OAKLAND ATHLETICS (20-14) VS. TAMPA BAY RAYS (18-16)

SATURDAY, MAY 8, 2021 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 1:07 PDT RHP FRANKIE MONTAS (3-2, 5.87) VS. RHP TYLER GLASNOW (4-1, 2.06)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four of the last six games after losing four of the previous five contests...are now 6-7 since their 13-game winning streak...are 20-8 over the last 28 games after starting the season 0-6...are 20-14 (.588) overall, which is the second best record in the American League (Red Sox, 20-13) and third best in the majors (Giants, 19-13)...the six games over .500 are one short of the season high of seven (three times, last: May 4)...have held at least a share of first place in the AL West for each of the last 18 days and have been alone in first for each of the last 15...currently have a 1½-game lead, which is ½-game short of the season high of two (last on May 5)...went from sole possession of last on April 11 to sole possession of first on April 21...have spent 16 days alone in first place this year, two days tied for first, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's had their Major League leading fourth walk-off win of the season last night...the 2-1 win improved their record in one-run games to 8-2 (.800), which is the best in the majors...also have the best record in games decided by two runs or fewer (11-3, .786) and three runs or fewer (13-3, .813)...are 7-11 (.389) in games decided by four runs or more...have outscored the opposition 62-46 in games decided by three runs or fewer (+16) but have been outscored 107-79 in the other games (-28)...have an overall run differential of -12, which is fifth lowest in the American League...are 6-0 in games decided in the last at bat...are 2-0 in extra innings and are 8-1 in extra innings over the last two years.

THE INJURED LIST: After placing Mike Fiers on the injured list today, the A's have now used the IL 11 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have seven players on the IL (Fiers, Garcia, Luzardo, Pinder, Puk, Rosenthal, Wendelken).

OFFENSE: The A's have homered in each of the last nine games (14 home runs total), which matches the longest streak of the season (April 9-20)...have 44 home runs overall, which is tied with the Blue Jays and Yankees for the most in the American League...are 17-2 when out-homering the opposition and 1-10 when they are out-homered...A's pinch hitters are 9-for-28 (.321) with a home run, six RBI and a walk...the nine pinch hits are the most in the AL and more than five National League teams...had just three pinch hits all last year...also lead the AL in pinch RBI and plate appearances (29) and have one of three pinch home run...the A's are batting .212 (87-for-411) with 41 runs scored over the last 13 games (3.2 runs per game) after hitting .260 with 75 runs over the previous 12 contests (6.3 runs per game)...are batting .219 for the season, which is fourth lowest in the AL...lead the league in hit by pitches (24), rank third in stolen bases (21) and walks (118) and fourth in triples (5).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.71 ERA (33 er in 63.0 ip) in May after logging a 4.10 ERA in April...have a 4.23 ERA overall, which is fifth highest in the American League...have the third highest opponents batting average (.253) and fifth highest on-base percentage (.314)...are tied for second in shutouts (4) and rank third in wild pitches (22).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have walked two batters or fewer in each of the last 23 games, which is the second longest such streak in Oakland history to a 25-game streak from Aug. 2-29, 2012...have walked 26 batters in 129.2 innings during the streak (1.80 per nine innings) and are averaging 2.38 walks per nine innings overall, which is third lowest in the American League...are 10-6 with a 3.26 ERA (46 er in 127.0 ip) over the last 22 games after going 2-7 with a 6.63 ERA over the first 12...are 12-13 with a 4.32 ERA overall...are tied for the second most wins in the AL but have the second most losses...lead the AL and ranks third in the majors in innings pitched (185.1)...starters have tossed eight innings or fewer in each of the last 210 games, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history...have not had a pitcher toss more than eight innings since Frankie Montas on May 17, 2019 at Detroit (8.2).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has allowed 12 runs in the last three games after yielding 10 runs over the previous 12 contests (1.50 ERA)...was charged with its first blown save and first loss of the season Wednesday night...is now 9-for-10 (90.0%) in save opportunities, which is tied with the Yankees for the best percentage in the majors...has an 8-1 record and the one loss is the fewest in the majors...has allowed just four home runs over the A's last 26 games after surrendering seven over the first eight...the 11 home runs are second fewest in the AL (Mariners, 9)...has allowed 19-of-42 (45.2%) inherited runners to score, which is the third highest percentage in the AL...has the highest batting average (.309), on-base percentage (.400) and slugging percentage (.585) against first batters faced.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed two errors in the last five games and have 17 for the season, which is tied for fourth fewest in the American League...rank fifth in fielding percentage (.986) but have -28 defensive runs saved, which is the fewest in the majors (Angels, -24)...A's pitchers are tied for third in the AL in pickoffs (2).

