## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (26-17) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (24-18)

WEDNESDAY, MAY 19, 2021 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:40 PDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have won two straight, seven of the last 10 and 10 of the last 15 games to improve to a season-high nine games over .500 at 26-17 (.605)...that is the second best record in the American League (White Sox, 25-16/.610) and is tied with the Padres for third best in the majors (Giants, 26-16/.619)...are in sole possession of first place in the AL West and lead the second place Astros by 1½ games...have held at least a share of first in the West for each of the last 29 days and have been alone in first for each of the last 26...have spent 27 days alone in first place this year, two days tied for first, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth...started the season 0-6 but are 25-11 (.694) since then...went from sole possession of last on April 11 to sole possession of first on April 21.

**CLOSE CALLS (AND NOT SO CLOSE):** The A's scored single runs in each of the final four innings last night to defeat Houston 6-5...it was their second consecutive one-run, last at bat win and it was their Major League leading fifth walk-off win of the season...are now 8-1 in games decided in the last at bat...won for the fourth time when trailing after seven innings, which is tied with the Mariners and Angels for the most in the majors...improved to 11-4 (.733) in one-run games, which is the best mark in the majors...are tied for the second most one-run games (Phillies, 16)...also have the best record in games decided by two runs or fewer (14-5, .737) and three runs or fewer (18-5, .783)...however, are 8-12 (.400) in games decided by four runs or more, which is seventh worst in the majors...have outscored the opposition 95-72 in games decided by three runs or fewer (+23) but have been outscored 116-86 in the other games (-30)...have an overall run differential of -7...are 2-0 in extra innings and are 8-1 in extra innings over the last two years.

**THE LONG BALL:** Ramón Laureano and Matt Olson both hit their 10th home run of the season last night and the A's are one of four teams with two players with 10 or more home runs (Atlanta, Boston, Cleveland)...Oakland has hit nine home runs in the last four games and now have 56 for the season, which is tied with the Yankees for second most in the American League (Blue Jays, 57)...the A's are 21-3 when out-homer the opposition, 3-12 when they are out-homered.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** Last night began a stretch of 16 games in 16 days, all against American League West competition...the A's have played just eight of their first 43 games against divisional foes, all against Houston (3-5), and have the fewest intradivision games in the majors...the Astros have played 28 of their 42 games against AL West teams (19-9) and are tied for the most intradivision games in the majors...following tomorrow's game, the A's will face Houston just three times over the next 108 games...face the Angels the first time in game 46 on Friday, the Mariners for the first time in game 49 next Monday and the Rangers for the first time in game 74 on June 21.

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .241 (126-for-523) in May after hitting .214 (185-for-865) in April...that has lifted the A's overall batting average to a season-high .224, which is fourth lowest in the American League...however, lead the AL in hit by pitches (25), are tied for second in home runs (56), rank third in walks (150) and fifth in extra base hits (125), stolen bases (22) and fewest strikeouts (386)...have four stolen bases over the last 24 games after stealing 18 bases over the first 19 contests.

**IN THE PINCH:** A's pinch hitters are 10-for-35 (.286) with two home runs, seven RBI and two walks...lead the American League in pinch hits, home runs, RBI and plate appearances (37)...went 3-for-29 (.103) with three RBI in the pinch last year.

**PITCHING:** The A's have a 3.37 ERA (98 er in 262.0 ip) over their last 30 games dating back to April 16, which is second lowest in the American League over that span to the Rays (3.05)...have issued the second fewest walks in the AL (117), are tied for third in shutouts (4) and tied for fifth in fewest home runs (46)...are tied for the most wild pitches (27).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have three consecutive no decisions for the first time since Sept. 16-18, 2019...are 16-15 with a 4.34 ERA (113 er in 234.1 ip)...the wins are third most in the American League and the losses are tied for fourth most...lead the AL and rank fourth in the majors in innings pitched (234.1)...have tossed eight innings or fewer in each of the last 219 games, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history...have not had a pitcher toss more than eight innings since Frankie Montas on May 17, 2019 at Detroit (8.2)...lead the AL and rank second in the majors in fewest walks per nine innings (2.34)...have walked two batters or fewer in 31 of the last 32 games, including an Oakland record 26 consecutive games from April 13-May 11.

**BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen has allowed eight runs over the last three games (8.1 ip, 8.64 ERA) and is 2-1 with two blown saves over that span...is now 3-2

with three saves, three blown saves and a 4.58 ERA (20 er in 39.1 ip) over the last 12 games dating back to May 5 after going 7-0 with nine saves, no blown saves and a 3.50 ERA over the first 31 contests...has converted 12-of-15 (80.0%) save opportunities, which is the third best percentage in the American League...is tied for third in saves...Lou Trivino has six saves and Jake Diekman has five and the A's are one of three teams in the majors with two pitchers with five or more saves (Giants, Mariners)...has allowed just six home runs over the A's last 35 games after surrendering seven over the first eight...the 13 home runs are the fewest in the AL and fourth fewest in the majors...has two losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has allowed 22-of-55 (40.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the fifth highest percentage in the AL...has the highest batting average (.299), on-base percentage (.385) and slugging percentage (.564) against first batters faced in the AL

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 19 errors in the last 26 games after making just five errors over the first 17 contests...have -20 defensive runs saved, which is second fewest in the majors (Angels, -28)...have turned the fourth fewest double plays in the American League (30)...opponents have been successful is 16-of-22 (72.7%) stolen base attempts, which is the fifth lowest percentage in the AL...A's outfielders have three assists (all by Laureano), which is tied for third fewest in the AL.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 1-0 on this three-game homestand against Houston...leave following the game tomorrow for a three-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL before returning home for a seven-game homestand against Seattle (three games) and Los Angeles-AL (four games) starting next Monday...are in a stretch where they are scheduled to play 20 of 29 games at home and 35 of 44 in the Pacific Time Zone...are 10-7 over that span, including 6-5 at home...went 5-5 on the last homestand against Baltimore (1-2), Toronto (2-2) and Tampa Bay (2-1) and are 14-11 (.560) at home...went 4-2 on the last road trip to Boston (2-1) and Minnesota (2-1) and have won five road series, lost none and split one...are 12-6 (.667) on the road, which is tied with the Red Sox for the best road record in the major...have a 4.60 ERA (114 er in 223.0 ip) at home, which is fifth highest in the American League, compared to 3.46 (60 er in 156.0 ip) on the road, which is second lowest.

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** The A's are scheduled to face a right-handed starting pitcher for the sixth consecutive game tonight after squaring off against left-handers in 13 of the previous 18 contests...are 11-6 (.647) in games in which the opponent starts a left-hander compared to 15-11 (.577) against right-handers...are batting .241 (116-for-482) with a .753 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .215 (195-for-906) with a .684 OPS against right-handers...have the fifth best OPS in the AL against lefties and the fifth lowest against righties.

**THE INJURED LIST:** The A's have used the injured list 12 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have six players on the IL (Fiers, Luzardo, Moreland, Puk, Rosenthal, Wendelken).

**A's vs. ASTROS:** The A's are 3-5 against the Astros...are 1-4 in Oakland and 2-1 in Houston...won the season series last year, 7-3...it was their first season series win since going 11-8 in 2014...went 7-1 in Oakland and 0-2 in Houston...the seven wins at home matched the A's most against the Astros (7-3 in 2013)...then lost to the Astros in the ALDS, 3 games to 1...are now 47-66 (.416) against Houston over the last seven years after winning each of their first four season series against the Astros (31-13)...are 78-79 all-time, including 43-39 in Oakland and 35-40 in Houston.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Elvis Andrus** extended his hitting streak to eight games on Sunday, which is one short of the A's season high of nine (Chapman and Olson)...is 9-for-26 (.346) during the streak...**Mark Canha** leads the majors in hit by pitches (9) and is tied for second in the American League in runs (33)...**Ramón Laureano** leads Major League center fielders in home runs (10) and RBI (20)...leads all ML batters with seven home runs in May...**Matt Olson** is tied for the ML lead in go-ahead home runs (5) and is tied for the AL lead in home runs by a first baseman (10) and home runs at home (7).

