



OAKLAND ATHLETICS (23-16) VS. MINNESOTA TWINS (12-23)

ABOUT THE A'S: Won two of three games at Boston to conclude a 20-game stretch against American League East teams with an 11-9 record...are 7-4 over the last 11 games and 23-16 (.590) for the season, which is tied for the third best record in the AL...the seven games over .500 are one short of the season high of eight (23-15 on May 12)...started the season 0-6 but are 23-10 (.697) since then...are in first place in the AL West and are 1½ games ahead of second place Houston...have held at least a share of first in the West for each of the last 24 days and have been alone in first for each of the last 20...went from sole possession of last on April 11 to sole possession of first on April 21...have spent 22 days alone in first place this year, two days tied for first, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

CLOSE CALLS (AND NOT SO CLOSE): The A's lost 8-1 last night and are now 7-12 (.368) in games decided by four runs or more, which is the fourth worst record in the majors...are 16-4 (.800) in games decided by three runs or fewer, which is the best record in the majors...also have the best record in games decided by two runs or fewer (12-4, .750) and one-run games (9-3, .750)...have outscored the opposition 78-56 in games decided by three runs or fewer (+22) but have been outscored 115-80 in the other games (-35)...have an overall run differential of -13...have four walk-off wins, which is tied with the Mets for the most in the majors...are 6-0 in games decided in the last at bat...are 2-0 in extra innings and are 8-1 in extra innings over the last two years.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 7-0 against American League Central teams (4-0 vs. Detroit, 3-0 vs. Minnesota) and now have a nine-game winning streak against the Central...that matches the second longest winning streak against AL Central competition in Oakland history (20, Aug. 3-Sept. 4, 2002)...are batting .248 (52-for-210) with 42 runs in seven games against the AL Central (6.0 runs per game) compared to .214 with 116 runs in 32 games against all other teams (3.6 runs per game)...have a 2.40 ERA (16 er in 60.0 ip) against the Central, 4.47 against everyone else...went 25-8 against the AL Central in 2019 after going 26-8 in 2018...are now 72-20 (.783) against AL Central foes dating back to June 23, 2017.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-1 on this six-game road trip to Boston (2-1) and Minnesota (three games)...went 4-3 on the last road trip to Baltimore (2-1) and Tampa Bay (2-2) and are 10-5 (.667) on the road, which is the second best road record in the majors (Red Sox, 12-5/.706)...return home following the game Sunday for a brief three-game homestand against Houston that starts on Tuesday...went 5-5 on the last homestand against Baltimore (1-2), Toronto (2-2) and Tampa Bay (2-1), which was their longest homestand of the season...are now 13-11 (.542) at home...have a 3.32 ERA (48 er in 130.0 ip) on the road, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...have a 4.58 ERA at home, which is fourth highest in the AL...the last homestand began a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 20 of 29 games at home and 35 of 44 in the Pacific Time Zone...are 7-6 over that span, including 5-5 at home.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .233 (90-for-386) in May after hitting .214 (185-for-865) in April...have been held homerless in three of the last four games and have one home run over that span...are 19-2 when out-homer the opposition, 2-12 when they are out-homered...have four stolen bases over the last 20 games after stealing 18 bases over the first 19 contests...lead the American League in hit by pitches (25), rank second in walks (136), third in stolen bases (22), tied for fourth in home runs (47) and fifth in triples (6) and fewest strikeouts (349).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 9-for-31 (.290) with a home run, six RBI and a walk...lead the AL in pinch hits and RBI, are tied with the Rays for the lead in plate appearances (32) and have one of three pinch home runs...went 3-for-29 (.103) with three RBI in the pinch last year.

