OAKLAND ATHLETICS (21-14) VS. TAMPA BAY RAYS (18-17)

SUNDAY, MAY 9, 2021 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 1:07 PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight and five of the last seven games to increase their lead in the American League West to a season-high 2½ games... are 7-7 since their 14-game winning streak and are 21-8 over the last 28 games after starting the season 0-6...are 21-14 (.600) overall, which is the second best record in the AL (Red Sox, 21-13) and third best in the majors (Giants, 20-13)...are a season-high tying seven games over .500 for the fourth time this year...have held at least a share of first place in the AL West for each of the last 19 days and have been alone in first for each of the last 15...went from sole possession of last on April 11 to sole possession of first on April 21...have spent 17 days alone in first place this year, two days tied for first, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

A'S ON MOTHER'S DAY: Since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's have a 26-27 record on Mother's Day...that includes 17-10 in Oakland and 9-17 on the road...currently have a five-game losing streak on Mother's Day and have not won since defeating Washington 9-1 on May 11, 2014...this is the second Mother's Day meeting between the A's and Rays...the other one ended pretty well for Dallas Braden and his grandmother, Peggy.

LEFT-HANDED STARTERS: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher for the seventh time in the last eight games, ninth time in the last 11 games and 12th time in the last 16 games...faced a lefty in six straight games from May 2-7, which matched the longest such streak in Oakland history (sixth time)...are 10-5 (.667) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed compared to 11-9 (.550) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is fourth best in the American League...are batting .234 (99-for-423) with a .753 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .209 (146-for-697) with a .667 OPS against right-handers.

CLOSE CALLS (AND NOT SO CLOSE): The A's won 6-3 yesterday to improve to 14-3 (.824) in games decided by three runs or fewer, which is the best record in the majors...also have the best record in games decided by two runs or fewer (11-3, .786) and one-run games (8-2, .800)...however, are 7-11 (.389) in games decided by four runs or more...have outscored the opposition 68-49 in games decided by three runs or fewer (+19) but have been outscored 107-79 in the other games (-28)...have an overall run differential of -9...lead the majors with four walk-off wins...are 6-0 in games decided in the last at bat...are 2-0 in extra innings and are 8-1 in extra innings over the last two years.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have homered in 10 consecutive games, which matches their longest streak over the last two years (Aug. 1-10, 2020)...have 16 home runs during the streak and 46 overall, which is second most in the American League to Toronto (47)...are 18-2 when out-homer the opposition and 1-10 when they are out-homered.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .210 (93-for-442) with 47 runs scored over the last 14 games (3.4 runs per game) after hitting .260 with 75 runs over the previous 12 contests (6.3 runs per game)...are batting .219 for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...lead the league in hit by pitches (24), are tied for second in walks (124), rank third in stolen bases (22) and tied for fourth in triples (5)...A's pinch hitters are 9-for-30 (.300) with a home run, six RBI and a walk...lead the AL in pinch hits, RBI and plate appearances (31) and have one of three pinch home runs.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.50 ERA (36 er in 72.0 ip) in May after logging a 4.10 ERA in April...have the third highest opponents batting average in the American League (.254) and fifth highest on-base percentage (.315)...are tied for second in shutouts (4) and rank third in most wild pitches (22).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have walked two batters or fewer in each of the last 24 games, which is the second longest such streak in Oakland history to a 25-game streak from Aug. 2-29, 2012...have walked 28 batters in 135.0 innings during the streak (1.87 per nine innings) and are averaging 2.41 walks per nine innings overall, which is third lowest in the American League...are 11-6 with a 3.26 ERA (48 er in 132.1 ip) over the last 23 games after going 2-7 with a 6.63 ERA over the first 12...are 13-13 with a 4.30 ERA overall...are tied for the second most wins in the AL but are also tied for the second most losses...lead the AL and rank third in the majors in innings pitched (190.2)...have tossed eight innings or fewer in each of the last 211 games, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history...have not had a pitcher toss more than eight innings since Frankie Montas on May 17, 2019 at Detroit (8.2).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has converted 10-of-11 (90.9%) save opportunities, which is the best percentage in the majors...has an 8-1 record and the one loss is the fewest in the majors...has allowed just four home runs over the