LEFT-HANDED STARTERS: After facing a left-handed starting pitcher in an Oakland record tying six consecutive games (sixth time), the A's will face a right-handed starter today for the first time since May 1 against Baltimore (Harvey)...Glasnow will be the second righty the A's have faced in the last 10 games and the fourth in the last 15...are 10-5 (.667) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed compared to 10-9 (.526) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is fourth best in the American League... are batting .233 (98-for-420) with a .754 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .211 (141-for-669) with a .661 OPS against right-handers.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-4 on this season-long 10-game homestand against Baltimore (1-2), Toronto (2-2) and Tampa Bay (1-0) and are now 12-10 (.545) at home for the season...leave following the game tomorrow for a six-game road trip to Boston (three games) and Minnesota (three games) that begins on Tuesday...went 4-3 on the last road trip to Baltimore (2-1) and Tampa Bay (2-2) and are 8-4 (.667) on the road, which is the second best road record in the American League...have compiled a 4.73 ERA (103 er in 196.0 ip) in Oakland compared to 3.29 (38 er in 104.0 ip) on the road...have the fourth highest home ERA in the AL and the third lowest road ERA.

NO-HIT WEEKEND: Today marks the 53rd anniversary of Catfish Hunter's perfect game against Minnesota...tomorrow marks 11 years since Dallas Braden's Mother's Day perfecto against Tampa Bay and yesterday marked the second anniversary of Mike Fiers' lights-out no-hitter against Cincinnati...the A's had anniversaries of being no hit on Wednesday (Cy Young in 1904) and Thursday (Bobo Holloman in 1953)...next Wednesday is the 111th anniversay of Chief Bender's no-hitter against Cleveland....the A's have not been no-hit since July 13, 1991 for a streak of 4,639 games with one or more hits...that is the longest active streak in the majors and is fourth longest in American League history.

THE SCHEDULE: This three-game series with Tampa Bay concludes a stretch of 17 consecutive days without a day off...are 8-7 over that span...are in a stretch of 20 consecutive games against American League East teams from from April 23-May 13 (8-7)...this homestand begins a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 20 of 29 games at home and 35 of 44 in the Pacific Time Zone...are 4-4 over that span.

A's vs. RAYS: The A's lead the season series 3-2 and need one more win to clinch back-to-back season series victories over the Rays since 2011-12...won the first game in Oakland last night after splitting a four-game series in Tampa Bay, April 26-29...the A's won the season series in 2019, 4-3...it was their first season series win since 2016 (5-2)...split four games in Oakland and went 2-1 in Tampa Bay...are 31-30 against the Rays dating back to 2012... all-time, are 112-78 (.589), which is their best record against any American League team...are 61-32 in Oakland and 51-46 at Tropicana Field...the mark in the Coliseum is the A's best record against any AL team.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha leads the majors in hit by pitches (9)...ranks second in the American League in runs scored (27), fourth in stolen bases (6) tied for eighth in walks (18) and 10th in on-base percentage (.390)...Jake Diekman has not allowed an earned run in his last 11 games and 11.1 innings...Jed Lowrie is tied for the Major League lead in batting with runners in scoring position (.500) and multiple hit games (13)...is 11-for-23 (.478) with four doubles, five RBI and three three-hit games over his last six games... Yusmeiro Petit has a 13.0-inning scoreless streak and now has a 0.93 ERA, which is seventh lowest among American League relievers.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1906** pitcher Chief Bender is inserted into the game in left field in the sixth inning and hits two inside the park home runs in a game against the Boston Pilgrims...in **1968**, the A's first year in Oakland, Catfish Hunter tosses a perfect game and almost single handedly defeats Minnesota 4-0... he strikes out **11** and also collects three hits while driving in three of the A's four runs...in **1992** Dennis Eckersley records his 200th career save in the A's 8-6 win over New York.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (3-2, 5.87 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season...is 1-1 with an 6.75 ERA (12 er in 16.0 ip) over his last three starts after going 2-0 with a 0.75 ERA (1 er in 12.0 ip) over his previous two starts...the A's are 4-2 (.667) in his starting assignments.

