OAKLAND ATHLETICS (19-12) VS. TORONTO BLUE JAYS (14-14)

WEDNESDAY, MAY 5, 2021 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:40 PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: After starting the season 0-6, the A's have won 19 of the last 25 games and now have the best record in the majors at 19-12 (.613)... that matches the second best record by an A's team after 31 games over the last 31 years...the only better record was last year when the A's were 21-10... however, have a run differential of -2...are a season-high tying seven games over .500 (third time)...have won three straight games after losing four of the previous five...have held at least a share of first place in the American League West for each of the last 15 days and have been alone in first for each of the last 12...currently have a season-high tying two game lead...went from sole possession of last on April 11 to sole possession of first on April 21...have spent 13 days alone in first place this year, two days tied for first, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

LEFT-HANDED STARTERS: Tonight, the A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher for the fourth consecutive game, sixth time in the last seven games and ninth time in the last 12 contests...are 9-3 (.750) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed compared to 10-9 (.526) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second best in the American League to the White Sox (5-1)...are batting .240 (83-for-346) with a .773 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .210 (136-for-648) with a .661 OPS against right-handers.

INNINGS FROM THE STARTER: Cole Irvin tossed 8.0 innings last night, which was the longest outing by an A's starting pitcher since Mike Fiers pitched 8.0 innings on Sept. 20, 2019...Irvin's start snapped an Athletics record streak of 98 consecutive games of seven innings or fewer by the starting pitcher but extended the A's record streak of 207 consecutive games of eight innings or fewer...have not had a pitcher toss more than eight innings since Frankie Montas on May 17, 2019 at Detroit (8.2)...A's starting pitchers have 167.2 innings pitched for the season which is the most in the American League and fourth most in the majors.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have played five one-run game in their last nine games and are 7-2 (.778) in one-run decisions overall, which is the second best record in the American League to the Royals (6-1, .857)...seven of the last nine games have been decided by one or two runs and Oakland is a Major League best 10-3 (.769) in games decided by two runs or fewer...are 5-0 in games decided in the last at bat...have three walk-off wins, which are tied with the Nationals for the most in the majors...are 2-0 in extra innings and are 8-1 in extra innings over the last two years...are 12-0 when leading after six innings after going 25-0 last year...have now won 49 consecutive games when leading after six innings dating back to Sept. 7, 2019, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history (previous: 47, July 21, 1927 to May 16, 1928).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .212 (67-for-316) with 31 runs scored over the last 10 games (3.1 runs per game) after hitting .260 with 75 runs over the previous 12 contests (6.3 runs per game)...are batting .220 for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...lead the league in hit by pitches (23), are tied for the lead in home runs (40), tied for second in walks (109), rank third in stolen bases (20) and tied for third in triples (5)...are 16-1 when out-homer the opposition and 1-9 when they are out-homered...A's pinch hitters are 8-for-26 (.308) with a home run, five RBI and a walk...the eight pinch hits are the most in the AL and more than five National League teams...also lead the AL in pinch RBI and plate appearances (27) and have one of three pinch home runs.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.65 ERA (46 er in 156.0 ip) over the last 18 games dating back to April 16 after logging a 5.85 ERA over the first 13 contests...now have a season-low 4.02 ERA overall...have the second highest opponents batting average in the American League (.252) but rank fifth in fewest walks per nine innings (2.87) and sixth in fewest home runs per nine innings (1.09)...are tied for second in shutouts (4) and have the second most wild pitches (20).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 10-5 with a 3.13 ERA (38 er in 109.1 ip) over the last 19 games after going 2-7 with a 6.63 ERA over the first 12...are 12-12 with a 4.35 ERA overall...have the second most wins in the American League but are tied for the second most losses...have the fourth highest OPS (.745)...have walked two batters or fewer in each of the last 20 games (23 bb in 112.0 ip, 1.85 per nine innings) and are averaging 2.47 walks per nine innings overall, which is fourth lowest in the AL.

