OAKLAND ATHLETICS (18-12) VS. TORONTO BLUE JAYS (14-13)

TUESDAY, MAY 4, 2021 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:40 PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: After starting the season 0-6, the A's have won 18 of the last 24 games to improve to 18-12 (.600)...that is the best record in the American League and second best in the majors to the Giants (17-11, .607)...the six games over .500 are one short of the season high of seven (twice, last: 15-8 on April 26)...have matched the second best record by an A's team after 30 games over the last 31 years...the only better record was last year when the A's were 20-10...have won back-to-back games after losing four of the previous five contests and are now 4-5 since winning 13 consecutive games...are in first place in the AL West and have a season-high tying two game lead (fourth time, last: April 29)...went from sole possession of last place in the West on April 11 to sole possession of first on April 21 and have held at least a share of first place for each of the last 14 days...have spent 12 days alone in first place this year, two days tied for first, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's played their fifth one-run game in their last eight games last night and won...are now 7-2 (.778) in one-run games, which is the second best record in the majors to the Royals (6-1, .857)...seven of the last eight games have been decided by two runs or fewer and Oakland is a Major League best 10-3 (.769) in one- and two-run games...are 5-0 in games decided in the last at bat...have three walk-off wins, which are tied with the Nationals for the most in the majors...are 2-0 in extra innings and are 8-1 in extra innings over the last two years...are 11-0 when leading after six innings after going 25-0 last year...have now won 48 consecutive games when leading after six innings dating back to Sept. 7, 2019, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history (previous: 47, July 21, 1927 to May 16, 1928).

LEFT-HANDED STARTERS: Tonight, the A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher for the third consecutive game, fifth time in the last six games and eighth time in the last 11 contests...are 8-3 (.727) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed compared to 10-9 (.526) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League to the White Sox (5-1)...are batting .239 (79-for-331) with a .766 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .211 (134-for-634) with a .667 OPS against right-handers.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .213 (61-for-287) with 27 runs scored over the last nine games (3.0 runs per game) after hitting .260 with 75 runs over the previous 12 contests (6.3 runs per game)...are batting .221 for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...lead the league in hit by pitches (22), are tied for the lead in home runs (39), rank second in walks (105), third in stolen bases (20) and tied for third in triples (5)...A's pinch hitters are 8-for-26 (.308) with a home run, five RBI and a walk...the eight pinch hits are the most in the AL and more than seven National League teams...also lead the AL in pinch RBI and plate appearances (27) and have one of two pinch home runs...the A's are 3-for-18 (.167) with the bases loaded, which is the second lowest batting average in the majors to the Padres (.143).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.76 ERA (45 er in 147.0 ip) over the last 17 games dating back to April 16 after logging a 5.85 ERA over the first 13 contests...are tied for the American League lead in shutouts (4) but have the second highest opponents batting average (.256) and fourth highest OPS (.728), on-base percentage (.318) and slugging percentage (.410)...have six wild pitches in the last three games and 20 for the season, which is tied for the most in the majors.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 1-4 with a 4.74 ERA (20 er in 38.0 ip) over the last seven games...went 0-7 with a 7.91 ERA over the first eight games and were 10-1 with a 2.82 ERA in 15 games in between...are 11-12 with a 4.51 ERA overall...have the second most wins in the American League but also have the second most losses...have the third highest OPS (.762) and the fifth highest ERA...lead the AL and rank fourth in the majors in innings pitched (159.2)...have walked two batters or fewer in each of the last 19 games (22 bb in 104.0 ip, 1.90 per nine innings)...have tossed seven innings or fewer in each game and six innings or fewer in 28 of 30 games...now have a streak of 98 consecutive games of seven innings or fewer, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history...the last A's starter to toss more than seven innings is Mike Fiers on Sept. 20, 2019 (8.0 ip)...also have an Athletics record streak of 206 games of eight innings or fewer and have not had a pitcher toss more than eight innings since Frankie Montas on May 17, 2019 at Detroit (8.2).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has a 7-0 record with eight saves and no blown saves...the A's are the only Major League team without a loss from its bullpen and are one of two without a blown save (Yankees)...the pen has a 1.77 ERA (12 er in 61.0 ip) and .200 (45-for-225) opponents batting average over the A's last 19 games dating back to April 13 and has yielded just three home runs...posted a 6.02 ERA and .275 opponents average over the first 11