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.21 ERA (81 er in 227.0 ip) over their last 26 games dating back to April 16, which is third lowest in the American League over that span...overall, are tied for second in the AL in most wild pitches (24), rank third in fewest walks (108), tied for third in fewest hit batters (14) and most shutouts (4) and tied for fifth in fewest home runs (42).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 13-8 with a 3.60 ERA (61 er in 152.1 ip) over the last 27 games after going 2-7 with a 6.63 ERA over the first 12 contests...are 15-15 with a 4.44 ERA overall...are tied for the second most losses in the American League but have the third most wins...have 210.2 innings pitched, which is the most in the AL and third most in the majors...have tossed eight innings or fewer in each of the last 215 games, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history...have not had a pitcher toss more than eight innings since Frankie Montas on May 17, 2019 at Detroit (8.2)...have walked two batters or fewer in 27 of the last 28 games, including an

Oakland record 26 consecutive games from April 13-May 11...are averaging 2.39 walks per nine innings, which is third lowest in the AL...however, have the second highest opponents batting average (.262) and the fourth highest slugging percentage (.431) and OPS (.744)

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has allowed just one earned run over the last six games (20.1 ip, 0.44 ERA)...now has a 2.45 ERA (22 er in 80.2 ip) dating back to April 16, which is the second lowest mark in the majors over that span (Marlins, 2.38)...overall, the pen has converted 12-of-13 (92.3%) save opportunities, which is the best percentage in the majors...is tied with the Rays and Cleveland for the American League lead in saves...Lou Trivino has six saves and Jake Diekmann has five and the A's are the only team in the majors with two pitchers with five or more saves...the pen has an 8-1 record and the one loss is the fewest in the majors...has allowed just four home runs over the A's last 31 games after surrendering seven over the first eight...the 11 home runs are the fewest in the AL and tied for third fewest in the majors...has allowed 20-of-49 (40.8%) inherited runners to score, which is the fourth highest percentage in the AL...has the highest batting average (.274), on-base percentage (.366) and slugging percentage (.519) against first batters faced in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 17 errors in the last 22 games after making just five errors over the first 17 contests...have -24 defensive runs saved, which is second fewest in the majors (Angels, -30)...have turned the third fewest double plays in the American League (24)...opponents have been successful is 15-of-21 (71.4%) stolen base attempts, which is the fifth lowest percentage in the AL...A's outfielders have three assists (all by Laureano), which is tied for third fewest in the AL.

LEFT-HANDED STARTERS: The A's are scheduled to face a right-handed starting pitcher for the second consecutive game after facing a left-handed starting pitcher in eight of the previous 10 games, 10 of the previous 13 and 13 of the previous 18...are 11-6 (.647) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed compared to 12-10 (.545) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is fourth best in the American League and the 17 games are tied for second most...are batting .239 (112-for-469) with a .753 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .208 (163-for-782) with a .656 OPS against right-handers...have the fifth best OPS in the AL against lefties and the third lowest against righties.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 11 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have six players on the IL (Fiers, Luzardo, Pinder, Puk, Rosenthal, Wendelken).

A's vs. TWINS: The A's lead the season series 3-0 after sweeping a three-game series in Oakland April 20-21...need to win one of the remaining three games to clinch their third consecutive season series and seventh in the last nine seasons (have a loss and a split over that span)...are 34-16 (.680) against the Twins dating back to 2013, which includes a 21-5 (.808) record in Oakland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 312-305 against Minnesota...that includes 175-131 in Oakland and 137-174 in Minnesota...are 20-19 at Target Field...are 369-374 all-time against the Twins and have a 1016-1010 record against the Twins/Senators...the 1016 wins are the A's most against any franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Seth Brown is tied for second among American League rookies in home runs (5) and tied for sixth in RBI (12)...**Mark Canha** leads the majors in hit by pitches (9)...ranks third in the AL in runs (28), tied for fifth in stolen bases (6) and tied for ninth in walks (20)...**Jed Lowrie** ranks second in the AL in batting with runners in scoring position (.464) and tied for third in multiple hit games (13) and doubles (11)...**Matt Olson** hit safely in each of the A's three games against Minnesota earlier this year, going 5-for-12 (.417) with three home runs and seven RBI...now has an 11-game hitting streak against the Twins (16-for-45, .356)...**Yusmeiro Petit** has a 15.1-inning scoreless streak and now has a 0.83 ERA, which is fifth lowest among AL relievers.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1944** Ford Garrison goes 5-for-6 with three RBI, including a walk-off single in the 11th inning in a 4-3 win over St. Louis...in **1988** Bob Welch tosses a five hit shutout as the A's win at Baltimore, 8-0...in **1995** Geronimo Berroa and Terry Steinbach have four RBI each in the A's 12-3 win at Minnesota...the A's hit five home runs, including two by Berroa.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (4-2, 5.50 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season...is 2-0 with a 3.97 ERA (5 er in 11.1 ip) in two starts in May after going 2-2 with a 6.20 ERA in five starts in April...his four wins are tied for seventh in the American League...the A's are 5-2 (.714) in his starting assignments.

