OAKLAND ATHLETICS (21-15) VS. BOSTON RED SOX (22-14)

TUESDAY, MAY 11, 2021 — FENWAY PARK — 7:10 EDT

RHP CHRIS BASSITT (2-2, 3.70) VS. RHP NATHAN EOVALDI (4-2, 4.62)

ABOUT THE A'S: Won two of three from Tampa Bay to close out the last homestand and are now 5-3 over the last eight games...are 7-8 since their 13-game winning streak but are 21-9 (.700) over the last 30 games after starting the season 0-6...are 21-15 (.583) overall, which is the third best record in the American League...are six games over .500, which is one short of the season high of seven (four times, last: 21-14 on May 8)...are in first place in the AL West and have a season-high tying 2½ game lead (second time, last: May 8)...have held at least a share of first in the West for each of the last 21 days and have been alone in first for each of the last 17...went from sole possession of last on April 11 to sole possession of first on April 21...have spent 19 days alone in first place this year, two days tied for first, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a six-game road trip to Boston (three games) and Minnesota (three games) tonight...went 4-3 on the last road trip to Baltimore (2-1) and Tampa Bay (2-2) and are 8-4 (.667) on the road, which is the second best road record in the American League to the Red Sox (12-5, .706)...went 5-5 the last homestand against Baltimore (1-2), Toronto (2-2) and Tampa Bay (2-1), which was their longest homestand of the season...are now 13-11 (.542) at home, which is fourth best in the AL...have a 3.29 ERA (38 er in 104.0 ip) on the road, which is second lowest in the AL to Baltimore (3.11)...have a 4.58 ERA at home, which is fourth highest.

CLOSE CALLS (AND NOT SO CLOSE): The A's have the best record in the majors in games decided by three runs or fewer (14-4, .778) and two runs or fewer (11-4, .733) and the second best record in one-run games (8-3, .727)...however, are 7-11 (.389) in games decided by four runs or more...have outscored the opposition 71-53 in games decided by three runs or fewer (+18) but have been outscored 107-79 in the other games (-28)...have an overall run differential of -10...lead the majors with four walk-off wins...are 6-0 in games decided in the last at bat...are 2-0 in extra innings and are 8-1 in extra innings over the last two years.

THE LONG BALL: The A's had their streak of 10 consecutive games with a home run snapped on Sunday...hit 16 home runs during the streak and now have 46 for the season, which is tied with the Yankees, Rangers and Angels for second most in the American League to the Blue Jays (48)...are 18-2 when out-homer the opposition and 1-11 when they are out-homered.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 9-for-30 (.300) with a home run, six RBI and a walk...lead the AL in pinch hits, RBI and plate appearances (31) and have one of three pinch home runs...went 3-for-29 (.103) with three RBI in the pinch last year.

FREE PASSES: A's starting pitchers have walked two batters or fewer in each of the last 25 games, which matches the longest such streak in Oakland history (Aug. 2-29, 2012)...have walked 29 batters in 141.0 innings during the streak (1.85 per nine innings) and are averaging 2.38 walks per nine innings overall, which is second lowest in the American League to the Yankees (2.38)...as a team, A's pitchers have walked 99 batters, which is fourth fewest in the AL...A's batters have drawn 128 walks, which is second most.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .211 (100-for-474) with 50 runs scored over the last 15 games (3.3 runs per game) after hitting .260 with 75 runs over the previous 12 contests (6.3 runs per game)...are batting .219 for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...lead the league in hit by pitches (24), rank second in walks (128), tied for second in home runs (46), third in stolen bases (22), tied for fourth in triples (6) and fifth in fewest strikeouts (323)

