings after going 25-0 last year...have now won 47 consecutive games when leading after six innings dating back to Sept. 7, 2019, which matches the longest such streak in Athletics history (47, July 21, 1927 to May 16, 1928).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 0-2 on this season-long 10-game homestand against Baltimore (0-2), Toronto (four games) and Tampa Bay (three games)... had their eight-game home winning streak snapped Friday night and are now 8-8 (.500) at home for the season...went 4-3 on the last road trip to Baltimore (2-1) and Tampa Bay (2-2) and are now 8-4 (.667) on the road, which is the third best road record in the American League...have compiled a 4.75 ERA (75 er in 142.0 ip) in Oakland compared to 3.29 (38 er in 104.0 ip) on the road...are batting .205 (102-for-497) at home compared to .226 (91-for-403) on the road.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's out-homered Baltimore 2-1 yesterday but lost...it was their first loss of the season when out-homering their opponent...are 13-1 when out-homering the opposition and 1-9 when they are out-homered... have two successful replay challenges in the last two games after going 0-4 over the first 26 contests...although Oakland has the fourth best record in the American League, they have been out-scored 123-115 for a run differential of -8...have an average time of game of 2:53 over the last 15 games after averaging 3:22 over the first 13.

**THE SCHEDULE:** Friday night began a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 20 of 29 games at home and 35 of 44 in the Pacific Time Zone...are 0-2 over that span...began a stretch of 17 consecutive days without a scheduled day off April 23 are 4-5 over that span...also began a stretch of 20 consecutive games against American League East competition April 23.

**THE INJURED LIST:** The A's have used the injured list eight times this year, which matches their total from the entire 2020 season when they had the second fewest IL placements in the majors to Cleveland (4)...currently have five players on the IL (Pinder, Puk, Rosenthal, Smith, Wendelken)...used the IL just 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest in the majors.

**IN APRIL:** The A's finished April with a 16-11 record, which was their best mark in April since 2014 when they went 18-9...A's pitchers set an Athletics record for strikeouts in April with 233...A's batters set Athletics records for hit by pitches (19) and strikeouts (244)...hit .214, which was fourth lowest in Oakland history in April and the lowest since 2012 (.211)...stole 19 bases, which were the A's most in any month since April of 2014 when they also had 19.

**A's vs. ORIOLES:** The A's are 2-3 in the season series entering the final game today...combined for an 11-2 record against the Orioles in 2018 and 2019 and have not lost the season series since going 3-4 in 2017...have lost the first two games in Oakland after winning two of three in Baltimore last weekend...have not been swept by the Orioles since Aug. 14-17, 2015 in a four-game series at Baltimore...have not been swept in Oakland since a three-game sweep on Aug. 15-17, 2005...are 31-14 (.689) against Baltimore at home dating back to 2008...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 276-270 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 139-137 in Oakland and 137-133 in Baltimore...are 70-59 at Camden Yards...are 1013-949 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...the only other of the other seven original American League franchises that the A's have a winning record against is the Twins/Senators.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Mark Canha** stole his fifth base of the season yesterday, which are his most since stealing seven bases in his rookie campaign of 2015...**Jake Diekman** has not allowed a run in his last eight games (8.2 ip, 3 h, 2 bb, 10 so)...**Yusmeiro Petit** has an eight-game, 10.0-inning scoreless streak and not allowed a run in 11 of his last 12 games (14.0 ip, 9 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 11 so, 0.64 ERA)...**Stephen Piscotty** extended his errorless streak to 209 games yesterday, which ties the Athletics record for an outfielder...shares the mark with Ryan Sweeney (Aug. 17, 2009-Sept. 14, 2011).

In **1975** Reggie Jackson collects his 1000th hit in an Oakland uniform in the A's 4-3 win at Chicago...in **2001** Mark Mulder tosses a three-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win over Toronto...Miguel Tejada homers twice and drives in four runs...in **2012** Brian Fuentes records the 200th save of his career in the A's 4-2 win at Boston...he becomes the sixth left-hander in Major League history to reach the 200 save plateau.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (3-1, 2.83 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...is 3-0 with a 1.50 ERA (4 er in 24.0 ip) over his last four starts after allowing five runs on six hits in 4.2 innings in his first start, a loss...is tied for eighth in the American League in wins (3) and ranks 10th in ERA (2.83)...the A's are 4-1 (.800) in his starting assignments and are 15-6 (.714) when he starts over the last three years.