A's last 27 games after surrendering seven over the first eight...the 11 home runs are tied with the Mariners for the fewest in the AL...has allowed 19-of-46 (41.3%) inherited runners to score, which is the fourth highest percentage in the AL...has the highest batting average (.299), on-base percentage (.389) and slugging percentage (.567) against first batters faced.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed four errors in the last three games and now have a .985 fielding percentage, which ranks fifth in the American League...however, have -25 defensive runs saved, which is second fewest in the majors (Angels, -26)...A's pitchers are tied for third in the AL in pickoffs (2)...opponents have been successful is 15-of-21 (71.4%) stolen base attempts, which is fifth lowest in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 5-4 on this season-long 10-game homestand against Baltimore (1-2), Toronto (2-2) and Tampa Bay (2-0) and are now 13-10 (.565) at home for the season...leave following the game today for a six-game road trip to Boston (three games) and Minnesota (three games) that begins on Tuesday...went 4-3 on the last road trip to Baltimore (2-1) and Tampa Bay (2-2) and are 8-4 (.667) on the road, which is the second best road record in the American League...have compiled a 4.65 ERA (106 er in 205.0 ip) in Oakland compared to 3.29 (38 er in 104.0 ip) on the road...have the fourth highest home ERA in the AL and the second lowest road ERA.

NO-HIT WEEKEND: Today marks the 11th anniversary of Dallas Braden's Mother's Day perfect game...yesterday was the 53rd anniversary of Catfish Hunter's perfect game against Minnesota and Friday marked two years since Mike Fiers' lights-out no-hitter against Cincinnati...the A's had anniversaries of being no hit on Wednesday (Cy Young in 1904) and Thursday (Bobo Holoman in 1953)...next Wednesday is the 111th anniversary of Chief Bender's no-hitter against Cleveland...the A's have not been no-hit since July 13, 1991 for a streak of 4,640 games with one or more hits...that is the longest active streak in the majors and is fourth longest in American League history.

THE SCHEDULE: Today's game concludes a stretch of 17 consecutive days without a day off...are 9-7 over that span...are in a stretch of 20 consecutive games against American League East teams from April 23-May 13 (9-7)...this homestand begins a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 20 of 29 games at home and 35 of 44 in the Pacific Time Zone...are 5-4 over that span.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 11 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have seven players on the IL (Fiers, Garcia, Luzardo, Pinder, Puk, Rosenthal, Wendelken).

A's vs. RAYS: The A's have won the season series as they lead 4-2 entering the final game today...went 4-3 in 2019 and have won back-to-back season series from the Rays for the first time since 2011-12...have won the first two games in Oakland after splitting a four-game series in Tampa Bay, April 26-29...have not swept a series from the Rays since Aug. 30-Sept. 1, 2013 in Oakland...are 32-30 against the Rays dating back to 2012...all-time, are 113-78 (.592), which is their best record against any American League team...are 62-32 in Oakland and 51-46 at Tropicana Field...the mark in the Coliseum is the A's best record against any AL team.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Seth Brown is tied for second among American League rookies in home runs (5) and tied for fourth in RBI (12)...**Mark Canha** leads the majors in hit by pitches (9)...ranks second in the American League in runs (28), tied for fourth in stolen bases (6), seventh in walks (20) and 10th in on-base percentage (.391)...**Jed Lowrie** leads the majors in batting with runners in scoring position (.500) and is tied for the lead in multiple hit games (13)...is 11-for-23 (.478) with four doubles, five RBI and three three-hit games over his last six games...**Yusmeiro Petit** has a 14.1-inning scoreless streak and now has a 0.87 ERA, which is seventh lowest among American League relievers.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1972** the A's score 10 times in the fourth inning of the first game of a doubleheader against Milwaukee...the first seven batters reach base and score in the A's 10-2 win...in **1988** Bob Welch and Dennis Eckersley combine on a four-hitter as the A's defeat Detroit 3-1 for what was then a club record 14th consecutive victory...the A's would go on to win an Oakland record 104 games and their first division title since 1981...in **2010** Dallas Braden pitches the 19th perfect game in Major League history in the A's 4-0 win over Tampa Bay on Mother's Day.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (3-3, 3.09 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season...has allowed two runs or fewer in each of his last four starts and is 3-1 with a 1.42 ERA (4 er in 25.1 ip) over that span...has struck out 29 and walked just three...went 0-2 with a 7.45 ERA over his first two starts.

