OAKLAND ATHLETICS (17-12) VS. TORONTO BLUE JAYS (14-12)

ABOUT THE A'S: Lost two of three to Baltimore to start the homestand and are now 3-5 since winning 13 consecutive games...are 17-6 over the last 23 games after starting the season 0-6...are 17-12 (.586) overall, which is tied with the Red Sox for the second best record in the American League (Royals, 16-10)...went from sole possession of last place in the AL West on April 11 to sole possession of first on April 21 and have held at least a share of first place for each of the last 13 days...have spent 11 days alone in first place this year, two days tied for first, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's scored twice in the bottom of the eighth yesterday to defeat Baltimore 7-5...improved to 5-0 in games decided in the last at bat... are now 7-12 (.368) when trailing or tied after seven innings, which is the best record in the majors...six of the A's last seven games have been decided by two runs or fewer and Oakland is 9-3 (.750) in games decided by two runs or fewer for the season...are 6-2 (.750) in one-run games and both records are second best in the American League to Kansas City (8-2 in two or fewer, 6-1 in one-run)...are 2-0 in extra innings and are now 8-1 in extra innings over the last two years...have three walk-off wins, which are tied with the Nationals for the most in the majors...are 10-0 when leading after six innings after going 25-0 last year...have now won 47 consecutive games when leading after six innings dating back to Sept. 7, 2019, which matches the longest such streak in Athletics history (47, July 21, 1927 to May 16, 1928).

LEFT-HANDED STARTERS: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher for the fourth time in the last five games and the seventh time in the last 10 tonight...are 7-3 (.700) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed compared to 10-9 (.526) against right-handers...are tied with the Red Sox for the second best record against left-handed starters in the American League (White Sox, 5-1)...are batting .233 (70-for-300) against left-handed pitchers compared to .211 (134-for-634) against right-handers.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .203 (52-for-256) with 22 runs scored over the last eight games (2.8 runs per game) after hitting .260 with 75 runs over the prevous 12 contests (6.3 runs per game)...are batting .218 for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...lead the league in hit by pitches (21), are tied for second in home runs (37), rank third in stolen bases (20) and walks (101) and tied for third in triples (5)...A's pinch hitters are 8-for-26 (.308) with a home run, five RBI and a walk...the eight pinch hits are the most in the AL and more than seven National League teams...also lead the AL in pinch RBI and plate appearances (27) and have one of two pinch home runs...the A's are 3-for-18 (.167) with the bases loaded, which is the second lowest batting average in the majors to the Padres (.143).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.67 ERA (41 er in 138.0 ip) over the last 16 games dating back to April 16 after logging a 5.85 ERA over the first 13 contests...are tied for the American League lead in shutouts (4) but have the second highest opponents batting average (.256), third highest OPS (.734) and fourth highest on-base percentage (.320) and slugging percentage (.414)...have five wild pitches in the last two games and 19 for the season, which is the most in the majors.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 0-4 with a 4.78 ERA (17 er in 32.0 ip) over the last six games...went 0-7 with a 7.91 ERA over the first eight games and were 10-1 with a 2.82 ERA in 15 games in between...are 10-12 with a 4.51 ERA overall...have the second most losses in the American League but are tied for the second most wins...have the third highest OPS (.769)... lead the AL and rank fourth in the majors in innings pitched (153.2)...have walked two batters or fewer in each of the last 18 games (21 bb in 98.0 ip, 1.93 per nine innings)...have tossed seven innings or fewer in each game and six innings or fewer in 27 of 29 games...now have a streak of 97 consecutive games of seven innings or fewer, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history...the last A's starter to toss more than seven innings is Mike Fiers on Sept. 20, 2019 (8.0 ip)...also have an Athletics record streak of 205 games of eight innings or fewer and have not had a pitcher toss more than eight innings since Frankie Montas on May 17, 2019 at Detroit (8.2).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has a 7-0 record with seven saves and no blown saves...the A's are the only Major League team without a loss from its bullpen and are one of two without a blown save (Yankees)...the pen has a 1.71 ERA (11 er in 58.0 ip) and .201 (43-for-214) opponents batting average over the A's last 18 games dating back to April 13 and has yielded just three home runs...posted a 6.02 ERA and .275 opponents average over the first 11 contests and surrendered seven home runs...has allowed 14-of-35 (40.0%) inherited runners to score, which is tied for the third highest percentage in the American League...has the highest batting average (.298), on-base percentage (.392) and slugging percentage (.595) against first batters faced.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 10 errors over the last 12 games but have just 15 for the season, which is tied for third fewest in the American League...rank third in fielding percentage (.985)...however, have -17 defensive runs saved, which is the fewest in the majors (Cubs, -14)...A's pitchers are tied for third in the AL in pickoffs (2)...A's opponents have been successful in just 10-of-14 (71.4%) stole base attempts, which is fifth lowest in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-2 on this season-long 10-game homestand against Baltimore (1-2), Toronto (four games) and Tampa Bay (three games)... had their eight-game home winning streak snapped Friday night and are now 9-8 (.529) at home for the season...went 4-3 on the last road trip to Baltimore (2-1) and Tampa Bay (2-2) and are now 8-4 (.667) on the road, which is the second best road record in the American League...have compiled a 4.71 ERA (79 er in 151.0 ip) in Oakland compared to 3.29 (38 er in 104.0 ip) on the road...have the third highest home ERA in the AL and the fourth lowest road ERA.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 14-1 when out-homering the opposition and 1-9 when they are out-homered...have two successful replay challenges in the last three games after going 0-4 over the first 26 contests...although Oakland is tied for the second best record in the American League, they have been out-scored 128-122 for a run differential of -6...have an average time of game of 2:54 over the last 16 games after averaging 3:22 over the first 13.