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has a 7-0 record with nine saves and no blown saves...the A's are the only Major League team without a loss from its bullpen and are one of two without a blown save (Yankees)...are tied for second

in the American League in saves...the pen has a 1.74 ERA (12 er in 62.0 ip) and .197 (45-for-228) opponents batting average over the A's last 20 games dating back to April 13 and has yielded just three home runs...posted a 6.02 ERA and .275 opponents average over the first 11 contests and surrendered seven home runs...has allowed 14-of-35 (40.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the fourth highest percentage in the American League...has the highest batting average (.295), on-base percentage (.386) and slugging percentage (.591) against first batters faced.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's rank third in the American League in fielding percentage (.986) and their 15 errors are tied for third fewest...however, have -18 defensive runs saved, which is second fewest in the majors (Angels, -20)...A's pitchers are tied for third in the AL in pickoffs (2)...A's opponents have been successful in just 10-of-14 (71.4%) stole base attempts, which is fourth lowest in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-2 on this season-long 10-game homestand against Baltimore (1-2), Toronto (2-0) and Tampa Bay (three games)...had their eight-game home winning streak snapped Friday night and are now 11-8 (.579) at home for the season...have the third best home record in the American League and the second best road record (8-4, .667)...went 4-3 on the last road trip to Baltimore (2-1) and Tampa Bay (2-2)...have compiled a 4.47 ERA (84 er in 169.0 ip) in Oakland compared to 3.29 (38 er in 104.0 ip) on the road...have the fourth highest home ERA in the AL and the third lowest road ERA.

THE SCHEDULE: Friday night began a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 20 of 29 games at home and 35 of 44 in the Pacific Time Zone...are 3-2 over that span...began a stretch of 17 consecutive days without a scheduled day off April 23 are 7-5 over that span...also began a stretch of 20 consecutive games against American League East competition April 23.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's placed Aramis Garcia on the 10-day injured list yesterday and have now used the IL 10 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have seven players on the IL (Garcia, Luzardo, Pinder, Puk, Rosenthal, Smith, Wendelken), which are their most since July 2, 2019 when they also had seven.

IN APRIL: The A's finished April with a 16-11 record, which was their best mark in April since 2014 when they went 18-9...A's pitchers set Athletics record for strikeouts in April with 233...A's batters set Athletics records for hit by pitches (19) and strikeouts (244)...hit .214, which was fourth lowest in Oakland history in April and the lowest since 2012 (.211)...stole 19 bases, which were the A's most in any month since April of 2014 when they also had 19.

A's vs. BLUE JAYS: The A's have won the first two meetings of 2021 after going 0-6 in 2019...were swept in a three-game series in both Oakland (April 19-21) and Toronto (April 26-28)...it was the fourth time in Oakland history the A's went winless against an American League team (0-7 vs. CLE in 1995, 0-6 vs. CLE in 1994, 0-11 vs. BAL in 1978)...went 7-0 against the Blue Jays in 2018...have won just one season series against the Blue Jays dating back to 2015 and are 15-19 over that span...are 226-201 all-time against the Blue Jays, including 114-100 in Oakland, 112-99 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas...are 71-67 (.514) in Rogers Centre.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha leads the majors in hit by pitches (8)...leads the American League in runs scored (26), is tied for eighth in walks (17) and tied for ninth in stolen bases (5)...**Jed Lowrie** is tied for the Major League lead in multiple hit games (12) and batting with runners in scoring position (.500)...**Yusmeiro Petit** tossed a scoreless ninth inning last night for his first save since Sept. 16, 2017 for the Angels against the Rangers...it was the eighth save of his career...now has a 12.0-inning scoreless streak.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1939** Sam Chapman hits for the cycle and then homers in his first two at bats the following day...in **2000** the A's score 16 runs at Texas but lose 17-16, setting an AL record for runs scored in a loss...all 18 starters in the game score at least one run, an AL first...in **2018** Khris Davis hits a two-run walk-off home run in the bottom of the 12th to defeat Baltimore 2-0...it is the first time in franchise history a player hit an extra-inning walk-off home run to break a scoreless tie.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (2-2, 3.93 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season...has allowed two runs in each of his last four starts and is 2-0 with a 3.13 ERA (8 er in 23.0 ip) and .221 (19-for-86) opponents batting average over that span...went 0-2 with a 5.56 ERA and .289 opponents average over his first two starts.

STRIKEOUTS: Struck out nine batters in his last start after fanning eight in each of his previous two...now has 25 strikeouts over his last three starts (18.0 ip, 12.50 per nine innings) after tallying 11 in 16.1 innings over his first two (6.06 per nine innings)...his streak of three consecutive starts with eight or more strikeouts matches the longest such streak by an A's pitcher over the last 49 years (ninth time, last: Frankie Montas, June 9-20, 2019)...the last A's pitcher with four consecutive starts of eight or more strikeouts is Catfish Hunter (June 9-25, 1972)...has 36 strikeouts for the season, which is tied for ninth in the American League.

