OAKLAND ATHLETICS (24-17) VS. MINNESOTA TWINS (13-24)

SUNDAY, MAY 16, 2021 — TARGET FIELD — 1:10 CDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Dropped game two of the series yesterday by a score of 5-4... won the series opener the night before...it was their first loss of the season to Minnesota (4-1)...won two of three games at Boston to conclude a 20-game stretch against American League East teams with an 11-9 record...are 8-5 over the last 13 games and 24-17 (.585) for the season, which is the third best record in the American League...the seven games over .500 are one shy of the season high (23-15 on May 12 & 24-16 on May 15)...started the season 0-6 but are 24-11 (.686) since then...are in first place in the AL West and are ½ game ahead of second place Houston...have held at least a share of first in the West for each of the last 26 days and have been alone in first for each of the last 22...went from sole possession of last on April 11 to sole possession of first on April 21...have spent 24 days alone in first place this year, two days tied for first, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

CLOSE CALLS (AND NOT SO CLOSE): The A's won 6-1 Friday night and are now 8-12 (.400) in games decided by four runs or more...are 16-5 (.762) in games decided by three runs or fewer...have outscored the opposition 82-61 in games decided by three runs or fewer (+21) but have been outscored 115-85 in the other games (-30)...have an overall run differential of -9...have four walk-off wins, which is tied with the Mets for the most in the majors...are 6-0 in games decided in the last at bat...are 2-0 in extra innings and are 8-1 in extra innings over the last two years.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 8-1 against American League Central teams (4-0 vs. Detroit, 4-1 vs. Minnesota)...snapped a 10-game winning streak against the Central yesterday...that was the second longest winning streak against AL Central competition in Oakland history (20, Aug. 3-Sept. 4, 2002)...are batting .244 (68-for-279) with 52 runs in nine games against the AL Central (5.78 runs per game) compared to .214 with 116 runs in 32 games against all other teams (3.6 runs per game)...have a 2.57 ERA (22 er in 77.0 ip) against the Central, 4.47 against everyone else...went 25-8 against the AL Central in 2019 after going 26-8 in 2018...are now 73-21 (.777) against AL Central foes dating back to June 23, 2017.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-2 on this six-game road trip to Boston (2-1) and Minnesota (1-1)...went 4-3 on the last road trip to Baltimore (2-1) and Tampa Bay (2-2) and are 11-6 (.647) on the road...return home following today's game for a brief three-game homestand against Houston that starts on Tuesday...went 5-5 on the last homestand against Baltimore (1-2), Toronto (2-2) and Tampa Bay (2-1), which was their longest homestand of the season...are now 13-11 (.542) at home...have a 3.31 ERA (54 er in 147.0 ip) on the road, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...have a 4.58 ERA at home, which is fourth highest in the AL...the last homestand began a stretch where the A's are scheduled to play 20 of 29 games at home and 35 of 44 in the Pacific Time Zone...are 8-7 over that span, including 5-5 at home.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .233 (106-for-455) in May after hitting .214 (185-for-865) in April...hit a season-high four home runs Friday night...lost yesterday despite out-homer Minnesota...are now 20-3 when out-homer the opposition, 2-12 when they are out-homered...have four stolen bases over the last 22 games after stealing 18 bases over the first 19 contests...lead the American League in hit by pitches (25), rank fourth in walks (140), fourth in stolen bases (22), tied for first in home runs (51) and fifth in triples (6).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 10-for-34 (.294) with two home runs, seven RBI and two walks...lead the AL in pinch hits, RBI, and plate appearances (36) and have two of five pinch home runs...went 3-for-29 (.103) with three RBI in the pinch last year.

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.21 ERA (87 er in 244.0 ip) over their last 28 games dating back to April 16...overall, are third in the AL in most wild pitches (24), rank tied for third in fewest walks (114), tied for third in fewest hit batters (14) and most shutouts (4) and are sixth in fewest home runs (44)...have surrendered the second most hits (347) but are 10th in opponents batting average (.248) and eighth in opponents OPS (.706).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 14-8 with a 3.44 ERA (63 er in 165.0 ip) over the last 29 games after going 2-7 with a 6.63 ERA over the first 12 contests...are 16-15 with a 4.27 ERA overall...have the third most losses in the American League but are tied for the second most wins...have 223.1 innings pitched, which is the most in the AL and third most in the majors...have tossed eight innings or fewer in each of the last 217 games, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history...have not had a pitcher toss more