**DON'T WALK:** Has walked two batters or fewer in each of his last four starts (4 bb in 24.0 ip, 1.50 per nine innings)...has one start with no walks and two others with one...has walked seven batters in 28.2 innings for the season (2.20 per nine innings)...over the last four years, he has walked two batters or fewer in 42 of his 48 starts (15 with no walks, 19 with one)...has 54 walks in 273.0 innings over that span, an average of 1.78 per nine innings.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has held left-handed hitters to a .120 (3-for-25) batting average compared to .286 (24-for-84) by right-handers...two of the three hits by lefties are home runs...opponents are 2-for-18 (.111) with runners in scoring position after hitting .375 with RISP last year.

**BY MONTH:** Went 3-1 with a 2.83 ERA in five starts in April...is now 8-4 with a 2.97 ERA and .189 opponents batting average in 16 career starts in the month of April...is 5-8 with a 5.79 ERA (53 er in 82.1 ip) in 15 career starts in May...his May ERA is his highest for any month (5.22 in August).

**FIRST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-2 loss to Houston on April 4 in Oakland...allowed a solo home run to Tucker in the first inning but the A's came back to tie the game in the bottom of the first...then allowed a two-run home run to Castro in the second and a two-run double to Gurriel in the third.

**SECOND START:** He had a no decision in the A's 6-2 win at Houston on April 9...blanked the Astros on three hits over the first three innings and allowed his only run in the fourth when Gurriel walked, went to third on a Correa single and scored on a Tucker ground out...was relieved by Petit to start the seventh inning with the score tied 1-1.

**THIRD START:** He picked up his first win of the season in the A's 8-4 victory over Detroit on April 15 in Oakland...it was the 100th game of his career...blanked the Tigers on two hits over the first three innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a RBI double to Castro in the fourth...Oakland built a 3-1 lead before he allowed his final run on a leadoff home run to Goodrum in the sixth...was relieved by Petit to start the seventh with the A's leading 7-2.

**FOURTH START:** He tossed a six-hit, seven-inning shutout in the A's 7-0 win over Minnesota in the first game of the doubleheader April 20 in Oakland...it was the 11th complete game shutout of fewer than eight innings in Oakland history (last: Mike Minor, Sept. 14, 2020 at Seattle)...it was his second career complete game and shutout, with the other being his no-hitter on April 21, 2018 against Boston...the start was the 100th of his career and he became the 25th pitcher in Oakland history to make 100 starts...did not walk a batter and struck out seven.

**LAST START:** He won his third consecutive start in the A's 2-1 win at Tampa Bay on Monday...allowed a leadoff single to Arozarena, who went to second on a ground out, stole third and scored on a Meadows sacrifice fly...that would be the only run he would allow in five innings of work...Oakland scored twice in the fourth for the win.

**MANAEA vs. BALTIMORE:** Was the losing pitcher in his only career start, a 12-5 A's loss in Oakland on Aug. 12, 2017...faced seven batters and allowed six hits and a walk while pitching a career-low 0.1 innings...six of the runners scored and he recorded his only out when Schoop was thrown out at the plate trying to score from first on a Jones double...became the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to face seven or more batters in a game and have each batter reach safely via hit or walk (8, Blake Stein on Aug. 31, 1998; 7, Craig Minetto on July 4, 1979; 7, Ken Holtzman on June 30, 1972).

**SPRING TRAINING RECAP:** Went 3-1 with a 5.28 ERA (15.1 ip, 15 h, 10 r, 9 er, 9 bb, 17 so) and .250 opponents batting average in four starts this spring...allowed five runs in 3.1 innings for the loss in his last start after allowing five runs in 12.0 innings over his first three starts, all wins...tied for second in the Cactus League in wins...led the A's in walks (9) and tied for the team lead in wins and starts.

