### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (25-17) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (24-17)

TUESDAY, MAY 17, 2021 — OAKLAND COLISEUM— 6:40 PDT LHP SEAN MANAEA (3-2, 4.40) VS. RHP CRISTIAN JAVIER (3-1, 3.08)

ABOUT THE A'S: Won two of three at Minnesota over the weekend and have now taken two of three in each of the last three series...have won six of the last nine games and nine of the last 14...are 25-17 (.595) overall, which is tied with the Red Sox for the second best record in the American League to the White Sox (25-15, .625)...are a season-high tying eight games over .500 for the third time...are in sole possession of first place in the AL West and lead the second place Astros by ½ game...have held at least a share of first in the West for each of the last 28 days and have been alone in first for each of the last 25...have not been out of first since April 19 when they were tied for second...have spent 26 days alone in first place this year, two days tied for first, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth...started the season 0-6 but are 25-11 (.694) since then...went from sole possession of last on April 11 to sole possession of first on April 21.

CLOSE CALLS (AND NOT SO CLOSE): The A's scored once in the top of the ninth on Sunday to break a 6-6 tie and defeat Minnesota, 7-6...are now 7-1 in games decided in the last at bat...improved to 10-4 (.714) in one-run games, which is the best record in the majors...also have the best record in games decided by two runs or fewer (13-5, .722) and three runs or fewer (17-5, .773)...however, are 8-12 (.400) in games decided by four runs or more, which is tied for seventh worst in the majors...have outscored the opposition 89-67 in games decided by three runs or fewer (+22) but have been outscored 116-86 in the other games (-30)...have an overall run differential of -8...have four walk-off wins, which is tied with the Mets for the most in the majors...are 2-0 in extra innings and are 8-1 in extra innings over the last two years.

DAYS OFF AND THE WEST: The A's had their second day off in eight days yesterday...are 5-0 following a day off and are one of two teams without a loss following an off day (Boston, 5-0)...the next scheduled day off is June 3 and today begins a stretch of 16 games in 16 days, all against American League West competition...the only AL West foe the A's have faced is Houston...face the Angels the first time in game 46 on Friday, the Mariners for the first time in game 49 next Monday and the Rangers for the first time in game 74 on June 21...following Thursday's game, will face Houston just three times over the next 108 games...are 2-5 (.286) against the Astros and 23-12 (.657) against all other teams.

*OFFENSE:* The A's are batting .240 (118-for-492) in May after hitting .214 (185-for-865) in April...are hitting .223 overall, which is fourth lowest in the American League...however, lead the AL in hit by pitches (25), rank third in walks (144), tied for third in home runs (53), tied for fourth in stolen bases (22), fifth in extra base hits (120) and fewest strikeouts (376) and tied for fifth in triples (6)...are 20-3 when out-homering the opposition, 3-12 when they are out-homered...have been held homerless four times over the last seven games and have seven home runs over that span...have four stolen bases over the last 23 games after stealing 18 bases over the first 19 contests.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 10-for-35 (.286) with two home runs, seven RBI and two walks...lead the American League in pinch hits, home runs, RBI and plate appearances (37)...went 3-for-29 (.103) with three RBI in the pinch last year.

**PITCHING:** The A's have a 3.31 ERA (93 er in 253.0 ip) over their last 29 games dating back to April 16, which is second lowest in the American League over that span to the Rays (2.95)...have issued the third fewest walks in the AL (117), are tied for third in shutouts (4) and tied for fifth in fewest home runs (46)...have the third most wild pitches (25).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers had a no decision in each of the final two games at Minnesota, which marks the first time this year they have gone back-to-back games without a decision...are 16-15 with a 4.34 ERA (110 er in 228.1 ip)...the wins are third most in the American League but the losses are tied for third most...lead the AL and rank third in the majors in innings pitched (228.1)...have tossed eight innings or fewer in each of the last 218 games, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history...have not had a pitcher toss more than eight innings since Frankie Montas on May 17, 2019 at Detroit (8.2)...are averaging 2.40 walks per nine innings, which is second lowest in the AL to the Yankees (2.33)...have walked two batters or fewer in 30 of the last 31 games, including an Oakland record 26 consecutive games from April 13-May 11