THIS AND THAT: Has allowed nine of his 22 runs in the third inning (9 er in 6.2 ip, 12.15 ERA)...has a .196 (11-for-56) average against batters the first time through the order, .350 (21-for-60) the second time and .286 (10-for-35) with four of his seven home runs after that...has allowed a .308 (8-for-26) average with runners in scoring position...is 3-1 in five starts at home, 1-1 in two starts on the road...over the last three years, he is 9-2 in Oakland, 7-7 on the road.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-3 loss to Los Angeles (NL) on April 5 in Oakland...tossed 90 pitches in 2.2 innings, which were the most by an A's pitcher in an outing of fewer than three innings since pitch counts were tracked beginning in 1988...allowed four runs in the second inning on a McKinstry sacrifice fly and a three-run double by Seager...yielded three more runs in the third on a Smith home run, a McKinstry RBI single and a wild pitch.

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-3 win at Houston on April 10...it snapped a career-high three-game losing streak dating back to Sept. 13, 2020...shut out the Astros on five hits and a walk over the first six innings before allowing his only run on a leadoff home run to Tucker in the seventh...was relieved by Romo following the home run with the A's leading 6-0.

THIRD START: He won his second consecutive start when he combined with three A's relievers on a four-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win over Detroit on April 16 in Oakland...tossed six of the innings and allowed two of the hits (Grossman single in the third, Reyes single in the sixth)...also walked Castro in the first but did not allow a runners to advance past first base.

FOURTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 13-12, 10-inning win over Minnesota April 21 in Oakland...allowed three home runs in a start for the second time in his career (Sept. 22, 2020 vs. Los Angeles-NL)...surrendered a solo home run to Donaldson in the first but the A's scored three times in the second...then allowed three runs in the third on a Donaldson RBI single and a Cruz two-run home run...had a 7-4 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Cruz in the fifth...Buxton followed with a single and he was relieved by Wendelken with no outs in the fifth inning and the A's leading 7-5.

FIFTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss at Tampa Bay April 27...allowed a run in the first inning when Kiermaier led off with a triple and scored when Arozarena reached on a Machin error...Oakland scored single runs in the second and sixth innings to take a 2-1 lead but he allowed a two-run home run to Phillips in the bottom of the sixth for the loss.

SIXTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-4 victory over Toronto on May 3 in Oakland...the A's scored three times in the second but he allowed three runs in the third on a RBI single by Bichette and a two-run single by Hernandez...then retired 11 of the final 13 batters he faced and was relieved by Romo to start the seventh with the A's leading 5-3.

LAST START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 6-3 win over Tampa Bay last Saturday in Oakland...shut out the Rays on two hits and two walks over the first five innings and had a 3-0 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Lowe in the sixth inning...those were the only runs he would allow in 5.1 innings of work.

MONTAS vs. MINNESOTA: Is 0-0 with an 8.25 ERA (12.0 ip, 18 h, 11 r, 11 er, 8 bb, 16 so, 4 hr) in six career appearances, including one start...has a 10.13 ERA (3 er in 2.2 ip) in three games at Target Field and a 7.71 ERA (8 er in 9.1 ip) in three games in his home ballparks...his lone start came in his only outing this year, a no decision in the A's 13-12, 10-inning win in Oakland on April 21 (see fourth start in above)...prior that had not faced the Twins since July 28, 2017 in Oakland (2.1 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 4 bb, 4 so)...has not pitched in Minnesota since May 4, 2017 (0.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 so).