than eight innings since Frankie Montas on May 17, 2019 at Detroit (8.2)... have walked two batters or fewer in 29 of the last 30 games, including an Oakland record 26 consecutive games from April 13-May 11...are averaging 2.38 walks per nine innings, which is third lowest in the Majors...however, have the fourth highest opponents batting average (.259) in the AL and the sixth highest slugging percentage (.424).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen allowed four earned runs yesterday and has now allowed five earned run over the last eight games (24.2 ip, 1.82 ERA)...now has a 2.75 ERA (26 er in 85.0 ip) dating back to April 16...overall, the pen has converted 12-of-14 (85.7%) save opportunities...is tied with Tampa Bay, Cleveland, Boston, and New York for the American League lead in saves...Lou Trivino has six saves and Jake Diekman has five and the A's are the only team in the majors with two pitchers with five or more saves...the pen has an 8-2 record...has allowed just five home runs over the A's last 33 games after surrendering seven over the first eight...the 11 home runs are the fewest in the AL and fourth fewest in the majors...A's relievers have thrown the fifth fewest innings (137.2) in the American League...the four teams whose bullpens have thrown fewer innings have also played at least two fewer games so far this year.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 18 errors in the last 24 games after making just five errors over the first 17 contests...have the fourth fewest double plays turned in the American League (27)...opponents have been successful is 15-of-21 (71.4%) stolen base attempts, which is the fifth lowest percentage in the AL...A's outfielders have three assists (all by Laureano), which is tied for third fewest in the AL.

RIGHT-HANDED STARTERS: The A's are scheduled to face a right-handed starting pitcher for the fourth consecutive game after facing a left-handed starting pitcher in eight of the previous 10 games, 10 of the previous 13 and 13 of the previous 18...are 11-6 (.647) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed compared to 13-11 (.542) against right-handers...are batting .239 (113-for-473) with a .752 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .210 (178-for-847) with a .670 OPS against right-handers...have the fourth best OPS in the AL against lefties and the second lowest against righties.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 11 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have five players on the IL (Fiers, Luzardo, Puk, Rosenthal, Wendelken).

A's vs. TWINS: The A's lead the season series 4-1 after sweeping a three-game series in Oakland April 20-21...after Friday night's win, the A's clinched their third consecutive season series and seventh in the last nine seasons (have a loss and a split over that span)...are 35-17 (.673) against the Twins dating back to 2013, which includes a 21-5 (.808) record in Oakland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 313-306 against Minnesota...that includes 175-131 in Oakland and 138-175 in Minnesota...are 21-20 at Target Field...are 370-375 all-time against the Twins and have a 1017-1011 record against the Twins/Senators...the 1017 wins are the A's most against any franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Seth Brown is tied for second among American League rookies in home runs (5) and tied for sixth in RBI (12)...**Mark Canha** leads the majors in hit by pitches (9)...ranks tied for second in the AL in runs (31), tied for eighth in stolen bases (6) and tied for 11th in walks (20)...**Jed Lowrie** ranks third in the AL in batting with runners in scoring position (.433) and tied for fifth in doubles (11)...in the month of May, **Matt Chapman** is hitting .250 with a .345 on-base percentage after hitting .189 with a .306 OBP in April...has hit safely in 10 of his 14 games this month...has increased his season batting average from .189 to .210...**Chris Bassitt** is tied for fourth in the American League with 53 strikeouts...his 4.42 strikeout/walk ratio is seventh best...the A's have three pitchers in the top seven in strikeout/walk ratio (Manaea, Irvin, Bassitt).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1939** the first American League night game is played at Shibe Park but the A's lose to Cleveland 8-3 in 10 innings...in **1975** Vida Blue becomes the second Oakland Athletic to win 100 games as he fires a seven-hitter at Yankee Stadium in the A's 4-2 win...in **1986** Tony Phillips hits for the cycle in the A's 8-4 win at Baltimore...he has five hits, scores two runs and drives in four...it is the first cycle in Oakland history...in **1990** Jose Canseco, Mark McGwire and Ron Hassey hit consecutive homers in the fourth inning of the A's 7-6 win at Cleveland.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (3-2, 3.54 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season...is 3-0 with a 2.92 ERA (12 er in 37.0 ip) and .207 (28-for-135) opponents batting average over his last six starts after going 0-2 with a 5.56 ERA and .289 opponents average over his first two starts...the three-game winning streak matches the second longest of his career...his best is a five-game streak from Aug. 11, 2019 to Aug. 12, 2020.