THE SCHEDULE: Friday night began a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 20 of 29 games at home and 35 of 44 in the Pacific Time Zone...are 1-2 over that span...began a stretch of 17 consecutive days without a scheduled day off April 23 are 5-5 over that span...also began a stretch of 20 consecutive games against American League East competition April 23.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list nine times this year, which is one more than their total from the entire 2020 season when their eight placements were second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4)...currently have six players on the IL (Luzardo, Pinder, Puk, Rosenthal, Smith, Wendelken)...used the IL just 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest in the majors.

IN APRIL: The A's finished April with a 16-11 record, which was their best mark in April since 2014 when they went 18-9...A's pitchers set an Athletics record for strikeouts in April with 233...A's batters set Athletics records for hit by pitches (19) and strikeouts (244)...hit .214, which was fourth lowest in Oakland history in April and the lowest since 2012 (.211)...stole 19 bases, which were the A's most in any month since April of 2014 when they also had 19.

A's vs. BLUE JAYS: The A's and Blue Jays will play for the first time in over two years as they last met on April 28, 2019, a span of 736 days...went 0-6 against Toronto in 2019 as the A's were swept in a three-game series in both Oakland (April 19-21) and Toronto (April 26-28)...it was the fourth time in Oakland history the A's went winless against an American League team (0-7 vs. CLE in 1995, 0-6 vs. CLE in 1994, 0-11 vs. BAL in 1978)...went 7-0 against the Blue Jays in 2018...have won just one season series against the Blue Jays dating back to 2015 and are 13-19 over that span...are 224-201 all-time against the Blue Jays, including 112-100 in Oakland, 112-99 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas...are 71-67 (.514) in Rogers Centre.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha set the Oakland career record for hit by pitches yesterday with his 60th...is tied for the Major League lead in runs scored (26) and hit by pitches (7)...Yusmeiro Petit was credited with his fourth win of the season yesterday, which ties him for the American League lead...has a ninegame, 11.0-inning scoreless streak and not allowed a run in 12 of his last 13 games (15.0 ip, 10 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 11 so, 0.60 ERA)...Stephen Piscotty extended his errorless streak to 210 games yesterday, which set the Athletics record for an outfielder...broke the mark of 209 by Ryan Sweeney (Aug. 17, 2009-Sept. 14, 2011)...Lou Trivino collected his fifth save of the season yesterday, which surpasses his career high of four from his rookie campaign of 2018.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1980 Wayne Gross and Dwayne Murphy both steal home in the A's 5-3 win against Detroit...Murphy's comes as part of a triple steal with Gross and Mitchell Page...in 2000 the A's set an Oakland record with 10 hits and 21 total bases in the seventh inning in a 14-5 win at Kansas City...in 2019 Josh Phegley collects eight RBI in the A's 14-1 win at Pittsburgh to set an Athletics record for RBI by a catcher.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (2-2, 6.20 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...is 0-1 with an 8.10 ERA (9 er in 10.0 ip) over his last two starts after going 2-0 with a 0.75 ERA (1 er in 12.0 ip) over his previous two starts...the A's are 3-2 (.600) in his starting assignments.

