ABOUT THE A'S: Lost the final two games of the Toronto series after winning the first two and are now 5-7 since their 13-game winning streak...are 19-8 over the last 27 games after starting the season 0-6...are 19-14 (.576) overall, which is the second best record in the American League and third best in the majors...have held at least a share of first place in the American League West for each of the last 17 days and have been alone in first for each of the last 14...went from sole possession of last on April 11 to sole possession of first on April 21...have spent 15 days alone in first place this year, two days tied for first, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

LEFT-HANDED STARTERS: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher for the sixth consecutive game tonight, which matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (sixth time, last: April 17-24, 2009)...are 3-2 in those games...tonight will be the eighth lefty the A's have faced in the last nine games and the 11th in the last 13...are 9-5 (.643) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed compared to 10-9 (.526) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is fourth best in the American League...are batting .239 (95-for-398) with a .767 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .208 (137-for-660) with a .657 OPS against right-handers..

CLOSE CALLS (AND NOT SO CLOSE): The A's lost 10-4 yesterday after dropping a 9-4 decision on Wednesday...are now 7-11 (.389) in games decided by four runs or more compared to 12-3 (.800) in games decided by three runs or fewer...have the best record in the majors in games decided by three runs or fewer and two runs or fewer (10-3, .769) and the second best record in one-run games (7-2, .778)...have a run differential of -13, which is fourth lowest in the American League...are 5-0 in games decided in the last at bat...have three walk-off wins, which is tied with the Cubs, Nationals and Reds for the most in the majors...are 2-0 in extra innings and are 8-1 in extra innings over the last two years.

OFFENSE: The A's have homered in each of the last eight games (13 home runs total) and now have an American League leading 43 home runs for the season...in the majors, only the Braves (44) have more...are 16-2 when out-homering the opposition and 1-10 when they are out-homered...are batting .211 (80-for-380) with 39 runs scored over the last 12 games (3.3 runs per game) after hitting .260 with 75 runs over the previous 12 contests (6.3 runs per game)...are batting .219 for the season, which is fourth lowest in the AL...lead the league in hit by pitches (23), rank third in stolen bases (20) and walks (116) and fourth in triples (5)...A's pinch hitters are 8-for-27 (.296) with a home run, five RBI and a walk...the eight pinch hits are the most in the AL and more than three National League teams...also lead the AL in pinch RBI and plate appearances (28) and have one of three pinch home runs.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 19 runs in the last two games after posting a 2.73 ERA over the previous 19 contests...have a 4.33 ERA overall, which is fourth highest in the American League...have the highest opponents batting average (.257), the fourth highest slugging percentage (.409) and the fifth highest OPS (.727) and on-base percentage (.319)...are tied for second in shutouts (4) and most wild pitches (22).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have walked two batters or fewer in each of the last 22 games, which is the second longest such streak in Oakland history to a 25-game streak from Aug. 2-29, 2012...have walked 25 batters in 122.1 innings during the streak (1.84 per nine innings) and are averaging 2.43 walks per nine innings overall, which is fourth lowest in the American League...are 10-6 with a 3.38 ERA (45 er in 119.2 ip) over the last 21 games after going 2-7 with a 6.63 ERA over the first 12...are 12-13 with a 4.45 ERA overall...have the second most wins in the AL but also have the second most losses...have the third highest OPS (.754) and fifth highest ERA...lead the AL and are tied for third in the majors in innings pitched (178.0)...starters have tossed eight innings or fewer in each of the last 209 games, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history...have not had a pitcher toss more than eight innings since Frankie Montas on May 17, 2019 at Detroit (8.2).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has allowed 12 runs in the last two games after yielding 10 runs over the previous 12 contests (1.50 ERA)...was charged with its first blown save and first loss of the season Wednesday night...is now 9-for-10 (90.0%) in save opportunities, which is tied with the Yankees for the best percentage in the majors (Yankees, 100.0%)...are tied for fourth in the American League in saves...has a 7-1 record and the one loss is the fewest in the majors...has allowed just four home runs over the A's last 25 games after surrendering seven over the first eight...the 11 home runs are tied for second fewest in the AL...has allowed 19-of-41 (46.3%) inherited runners to score, which is the third highest percentage in the AL...has the highest

