OAKLAND ATHLETICS (23-15) VS. BOSTON RED SOX (22-16)

THURSDAY, MAY 13, 2021 — FENWAY PARK — 7:10 EDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight, four of the last five and seven of the last 10 games to improve to a season-high eight games over .500...are 23-15 (.605), which is the second best record in the American League to the White Sox (21-13, .618) and third best in the majors (Giants, 22-14/.611)...started the season 0-6 but are 23-9 (.719) since then...are in first place in the AL West and have a season-high tying 2½ game lead for the fourth time in the last five days...have held at least a share of first in the West for each of the last 23 days and have been alone in first for each of the last 19...went from sole possession of last on April 11 to sole possession of first on April 21...have spent 21 days alone in first place this year, two days tied for first, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

GOING FOR THE SWEEP: The A's have won the first two games of this series...over the last 48 years, Oakland has swept just one series at Boston and that was in 1990 (Sept. 3-5)...have not swept a series from the Red Sox since Aug. 31-Sept. 2, 2012 in Oakland...the A's have swept three series this year, including one on the road (April 12-13 at Arizona)...have swept just one series of three or more games on the road over the last two years (Aug. 14-16, 2020 at San Francisco).

CLOSE CALLS (AND NOT SO CLOSE): The A's won 4-1 last night and each of their last nine wins have been by three runs or fewer...are 16-4 (.800) in games decided by three runs or fewer, which is the best record in the majors...also have the best record in games decided by two runs or fewer (12-4, .750) and one-run games (9-3, .750)...however, are 7-11 (.389) in games decided by four runs or more...have outscored the opposition 78-56 in games decided by three runs or fewer (+22) but have been outscored 107-79 in the other games (-28)...have an overall run differential of -6...have four walk-off wins, which is tied with the Mets for the most in the majors...are 6-0 in games decided in the last at bat...are 2-0 in extra innings and are 8-1 in extra innings over the last two years.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-0 on this six-game road trip to Boston (2-0) and Minnesota (three games)...went 4-3 on the last road trip to Baltimore (2-1) and Tampa Bay (2-2) and are 10-4 (.714) on the road, which is the best road record in the majors ahead of the Red Sox (12-5, .706)...went 5-5 on the last homestand against Baltimore (1-2), Toronto (2-2) and Tampa Bay (2-1), which was their longest homestand of the season...are now 13-11 (.542) at home...have a 3.02 ERA (41 er in 122.0 ip) on the road, which is the lowest in the majors ahead of the Brewers (3.05)...have a 4.58 ERA at home, which is eighth highest...the last homestand began a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 20 of 29 games at home and 35 of 44 in the Pacific Time Zone...are 7-5 over that span, including 5-5 at home.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .232 (82-for-354) in May after hitting .214 (185-for-865) in April...are hitting .219 overall, which is fifth lowest in the American League...lead the league in hit by pitches (24), rank second in walks (132), third in stolen bases (22), tied for third in home runs (47) and fifth in triples (6) and fewest strikeouts (343).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 9-for-30 (.300) with a home run, six RBI and a walk...lead the AL in pinch hits and RBI, have one of three home runs and rank second in plate appearances (31)...went 3-for-29 (.103) with three RBI in the pinch last year.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 11 runs over the last five games (10 er in 45.0 ip, 2.00 ERA) and now have a 3.05 ERA (74 er in 219.0 ip) over their last 25 games dating back to April 16, which is second lowest in the American League over that span (Yankees, 2.95)...overall, are tied for second in the AL in most wild pitches (24), tied for third in fewest walks (105), fewest hit batters (14) and most shutouts (4) and tied for fifth in fewest home runs (40).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 13-7 with a 3.23 ERA (54 er in 150.1 ip) over the last 26 games after going 2-7 with a 6.63 ERA over the first 12 contests...are 15-14 with a 4.18 ERA overall...are tied for the second most wins and losses in the American League...have 208.2 innings pitched, which is second most in the majors to the Dodgers (214.0)...have tossed eight innings or fewer in each of the last 214 games, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history...have not had a pitcher toss more than eight innings since Frankie Montas on May 17, 2019 at Detroit (8.2).

FREE PASSES: James Kaprielian walked three batters last night, snapping the A's streak of 26 consecutive games with two walks or fewer from their starting pitchers...that was the longest such streak in Oakland history, breaking the previous mark of 25 from Aug. 2-29, 2012...starters are averaging 2.37

walks per nine innings, which is second lowest in the American League to the Yankees (2.16).

