OAKLAND ATHLETICS (19-13) VS. TORONTO BLUE JAYS (15-14)

THURSDAY, MAY 6, 2021 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 12:37 PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Had their three-game winning streak snapped last night and are now 5-6 since their 13-game winning streak...are 19-7 over the last 26 games after starting the season 0-6 and are 19-13 (.594) overall, which is the best record in the majors...however, have been out-scored 142-135 for a run differential of -7...have held at least a share of first place in the American League West for each of the last 16 days and have been alone in first for each of the last 13...currently have a season-high tying two game lead...went from sole possession of last on April 11 to sole possession of first on April 21... have spent 14 days alone in first place this year, two days tied for first, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

LEFT-HANDED STARTERS: The A's have faced a left-handed starting pitcher in each of the previous four games, six of the previous seven and nine of the previous 12...are 9-4 (.692) in games in which the opponent starts a lefthanded compared to 10-9 (.526) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is fourth best in the American League...are batting .239 (89-for-373) with a .770 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .209 (137-for-655) with a .660 OPS against right-handers.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's led 3-2 after seven innings last night but the Blue Jays scored five times in the eighth for the win...it was the first time this year the A's lost when leading after six or seven innings...had not lost when leading after six innings since Sept. 6, 2019 and the loss snapped a franchise record 49-game winning streak when leading after six innings...have played five one-run game in their last 10 games and are 7-2 (.778) in one-run decisions overall, which is the second best record in the majors to the Pirates (4-1, .800)...seven of the last 10 games have been decided by one or two runs and Oakland is a Major League best 10-3 (.769) in games decided by two runs or fewer...are 5-0 in games decided in the last at bat...have three walk-off wins, which is tied with the Cubs, Nationals and Reds for the most in the majors... are 2-0 in extra innings and are 8-1 in extra innings over the last two years

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .211 (74-for-350) with 35 runs scored over the last 11 games (3.2 runs per game) after hitting .260 with 75 runs over the previous 12 contests (6.3 runs per game)...are batting .220 for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...lead the league in home runs (42) and hit by pitches (23), rank third in stolen bases (20) and tied for third in walks (111) and triples (5)...are 16-2 when out-homering the opposition and 1-9 when they are out-homered...A's pinch hitters are 8-for-27 (.296) with a home run, five RBI and a walk...the eight pinch hits are the most in the AL and more than three National League teams...also lead the AL in pinch RBI and plate appearances (28) and have one of three pinch home runs.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.00 ERA (55 er in 165.0 ip) over the last 19 games after logging a 5.85 ERA over the first 13 contests...have the second highest opponents batting average in the American League (.253) and fifth highest on-base percentage (.315)...are tied for the league lead in wild pitches (22)...are tied for second in shutouts (4).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have walked two batters or fewer in each of the last 21 games, which matches the second longest such streak in Oakland history...the longest is 25 games from Aug. 2-29, 2012...have walked 23 batters in 119.0 innings during the streak (1.74 per nine innings) and are averaging 2.37 walks per nine innings overall, which is third fewest in the American League...are 10-5 with a 3.09 ERA (40 er in 116.1 ip) over the last 19 games after going 2-7 with a 6.63 ERA over the first 12...are 12-12 with a 4.28 ERA overall...have the second most wins in the AL but are tied for the second most losses...have the third highest OPS (.736)...lead the AL and rank third in the majors in innings pitched (174.2)...starters have tossed eight innings or fewer in each of the last 208 games, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history...have not had a pitcher toss more than eight innings since Frankie Montas on May 17, 2019 at Detroit (8.2).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen was charged with its first blown save and first loss of the season last night...are now 9-for-10 (90.0%) in save opportunities, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Yankees, 100.0%)...are tied for third in the American League in saves...has a 7-1 record and the one loss is the fewest in the majors...allowed seven runs last night after yielding five runs over the previous nine contests...has a 2.67 ERA (19 er in 64.0 ip) and .206 (49-for-238) opponents batting average over the A's last 21 games dating back to April 13 and has yielded just three home runs...posted a 6.02 ERA and .275 opponents average over the first 11 contests and surrendered seven home runs...has allowed 16-of-37 (43.2%) inherited runners to score, which is the fourth highest percentage in the American League...has the highest batting average (.295), on-base percentage (.394) and slugging percentage (.591) against first batters faced.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's rank third in the American League in fielding percentage (.987) and their 15 errors are tied for third fewest...however, have -20 defensive runs saved, which is the fewest in the majors (Angels, -18)...A's pitchers are tied for third in the AL in pickoffs (2)...A's opponents have been successful in just 11-of-16 (69.7%) stole base attempts, which is fourth lowest in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-3 on this season-long 10-game homestand against Baltimore (1-2), Toronto (2-1) and Tampa Bay (three games)...had their eight-game home winning streak snapped last Friday night and are now 11-9 (.550) at home for the season...have the fourth best home record in the American League and are tied for the second best road record (8-4, .667)...went 4-3 on the last road trip to Baltimore (2-1) and Tampa Bay (2-2)... have compiled a 4.70 ERA (93 er in 178.0 ip) in Oakland compared to 3.29 (38 er in 104.0 ip) on the road...have the third highest home ERA in the AL and the third lowest road ERA.