STRIKEOUTS: Has struck out seven or more batters in each of his last five starts, which matches the second longest such streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since Sept. 4-24, 1997 when Jimmy Haynes also had a five-start streak...the longest such streak in Oakland history in six by Vida Blue from April 18-May 9, 1971...Bassitt has 42 strikeouts in 32.0 innings over his last five starts (11.81 strikeouts per nine innings) and 53 for the season, which is tied for fourth in the American League.

EXACTLY TWO RUNS: Has allowed exactly two runs in each of his last six starts and is the second pitcher in Athletic history to allow exactly two runs in six consecutive games...joins Bob Davis of the Kansas City A's, who did it all in relief from Aug. 8-26, 1960...since 1901, the only American League or National League pitcher to allow exactly two runs in seven consecutive games is Cy Morgan, who did it for the Boston Red Sox from June 11 to July 21, 1908.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-0 with a 3.00 ERA (8 er in 24.0 ip) and .198 (17-for-86) opponents batting average in four starts on the road compared to 0-2 with a 4.07 ERA (11 er in 24.1 ip) and .255 (24-for-94) opponents average in four starts at home...now has a 13-10 career record on the road, 9-13 at home...however, has a career ERA of 4.44 (107 er in 216.2 ip) on the road, 2.78 (71 er in 230.0 ip) at home...is 9-12 despite a 2.62 ERA (62 er in 212.2 ip) in 39 career games in the Coliseum...has the fifth lowest ERA in Coliseum history among pitchers with 200 or more innings.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: Had a no decision in his only start against an American League Central team (Detroit on April 18)...went 5-0 with a 2.23 ERA and .224 opponents batting average in seven starts against American League Central teams in 2019...now has a six-game winning streak against the Central dating back to June 27, 2018 and has a 1.92 ERA (13 er in 61.0 ip) and .204 (46-for-225) opponents average over that 11 game, 10-start stretch...his last loss to a Central team was at Chicago on June 22, 2018.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed four home runs, all to left-handed hitters...has surrendered 22 of his 31 home runs over the last three years to lefties...has not allowed a home run to a right-handed hitter since Aug. 12, 2020 (Rendon, LAA)...opponents are batting .281 (18-for-64) the first time through the order, .200 (23-for-115) after that...has a .128 opponents batting average with two strikes, which is seventh lowest in the American League.

THIS AND THAT: Is tied for the American League lead in hit batters (5) and ranks seventh in innings pitched (48.1)...has received two runs of support or fewer in four of his eight starts and is 0-2 in those starts...is 18-1 in 29 career starts with three runs of support or more, 4-22 in 45 starts with two runs of support or fewer...is 2-0 with a 3.00 ERA (8 er in 24.0 ip) in four starts on five days rest and now has a seven-game winning streak when starting on five days rest...is 7-0 with a 2.86 ERA (22 er in 69.1 ip) in 12 starts over that span, which dates back to July 19, 2019...has walked one batter or fewer in each of his last four starts and five of eight this year...has yielded four hits or fewer four times...the A's are 5-3 (.625) in his starting assignments and are 28-16 (.636) when he starts over the last three years...does not have a complete game in 74 career starts...69 of those starts have come with Oakland, which is the second longest streak of consecutive starts with no complete games in Oakland history (113, Barry Zito, Aug. 22, 2003-Sept. 28, 2006).

POST-TOMMY JOHN: Did not pitch in the majors in 2017 following May 6, 2016 "Tommy John" surgery...is 20-12 with a 3.33 ERA (112 er in 303.0 ip) and is averaging 8.61 strikeouts per nine innings (290 so in 303.0 ip) in 57 games (50 starts) since the surgery...was 2-11 with a 4.13 ERA and 6.77 strikeouts per nine innings in 29 games (23 starts) before the surgery.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Was the A's Opening Day starting pitcher and took the loss in an 8-1 decision to Houston on April 1 in Oakland...became the A's 14th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 16 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill, Graveman twice, Fiers, Montas)...allowed a run in the fourth inning to snap a 16.2-inning scoreless streak during the regular season and a 27.1-inning home scoreless streak, which was ninth longest in Oakland history...lost his second start on April 6, a 5-1 loss to Los Angeles (NL) on April 6 in Oakland when he allowed a season-high four runs on a season-high nine hits in 6.0 innings...allowed two home runs in the third, which were his first home runs in the Coliseum since Aug. 24, 2019...that snapped a 10-game, 55.1-inning, 229-batter homerless streak in Oakland...that ran his record to 0-2 with a 5.56 ERA but he is 3-0 with a 2.92 ERA (12 er in 37.0 ip) in six starts since then...allowed just two hits in 5.0 innings for the win on April 12 at Arizona, which matched his fewest hits ever in a start...the innings pitched are a sea-