FIVE DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 2-0 with a 3.18 ERA (6 er in 17.0 ip) in three starts on five days rest and now has a seven-game winning streak when starting on five days rest...is 7-0 with a 2.89 ERA (6 er in 17.0 ip) in 11 starts over that span, which dates back to July 19, 2019.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-0 with a 3.18 ERA (6 er in 17.0 ip) in three starts on the road compared to 0-2 with a 4.67 ERA (9 er in 17.1 ip) in three starts at home...last year, he went 2-1 with a 0.72 ERA, .207 opponents batting average and .512 OPS in five starts in Oakland compared to 3-1 with a 4.56 ERA, .270 opponents average and .683 OPS in five starts on the road...his home ERA was second lowest in the majors (Keller, KC 0.27) and second lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 30 innings (Treinen, 0.63 in 2018)...did not allow a home run in 37.1 innings in Oakland...is 9-12 with a 2.63 ERA (60 er in 205.2 ip) in 38 career games in the Coliseum, 12-11 with a 4.52 ERA (114 er in 227.0 ip) in 47 games in all other ballparks...has yielded just 13 home runs in 205.2 career innings in Oakland (0.57 per nine innings).

THIS AND THAT: Is tied for the Major League lead with five hit batters...has allowed three home runs, all to left-handed hitters...has surrendered 21 of his 30 home runs over the last three years to lefties...opponents are 6-for-34 (.176) with runners in scoring position...has received two runs of support or fewer in four of his six starts and is 0-2 in those starts...is 17-1 in 27 career starts with three runs of support or more, 4-22 in 45 starts with two runs of support or fewer...the A's are 4-2 (.667) in his starting assignments and are 27-15 (.643) when he starts over the last three years ...did not pitch in the majors in 2017 following May 6, 2016 "Tommy John" surgery...is 19-12 with a 3.36 ERA (108 er in 289.0 ip) and is averaging 8.50 strikeouts per nine innings (273 so in 289.0 ip) in 56 games (49 starts) since the surgery...was 2-11 with a 4.13 ERA and 6.77 strikeouts per nine innings in 29 games (23 starts) before the surgery.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-1 loss to Houston on Opening Day, April 1 in Oakland...became the A's 14th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 16 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill, Graveman twice, Fiers, Montas)...blanked the Astros on one hit over the first three innings before allowing a run in the fourth when Altuve walked, went to third on a Brantley double and scored on a Bregman ground out...the run snapped a 16.2-inning scoreless streak during the regular season and a 27.1-inning home scoreless streak, which was ninth longest in Oakland history...was relieved by Petit with one out in the sixth inning, runners on first and second and the A's trailing 1-0...Petit allowed both runners to score.

SECOND START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 5-1 loss to Los Angeles (NL) on April 6 in Oakland...allowed nine hits, which were his most since April 28, 2016 at Detroit when he yielded a career-high 10...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed a RBI double to Barnes in the second...then allowed three more runs in the third on a two-run home run by Muncy and a solo home run by Rios...the home runs were the first he allowed in the Coliseum since Aug. 24, 2019, snapping a 10-game, 55.1-inning, 229-batter homerless streak.

THIRD START: He picked up his first win of the season in the A's 9-5 win at Arizona on April 12...allowed just two hits in 5.0 innings, which matched his fewest hits ever in a start...however, issued five walks...had a 3-0 lead when he issued consecutive one-out walks in the third...Calhoun followed with a RBI single and Cabrera added a sacrifice fly...those were the only two runs he would allow in five innings of work.

FOURTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win over Detroit on April 18 in Oakland...loaded the bases with one out in the first inning but then retired each of the next 10 batters and 14 of the next 15...had a 1-0 lead

when he allowed a two-out, two-run single to Harold Castro in the sixth...was relieved by Diekmann to start the seventh inning with the A's trailing 2-1 but Oakland scored once in the eighth to get him off the hook and once in the ninth for the win.

FIFTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-2 victory at Baltimore April 24...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed a RBI double to Sisco in the second inning...retired the side in order in the third and fourth inning and had a 7-1 lead when he allowed a RBI double to Mancini in the fifth.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win at Tampa Bay last Thursday...tied an Oakland record with three hit batters (12th time, last: Fiers, June 22, 2019, also against Tampa Bay)...allowed a RBI double to Meadows in the first inning but the A's came back with single runs in the third and fourth innings to give him a 2-1 lead...allowed a solo home run to Lowe in the fifth and was relieved by Petit to start the seventh with the score tied 2-2.

allowed a leadoff home run to Sogard in the bottom of the first but then shut out the Blue Jays on two hits and no walks the rest of the way...the A's tied the game with a run in the third and he was relieved by Wendelken to start the eighth with the score tied 1-1...the loss came in a 9-3 decision on April 23, 2016...allowed six runs on nine hits...the A's scored a run in the first, but he allowed two runs in the bottom of the first on a Bautista RBI ground out and a Martin RBI single...also allowed a three-run home run to Donaldson in the second and a leadoff home run to Tulowitzki in the fifth.

2020 RECAP: Spent the entire season on the active roster for the first time in his six-year career and went 5-2 with a 2.29 ERA in 11 starts...his ERA ranked second among pitchers in the West divisions (Lamet, SD 2.09) and sixth in the majors...it was fifth lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 10 starts...also tied for fifth in the West divisions in winning percentage (.714), ranked seventh in opponents OPS (.659), batting average (.233) and slugging percentage (.371), tied for seventh in wins and eighth in on-base percentage (.288)...had career lows in ERA and opponents on-base percentage...walked 17 batters in 63.0 innings for a career-low 2.43 walks per nine innings...struck out 55 for a career-best 3.24 strikeout-to-walk ratio...led the A's in innings pitched and tied for the lead in games started...received five votes (two third, one fourth, two fifth) in American League Cy Young balloting...went 1-0 with a 1.08 ERA over his first three starts, 1-2 with a 5.95 ERA over his next four starts and 3-0 with a 0.34 ERA over his final four starts...allowed a .233 opponents batting average, which broke down to .223 (31-for-139) with a .590 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .248 (25-for-101) with a .755 OPS against left-handers...yielded four of his six home runs to lefties...walked just one batter to lead off an inning and held opponents to a .203 (13-for-64) batting average and .227 on-base percentage in that situation...the on-base percentage was sixth lowest in the majors...five of his six home runs came with the bases empty...had a .244 opponents batting average with runners in scoring position, but that dropped to .176 with RISP and two outs...had a .130 opponent average with two strikes...went 3-0 with a 1.15 ERA in six starts at night compared to 2-2 with a 4.13 ERA in five starts during the day...his night ERA was the lowest in the majors and in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 30 innings at night...was 3-0 with a 1.75 ERA in four starts following an A's loss...allowed one run or fewer in seven of his 11 starts, including no runs four times.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Mike Fiers (0-1, 4.50 ERA): Is scheduled to make his second start of the season...began the season on the 10-day injured list with a lumbar strain...was reinstated on April 26 and was initially placed in the bullpen before making his first start on April 30, a loss in the A's 3-2 decision to Baltimore on Friday here in Oakland (6.0 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...now has 993 in his career...need seven strikeouts to become the 40th active pitcher with 1,000 strikeouts...is 1-4 with a 4.22 ERA (49.0 ip, 40 h, 25 r, 23 er, 11 bb, 48 so, 8 hr) in nine career appearances, including eight starts, against Toronto...was 0-1 with a 6.97 ERA (10.1 ip, 15 h, 8 r, 8 er, 0 bb, 9 so, 3 hr) in two starts in 2019...did not pitch during the spring...went 6-3 with a 4.58 ERA in 11 starts for the A's last year...led the team in wins for the second consecutive season (had 15 in 2019)...the A's went 8-3 (.727) in his starting assignments and are 38-16 (.704) when he starts in his career

- Has not allowed an earned run in his last 10 games (10.2 ip, 4 h, r, 3 bb, 14 so) after yielding four runs over his first three contests.
- Has three saves, which are his first since June 20, 2018 for Texas against Kansas City...now has 10 saves in his career.
- Has yielded a .129 (4-for-31) average against right-handed hitters compared to .278 (5-for-18) against left-handers.
- Has faced Toronto 14 times in his career, last in 2019 with Kansas City... has thrown 12.1 scoreless innings in those 14 outings, including 18 strikeouts and three walks.

Last Year: Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)

- Has allowed a hit to the first batter he has faced in four of his five appearances.