NO-HIT WEEK: Today is day two of a five-day stretch where the A's were either no-hit or no-hit another team on this date...the streak began yesterday with the 117th anniversary of Cy Young's no-hitter against the A's and continues today with the 68th anniversary of Bobo Holloman's no-hitter... tomorrow marks the second anniversary of Mike Fiers' lights-out no-hitter against Cincinnati, Saturday is the 53rd anniversary of Catfish Hunter's perfect game against Minnesota and Sunday marks 11 years since Dallas Braden's Mother's Day perfecto against Tampa Bay...the A's have not been no-hit since July 13, 1991 for a streak of 4,637 games with one or more hits... that is the longest active streak in the majors and is fourth longest in American League history.

THE SCHEDULE: Last Friday night began a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 20 of 29 games at home and 35 of 44 in the Pacific Time Zone...are 3-3 over that span...began a stretch of 17 consecutive days without a scheduled day off April 23 are 7-6 over that span...also began a stretch of 20 consecutive games against American League East competition April 23.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 10 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have seven players on the IL (Garcia, Luzardo, Pinder, Puk, Rosenthal, Smith, Wendelken), which are their most since July 2, 2019 when they also had seven.

IN APRIL: The A's finished April with a 16-11 record, which was their best mark in April since 2014 when they went 18-9...A's pitchers set an Athletics record for strikeouts in April with 233...A's batters set Athletics records for hit by pitches (19) and strikeouts (244)...hit .214, which was fourth lowest in Oakland history in April and the lowest since 2012 (.211)...stole 19 bases, which were the A's most in any month since April of 2014 when they also had 19.

A's vs. BLUE JAYS: The A's lead the season series 2-1 after going 0-6 in 2019... were swept in a three-game series in both Oakland (April 19-21) and Toronto (April 26-28)...it was the fourth time in Oakland history the A's went winless against an American League team (0-7 vs. CLE in 1995, 0-6 vs. CLE in 1994, 0-11 vs. BAL in 1978)...went 7-0 against the Blue Jays in 2018...have won just one season series against the Blue Jays dating back to 2015 and are 15-20 over that span...are 226-202 all-time against the Blue Jays, including 114-101 in Oakland, 112-99 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas...are 71-67 (.514) in Rogers Centre.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha leads the majors in hit by pitches (8)...leads the American League in runs scored (26), is tied for eighth in walks (17) and tied for ninth in stolen bases (5)...*Ramón Laureano* ranks second in the American League in stolen bases (8) and tied for ninth in home runs (7)...*Jed Lowrie* is tied for the Major League lead in multiple hit games (12) and batting with runners in scoring position (.500)...*Yusmeiro Petit* has a 12.0-inning scoreless streak.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1975** Claudell Washington homers off California's Ed Figueroa for the 1000th home run in Oakland A's history...in **2003** Mark Mulder tosses his third consecutive complete game as the A's defeat the Chicago White Sox 6-0 in 1 hour and 49 minutes...that is the A's fastest game since August 12, 1979...in **2017** Adam Rosales has a walk-off single in the bottom of the ninth inning to defeat the Detroit Tigers 6-5...it is the first of three consecutive walk-off wins for the A's.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Mike Fiers (0-1, 4.50 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his second start of the season...began the season on the 10day injured list with a lumbar strain...was reinstated on April 26 and was initially placed in the bullpen before making his first start on April 30... this is his 11th season in the majors and is with his fourth team...has pitched for Milwaukee (2011-15), Houston (2015-17), Detroit (2018) and Oakland (2018-present).



CLOSING IN ON 1,000 STRIKEOUTS: Struck out three batters in his first start and now has 993 in his ca-

reer...need seven strikeouts to become the 40th active pitcher with 1,000 strikeouts...his first strikeout came on Sept. 14, 2011 for Milwaukee against Colorado when he fanned Carlos Gonzalez in the ninth inning.

WITH THE A's: Is 26-10 with a 4.01 ERA (135 er in 302.2 ip) in 55 games, including 54 starts...the wins are tied for fifth in the majors dating back to his first start with the A's on Aug. 6, 2018...his .722 winning percentage with Oakland is the best in Athletics history among pitchers with 30 or more decisions...is 15-5 with a 3.43 ERA (72 er in 189.0 ip) and .231 (160-for-692) opponents batting average in 33 career games, including 32 starts, in the Coliseum, including 14-3 with a 3.16 ERA (56 er in 159.2 ip) and .227 (133-for-585) opponents batting average in 27 starts as an Athletic.