THIS AND THAT: Has a .317 (20-for-63) opponents batting average and four of his six home runs allowed with the bases empty...however, opponents are hitting .238 (10-for-42 with runners on base, including .211 (4-for-19) with runners in scoring position...is 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA (4 er in 12.0 ip) in two starts on the road compared to 1-1 with a 9.24 ERA (13 er in 12.2 ip) in three starts at home.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-3 loss to Los Angeles (NL) on April 5 in Oakland...tossed 90 pitches in 2.2 innings, which were the most by an A's pitcher in an outing of fewer than three innings since pitch counts were tracked beginning in 1988...allowed four runs in the second inning on a McKinstry sacrifice fly and a three-run double by Seager...yielded three more runs in the third on a Smith home run, a McKinstry RBI single and a wild pitch.

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-3 win at Houston on April 10...it snapped a career-high three-game losing streak dating back to Sept. 13, 2020...shut out the Astros on five hits and a walk over the first six innings before allowing his only run on a leadoff home run to Tucker in the seventh...was relieved by Romo following the home run with the A's leading 6-0.

THIRD START: He won his second consecutive start when he combined with three A's relievers on a four-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win over Detroit on April 16 in Oakland...tossed six of the innings and allowed two of the hits (Grossman single in the third, Reyes single in the sixth)...also walked Castro in the first but did not allow a runners to advance past first base.

FOURTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 13-12, 10-inning win over Minnesota April 21 in Oakland...allowed three home runs in a start for the second time in his career (Sept. 22, 2020 vs. Los Angeles-NL)...surrendered a solo home run to Donaldson in the first but the A's scored three times in the second...then allowed three runs in the third on a Donaldson RBI single and a Cruz two-run home run...had a 7-4 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Cruz in the fifth...Buxton followed with a single and he was relieved by Wendelken with no outs in the fifth inning and the A's leading 7-5.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss at Tampa Bay last Tuesday...allowed a run in the first inning when Kiermaier led off with a triple and scored when Arozarena reached on a Machin error...Oakland scored single runs in the second and sixth innings to take a 2-1 lead but he allowed a two-run home run to Phillips in the bottom of the sixth for the loss.

MONTAS vs. TORONTO: Has faced the Blue Jays once in his career and it came in relief on June 7, 2017 in Oakland (0.2 ip, 2 h, 3 r, 3 er, 0 bb, 0 so, 2 hr...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-5 loss in 10 innings...came in to pitch the 10th inning and allowed a two-run home run to Donaldson and a solo home run to Smoak.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 0-1 with a 6.75 ERA (8.0 ip, 9 h, 6 r, 6 er, 4 bb, 8 so, 1 hr) and .290 opponents batting average in three Spring Training starts... left his final start on March 25 against Seattle with a cuticle tear on his right middle finger...tossed 3.0 scoreless innings in his first start but allowed six runs in 5.0 innings over his final two.

2020 RECAP: Was off to a strong start as he was 2-1 with a 1.57 ERA, .175 opponents batting average and no home runs over his first four starts...was scratched from his scheduled start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness and went 1-4 with an 8.70 ERA, .321 opponents average and 10 home runs over his final seven starts...went 3-5 with a 5.60 ERA in 11 starts overall...his ERA was eighth highest in the majors among pitchers with at least 50 innings pitched...had career highs in losses (5) and earned runs

(33) and matched his high in home runs (10), runs (35) and walks (23)...led the A's in strikeouts (60), losses, runs, home runs and walks.