batting average (.304), on-base percentage (.398) and slugging percentage (.587) against first batters faced.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-4 on this season-long 10-game homestand against Baltimore (1-2), Toronto (2-2) and Tampa Bay (three games)...had their eight-game home winning streak snapped a week ago tonight and are now 11-10 (.524) at home for the season...leave following the game Sunday for a six-game road trip to Boston (three games) and Minnesota (three games) that begins on Tuesday...went 4-3 on the last road trip to Baltimore (2-1) and Tampa Bay (2-2) and are 8-4 (.667) on the road, which is the third best road record in the American League...have compiled a 4.91 ERA (102 er in 187.0 ip) in Oakland compared to 3.29 (38 er in 104.0 ip) on the road...have the fourth highest home ERA in the AL and the third lowest road ERA.

NO-HIT WEEKEND: Tonight marks the second anniversary of Mike Fiers' lights-out no-hitter against Cincinnati...tomorrow is the 53rd anniversary of Catfish Hunter's perfect game against Minnesota and Sunday marks 11 years since Dallas Braden's Mother's Day perfecto against Tampa Bay...the A's had anniversaries of being no hit on Wednesday (Cy Young in 1904) and Thursday (Bobo Holloman in 1953)...next Wednesday is the 111th anniversary of Chief Bender's no-hitter against Cleveland...the A's have not been no-hit since July 13, 1991 for a streak of 4,638 games with one or more hits...that is the longest active streak in the majors and is fourth longest in American League history.

THE SCHEDULE: This three-game series with Tampa Bay concludes a stretch of 17 consecutive days without a day off...are 7-7 over that span...are in a stretch of 20 consecutive games against American League East teams from from April 23-May 13 (7-7)...this homestand begins a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 20 of 29 games at home and 35 of 44 in the Pacific Time Zone...are 3-4 over that span.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 10 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have seven players on the IL (Garcia, Luzardo, Pinder, Puk, Rosenthal, Smith, Wendelken), which are their most since July 2, 2019 when they also had seven.

IN APRIL: The A's finished April with a 16-11 record, which was their best mark in April since 2014 when they went 18-9...A's pitchers set an Athletics record for strikeouts in April with 233...A's batters set Athletics records for hit by pitches (19) and strikeouts (244)...hit .214, which was fourth lowest in Oakland history in April and the lowest since 2012 (.211)...stole 19 bases, which were the A's most in any month since April of 2014 when they also had 19.

A's vs. RAYS: The season series is even at two games each after the two clubs split a four-game series in Tampa Bay, April 26-29...the A's won the season series in 2019, 4-3...it was their first season series win since 2016 (5-2)...split four games in Oakland and went 2-1 in Tampa Bay...are 30-30 against the Rays dating back to 2012...all-time, are 111-78 (.587), which is their best record against any American League team...are 60-32 in Oakland and 51-46 at Tropicana Field...the mark in the Coliseum is the A's best record against any AL team.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha leads the majors in hit by pitches (8)...ranks second in the American League in runs scored (27), is tied for ninth in walks (17) and tied for 10th in stolen bases (5)...**Ramón Laureano** ranks second in the American League in stolen bases (8) and tied for 10th in home runs (7)...**Jed Lowrie** is tied for the Major League lead in batting with runners in scoring position (.500) and is tied for second in multiple hit games (12)...**Yusmeiro Petit** has a 12.0-inning scoreless streak.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1979** the A's turn the first triple play in Oakland history at Baltimore when Gary Roenicke hits into a Gross to Klutts to Revering triple play...it is the first of the A's major league recording tying three triple plays in 1979... in **1991** Harold Baines sets an Oakland record with 14 total bases in the A's 11-3 win against Baltimore...he doubles, hits a club record tying three home runs and also walks while collecting seven RBI...in **1997** the A's and Milwaukee set a what was then a major league record for the longest 1-0 nine inning game...the Brewers win the game in 3 hours and 20 minutes, breaking the previous record of 3:07...in **2019**, Mike Fiers tosses his second career no-hitter in the A's 2-0 win over Cincinnati...it is the 13th no-hitter in Athletics history, the eighth since the club moved to Oakland in 1968.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (3-1, 3.48 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season...is 3-0 with a 2.48 ERA (8 er in 29.0 ip) over his last five starts after allowing five runs on six hits in 4.2 innings in his first start, a loss...the A's are 5-1 (.833) in his starting assignments and are 16-6 (.727) when he starts over the last three years.