son low and he walked a season-high five batters...tied an Oakland record with three hit batters April 29 at Tampa Bay (12th time, last: Fiers, June 22, 2019, also against Tampa Bay)...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings May 5 against Toronto and did not walk a batter, but had a no decision in the A's 9-4 loss...left with a 3-2 lead but Trivino allowed five runs in the eighth inning for the blown save.

LAST START: He won his third game of the season in the A's 3-2 victory at Boston last Tuesday...struck out a season-high 10 batters in a season-high tying 7.0 innings...it was his third career game of 10 or more strikeouts...did not walk a batter, the second time he has fanned 10 or more without issuing a free pass...is one of nine pitchers in Oakland history with two such games...allowed a sacrifice fly to Martinez in the first inning, but that started a string of 15 consecutive batters retired...had a 3-1 lead when he yielded a solo home run to Devers in the seventh.

2020 RECAP: Spent the entire season on the active roster for the first time in his six-year career and went 5-2 with a 2.29 ERA in 11 starts...his ERA ranked second among pitchers in the West divisions (Lameter, SD 2.09) and sixth in the majors...it was fifth lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 10 starts...also tied for fifth in the West divisions in winning percentage (.714), ranked seventh in opponents OPS (.659), batting average (.233) and slugging percentage (.371), tied for seventh in wins and eighth in on-base percentage (.288)...had career lows in ERA and opponents on-base percentage...walked 17 batters in 63.0 innings for a career-low 2.43 walks per nine innings...struck out 55 for a career-best 3.24 strikeout-to-walk ratio...led the A's in innings pitched and tied for the lead in games started...received five votes (two third, one fourth, two fifth) in American League Cy Young balloting...went 1-0 with a 1.08 ERA over his first three starts, 1-2 with a 5.95 ERA over his next four starts and 3-0 with a 0.34 ERA over his final four starts...allowed a .233 opponents batting average, which broke down to .223 (31-for-139) with a .590 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .248 (25-for-101) with a .755 OPS against left-handers...yielded four of his six home runs to lefties...walked just one batter to lead off an inning and held opponents to a .203 (13-for-64) batting average and .227 on-base percentage in that situation...the on-base percentage was sixth lowest in the majors...five of his six home runs came with the bases empty.

LHP Sean Manaea (3-2, 4.40 ERA): Is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season...gave up seven earned runs and 10 hits in his last start against the Red Sox in Boston...went 3-0 with a 2.23 ERA over his previous six starts after allowing five runs on six hits in 4.2 innings in his first start, a loss...has allowed one run in two of his three no decisions and had one run of support in each of those two starts...had a no decision on May 7, a 2-1 A's win over Tampa Bay last Friday (7.1 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 10 so)...retired each of the first 18 batters and had a no-hitter until Brosseau doubled to start the eighth...is 3-6 with a 3.50 ERA in 15 career starts against the Astros, including 70 strikeouts and 25 walks in 82.1 innings pitched...has faced Houston twice this season, and is 0-1 with a 5.06 ERA including eight strikeouts and four walks in 10.2 innings pitched...is 2-1 with a 3.60 ERA at the Coliseum this season, including 33 strikeouts and five walks.

- Blew his first save of the season yesterday...earned his fifth save of the season Wednesday night, which surpasses his career high of four with Texas in 2016.
- Has a 1.22 ERA (2 er in 14.2 ip) and .154 (8-for-52) opponents batting average over his last 15 games.
- Has struck out at least one batter in 13 of his last 14 games (21 so in 13.1 ip) and has 25 for the season, which is tied for sixth among American League relievers...ranks second in first batter strikeouts (9).
- Has yielded a .171 (7-for-41) average against right-handed hitters compared to .250 (6-for-24) against left-handers...has issued five of his seven walks to righties.
- Had not allowed a run in his previous seven road games before yesterday (7.2 ip)...has a 2.00 ERA (2 er in 9.0 ip) on the road, 3.24 (3 er in 8.1 ip) at home.
- Has one save and one blown save this year against Minnesota...has a 10.00 ERA (10 er in 9.0 ip) in 12 career outings against the Twins.