contests and surrendered seven home runs...has allowed 14-of-35 (40.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the fourth highest percentage in the American League...has the highest batting average (.299), on-base percentage (.390) and slugging percentage (.598) against first batters faced.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 10 errors over the last 13 games but have just 15 for the season, which is tied for third fewest in the American League...rank third in fielding percentage (.986)...however, have -19 defensive runs saved, which is the fewest in the majors (Angels, -15)...A's pitchers are tied for third in the AL in pickoffs (2)...A's opponents have been successful in just 10-of-14 (71.4%) stole base attempts, which is fifth lowest in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-2 on this season-long 10-game homestand against Baltimore (1-2), Toronto (1-0) and Tampa Bay (three games)...had their eight-game home winning streak snapped Friday night and are now 10-8 (.556) at home for the season...went 4-3 on the last road trip to Baltimore (2-1) and Tampa Bay (2-2) and are now 8-4 (.667) on the road, which is tied for the second best road record in the American League...have compiled a 4.67 ERA (83 er in 160.0 ip) in Oakland compared to 3.29 (38 er in 104.0 ip) on the road...have the fourth highest home ERA in the AL and the fourth lowest road ERA.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 15-1 when out-homer the opposition and 1-9 when they are out-homered...have two successful replay challenges in the last four games after going 0-4 over the first 26 contests...although Oakland has the best record in the American League, they have been out-scored 132-127 for a run differential of -5...have an average time of game of 2:53 over the last 17 games after averaging 3:22 over the first 13.

THE SCHEDULE: Friday night began a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 20 of 29 games at home and 35 of 44 in the Pacific Time Zone...are 2-2 over that span...began a stretch of 17 consecutive days without a scheduled day off April 23 are 6-5 over that span...also began a stretch of 20 consecutive games against American League East competition April 23.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list nine times this year, which is one more than their total from the entire 2020 season when their eight placements were second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4)...currently have six players on the IL (Luzardo, Pinder, Puk, Rosenthal, Smith, Wendelken)...used the IL just 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest in the majors.

IN APRIL: The A's finished April with a 16-11 record, which was their best mark in April since 2014 when they went 18-9...A's pitchers set an Athletics record for strikeouts in April with 233...A's batters set Athletics records for hit by pitches (19) and strikeouts (244)...hit .214, which was fourth lowest in Oakland history in April and the lowest since 2012 (.211)...stole 19 bases, which were the A's most in any month since April of 2014 when they also had 19.

A's vs. BLUE JAYS: The A's won the first meeting of 2021 last night after going 0-6 in 2019...were swept in a three-game series in both Oakland (April 19-21) and Toronto (April 26-28)...it was the fourth time in Oakland history the A's went winless against an American League team (0-7 vs. CLE in 1995, 0-6 vs. CLE in 1994, 0-11 vs. BAL in 1978)...went 7-0 against the Blue Jays in 2018...have won just one season series against the Blue Jays dating back to 2015 and are 14-19 over that span...are 225-201 all-time against the Blue Jays, including 113-100 in Oakland, 112-99 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas...are 71-67 (.514) in Rogers Centre.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha leads the majors in hit by pitches (8) and is tied with Acuña (ATL) for the lead in runs scored (26)...**Ramón Laureano** has homered in three consecutive games for the second time in his career (July 6-12, 2019)...**Jed Lowrie** is tied for the Major League lead in multiple hit games (11) and ranks second in batting with runners in scoring position (.480)...**Yusmeiro Petit** is tied for the American League lead in wins (4)...has a nine-game, 11.0-inning scoreless streak and not allowed a run in 12 of his last 13 games (15.0 ip, 10 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 11 so, 0.60 ERA).

In **1935** Jimmie Foxx scores five runs in the A's 12-1 victory over Cleveland... in **1969** John "Blue Moon" Odom is 3 for 3 with a homer and six RBI in the second game of a doubleheader vs. Seattle and picks up the win in the A's 11-7 victory...in **1980** Mike Norris tosses a four-hit shutout in the second game of a doubleheader against Detroit and Jeff Newman hits a solo home run for the A's only run in a 1-0 victory.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (2-3, 3.67 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season...is 2-1 with a 1.56 ERA (3 er in 17.1 ip) over his last three starts after going 0-2 with a 7.45 ERA over his first two...has 20 strikeouts 17.1 innings over his last three starts after fanning five in 10.0 innings over his first two...has walked one batter or fewer in each of his five starts this year and seven of eight in his career...has walked four batters in 27.0 innings this year (1.33 per nine innings) and 18 in 72.1 career innings (2.24 per nine innings).