BULLPEN: Jake Diekman recorded his fifth save of the season last night, which is second on the A's to Lou Trivino (6)...the A's are the only team in the majors with two pitchers with five or more saves...the A's bullpen has not allowed a run in four of the last five games (1 er in 14.1 ip, 0.62 ERA) after yielding 12 runs in the previous two contests...has converted 12-of-13 (92.3%) save opportunities, which is the best percentage in the majors...is tied with the Rays for the American League lead in saves...has an 8-1 record and the one loss is the fewest in the majors...has a .656 opponents OPS, which is fifth lowest in the AL...has allowed just four home runs over the A's last 30 games after surrendering seven over the first eight...the 11 home runs are the fewest in the AL and tied for third fewest in the majors...has allowed 19-of-46 (41.3%) inherited runners to score, which is the fourth highest percentage in the AL...has the highest batting average (.282), on-base percentage (.375) and slugging percentage (.534) against first batters faced in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed six errors in the last six games...have -24 defensive runs saved, which is second fewest in the majors (Angels, -29)...A's pitchers are tied for fourth in the AL in pickoffs (2)...opponents have been successful is 15-of-21 (71.4%) stolen base attempts, which is the fifth lowest percentage in the AL...A's outfielders had three assists (all by Laureano), which is tied for third fewest in the AL...the A's have turned the second fewest double plays in the AL (22).

LEFT-HANDED STARTERS: After facing a left-handed starting pitcher in eight of the previous 10 games, 10 of the previous 13 and 13 of the previous 18, the A's are now scheduled to face a right-hander in at least each of the next four games...are 11-6 (.647) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed compared to 12-9 (.571) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is fourth best in the American League and the 17 games are tied for second most...are batting .239 (112-for-469) with a .753 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .207 (155-for-750) with a .653 OPS against right-handers...have the fifth best OPS in the AL against lefties and the second lowest against righties.

THIS AND THAT: The A's conclude a stretch of 20 consecutive games against American League East teams tonight...are 11-8 over the first 19 games...have a three-game series at Minnesota this weekend and are 7-0 against AL Central...are 19-2 when out-homer the opposition, 2-11 when they are out-homered.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 11 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have six players on the IL (Fiers, Luzardo, Pinder, Puk, Rosenthal, Wendelken).

A's vs. RED SOX: The A's have won the first two meetings of 2021 and have not won three games at Boston in one season since going 3-4 in 2009...went 3-4 against the Red Sox in 2019...won three of four in Oakland but were swept in a three-game series at Fenway...are 15-19 against Boston dating back to 2015, which includes 10-7 at home and 5-12 on the road...had their four-game losing streak at Fenway snapped Tuesday night...have won nine of the last 12 games in the Coliseum...are 249-300 against Boston since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 150-123 in Oakland, 98-176 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 891-1081 against the Red Sox.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Seth Brown is tied for second among American League rookies in home runs (5) and tied for fourth in RBI (12)...**Mark Canha** leads the majors in hit by pitches (9)...ranks third in the AL in runs (28), tied for fifth in stolen bases (6) and tied for eighth in walks (20)...**Jed Lowrie** ranks second in the AL in batting with runners in scoring position (.464), tied for third in multiple hit games (13) and tied for sixth in doubles (10)...**Yusmeiro Petit** has a 15.1-inning scoreless streak and now has a 0.83 ERA, which is seventh lowest among AL relievers.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1981** Matt Keough improves to 6-0 as the A's defeat the Yankees at New York, 5-4...in **1986** Dave Kingman hits a three-run homer in the bottom of the 10th inning after the A's score single runs in the seventh, eighth and ninth innings in a 6-3 win over Toronto...in **2007** the A's score five times in the bottom of the ninth inning to defeat Cleveland, 10-7...Milton Bradley hits a two-run home run to tie the game and Jack Cust hits a three-run homer for the win as he homers in his fourth consecutive game.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (3-1, 3.07 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his eight start of the season...is 3-0 with a 2.23 ERA (9 er in 36.1 ip) over his last six starts after allowing five runs on six hits in 4.2 innings in his first start, a loss...has allowed one run in two of his three no decisions and had one run of support in each of those two starts...has allowed one run or fewer in four of his seven starts...the A's are 6-1 (.857) in his starting assignments and are 17-6 (.739) when he starts over the last three years.