DON'T WALK: Has walked two batters or fewer in each of his last five starts (4 bb in 29.0 ip, 1.24 per nine innings)...has two starts with no walks and two others with one...is averaging 1.87 walks per nine innings for the season, which is sixth lowest in the American League...also ranks sixth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.71)...over the last four years, he has walked two batters or fewer in 43 of his 49 starts (16 with no walks, 19 with one)...has 54 walks in 278.0 innings over that span, an average of 1.75 per nine innings.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held left-handed hitters to a .133 (4-for-30) batting average compared to .297 (30-for-101) by right-handers...two of the four hits by lefties are home runs...opponents are 4-for-22 (.182) with runners in scoring position after hitting .375 with RISP last year...has a .216 (11-for-51) average against a batter the first time he faces him in a game, .288 (23-for-80) after that...over the last four years, he has a mark of .194 (80-for-412) the first time against a batter, .263 (168-for-638) after that.

BY MONTH: Went 3-1 with a 2.83 ERA in five starts in April...is now 8-4 with a 2.97 ERA and .189 opponents batting average in 16 career starts in the month of April...allowed four runs in 5.0 innings in his first start in May and is now 5-8 with a 5.87 ERA (57 er in 87.1 ip) in 16 career starts in May...his May ERA is his highest for any month (5.22 in August).

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-2 loss to Houston on April 4 in Oakland...allowed a solo home run to Tucker in the first inning but the A's came back to tie the game in the bottom of the first...then allowed a two-run home run to Castro in the second and a two-run double to Gurriel in the third.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-2 win at Houston on April 9...blanked the Astros on three hits over the first three innings and allowed his only run in the fourth when Gurriel walked, went to third on a Correa single and scored on a Tucker ground out...was relieved by Petit to start the seventh inning with the score tied 1-1.

THIRD START: He picked up his first win of the season in the A's 8-4 victory over Detroit on April 15 in Oakland...it was the 100th game of his career...blanked the Tigers on two hits over the first three innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a RBI double to Castro in the fourth...Oakland built a 3-1 lead before he allowed his final run on a leadoff home run to Goodrum in the sixth...was relieved by Petit to start the seventh with the A's leading 7-2.

FOURTH START: He tossed a six-hit, seven-inning shutout in the A's 7-0 win over Minnesota in the first game of the doubleheader April 20 in Oakland...it was the 11th complete game shutout of fewer than eight innings in Oakland history (last: Mike Minor, Sept. 14, 2020 at Seattle)...it was his second career complete game and shutout, with the other being his no-hitter on April 21, 2018 against Boston...the start was the 100th of his career and he became the 25th pitcher in Oakland history to make 100 starts...did not walk a batter and struck out seven.

FIFTH START: He won his third consecutive start in the A's 2-1 win at Tampa Bay on April 26...allowed a leadoff single to Arozarena, who went to second on a ground out, stole third and scored on a Meadows sacrifice fly...that would be the only run he would allow in five innings of work...Oakland scored twice in the fourth for the win.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-5 win over Baltimore last Sunday in Oakland...the A's scored twice in the first but he allowed single runs in the second and third innings on a Galvis RBI single and a Hays solo home run...Oakland came back with two in the bottom of the third to take a 4-2 lead but he allowed a two-run single to Mancini in the fifth...left after five innings with the score tied at 4-4.

MANAEA vs. TAMPA BAY: Is 2-1 with a 2.52 ERA (25.0 ip, 20 h, 7 r, 7 er, 5 bb, 21 so, 2 hr) in four career starts...is 0-1 with a 2.77 ERA (4 er in 13.0 ip) in two starts in the Coliseum and 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA (3 er in 12.0 ip) in two starts at Tropicana Field...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, a 2-1 A's win at Tampa Bay on April 26 (see fifth start above).