THIS AND THAT: Has a .282 opponents batting average, which breaks down to .253 (21-for-83) against right-handed hitters compared to .370 (10-for-27) against left-handers...has issued three of his four walks to righties...his career splits are .258 (54-for-209) against righties, .393 (33-for-84) against lefties...has surrendered three home runs, all solo shots...has allowed seven of his 11 runs in the fifth and six innings (7 er in 7.0 ip, 9.00 ERA)...has a 1.80 ERA (4 er in 20.0 ip) over the first four innings...has a .262 (11-for-42) average against a batter the first time through the order, .233 (10-for-43) the second time and .400 (10-for-25) after that.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-1 loss to Houston on April 3 in Oakland...it was his first start since May 22, 2019 with Philadelphia at Chicago (NL)...tossed 4.1 innings, which was the shortest start of his career...allowed a RBI single to Tucker in the first but the A's came back to tie the game with a run in the bottom of the first...then allowed a RBI single to Altuve in the second...was relieved by Trivino with runners on first and second and one out in the fifth and Trivino allowed a three-run home run.

SECOND START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 6-2 loss at Houston on April 8...allowed a leadoff home run to Correa in the second, a RBI double to Correa in the fourth and a solo home run to Alvarez in the sixth...walked the next batter (Correa) and was relieved by Wendelken with a runner on first and one out in the sixth with the A's trailing 3-0...Wendelken allowed Correa to score plus a run of his own.

THIRD START: He combined with Wendelken, Guerra and Weems on a five-hit shutout in the A's 7-0 win over Detroit on April 17 in Oakland...it was his first win since May 17, 2019 against Colorado and it snapped a career-high four-game losing streak...tossed six of the inning and allowed four of the hits for the longest scoreless outing of his career...did not walk a batter for the first time as a starter.

FOURTH START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 3-1 win at Baltimore April 23...it is the second time in his career he put together consecutive wins (May 12-17, 2019)...shut out the Orioles on four hits and a walk over the first five innings before loading the bases on three consecutive singles to start the sixth...struck out the next batter he faced (Mountcastle) before allowing a RBI single to Severino...that snapped a career-high 11.0 inning scoreless streak...was relieved by Petit following the Severino single with the A's leading 3-1.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-0 loss at Tampa Bay last Wednesday...struck out a career-high eight batters in 6.0 innings of work...also had a career-high 98 pitches...allowed at least one hit in each of the first four innings but did not allow a run until Zunino homered with two outs in the fifth...also allowed a RBI single to Margot in the fifth but then struck out the side in the sixth...Glasnow and two Tampa Bay relievers combined to shut out Oakland on seven hits.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 1-1 with a 1.00 ERA (18.0 ip, 10 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 18 so, 1 hr) and .169 opponents batting average in five spring appearances, including three starts...10 of his strikeouts came in his final start on March 26 at Los Angeles (NL)...those were the most in a single game by an A's pitcher in the MLB Spring Training database, which dates back to 2006...finished the spring with an 11.0-inning scoreless streak...allowed one run twice and no runs three times...tied for the team-lead in innings pitched.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Chris Bassitt (2-2, 3.93 ERA): Is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season...has allowed two runs in each of his last four starts and is 2-0 with a 3.13 ERA and .221 opponents batting average over that span...went 0-2 with a 5.56 ERA and .289 opponents average over his first two starts...is scheduled to start on five days rest tomorrow...is 2-0 with a 3.18 ERA in three starts on five days rest this year and now has a seven-game winning streak when starting on five days rest dating back to July 19, 2019...is tied for the Major League lead with five hit batters, including an Oakland record tying three in his last start, a no decision in the A's 3-2 win at Tampa Bay last Thursday (6.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 9 so)...is 0-1 with a 5.25 ERA (12.0 ip, 12 h, 7 r, 7 er, 2 bb, 14 so, 3 hr) in two career appearances against Toronto, both starts at Rogers Centre...the no decision came in his last start on April 28, 2019, a 5-4 A's loss in 11 innings (7.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 9 so).