DON'T WALK: Has walked two batters or fewer in each of his last six starts (5 bb in 36.1 ip, 1.24 per nine innings)...has two starts with no walks and three others with one...is averaging 1.76 walks per nine innings for the season, which is seventh lowest in the American League...ranks fifth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (5.38)...over the last four years, he has walked two batters or fewer in 44 of his 50 starts (16 with no walks, 20 with one)...has 55 walks in 285.0 innings over that span, an average of 1.74 per nine innings.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held left-handed hitters to a .105 (4-for-38) batting average compared to .274 (32-for-117) by right-handers...the mark against lefties is second lowest in the majors (Miley, CIN .050)...two of the four hits by lefties are home runs...opponents are batting .217 (5-for-23) with runners in scoring position after hitting .375 with RISP last year...has a .183 (11-for-60) average against a batter the first time he faces him in a game, .263 (25-for-95) after that...over the last four years, he has a mark of .190 (88-for-464) the first time through the order, .252 (178-for-707) after that...has held the opponents three and four hitters in the order to a combined .162 (6-for-37) batting average.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-0 with a 1.85 ERA (5 er in 24.1 ip) and .193 (17-for-88) opponents batting average in four starts at night compared to 1-1 with a 4.86 ERA (9 er in 16.2 ip) and .284 (19-for-67) opponents average in three starts during the day...entered the season with a 24-27 record at night, 18-5 during the day.

BY MONTH: Went 3-1 with a 2.83 ERA in five starts in April...is now 8-4 with a 2.97 ERA and .189 opponents batting average in 16 career starts in the month of April...is 0-0 with a 3.65 ERA (5 er in 12.1 ip) over his first two starts in May and is now 5-8 with a 5.51 ERA (58 er in 94.2 ip) in 17 career starts in May...his May ERA is his highest for any month (5.22 in August).

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-2 loss to Houston on April 4 in Oakland...allowed a solo home run to Tucker in the first inning but the A's came back to tie the game in the bottom of the first...then allowed a two-run home run to Castro in the second and a two-run double to Gurriel in the third.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-2 win at Houston on April 9...blanked the Astros on three hits over the first three innings and allowed his only run in the fourth when Gurriel walked, went to third on a Correa single and scored on a Tucker ground out...was relieved by Petit to start the seventh inning with the scored tied 1-1.

THIRD START: He picked up his first win of the season in the A's 8-4 victory over Detroit on April 15 in Oakland...it was the 100th game of his career...blanked the Tigers on two hits over the first three innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a RBI double to Castro in the fourth...Oakland built a 3-1 lead before he allowed his final run on a leadoff home run to Goodrum in the sixth...was relieved by Petit to start the seventh with the A's leading 7-2.

FOURTH START: He tossed a six-hit, seven-inning shutout in the A's 7-0 win over Minnesota in the first game of the doubleheader April 20 in Oakland...it was the 11th complete game shutout of fewer than eight innings in Oakland history (last: Mike Minor, Sept. 14, 2020 at Seattle)...it was his second career complete game and shutout, with the other being his no-hitter on April 21, 2018 against Boston...the start was the 100th of his career and he became the 25th pitcher in Oakland history to make 100 starts...did not walk a batter and struck out seven.

FIFTH START: He won his third consecutive start in the A's 2-1 win at Tampa Bay on April 26...allowed a leadoff single to Arozarena, who went to second on a ground out, stole third and scored on a Meadows sacrifice fly...that would be the only run he would allow in five innings of work...Oakland scored twice in the fourth for the win.

SIXTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-5 win over Baltimore May 2 in Oakland...the A's scored twice in the first but he allowed single runs in the second and third innings on a Galvis RBI single and a Hays solo home run...Oakland came back with two in the bottom of the third to take a 4-2 lead but he allowed a two-run single to Mancini in the fifth...left after five innings with the scored tied at 4-4.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 2-1 win over Tampa Bay last Friday in Oakland...struck out a career-high tying 10 batters (fourth time, previous: Sept. 8, 2019 vs. Detroit)...retired each of the first 18 batters he faced before

walking Arozarena to start the seventh...then retired the next three before Brosseau led off the eighth inning with a double...Brosseau scored on a Zunino RBI single and Manaea was relieved by Petit with one out in the eighth inning, a runner on first and the scored tied 1-1.