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has been charged with a blown save in each of the last two games after converting 12 of its first 13 save opportunities...is 12-for-15 (80.0%) for the season...is tied for the American League lead in saves and ranks third in save percentage...is now 2-2 with three saves, three blown saves and a 4.46 ERA (18 er in 36.1 ip) over the last 11 games dating back to

May 5 after going 7-0 with nine saves, no blown saves and a 3.50 ERA over the first 31 contests...Lou Trivino has six saves and Jake Diekman has five and the A's are one of three teams in the majors with two pitchers with five or more saves (Giants, Mariners)...was charged with its second loss of the season on Saturday, but that is still the fewest in the majors...has allowed just six home runs over the A's last 34 games after surrendering seven over the first eight...the 13 home runs are the fewest in the AL and fourth fewest in the majors...has allowed 22-of-55 (40.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the fifth highest percentage in the AL...has the highest batting average (.289) and slugging percentage (.561) against first batters faced in the AL and the second highest on-base percentage (.379).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 19 errors in the last 25 games after making just five errors over the first 17 contests...have -18 defensive runs saved, which is third fewest in the majors...have turned the fourth fewest double plays in the American League (28)...opponents have been successful is 16-of-22 (72.7%) stolen base attempts, which is the fifth lowest percentage in the AL...A's outfielders have three assists (all by Laureano), which is tied for third fewest in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a brief three-game homestand against Houston tonight...leave following the game Thursday for a three-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL before returning home for a seven-game homestand against Seattle (three games) and Los Angeles-AL (four games) starting next Monday...are in a stretch where they are scheduled to play 20 of 29 games at home and 35 of 44 in the Pacific Time Zone...are 9-7 over that span, including 5-5 at home...went 5-5 on the last homestand against Baltimore (1-2), Toronto (2-2) and Tampa Bay (2-1) and are 13-11 (.542) at home...went 4-2 on the last road trip to Boston (2-1) and Minnesota (2-1) and have won five road series, lost none and split one...are 12-6 (.667) on the road, which is the second best road record in the American League to the Red Sox (12-5, .706)... have a 4.58 ERA (109 er in 214.0 ip) at home, which is fifth highest in the AL, compared to 3.46 (60 er in 156.0 ip) on the road, which is third lowest.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are scheduled to face a right-handed starting pitcher for the fifth consecutive game tonight after squaring off against left-handers in 13 of the previous 18 contests...are 11-6 (.647) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed compared to 14-11 (.560) against right-handers...are batting .241 (116-for-482) with a .753 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .214 (187-for-875) with a .674 OPS against right-handers...have the fourth best OPS in the AL against lefties and the third lowest against righties.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 12 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have six players on the IL (Fiers, Luzardo, Moreland, Puk, Rosenthal, Wendelken).

**A's vs. ASTROS:** The A's are 2-5 against the Astros...won two of three in Houston but were swept in a four-game series in Oakland to start the season...it was the second time the A's were swept by Houston in a four-game series (June 19-22, 2017 at Oakland)...won the season series last year, 7-3...it was their first season series win since going 11-8 in 2014...went 7-1 in Oakland and 0-2 in Houston...the seven wins at home matched the A's most against the Astros (7-3 in 2013)...then lost to the Astros in the ALDS, 3 games to 1... are now 46-66 (.411) against Houston over the last seven years after winning each of their first four season series against the Astros (31-13)...are 77-79 all-time, including 42-39 in Oakland and 35-40 in Houston.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

Elvis Andrus extended his hitting streak to eight games on Sunday, which is one short of the A's season high of nine (Chapman and Olson)...is 9-for-26 (.346) during the streak...Mark Canha leads the majors in hit by pitches (9) and ranks third in the American League in runs (32)...Matt Chapman leads AL third basemen in fielding percentage (.979), total chances (142) and putouts (58) and ranks second in assists (81) and double plays (12)... Matt Olson has five go-ahead home runs, which is tied for the most in the majors.

#### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1952 Bobby Shantz tosses a three-hit shutout to defeat Bob Feller 2-0 in the first game of a doubleheader at Cleveland...in 1998 Mike Blowers becomes the second player in Oakland history to hit for the cycle in the A's 14-0 win at Chicago...in 2003 the A's score three runs in the eighth inning and five in the ninth to come from behind and defeat Cleveland, 8-5...in 2014 Josh Donaldson and Brandon Moss score four runs each as the A's win at Cleveland, 13-3.

### TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (3-2, 4.40 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season...allowed seven runs on 10 hits in 2.0 innings for the loss in his last start on Thursday at Boston...allowed five runs on six hits in 4.2 innings for the loss in his first start this year and was 3-0 with a 2.23 ERA and .219 opponents batting average in six starts in between

*DON'T WALK*: Has walked two batters or fewer in each of his last seven starts (6 bb in 38.1 ip, 1.41 per nine innings)...has two starts with no walks and four others with one...is averaging 1.88 walks per nine innings for the season, which is seventh lowest in the American League...ranks fourth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (5.00)...over the last four years, he has walked two batters or fewer in 45 of his 51 starts (16 with no walks, 21 with one)...has 56 walks in 287.0 innings over that span, an average of 1.76 per nine innings.

AGAINST LEFT-HANDERS: Has allowed just four hits to left-handed hitters and they are batting .095 (4-for-42), which is the lowest mark in the majors... two of the four hits are home runs...has a .326 (42-for-129) opponents batting average against right-handers

APRIL AND MAY: Is 0-1 with a 7.53 ERA (12 er in 14.1 ip) in three starts in the month of May after going 3-1 with a 2.83 ERA in five starts in April...is now 5-9 with a 6.05 ERA (65 er in 96.2 ip) in 18 career starts in May compared to 8-4 with a 2.97 ERA in 16 starts in April...his May ERA is his highest for any month (5.22 in August).

INNING BY INNING: Has a 5.87 ERA (15 er in 23.0 ip) and .302 (29-for-96) opponents batting average over the first three innings of his starts, a 2.70 ERA (6 er in 20.0 ip) and .227 (17-for-75) average from the fourth inning on...last year, he had a 2.56 ERA and .233 opponents batting average over the first three innings of his starts compared to a 7.59 ERA and .319 opponents average from the fourth inning on.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-1 with a 3.60 ERA (12 er in 30.0 ip) and .228 (26-for-114) opponents batting average in five starts at home compared to 1-1 with a 6.23 ERA (9 er in 13.0 ip) and .387 (20-for-57) opponents batting average in three starts on the road...over the last two years, he is 5-2 with a 3.74 ERA (23 er in 55.1 ip) in 10 starts in Oakland, 2-3 with a 5.40 ERA (25 er in 41.2 ip) in nine starts on the road...is 23-14 in his career in the Coliseum compared to 19-19 on the road.

*DAYS REST*: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 1-0 with a 0.89 ERA (2 er in 20.1 ip) in three starts on four days rest compared to 2-1 with a 7.00 ERA (14 er in 18.0 ip) in four starts on five days rest...over the last three years, he is 5-1 with a 2.83 ERA (19 er in 60.1 ip) in 11 starts on four days rest, 3-2 with a 6.11 ERA (19 er in 28.0 ip) in six starts on five days rest