APRIL, SEPTEMBER AND IN BETWEEN: Took the loss in his first start on April 30 and is now 5-10 with a 5.63 ERA and .309 opponents batting average in 26 career appearances in the month of April...is 11-16 with a 5.46 ERA and .274 opponents batting average in 41 games in September and 58-36 with a 3.45 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in 148 games from May 1 through Aug. 31.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-2 loss to Baltimore last Friday in Oakland...the A's scored a run in the second inning but he allowed back-to-back home runs to Mullins and Hays in the third inning...then allowed a run in the fifth on a Mullins RBI ground out and was relieved by Guerra to start the sixth inning with the A's trailing 3-1.

FIERS vs. TORONTO: Is 1-4 with a 4.22 ERA (49.0 ip, 40 h, 25 r, 23 er, 11 bb, 48 so, 8 hr) in nine career appearances, including eight starts...that includes 0-2 with a 3.51 ERA (10 er in 25.2 ip) in four starts in Rogers Centre and 1-2 with a 5.01 ERA (13 er in 23.1 ip) in five games in his home ballparks... was 0-1 with a 6.97 ERA (10.1 ip, 15 h, 8 r, 8 er, 0 bb, 9 so, 3 hr) in two starts in 2019...the loss came in a 10-1 deci-

sion in Oakland on April 20...retired the side in order in the first two innings before allowing a RBI single to Sogard in the third...then allowed five runs in the fourth inning, highlighted by a three-run home run by Tellez and a solo home run by Drury...left after 3.1 innings trailing 5-0...then had a no decision in a 4-2 loss at Toronto on April 26...allowed a leadoff home run to Sogard in the first and a Grichuk RBI single in the third...Stroman blanked Oakland on one hit over seven innings but the A's tied the game with a two-run eighth and he was relieved by Wendelken to start the bottom of the eighth.

2020 RECAP: Went 6-3 with a 4.58 ERA in 11 starts and tied for seventh in the majors in wins...led the A's in wins for the second consecutive season (had 15 in 2019)...also led the club in most hits allowed (65) and tied for the team lead in games started...the A's went 8-3 (.727) in his starting assignments and are 38-16 (.704) when he starts in his career...went 1-1 with a 6.86 ERA

and six home runs allowed over his first four starts but was 5-2 with a 3.43 ERA and three home runs over his final seven starts...had 37 strikeouts in 59.0 innings and his average of 5.64 strikeouts per nine was a career-low (6.04 in 2013) and fourth lowest in the majors among pitchers with at least 50 innings.

2020 OPPONENTS BATTING: His .275 opponents batting average broke down to .244 (29-for-119) with a .730 OPS against left-handed hitters compared to .308 (36-for-117) with an .806 OPS against right-handers...issued 11 of his 16 walks to lefties...held the opposition to a .196 batting average with runners in scoring position, including .091 with RISP and two outs...now has a .185 (77-for-416) opponents average with RISP and two outs in his career... had a .209 opponents batting average and one home run allowed the first time through the lineup, .317 with eight home runs after that...opponents hit .333 when leading off an inning but he walked just three...allowed a .337 batting average and seven of his nine home runs with no outs, .278 with one out and .197 with two outs...the opponents number three hitter went 5-for 29 (.172) but the clean-up hitter was 11-for-27 (.407).

2020 HOME AND AWAY: Went 2-1 with a 6.20 ERA in four starts in Oakland and 4-2 with a 3.72 ERA in seven starts on the road...tied for the third most road wins in the majors...however, since joining the A's on Aug. 6, 2018, he is 14-3 with a 3.16 ERA (56 er in 159.2 ip) and .227 (133-for-585) opponents batting average in 27 starts in the Coliseum compared to 12-7 with a 4.97 ERA (79 er in 143.0 ip) and .269 (149-for-554) opponent average in 28 games at all other ballparks...is 15-5 with a 3.43 ERA (72 er in 189.0 ip) and .231 (160-for-692) opponents batting average in 33 career games, including 32 starts, in the Coliseum...the 15 wins are his most in any ballpark.

2020 BY INNING: Allowed two runs in the first inning and one in the second and had a 1.23 ERA and .167 opponents batting average over the first two innings of a game...yielded 11 of his 31 runs in the third inning and had a 6.57 ERA and .329 opponents average from the third inning on.