2020 RECAP: Was off to a strong start as he was 2-1 with a 1.57 ERA, .175 opponents batting average and no home runs over his first four starts...was scratched from his scheduled start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness and went 1-4 with an 8.70 ERA, .321 opponents average and 10 home runs over his final seven starts...went 3-5 with a 5.60 ERA in 11 starts overall...his ERA was eighth highest in the majors among pitchers with at least 50 innings pitched...had career highs in losses (5) and earned runs (33) and matched his high in home runs (10), runs (35) and walks (23)...led the A's in strikeouts (60), losses, runs, home runs and walks...his opponents batting average broke down to .198 (22-for-111) against right-handed hitters compared to .350 (35-for-100) against left-handers...surrendered six of his 10 home runs and issued 15 of his 23 walks to lefties for a 1.061 OPS (.572 against right-handers)...had a .306 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .264 the second time and .205 after that...allowed a .133 average with two strikes...was 2-1 with a 2.56 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in six starts in Oakland, 1-4 with a 10.13 ERA and .330 opponents average in five starts on the road...surrendered just two home runs in 31.2 innings in Oakland compared to eight in 21.1 innings on the road...made eight of his 11 starts during the day, which tied for the most in the majors...was 2-4 with a 6.16 ERA during the day, 1-1 with a 4.20 ERA at night...was 3-2 with a 3.61 ERA and .236 opponents batting average in eight starts against American League West competition, 0-3 with a 13.50 ERA and .391 opponents average in three interleague starts...the A's were 6-5 (.545) in his starting assignments...had two starts of seven innings and five starts of fewer than five innings...went 2-2 with a 2.83 ERA in six starts on four days rest, 1-3 with an 11.00 ERA in five starts on five days rest or more...received two runs of support or fewer in nine of his 11 starts...had 10 of his 28 runs of support in one start on Aug. 3 at Seattle and had a 4.75 RSA for the season...won both of his starts with support of three or more runs and is now 15-1 in 19 career starts with at least three runs of support.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
LHP Cole Irvin (3-4, 3.29 ERA): Is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season...is 3-2 with a 2.01 ERA over his last five starts and has 32 strikeouts and just four walks in 31.1 innings over that span...went 0-2 with a 7.45 ERA over his first two starts...his four losses are tied for second most in the American League but his ERA ranks 15th...has walked one batter or fewer in each of his seven starts...has issued just six free passes in 41.0 innings and his average of 1.32 walks per nine innings is third lowest in the American League...has a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 6.17, which also ranks third...has allowed just four runs over the first four inning of a game (1.38 ERA)...has yielded seven runs in the fifth inning and five in the sixth and has a 7.62 ERA from the fifth inning on...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 4-3 A's loss to Tampa Bay last Sunday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 4 h, 4 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...has never faced the Twins in his career.

- Has a 0.63 ERA (1 er in 14.1 ip) and .140 (7-for-50) opponents batting average over his last 14 games.
- Has struck out at least one batter in each of his last 13 games (21 so in 13.0 ip) and has 25 for the season, which is tied for fifth among American League relievers...ranks second in first batter strikeouts (9).
- Has yielded a .150 (6-for-40) average against right-handed hitters compared to .261 (6-for-23) against left-handers...has issued five of his seven walks to righties.
- Has not allowed a run in his last seven road games (7.2 ip)...has a 1.04 ERA (1 er in 8.2 ip) on the road, 3.24 (3 er in 8.1 ip) at home.
- Has not allowed an earned run in eight outings on two days rest or more (7.2 ip).
- Had a save in his only outing against Minnesota earlier this year in the second game of the April 20 doubleheader (1.0 ip, 2 so)...has a 9.35 ERA (9 er in 8.2 ip) in 11 career outings against the Twins.

Last Year: Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)

- Tossed 3.0 scoreless innings last night, his second outing of 3.0 scoreless innings this year...has pitched at least two innings in five of his 11 appearances.
- Has not allow a run in four of his last five games (9.0 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 9 so, 2.00 ERA).
- Has held left-handed hitters to a .043 (1-for-23) batting average compared to .216 (8-for-37) against right-handers...has issued all six of his walks and yielded both of his home runs to righties for a .704 OPS...has a .087 OPS against lefties.
- Opponents are 0-for-12 with runners in scoring position.