DON'T WALK: Has walked one batter or fewer in each of his six starts this year...has issued just five free passes in 35.0 innings and his average of 1.29 walks per nine innings is third lowest in the American League...has a strike-out-to-walk ratio of 6.80, which is also ranks third...has walked one batter or fewer in eight of his nine career starts and has walked just 19 batters in 80.1 career innings (2.13 per nine innings).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .217 (23-for-106) batting average and .570 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .367 (11-for-30) and a .973 OPS against left-handers...his career splits are .241 (56-for-232) with a .688 OPS against righties, .391 (34-for-87) with a 1.002 OPS against lefties...has allowed three home runs, all solo shots...has a .223 (23-for-103) average against a batter the first two times through the order, .333 (11-for-33) after that.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-1 with a 2.45 ERA (5 er in 18.1 ip) and .209 (14-for-67) opponents batting average in three starts at home compared to 1-2 with a 3.78 ERA (7 er in 16.2 ip) and .290 (20-for-69) opponents average in three starts on the road...has yielded all three of his home runs on the road

THIS AND THAT: Is 2-1 with a 1.86 ERA (4 er in 19.1 ip) in three starts against American League East teams, 1-2 with a 4.60 ERA (8 er in 15.2 ip) in three starts against everyone else...has allowed eight of his 12 runs in the fifth and sixth innings and has a 1.50 ERA (4 er in 24.0 ip) over innings one through four compared to a 6.55 ERA (8 er in 11.0 ip) from the fifth inning on...is 3-0 in three starts with more than one run of support, 0-3 in three starts with support of one run or fewer...has a season RSA of 3.34 (13 rs in 35.0 ip).

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-1 loss to Houston on April 3 in Oakland...it was his first start since May 22, 2019 with Philadelphia at Chicago (NL)...tossed 4.1 innings, which was the shortest start of his career...allowed a RBI single to Tucker in the first but the A's came back to tie the game with a run in the bottom of the first...then allowed a RBI single to Altuve in the second...was relieved by Trivino with runners on first and second and one out in the fifth and Trivino allowed a three-run home run.

SECOND START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 6-2 loss at Houston on April 8...allowed a leadoff home run to Correa in the second, a RBI double to Correa in the fourth and a solo home run to Alvarez in the sixth...walked the next batter (Correa) and was relieved by Wendelken with a runner on first and one out in the sixth with the A's trailing 3-0...Wendelken allowed Correa to score plus a run of his own.

THIRD START: He combined with Wendelken, Guerra and Weems on a five-hit shutout in the A's 7-0 win over Detroit on April 17 in Oakland...it was his first win since May 17, 2019 against Colorado and it snapped a career-high four-game losing streak...tossed six of the inning and allowed four of the hits for the longest scoreless outing of his career...did not walk a batter for the first time as a starter.

FOURTH START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 3-1 win at Baltimore April 23...it is the second time in his career he put together consecutive wins (May 12-17, 2019)...shut out the Orioles on four hits and a walk over the first five innings before loading the bases on three consecutive singles to start the sixth...struck out the next batter he faced (Mountcastle) before allowing a RBI single to Severino...that snapped a career-high 11.0 inning scoreless streak...was relieved by Petit following the Severino single with the A's leading 3-1.

FIFTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-0 loss at Tampa Bay April 28...allowed at least one hit in each of the first four innings but did not allow a run until Zunino homered with two outs in the fifth...also allowed a RBI single to Margot in the fifth but then struck out the side in the sixth...Glasnow and two Tampa Bay relievers combined to shut out Oakland on seven hits.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-1 win over Toronto last Tuesday in Oakland...had career highs in innings pitched (8.0), strikeouts (9) and pitches (102)...faced the minimum over the first five innings as his only base runner, a Biggio single to lead off the third, was erased on a double play...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the sixth inning on a Semien RBI double...then retired seven of the final eight batters he faced.

2020 RECAP: Had two stints with Philadelphia and was 0-1 with a 17.18 ERA in three relief appearances...opponents went 11-for-21 (.524) but he walked just one and struck out four in 3.2 innings...allowed a .438 (7-for-16) average against right-handed hitters compared to .800 (4-for-5) against left-handers...was 2-0 with a 4.50 ERA in four spring training appearances...was optioned to Lehigh Valley March 26 but was recalled on July 23 and was on the Phillies Opening Day roster...made his 2020 debut on July 26 against Miami and allowed four runs on five hits in an inning of relief and was the losing pitcher in an 11-6 decision...tossed a scoreless inning of relief Aug. 9 against Atlanta but was optioned to Philadelphia's alternate site on Aug. 9...was recalled for a second time Aug. 20, pitched the next day at Atlanta (1.2 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 3 so) and was optioned Aug. 22...did not pitch the remainder of the season.

TUESDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Chris Bassitt (2-2, 3.70 ERA): Is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season...is 2-0 with a 3.13 ERA and .221 opponents batting average over his last five starts after going 0-2 with a 5.56 ERA and .289 opponents average over his first two starts...has allowed exactly two runs in each of his last five starts and is the first pitcher in Oakland history to allow exactly two runs in five consecutive games (starter or reliever)...has struck out seven or more batters in each of his last four starts and has 32 strikeouts in 25.0 innings over that span (11.52 per nine innings)...now has 43 strikeouts for the season, which is tied for seventh in the American League...is tied for the AL lead with five hit batters...had a no decision in his last start, a 9-4 A's loss to Toronto on Wednesday here in Oakland (7.0 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 0 bb, 7 so)...has never faced the Red Sox in his career and Boston is one of two AL teams he has never faced (New York).

- Has allowed just one earned run in his last 12 games (12.1 ip, 7 h, 2 r, er, 3 bb, 16 so) after yielding four runs over his first three contests.
- Has three saves, which are his first since June 20, 2018 for Texas against Kansas City...now has 10 saves in his career.
- Has yielded a .171 (6-for-35) average against right-handed hitters compared to .273 (6-for-22) against left-handers.
- Has faced Tampa Bay four times this year, going 2-0 with one run over 3.2 innings pitched...has faced Tampa Bay 17 times in his career, accruing a 2.35 ERA (4 er, 15.1 ip) with 24 strikeouts and three walks.

Last Year: Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)

Inherited Runners/Scored: 0/0 **First Hitters:** 4-6

- Was reinstated from the injured list April 20.
- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and allowed eight runs on nine hits in 2.2 innings over three appearances before he was placed on the IL April 6 with a sprained left thumb sustained while covering first base.
- Has allowed a hit to the first batter he has faced in four of his six appearances.
- Faced Tampa Bay earlier this year, throwing one scoreless frame on April 27 at Tropicana Field...has faced the Rays three times in his career, throwing 2.2 scoreless innings.
- Was signed to a minor league contract Dec. 4 and was a non-roster invitee...compiled a 0.96 ERA in nine relief appearances this spring...opponents were 3-for-29 (.103) with one walk in 9.1 innings.

Last Year: Was a non-roster invitee with the Los Angeles Dodgers and had a loss and a 3.00 ERA in six spring training appearances...was not added to the Dodgers 60-man player pool and did not pitch in 2020.

Inherited Runners/Scored: 1/0 **First Hitters:** 3-10

- Walked a career-high four batters April 25 at Baltimore...had just two career outings with more than one walk prior to that (both two walks)...was charged with five runs (two earned) in 0.2 innings, which were the second most of his career (6, July 30, 2015 at Cincinnati).
- Left-handed hitters are 1-for-20 (.050) this year and are 2-for-33 (.061) over the last two years.
- Had his streak of consecutive batters retired snapped at 15 on April 24 when he allowed a two-out single to Hays in the ninth.
- Faced Tampa Bay once earlier this season, throwing 1.0 scoreless inning with two strikeouts...has faced them three times in his career and is 1-0 with 4.1 scoreless innings pitched.
- Was selected from the A's alternate site April 8.

Last Year: Was on the Opening Day roster and appeared in nine games for Philadelphia in 2020 and went 1-3 with an 8.59 ERA (7 er in 7.1 ip)...struck out eight batters and walked two.

21 LHP ADAM KOLAREK

Last Outing: 5/6 vs. Toronto (ND, 1.0 ip, 2 h)

Saves/Opportunities: 0-0

Inherited Runners/Scored: 9/6 **First Hitters:** 3-9, sac

- Has not allowed a run over his last seven games (5.0 ip, 4 h, 1 bb, 2 so) but has allowed 6-of-8 (75.0%) inherited runners to score...allowed six runs in 2.0 innings over his first three appearances.
- Left-handed hitters are 3-for-16 (.188) against him but right-handers are 7-for-17 (.412).
- Has faced Tampa Bay once in his career, recording one out without allowing a baserunner with the Dodgers in 2019...spent three seasons with the Rays, recording a 4.19 ERA (40 er, 86.0 ip) across 97 appearances from 2017-19.
- Was acquired from Los Angeles (NL) with minor leaguer Cody Thomas on Feb. 12 for Sheldon Neuse and Gus Varland.

Last Year: Went 3-0 with a 0.95 ERA, .164 opponents batting average and .432 OPS in 20 relief appearances over three stints with the Los Angeles Dodgers...his ERA was second lowest among relievers in the West divisions to the A's Jake Diekman (0.42).

36 RHP YUSMEIRO PETIT

Last Outing: 5/8 vs. Tampa Bay (ND, 1.1 ip, h, 3 so)

Saves/Opportunities: 1-1