**2020 RECAP:** Went 4-3 with a 4.50 ERA in 11 starts...the ERA was the highest of his career as was his .270 opponents batting average...his .427 slugging percentage matched his high...went 4-1 with a 2.65 ERA and .234 opponents batting average over his final six starts dating back to Aug. 20...the wins tied for fourth most in the majors over that span...went 0-2 with a 7.65 ERA and .325 opponents average over his first five starts...tied for the team lead in starts...walked just eight batters in 54.0 innings, an average of 1.33 walks per nine innings...that was the lowest mark of his career and was sixth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 50 or more innings pitched...struck out 45 for a career-best 5.63 strikeout-to-walk ratio...had five starts without a walk, five with one and three in his other.

**2020 THE FIRST THREE INNINGS:** Had a 2.56 ERA and .233 opponents batting average over the first three innings of his starts compared to a 7.59 ERA and .319 opponents average from the fourth inning on...in 21 starts over the last three seasons, he has a 2.15 ERA (15 er in 62.2 ip) and .225 (51-for-227) opponents batting average over innings 1-3 and a 4.53 ERA (25 er in 49.2 ip) and .254 (49-for-193) opponents average from the fourth inning on.

**2020 OPPONENTS BATTING:** His .270 opponents batting average broke down to .250 (13-for-52) against left-handed hitters compared to .277 (44-for-159) against right-handers...issued seven of eight walks to righties...had a .204 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .327 with seven of his eight walks after that...had a .281 batting average against batters leading off an inning but issued just one walk (.293 on-base percentage)...yielded a .222 average with the bases empty, .373 with runners on...opponents hit .375 with runners in scoring position and were 7-for-15 (.467) with RISP and two outs...entered the season with a .227 career opponents average with RISP, including .199 with RISP and two outs...allowed a .248 opponents average and four of his seven home runs with two strikes.

**2020 NIGHT AND DAY:** Went 2-1 with a 3.32 ERA and .182 opponents batting average in four starts during the day, 2-2 with a 5.29 ERA and .321 opponent average in seven starts at night...is now 18-6 with a 3.28 ERA (79 er in 217.0 ip) and .215 (173-for-806) opponents batting average in 37 career day games compared to 24-26 with a 4.11 ERA (164 er in 359.1 ip) and .266 (370-for-1390) opponents average in 65 career starts at night.

**2020 HOME AND AWAY:** Was 3-1 with a 3.91 ERA and .232 opponents batting average in five starts in Oakland, 1-2 with a 5.02 ERA and .302 opponents average in five starts on the road...is now 23-14 in his career in the Coliseum compared to 19-18 on the road.

**2020 AL AND NL:** Was 2-1 with a 3.33 ERA in five interleague starts compared to 2-2 with a 5.67 ERA in six starts against the American League...however, is 5-8 with a 4.03 ERA (46 er in 102.2 ip) in 19 career starts against the National League compared to 37-24 with a 3.74 ERA (197 er in 473.2 ip) in 83 games against the AL.

**2020 THIS AND THAT:** Was charged with five unearned runs, which tied for eighth most in the majors...tossed fewer than six innings in nine of his 11 starts...was 0-3 in four starts with two runs of support or fewer, 4-0 in seven starts with three or more...is now 5-30 in 50 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 37-2 in 51 starts with support of three or more.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
<b>RHP Frankie Montas (2-2, 6.20 ERA):</b> Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...is 0-1 with an 8.10 ERA (9 er in 10.0 ip) over his last two starts after going 2-0 with a 0.75 ERA (1 er in 12.0 ip) over his previous two starts...has allowed a .211 batting average with runners in scoring position...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 4-3 A's loss at Tampa Bay on Tuesday (6.0 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 5 so)...faced Toronto once in his career and it came in relief on June 7, 2017 in Oakland (0.2 ip, 2 h, 3 r, 3 er, 0 bb, 0 so, 2 hr...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-5 loss in 10 innings...went 0-1 with a 6.75 ERA and .290 opponents batting average in three Spring Training starts...was off to a strong start last year as he was 2-1 with a 1.57 ERA and .175 opponents average over his first four starts...was scratched from his start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness and went 1-4 with an 8.70 ERA and .321 opponents average over his final seven starts.