2020 BY DIVISION: Went 2-2 with a 3.27 ERA in four interleague starts compared to 4-1 with a 5.35 ERA in seven starts against the American League West...is now 4-2 with a 2.14 ERA (10 er in 42.0 ip) in seven career interleague starts with the A's and is 9-7 with a 2.87 ERA (45 er in 141.1 ip) and .223 (115-for-515) opponents average in 26 career interleague appearances...is 18-16 with a 5.52 ERA (200 er in 326.1 ip) in 62 career appearances against AL West teams compared to 57-46 with a 3.46 ERA (316 er in 821.1 ip) in 155 games against all other opponents.

2020 THIS AND THAT: Was 6-1 with a 4.38 ERA in seven starts on four days rest, 0-2 with a 4.95 ERA in four starts on five days rest or more...had a run support average of 7.02, which ranked eighth highest in the majors among pitchers with 50 or more innings...induced just one double play and his average of 0.15 GIDP per nine innings was third lowest...tossed six innings or fewer in all 11 of his starts and struck out four or fewer nine times.

2020 HIGHLIGHTS: Started the A's third game of the season on July 26 against Los Angeles (AL) and had a no decision in the A's 6-4 win...did not walk or strikeout a batter in 4.0 innings...it was his first career start with no walks and no strikeouts...tossed a season-high 6.0 innings in his second start on Aug. 1 at Seattle, a no decision in a 3-2 A's win...it was his first of six starts of 6.0 innings...was charged with his first loss on Aug. 11 at Los Angeles (AL), giving him a 1-1 record and a 6.86 ERA over his first four starts...then won each of his next three starts from Aug. 16-26 (2.60 ERA)...struck out a season-high seven Aug. 26 at Texas...finished August 4-1 with a 4.36 ERA in six starts...tied for second in the majors in wins in August...it is the fifth time in his career he has won four games in a month, the fourth time in August (2012, 2014, 2019)...is now 24-10 with a 3.80 ERA in 45 career games in August...has no more than 14 wins in any other month...then went 2-2 with a 4.09 ERA in four starts in September...is now 10-16 with a 5.49 ERA in 40 career games in September...the losses are his most in any month and the ERA is second highest to his 5.63 in April...had his three-game winning streak snapped in the A's 5-3 loss to San Diego on Sept. 6...it also snapped a ninegame home winning streak, which tied for ninth longest in Oakland history... it was the longest by a starting pitcher since Mark Mulder had a 10-game streak from July 31, 2002-June 19, 2003...it was his first loss at home since April 20, 2019 vs. Toronto and he compiled a 2.99 ERA and .227 opponents batting average during the winning streak, which spanned 16 starts from May 7, 2019 to Aug. 21, 2020...then won each of his next two starts, including Sept. 11 at Texas when he tossed a season-high 100 pitches...made his second career postseason appearance and his first start in Game 3 of the ALWCS against Chicago and had a no decision in the A's 6-4 win (1.2 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 2 so)...was on the A's roster for the ALDS against Houston but did not pitch.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Sean Manaea (3-1, 3.48 ERA): Is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season...is 3-0 with a 2.48 ERA over his last five starts after allowing five runs on six hits in 4.2 innings in his first start, a loss...has walked two batters or fewer in each of his last five starts and is averaging 1.87 walks per nine innings for the season, which is fifth lowest in the American League...also ranks fifth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.71)...held left-handed hitters to a .133 batting average compared to .297 by right-handers...opponents are 4-for-22 (.182) with runners in scoring position...had a no decision in his last start, a 7-5 A's win over Baltimore on Sunday here in Oakland (5.0 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 0 bb, 5 so)...is 2-1 with a 2.52 ERA (25.0 ip, 20 h, 7 r, 7 er, 5 bb, 21 so, 2 hr) in four career starts against Tampa Bay...including a win in his only start this year on April 26 at Tropicana Field (5.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 6 so)...went 4-3 with a 4.50 ERA in 11 starts with the A's last year.

- Has yielded a .129 (4-for-31) average against right-handed hitters compared to .278 (5-for-18) against left-handers.
- Has faced Toronto 14 times in his career, last in 2019 with Kansas City... has thrown 12.1 scoreless innings in those 14 outings, including 18 strikeouts and three walks.

Last Year: Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)

Was reinstated from the injured list April 20.

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and allowed eight runs on nine hits in 2.2 innings over three appearances before he was placed on the IL April 6 with a sprained left thumb sustained while covering first base.
- Has allowed a hit to the first batter he has faced in four of his five appearances.
- Has faced Toronto three times in his career, last in 2018 with Houston... has thrown 2.1 scoreless innings in those three appearances, including two strikeouts and zero walks.
- Was signed to a minor league contract Dec. 4 and was a non-roster invitee...compiled a 0.96 ERA in nine relief appearances this spring...opponents were 3-for-29 (.103) with one walk in 9.1 innings

Last Year: Was a non-roster invitee with the Los Angeles Dodgers and had a loss and a 3.00 ERA in six spring training appearances...was not added to the Dodgers 60-man player pool and did not pitch in 2020.