MANAEA vs. BOSTON: Is 3-2 with a 6.84 ERA (26.1 ip, 34 h, 22 r, 20 er, 3 bb, 22 so, 5 hr) in five career starts...is 2-0 with a 1.29 ERA (2 er in 14.0 ip) in two starts in Oakland and 1-2 with a 13.14 ERA (18 er in 12.1 ip) in three starts in Fenway Park...has not faced Boston since 2018 when he went 2-0 with a 1.80 ERA (15.0 ip, 8 h, 4 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 14 so) in two starts...the first start was a no-hitter in a 3-0 win in Oakland on April 21...walked Betts to start the game but then retired 14 straight before Leon reached on a Semien error...set down the next 12 before walking Benintendi with two outs in the ninth...then got Ramirez to hit into a game-ending force out for his first career complete game...walked two and matched his career high with 10 strikeouts...also picked up the win in a 6-5 decision at Fenway on May 14...Oakland scored a run in the third but he allowed two in the bottom of the third on RBI singles by Benintendi and Ramirez...then A's then scored three times in the fourth to take the lead for good...allowed another run in the fifth and a leadoff home run to Devers in the seventh...left with a 5-4 lead, a runner on first and no outs in the seventh and Petit stranded the runner.

2020 RECAP: Went 4-3 with a 4.50 ERA in 11 starts...the ERA was the highest of his career as was his .270 opponents batting average...his .427 slugging percentage matched his high...went 4-1 with a 2.65 ERA and .234 opponents batting average over his final six starts dating back to Aug. 20...the wins tied for fourth most in the majors over that span...went 0-2 with a 7.65 ERA and .325 opponents average over his first five starts...tied for the team lead in starts...walked just eight batters in 54.0 innings, an average of 1.33 walks per nine innings...that was the lowest mark of his career and was sixth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 50 or more innings pitched...struck out 45 for a career-best 5.63 strikeout-to-walk ratio...had five starts without a walk, five with one and three in his other...had a 2.56 ERA and .233 opponents batting average over the first three innings of his starts compared to a 7.59 ERA and .319 opponents average from the fourth inning on...his .270 opponents batting average broke down to .250 (13-for-52) against left-handed hitters compared to .277 (44-for-159) against right-handers...issued seven of eight walks to righties...had a .204 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .327 with seven of his eight walks after that...had a .281 batting average against batters leading off an inning but issued just one walk (.293 on-base percentage)...yielded a .222 average with the bases empty, .373 with runners on...opponents hit .375 with runners in scoring position and were 7-for-15 (.467) with RISP and two outs...went 2-1 with a 3.32 ERA and .182 opponents batting average in four starts during the day, 2-2 with a 5.29 ERA and .321 opponent average in seven starts at night...was 3-1 with a 3.91 ERA and .232 opponents batting average in five starts in Oakland, 1-2 with a 5.02 ERA and .302 opponents average in five starts on the road...is now 23-14 in his career in the Coliseum compared to 19-18 on the road...was 2-1 with a 3.33 ERA in five interleague starts compared to 2-2 with a 5.67 ERA in six starts against the American League...was charged with five unearned runs, which tied for eighth most in the majors...was 0-3 in four starts with two runs of support or fewer, 4-0 in seven starts with three or more...is now 5-30 in 51 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 37-2 in 52 starts with support of three or more.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Frankie Montas (4-2, 5.50 ERA): Is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season...is 2-0 with a 3.97 ERA in two starts in May after going 2-2 with a 6.20 ERA in five starts in April...his four wins are tied for seventh in the American League...the A's are 5-2 (.714) in his starting assignments...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 6-3 A's win over Tampa Bay last Saturday in Oakland (5.1 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 6 so)...is 0-0 with an 8.25 ERA (12.0 ip, 18 h, 11 r, 11 er, 8 bb, 16 so, 4 hr) in six career appearances, including one start, against Minnesota...his lone start came in his only outing this year, a no decision in the A's 13-12, 10-inning win in Oakland on April 21 (4.0 ip, 9 h, 6 r, 6 er, 4 so)...was off to a strong start last year as he was 2-1 with a 1.57 ERA and .175 opponents average over his first four starts...was scratched from his start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness and went 1-4 with an 8.70 ERA and .321 opponents average over his final seven starts.

- Earned his fifth save of the season last night, which surpasses his career high of four with Texas in 2016.
- Has a 0.63 ERA (1 er in 14.1 ip) and .140 (7-for-50) opponents batting average over his last 14 games.
- Has struck out at least one batter in each of his last 13 games (21 so in 13.0 ip) and has 25 for the season, which is tied for fourth among American League relievers...ranks second in first batter strikeouts (9).
- Has yielded a .150 (6-for-40) average against right-handed hitters compared to .261 (6-for-23) against left-handers...has issued five of his seven walks to righties.
- Has not allowed a run in his last seven road games (7.2 ip)...has a 1.04 ERA (1 er in 8.2 ip) on the road, 3.24 (3 er in 8.1 ip) at home.
- Has not allowed an earned run in eight outings on two days rest or more (7.2 ip).