THIS AND THAT: Has allowed nine of his 20 runs in the third inning (9 er in 5.2 ip, 14.29 ERA)...has a .224 (11-for-49) average against batters the first time through the order, .373 (19-for-51) the second time and .233 (7-for-30) after that...four of the six home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...is 2-1 in four starts at home, 1-1 in two starts on the road...over the last three years, he is 8-2 in Oakland, 7-7 on the road.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-3 loss to Los Angeles (NL) on April 5 in Oakland...tossed 90 pitches in 2.2 innings, which were the most by an A's pitcher in an outing of fewer than three innings since pitch counts were tracked beginning in 1988...allowed four runs in the second inning on a McKinstry sacrifice fly and a three-run double by Seager...yielded three more runs in the third on a Smith home run, a McKinstry RBI single and a wild pitch.

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-3 win at Houston on April 10...it snapped a career-high three-game losing streak dating back to Sept. 13, 2020...shut out the Astros on five hits and a walk over the first six innings before allowing his only run on a leadoff home run to Tucker in the seventh...was relieved by Romo following the home run with the A's leading

THIRD START: He won his second consecutive start when he combined with three A's relievers on a four-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win over Detroit on April 16 in Oakland...tossed six of the innings and allowed two of the hits (Grossman single in the third, Reyes single in the sixth)...also walked Castro in the first but did not allow a runners to advance past first base.

FOURTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 13-12, 10-inning win over Minnesota April 21 in Oakland...allowed three home runs in a start for the second time in his career (Sept. 22, 2020 vs. Los Angeles-NL)...surrendered a solo home run to Donaldson in the first but the A's scored three times in the second...then allowed three runs in the third on a Donaldson RBI single and a Cruz two-run home run...had a 7-4 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Cruz in the fifth...Buxton followed with a single and he was relieved by Wendelken with no outs in the fifth inning and the A's leading 7-5.

FIFTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss at Tampa Bay April 27...allowed a run in the first inning when Kiermaier led off with a triple and scored when Arozarena reached on a Machin error...Oakland scored single runs in the second and sixth innings to take a 2-1 lead but he allowed a tworun home run to Phillips in the bottom of the sixth for the loss.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-4 victory over Toronto on Monday in Oakland...the A's scored three times in the second but he allowed three runs in the third on a RBI single by Bichette and a two-run single by Hernandez...then retired 11 of the final 13 batters he faced and was relieved by Romo to start the seventh with the A's leading 5-3.

2020 RECAP: Was off to a strong start as he was 2-1 with a 1.57 ERA, .175 opponents batting average and no home runs over his first four starts...was scratched from his scheduled start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness and went 1-4 with an 8.70 ERA, .321 opponents average and 10 home runs over his final seven starts...went 3-5 with a 5.60 ERA in 11 starts overall...his ERA was eighth highest in the majors among pitchers with at least 50 innings pitched...had career highs in losses (5) and earned runs (33) and matched his high in home runs (10), runs (35) and walks (23)...led the A's in strikeouts (60), losses, runs, home runs and walks...his opponents batting average broke down to .198 (22-for-111) against right-handed hitters compared to .350 (35-for-100) against left-handers...surrendered six of his 10 home runs and issued 15 of his 23 walks to lefties for a 1.061 OPS (.572 against right-handers)...had a .306 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .264 the second time and .205 after that...allowed a .133 average with two strikes...was 2-1 with a 2.56 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in six starts in Oakland, 1-4 with a 10.13 ERA and .330 opponents average in five starts on the road...surrendered just two home runs in 31.2 innings in Oakland compared to eight in 21.1 innings on the road... made eight of his 11 starts during the day, which tied for the most in the majors...was 2-4 with a 6.16 ERA during the day, 1-1 with a 4.20 ERA at night... his career numbers are 8-9 with a 5.11 ERA (68 er in 119.2 ip) in 32 games during the day, 13-7 with a 3.87 ERA (74 er in 172.0 ip) in 44 contests at night...was 3-2 with a 3.61 ERA and .236 opponents batting average in eight starts against American League West competition, 0-3 with a 13.50 ERA and .391 opponents average in three interleague starts...the A's were 6-5 (.545) in his starting assignments...had two starts of seven innings and five starts of fewer than five innings...went 2-2 with a 2.83 ERA in six starts on four days rest, 1-3 with an 11.00 ERA in five starts on five days rest or more...received two runs of support or fewer in nine of his 11 starts...had 10 of his 28 runs of support in one start on Aug. 3 at Seattle and had a 4.75 RSA for the season... won both of his starts with support of three or more runs and is now 14-1 in 18 career starts with at least three runs of support.