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.18 ERA (71 er in 201.0 ip) over their last 23 games dating back to April 16 after posting a 5.85 ERA over the first 13 contests...have the third highest opponents batting average in the American League (.250) but the second lowest average with runners in scoring position (.215)...are tied for second in shutouts (4), tied for third in most wild pitches (22) and rank fourth in fewest walks (99).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 11-7 with a 3.32 ERA (51 er in 138.1 ip) over the last 24 games after going 2-7 with a 6.63 ERA over the first 12...are 13-14 with a 4.30 ERA overall...have the second most losses in the American League (Tigers, 19) but the third most wins...lead the AL and rank fourth in the majors in innings pitched (196.2)...have tossed eight innings or fewer in each of the last 212 games, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history...have not had a pitcher toss more than eight innings since Frankie Montas on May 17, 2019 at Detroit (8.2).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen allowed one run in the three-game series against Tampa Bay (8.1 ip) after yielding 13 in the four-game series against Toronto (11.2 ip)...has converted 10-of-11 (90.9%) save opportunities, which is the best percentage in the majors...is tied for third in the American League in saves...has an 8-1 record and the one loss is the fewest in the majors...has allowed just four home runs over the A's last 28 games after surrendering seven over the first eight...the 11 home runs are tied with the Mariners for the fewest in the AL...has allowed 19-of-46 (41.3%) inherited runners to score, which is the fourth highest percentage in the AL...has the highest batting average (.293), on-base percentage (.383) and slugging percentage (.556) against first batters faced in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed five errors in the last four games after making just three over the previous eight contests...have -24 defensive runs saved, which is second fewest in the majors (Angels, -28)...A's pitchers are tied for fourth in the American League in pickoffs (2)...opponents have been successful is 15-of-21 (71.4%) stolen base attempts, which is the fifth lowest percentage in the AL...A's outfielders have three assists (all by Laureano), which is tied for fourth fewest in the AL.

LEFT-HANDED STARTERS: The A's have faced a left-handed starting pitcher for in seven of the previous eight games, nine of the previous 11 and 12 of the previous 16...faced a lefty in six straight games from May 2-7, which matched the longest such streak in Oakland history (sixth time)...are 10-6 (.625) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed compared to 11-9 (.550) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is fourth best in the American League...are batting .233 (103-for-442) with a .742 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .210 (149-for-710) with a .668 OPS against right-handers.

THE SCHEDULE: The A's had their first day off yesterday since April 21, ending a streak of 17 consecutive days without a day off...went 9-8 over the stretch...are 4-0 following an off day...this three-game series with Boston will conclude a stretch of 20 consecutive games against American League East teams that began on April 23...are 9-8 over that span...the last homestand began a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 20 of 29 games at home and 35 of 44 in the Pacific Time Zone...are 5-5 over that span.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 11 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have seven players on the IL (Fiers, Garcia, Luzardo, Pinder, Puk, Rosenthal, Wendelken).

A's vs. RED SOX: The A's and Red Sox meet tonight for the first time in over two years...last played on May 1, 2019 in Boston, 741 days ago...the A's went 3-4 against the Red Sox in 2013...won three of four in Oakland but were swept in a three-game series at Fenway...are 13-19 against Boston dating back to 2015, which includes 10-7 at home and 3-12 on the road...have a four-game losing streak at Fenway but have won nine of the last 12 games in the Coliseum...are 247-300 against Boston since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 150-123 in Oakland, 96-176 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 889-1081 against the Red Sox.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Seth Brown is tied for second among American League rookies in home runs (5) and tied for fourth in RBI (12)...**Mark Canha** leads the majors in hit by pitches (9)...ranks second in the American League in runs (28), tied for fourth in stolen bases (6) and eighth in walks (20)...**Jed Lowrie** leads the majors in batting with runners in scoring position (.500) and is tied for second in multiple hit games (13)...is tied for fifth in the AL in doubles (10)...is 11-for-26 (.423) with four doubles, five RBI and three three-hit games over his last seven games...**Yusmeiro Petit** has a 14.1-inning scoreless streak and now has a 0.87 ERA, which is seventh lowest among AL relievers...**Lou Trivino** is tied for third in the American League in games pitched (17) and tied for sixth with a career-high six saves.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1904** Rube Waddell tosses a complete game and Danny Murphy goes 5-for-6 in the A's 6-5, 12-inning win over Chicago...in **2012** Brandon Inge drives in four runs for the fourth time in his last five games to become the second player in Major League history with four games of four or more RBI over a five-game stretch...the first was Lou Gehrig in 1931...in **2014** Derek Norris hits two three-run home runs on a 3-0 count in consecutive innings in the A's 9-1 win over Washington.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (2-2, 3.70 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season...is 2-0 with a 3.13 ERA (10 er in 30.0 ip) and .221 (25-for-112) opponents batting average over his last five starts after going 0-2 with a 5.56 ERA and .289 opponents average over his first two starts...has allowed exactly two runs in each of his last five starts and is the first pitcher in Oakland history to allow exactly two runs in five consecutive games (starter or reliever)...the only longer streak in Athletics history is six by Bob Davis of the 1960 Kansas City A's, all in relief (Aug. 8-26).