2020 OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average broke down to .198 (22-for-111) against right-handed hitters compared to .350 (35-for-100) against left-handers...surrendered six of his 10 home runs and issued 15 of his 23 walks to lefties for a 1.061 OPS (.572 against right-handers)...had a .306 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .264 the second time and .205 after that...allowed a .133 average with two strikes and has a .172 career opponents average in that situation.

2020 HOME AND AWAY: Was 2-1 with a 2.56 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in six starts in Oakland, 1-4 with a 10.13 ERA and .330 opponents average in five starts on the road...surrendered just two home runs in 31.2 innings in Oakland compared to eight in 21.1 innings on the road...over the last three years, he is 7-2 with a 3.75 ERA (36 er in 86.1 ip) and eight home runs in 86.1 innings over 16 starts in Oakland, 7-7 with a 4.33 ERA (42 er in 87.1 ip) and 15 home runs in 87.1 innings over 16 starts on the road.

2020 NIGHT AND DAY: Made eight of his 11 starts during the day, which tied for the most in the majors...was 2-4 with a 6.16 ERA during the day, 1-1 with a 4.20 ERA at night...his career numbers are 8-9 with a 5.11 ERA (68 er in 119.2 ip) in 32 games during the day, 12-7 with a 3.85 ERA (71 er in 166.0 ip) in 43 contests at night.

2020 THE WEST AND THE REST: Was 3-2 with a 3.61 ERA and .236 opponents batting average in eight starts against American League West competition, 0-3 with a 13.50 ERA and .391 opponents average in three interleague starts...is now 11-5 with a 3.61 ERA (56 er in 139.2 ip) in 34 career appearances against AL West competition, 9-11 with a 5.12 ERA (83 er in 146.0 ip) in 40 games against all other teams...is 2-5 with an 8.38 ERA (36 er in 38.2 ip) in 11 career interleague appearances.

2020 THIS AND THAT: The A's were 6-5 (.545) in his starting assignments... had two starts of seven innings and five starts of fewer than five innings... went 2-2 with a 2.83 ERA in six starts on four days rest, 1-3 with an 11.00 ERA in five starts on five days rest or more...received two runs of support or fewer in nine of his 11 starts...had 10 of his 28 runs of support in one start on Aug. 3 at Seattle and had a 4.75 RSA for the season...won both of his starts with support of three or more runs and is now 13-1 in 17 career starts with at least three runs of support.

LHP Cole Irvin (2-3, 3.67 ERA): Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...is 2-1 with a 1.56 ERA (3 er in 17.1 ip) over his last three starts after going 0-2 with a 7.45 ERA over his first two...has 20 strikeouts 17.1 innings over his last three starts after fanning five in 10.0 innings over his first two...has walked one batter or fewer in each of his five starts this year and seven of eight in his career...has walked four batters in 27.0 innings this year (1.33 per nine innings) and 18 in 72.1 career innings (2.24 per nine innings)...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 2-0 A's loss at Tampa Bay last Wednesday (6.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 8 so)...has never faced the Blue Jays in his career...went 1-1 with a 1.00 ERA and .169 opponents batting average in five spring appearances, including three starts...walked just three batters in 18.0 innings and struck out 18...had two stints with Philadelphia last year and was 0-1 with a 17.18 ERA in three relief appearances.

- Has faced Toronto three times in his career, last in 2018 with Houston...
 has thrown 2.1 scoreless innings in those three appearances, including

- Was signed to a minor league contract Dec. 4 and was a non-roster invitee...compiled a 0.96 ERA in nine relief appearances this spring...opponents were 3-for-29 (.103) with one walk in 9.1 innings.

- Left-handed hitters are 1-for-19 (.053) this year and are 2-for-32 (.063) over the last two years.
- Had his streak of consecutive batters retired snapped at 15 on April 24 when he allowed a two-out single to Hays in the ninth.
- Has never faced Toronto in his career.
- Was selected from the A's alternate site April 8.

Last Year: Was on the Opening Day roster and appeared in nine games for Philadelphia in 2020 and went 1-3 with an 8.59 ERA (7 er in 7.1 ip)...struck out eight batters and walked two.