35 LHP JAKE DIEKMAN

Saves/Opportunities: 3-3

Inherited Runners/Scored: 2/1 **First Hitters:** 2-11, bb, hbp

- Has not allowed an earned run in his last 10 games (10.2 ip, 4 h, r, 3 bb, 14 so) after yielding four runs over his first three contests.
- Has three saves, which are his first since June 20, 2018 for Texas against Kansas City...now has 10 saves in his career.
- Has yielded a .129 (4-for-31) average against right-handed hitters compared to .278 (5-for-18) against left-handers.
- Has faced Toronto 14 times in his career, last in 2019 with Kansas City... has thrown 12.1 scoreless innings in those 14 outings, including 18 strikeouts and three walks.

Last Year: Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)

61 LHP REYMIN GUDUAN

Inherited Runners/Scored: 0/0 **First Hitters:** 4-5

- Was reinstated from the injured list April 20.
- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and allowed eight runs on nine hits in 2.2 innings over three appearances before he was placed on the IL April 6 with a sprained left thumb sustained while covering first base.
- Has allowed a hit to the first batter he has faced in four of his five appearances.
- Has faced Toronto three times in his career, last in 2018 with Houston... has thrown 2.1 scoreless innings in those three appearances, including two strikeouts and zero walks.
- Has signed to a minor league contract Dec. 4 and was a non-roster invitee...compiled a 0.96 ERA in nine relief appearances this spring...opponents were 3-for-29 (.103) with one walk in 9.1 innings.

Last Year: Was a non-roster invitee with the Los Angeles Dodgers and had a loss and a 3.00 ERA in six spring training appearances...was not added to the Dodgers 60-man player pool and did not pitch in 2020.

65 RHP DEOLIS GUERRA

Inherited Runners/Scored: 0/0 **First Hitters:** 3-9

- Walked a career-high four batters April 25 at Baltimore...had just two career outings with more than one walk prior to that (both two walks)...was charged with five runs (two earned) in 0.2 innings, which were the second most of his career (6, July 30, 2015 at Cincinnati).
- Left-handed hitters are 1-for-19 (.053) this year and are 2-for-32 (.063) over the last two years.
- Had his streak of consecutive batters retired snapped at 15 on April 24 when he allowed a two-out single to Hays in the ninth.
- Has never faced Toronto in his career.
- Was selected from the A's alternate site April 8.

Last Year: Was on the Opening Day roster and appeared in nine games for Philadelphia in 2020 and went 1-3 with an 8.59 ERA (7 er in 7.1 ip)...struck out eight batters and walked two.

- Left-handed hitters are 2-for-15 (.133) against him but right-handers are 6-for-11 (.545).

Inherited Runners/Scored: 8/4 **First Hitters:** 4-12, 3 bb

- Has a nine-game, 11.0-inning scoreless streak and has not allowed a run in 12 of his last 13 games (15.0 ip, 10 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 11 so, 0.60 ERA).
- Has stranded all four of his inherited runners over his last 13 games after allowing all four to score over his first two contests.
- Is tied with Lou Trivino and J.B. Wendelken for first in the American League in games pitched (15)...first in the Majors in reliever wins (4) and is third in innings pitched (17.1).
- Opponents are 9-for-27 (.333) with the bases empty but are just 4-for-35 (.114) with runners on base.
- Has not allowed a run in eight games on zero or one day of rest (8.0 ip).
- Has faced Toronto nine times in his career, last in 2019...is 1-1 with a 1.08 ERA (2 er, 16.2 ip) with 14 strikeouts and three walks in those nine appearances.

Last Year: Compiled a career-low 1.66 ERA in a team-leading 26 relief appearances...opponents hit .232 and he walked just five batters for a .273 on-base percentage...yielded four runs, three of which scored on solo home runs.

54 RHP SERGIO ROMO

Inherited Runners/Scored: 2/0 **First Hitters:** 4-10, 2 hbp

- Has not allowed a run in each of his last five outings (4.1 ip)...allowed all nine of his runs in his first seven appearances...has allowed nine runs in 10.2 innings (7.59 ERA)...the runs are tied for 10th most among American League relievers.
- Opponents are batting .279, including .207 (6-for-29) by right-handed hitters compared to .429 (6-for-14) against left-handers.
- Has faced Toronto 16 times in his career...is 0-1 with six saves and a 4.11 ERA (7 er, 15.1 ip) including 15 strikeouts and zero walks in those 16 appearances.

Last Year: Was 1-2 with five saves, a 4.05 ERA and .211 opponents batting average in 24 relief appearances with Minnesota...had 10 holds, which tied for third most in the majors...was the only reliever in the majors with at least 10 holds and at least five saves.

- Recorded his fifth save of the season Sunday and the ninth of his career...the other four came in his rookie campaign of 2018.