STRIKEOUTS: Has struck out seven or more batters in each of his last four starts and has 32 strikeouts in 25.0 innings over that span (11.52 per nine innings)...fanned 11 in 16.1 innings over his first two starts (6.06 per nine innings) and now has 43 strikeouts for the season, which is tied for seventh in the American League.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-0 with a 3.18 ERA (6 er in 17.0 ip) in three starts on the road compared to 0-2 with a 4.07 ERA (11 er in 24.1 ip) in four starts at home...last year, he went 2-1 with a 0.72 ERA, .207 opponents batting average and .512 OPS in five starts in Oakland compared to 3-1 with a 4.56 ERA, .270 opponents average and .683 OPS in five starts on the road...his home ERA was second lowest in the majors (Keller, KC 0.27) and second lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 30 innings (Treinen, 0.63 in 2018)...did not allow a home run in 37.1 innings in Oakland...is 9-12 with a 2.62 ERA (62 er in 212.2 ip) in 39 career games in the Coliseum, 12-11 with a 4.52 ERA (114 er in 227.0 ip) in 47 games in all other ballparks...has yielded just 13 home runs in 212.2 career innings in Oakland (0.55 per nine innings).

FIVE DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 2-0 with a 3.00 ERA (8 er in 24.0 ip) in four starts on five days rest and now has a seven-game winning streak when starting on five days rest...is 7-0 with a 2.86 ERA (22 er in 69.1 ip) in 12 starts over that span, which dates back to July 19, 2019.

THIS AND THAT: Is tied for the American League lead in hit batters (5) and ranks eighth in innings pitched (41.1)...has allowed three home runs, all to left-handed hitters...has surrendered 21 of his 30 home runs over the last three years to lefties...opponents are batting .304 (17-for-56) the first time through the order, .208 (21-for-101) after that...has received two runs of support or fewer in four of his seven starts and is 0-2 in those starts...is 17-1 in 28 career starts with three runs of support or more, 4-22 in 45 starts with two runs of support or fewer...the A's are 4-3 (.571) in his starting assignments and are 27-16 (.628) when he starts over the last three years...does not have a complete game in 73 career starts...68 of those starts have come with Oakland, which is the second longest streak of consecutive starts with no complete games in Oakland history (Barry Zito, Aug. 22, 2003-Sept. 28, 2006)...did not pitch in the majors in 2017 following May 6, 2016 "Tommy John" surgery...is 19-12 with a 3.35 ERA (110 er in 296.0 ip) and is averaging 8.51 strikeouts per nine innings (280 so in 296.0 ip) in 56 games (49 starts) since the surgery...was 2-11 with a 4.13 ERA and 6.77 strikeouts per nine innings in 29 games (23 starts) before the surgery.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-1 loss to Houston on Opening Day, April 1 in Oakland...became the A's 14th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 16 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill, Graveman twice, Fiers, Montas)...blanked the Astros on one hit over the first three innings before allowing a run in the fourth when Altuve walked, went to third on a Brantley double and scored on a Bregman ground out...the run snapped a 16.2-inning scoreless streak during the regular season and a 27.1-inning home scoreless streak, which was ninth longest in Oakland history...was relieved by Petit with one out in the sixth inning, runners on first and second and the A's trailing 1-0...Petit allowed both runners to score.

SECOND START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 5-1 loss to Los Angeles (NL) on April 6 in Oakland...allowed nine hits, which were his most since April 28, 2016 at Detroit when he yielded a career-high 10...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed a RBI double to Barnes in the second...then allowed three more runs in the third on a two-run home run by Muncy and a solo home run by Rios...the home runs were the first he allowed in the Coliseum since Aug. 24, 2019, snapping a 10-game, 55.1-inning, 229-batter homerless streak.

THIRD START: He picked up his first win of the season in the A's 9-5 win at Arizona on April 12...allowed just two hits in 5.0 innings, which matched his fewest hits ever in a start...however, issued five walks...had a 3-0 lead when he issued consecutive one-out walks in the third...Calhoun followed with a RBI single and Cabrera added a sacrifice fly...those were the only two runs he would allow in five innings of work.

FOURTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win over Detroit on April 18 in Oakland...loaded the bases with one out in the first inning but then retired each of the next 10 batters and 14 of the next 15...had a 1-0 lead

when he allowed a two-out, two-run single to Harold Castro in the sixth...was relieved by Diekmann to start the seventh inning with the A's trailing 2-1 but Oakland scored once in the eighth to get him off the hook and once in the ninth for the win.

FIFTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-2 victory at Baltimore April 24...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed a RBI double to Sisco in the second inning...retired the side in order in the third and fourth inning and had a 7-1 lead when he allowed a RBI double to Mancini in the fifth.

SIXTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win at Tampa Bay April 29...tied an Oakland record with three hit batters (12th time, last: Fiers, June 22, 2019, also against Tampa Bay)...allowed a RBI double to Meadows in the first inning but the A's came back with single runs in the third and fourth innings to give him a 2-1 lead...allowed a solo home run to Lowe in the fifth and was relieved by Petit to start the seventh with the score tied 2-2.

LAST START: He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 9-4 loss to Toronto last Wednesday in Oakland...allowed two runs in the first inning on back-to-back RBI singles by Hernandez and Grichuk...those were the only two runs he would allow in seven innings of work as he retired 19 of the final 21 batters he faced...was relieved by Trivino to start the eighth with the A's leading 3-2 but Trivino allowed five runs for the blown save.

2020 RECAP: Spent the entire season on the active roster for the first time in his six-year career and went 5-2 with a 2.29 ERA in 11 starts...his ERA ranked second among pitchers in the West divisions (Lamet, SD 2.09) and sixth in the majors...it was fifth lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 10 starts...also tied for fifth in the West divisions in winning percentage (.714), ranked seventh in opponents OPS (.659), batting average (.233) and slugging percentage (.371), tied for seventh in wins and eighth in on-base percentage (.288)...had career lows in ERA and opponents on-base percentage...walked 17 batters in 63.0 innings for a career-low 2.43 walks per nine innings...struck out 55 for a career-best 3.24 strikeout-to-walk ratio...led the A's in innings pitched and tied for the lead in games started...received five votes (two third, one fourth, two fifth) in American League Cy Young balloting...went 1-0 with a 1.08 ERA over his first three starts, 1-2 with a 5.95 ERA over his next four starts and 3-0 with a 0.34 ERA over his final four starts...allowed a .233 opponents batting average, which broke down to .223 (31-for-139) with a .590 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .248 (25-for-101) with a .755 OPS against left-handers...yielded four of his six home runs to lefties...walked just one batter to lead off an inning and held opponents to a .203 (13-for-64) batting average and .227 on-base percentage in that situation...the on-base percentage was sixth lowest in the majors...five of his six home runs came with the bases empty...had a .244 opponents batting average with runners in scoring position, but that dropped to .176 with RISP and two outs...had a .130 opponent average with two strikes...went 3-0 with a 1.15 ERA in six starts at night compared to 2-2 with a 4.13 ERA in five starts during the day...his night ERA was the lowest in the majors and in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 30 innings at night...was 3-0 with a 1.75 ERA in four starts following an A's loss...allowed one run or fewer in seven of his 11 starts, including no runs four times.

- Allowed an earned run in his last outing on Saturday against Tampa Bay to snap a streak of 11 games and 11.1 innings without an earned run...now has a 0.73 ERA (1 er in 12.1 ip) over his last 12 games after surrendering four runs over his first three appearances.
- Has struck out two batters in each of his last four appearances (8 so in 3.2 ip) and at least one in each of his last 11 (18 so in 11.0 ip)...has 22 strikeouts for the season, which is tied for seventh among American League relievers...is tied for third in first batter strikeouts (9).
- Has yielded a .171 (6-for-35) average against right-handed hitters compared to .273 (6-for-22) against left-handers...has issued four of his five walks to righties.
- Has not allowed an earned run in seven outings on two days rest or more (6.2 ip).
- Last faced Boston on June 4, 2019 while pitching for Kansas City (1.0 ip, 3 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 so)...has a 10.80 ERA (6 er in 5.0 ip) in six career outings against the Red Sox.
- Has three saves, which are one short of his career high of four with Texas in 2016.

Last Year: Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and allowed eight runs on nine hits in 2.2 innings over three appearances before he was placed on the IL April 6 with a sprained left thumb sustained while covering first base.

- Has allowed a hit to the first batter he has faced in four of his six appearances.

- Has allowed eight runs over his last five games (6.2 ip, 4 h, 8 r, 4 er, 6 bb, 6 so, 5.40 ERA) after allowing one run over his first five contests (1.23 ERA).
- Has held left-handed hitters to a .050 (1-for-20) batting average compared to .226 (7-for-31) against right-handers...has issued all six of his walks and yielded both of his home runs to righties for a .771 OPS...has a .100 OPS against lefties.
- Opponents are 0-for-10 with runners in scoring position.
- Faced Boston once last year on Aug. 18 while pitching for Philadelphia (1.1 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 2 so)...has a 1.80 ERA (1 er in 5.0 ip) in four career outings against the Red Sox.