2020 RECAP: Went 4-3 with a 4.50 ERA in 11 starts...the ERA was the highest of his career as was his .270 opponents batting average...his .427 slugging percentage matched his high...went 4-1 with a 2.65 ERA and .234 opponents batting average over his final six starts dating back to Aug. 20...the wins tied for fourth most in the majors over that span...went 0-2 with a 7.65 ERA and .325 opponents average over his first five starts...tied for the team lead in starts...walked just eight batters in 54.0 innings, an average of 1.33 walks per nine innings...that was the lowest mark of his career and was sixth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 50 or more innings pitched...struck out 45 for a career-best 5.63 strikeout-to-walk ratio...had five starts without a walk, five with one and three in his other...had a 2.56 ERA and .233 opponents batting average over the first three innings of his starts compared to a 7.59 ERA and .319 opponents average from the fourth inning on...his .270 opponents batting average broke down to .250 (13-for-52) against left-handed hitters compared to .277 (44-for-159) against right-handers...issued seven of eight walks to righties...had a .204 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .327 with seven of his eight walks after that...had a .281 batting average against batters leading off an inning but issued just one walk (.293 on-base percentage)...yielded a .222 average with the bases empty, .373 with runners on...opponents hit .375 with runners in scoring position and were 7-for-15 (.467) with RISP and two outs...entered the season with a .227 career opponents average with RISP, including .199 with RISP and two outs...allowed a .248 opponents average and four of his seven home runs with two strikes...went 2-1 with a 3.32 ERA and .182 opponents batting average in four starts during the day, 2-2 with a 5.29 ERA and .321 opponent average in seven starts at night...is now 18-6 with a 3.33 ERA (83 er in 224.0 ip) and .217 (180-for-828) opponents batting average in 38 career day games compared to 24-26 with a 4.11 ERA (164 er in 359.1 ip) and .266 (370-for-1390) opponents average in 65 career starts at night...was 3-1 with a 3.91 ERA and .232 opponents batting average in five starts in Oakland, 1-2 with a 5.02 ERA and .302 opponents average in five starts on the road...is now 23-14 in his career in the Coliseum compared to 19-18 on the road...was 2-1 with a 3.33 ERA in five interleague starts compared to 2-2 with a 5.67 ERA in six starts against the American League...was charged with five unearned runs, which tied for eighth most in the majors...tossed fewer than six innings in nine of his 11 starts...was 0-3 in four starts with two runs of support or fewer, 4-0 in seven starts with three or more...is now 5-30 in 50 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 37-2 in 52 starts with support of three or more.

RHP Frankie Montas (3-2, 5.87 ERA): Is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season...is 1-1 with an 8.75 ERA (12 er in 16.0 ip) over his last three starts after going 2-0 with a 0.75 ERA (1 er in 12.0 ip) over his previous two starts...the A's are 4-2 (.667) in his starting assignments...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 5-4 A's win over Toronto on Monday here in Oakland (6.0 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 4 so)...is 0-1 with a 2.40 ERA (15.0 ip, 11 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 14 so, 2 hr) in three career appearances, including two starts, against the Rays...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 4-3 A's loss at Tampa Bay on April 27 (6.0 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 5 so)...was off to a strong start last year as he was 2-1 with a 1.57 ERA and .175 opponents average over his first four starts...was scratched from his start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness and went 1-4 with an 8.70 ERA and .321 opponents average over his final seven starts.

- Was reinstated from the injured list April 20.
- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and allowed eight runs on nine hits in 2.2 innings over three appearances before he was placed on the IL April 6 with a sprained left thumb sustained while covering first base.
- Has allowed a hit to the first batter he has faced in four of his six appearances.
- Faced Tampa Bay earlier this year, throwing one scoreless frame on April 27 at Tropicana Field...has faced the Rays three times in his career, throwing 2.2 scoreless innings.
- Was signed to a minor league contract Dec. 4 and was a non-roster invitee...compiled a 0.96 ERA in nine relief appearances this spring...opponents were 3-for-29 (.103) with one walk in 9.1 innings.

Last Year: Was a non-roster invitee with the Los Angeles Dodgers and had a loss and a 3.00 ERA in six spring training appearances...was not added to the Dodgers 60-man player pool and did not pitch in 2020.

- Walked a career-high four batters April 25 at Baltimore...had just two career outings with more than one walk prior to that (both two walks)...was charged with five runs (two earned) in 0.2 innings, which were the second most of his career (6, July 30, 2015 at Cincinnati).
- Left-handed hitters are 1-for-20 (.050) this year and are 2-for-33 (.061) over the last two years.