THIS AND THAT: Has received one run of support or fewer in four of his eight starts and is 0-2 in those starts...is 3-0 in four starts with two runs of support or more...has allowed one run in two of his three no decisions and had one run of support in each of those two starts...has allowed one run or fewer in four of his eight starts...the A's are 6-2 (.750) in his starting assignments and are 17-7 (.708) when he starts over the last three years.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Tossed a season-high 101 pitches in his first start on April 4 against Houston and allowed five runs on six hits in 4.2 innings for the loss...then went 3-0 with a 1.50 ERA over his next four starts...picked up his first win of the season in the 100th game of his career, an 8-4 victory over Detroit on April 15...tossed a six-hit, seven-inning shutout in the A's 7-0 win over Minnesota in the first game of the doubleheader April 20...it was the 11th complete game shutout of fewer than eight innings in Oakland history (last: Mike Minor, Sept. 14, 2020 at Seattle)...it was his second career complete game and shutout, with the other being his no-hitter on April 21, 2018 against Boston...the start was the 100th of his career and he became the 25th pitcher in Oakland history to make 100 starts...won his third consecutive start in the A's 2-1 victory at Tampa Bay on April 26...walked two batters in 5.0 innings, his only outing this year with more than one walk...struck out a career-high tying 10 batters in a season-high 7.1 innings on May 7 against Tampa Bay, but had a no decision in the A's 2-1 win...it was his fourth career 10-strikeout game, his first since Sept. 8, 2019 against Detroit...retired each of the first 18 batters he faced before walking Arozarena to start the seventh...then retired the next three before Brosseau led off the eighth inning with a double.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-1 loss at Boston last Thursday...allowed a season-high seven runs on a season-high 10 hits in a season-low 2.0 innings...has allowed seven or more runs in a start three times in his career, all at Fenway Park (8 on May 10, 2016; 7 on Sept. 12, 2017)...yielded three runs in the first inning on a Martinez RBI double and a Bogaerts two-run home run, and three more in the second on a Dalbec two-run home run and a Bogaerts RBI double...was relieved by Guerra with the bases loaded and no outs in the third and Guerra allowed one of those runners to score.

2020 RECAP: Went 4-3 with a 4.50 ERA in 11 starts...the ERA was the highest of his career as was his .270 opponents batting average...his .427 slugging percentage matched his high...went 4-1 with a 2.65 ERA and .234 opponents batting average over his final six starts dating back to Aug. 20...the wins tied for fourth most in the majors over that span...went 0-2 with a 7.65 ERA and .325 opponents average over his first five starts...tied for the team lead in starts...walked just eight batters in 54.0 innings, an average of 1.33 walks per nine innings...that was the lowest mark of his career and was sixth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 50 or more innings pitched...struck out 45 for a career-best 5.63 strikeout-to-walk ratio...had five starts without a walk, five with one and three in his other...had a 2.56 ERA and .233 opponents batting average over the first three innings of his starts compared to a 7.59 ERA and .319 opponents average from the fourth inning on...his .270 opponents batting average broke down to .250 (13-for-52) against left-handed hitters compared to .277 (44-for-159) against right-handers...issued seven of eight walks to righties...had a .204 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .327 with seven of his eight walks after that...had a .281 batting average against batters leading off an inning but issued just one walk (.293 on-base percentage)...yielded a .222 average with the bases empty, .373 with runners on...went 2-1 with a 3.32 ERA and .182 opponents batting average in four starts during the day, 2-2 with a 5.29 ERA and .321 opponent average in seven starts at night...was 3-1 with a 3.91 ERA and .232 opponents batting average in five starts in Oakland, 1-2 with a 5.02 ERA and .302 opponents average in five starts on the road...was charged with five unearned runs, which tied for eighth most in the majors...was 0-3 in four starts with two runs of support or fewer, 4-0 in seven starts with three or more. is now 5-31 in 52 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 37-2 in 52 starts with support of three or more.

### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Frankie Montas (5-2, 4.93 ERA): Is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season...is 3-0 with a 3.12 ERA in three starts in May after going 2-2 with a 6.20 ERA in five starts in April...his three wins in May are tied for the most in the majors and match his most ever in a month...is now 7-0 with a 2.84 ERA in 18 career appearances, including nine starts, in May...has five wins overall, which are tied for the most in the American League...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 6-1 A's win at Minnesota last Friday (6.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 4 so)...is 5-3 with a 4.11 ERA (46.0 ip, 49 h, 23 r, 21 er, 16 bb, 35 so, 6 hr) in 10 career appearances, including eight starts, during the regular season against Houston...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, a 7-3 A's win at Houston on April 10 (6.0 ip, 6 h, 1 r 1 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...is 11-5 with a 3.61 ERA in 34 games against AL West competition, 12-11 with a 4.90 ERA in 44 games against all other teams.