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (5-2, 4.93 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season...is tied for the American League lead with five wins...is 3-0 with a 3.12 ERA (6 er in 17.1 ip) in three starts in May after going 2-2 with a 6.20 ERA in five starts in April...his three wins in May are tied for the most in the majors and match his most ever in a month...is now 7-0 with a 2.84 ERA (21 er in 66.2 ip) in 18 career appearances, including nine starts, in May...the A's are 6-2 (.750) in his starting assignments.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Has a three-game home winning streak and is 3-1 despite a 6.75 ERA (18 er in 24.0 ip) in five starts in Oakland...is 2-1 with a 2.50 ERA (5 er in 18.0 ip) in three starts on the road...over the last three years, he is 9-2 in Oakland, 8-7 on the road.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** Picked up the win in his only start against an American League West team this year (Houston on April 10)...was 3-2 with a 3.61 ERA and .236 opponents batting average in eight starts against AL West competition last year, 0-3 with a 13.50 ERA and .391 opponents average in three starts against everyone else...is now 11-5 with a 3.61 ERA (56 er in 139.2 ip) in 34 games against AL West foes, 12-11 with a 4.90 ERA (89 er in 163.1 ip) in 44 games against all other teams.

**THIS AND THAT:** Has allowed nine of his 23 runs in the third inning (9 er in 7.2 ip, 10.57 ERA)...has a .188 (12-for-64) average against batters the first time through the order, .333 (23-for-69) the second time and .275 (11-for-40) with five of his eight home runs after that...has tossed six innings or fewer in all eight of his starts...has walked two batters or fewer seven times.

**2021 HIGHLIGHTS:** Took the loss in his first start on April 5 against Los Angeles (NL)...allowed a season-high seven runs in a season-low 2.2 innings and walked a season-high three batters...tossed 90 pitches, which were the most by an A's pitcher in an outing of fewer than three innings since pitch counts were tracked beginning in 1988...the loss extended his losing streak to a career-high three games dating back to Sept. 13, 2020...then picked up the win in each of his next two starts and allowed just one run on eight hits in 12.0 innings...won 7-3 at Houston on April 10 and then combined with Romo, Diekmann and Wendelken on a four-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 victory over Detroit on April 16...struck out a season-high seven against the Tigers...tossed 6.0 innings in each start, which is his season high (five times)...allowed six runs on a season-high nine hits in 4.0 innings against Minnesota on April 21 but had a no decision in the A's 13-12, 10-inning win...allowed three home runs in a start for the second time in his career (Sept. 22, 2020 vs. Los Angeles-NL)...had a season-high 105 pitches in a 4-3 loss at Tampa Bay on April 27...has won each of his first three starts in May.

**LAST START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 win at Minnesota last Friday...blanked the Twins on three hits and a walk over the first five innings and had a 5-0 lead when he allowed a lead-off home run to Donaldson in the bottom of the sixth...was relieved by Smith to start the seventh with the A's leading 5-1.

**MONTAS vs. HOUSTON:** Is 5-3 with a 4.11 ERA (46.0 ip, 49 h, 23 r, 21 er, 16 bb, 35 so, 6 hr) in 10 career appearances, including eight starts, during the regular season...also has a loss in one postseason start (5 er in 3.2 ip)...is 2-2 with a 4.64 ERA (11 er in 21.1 ip) in five games at Minute Maid Park and 3-1 with a 3.65 ERA (10 er in 24.2 ip) in five games in the Coliseum...was the winning pitcher in his only start this year, a 7-3 A's win at Houston on April 10...

**2020 RECAP:** Was off to a strong start as he was 2-1 with a 1.57 ERA, .175 opponents batting average and no home runs over his first four starts...was scratched from his scheduled start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness and went 1-4 with an 8.70 ERA, .321 opponents average and 10 home runs over his final seven starts...went 3-5 with a 5.60 ERA in 11 starts overall...his ERA was eighth highest in the majors among pitchers with at least 50 innings pitched...had career highs in losses (5) and earned runs (33) and matched his high in home runs (10), runs (35) and walks (23)...led the A's in strikeouts (60), losses, runs, home runs and walks...his opponents batting average broke down to .198 (22-for-111) against right-handed hitters compared to .350 (35-for-100) against left-handers...surrendered six of his 10 home runs and issued 15 of his 23 walks to lefties for a 1.061 OPS (.572 against right-handers)...had a .306 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .264 the second time and .205 after that...allowed a .133 average with two strikes...was 2-1 with a 2.56 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in six starts in Oakland, 1-4 with a 10.13 ERA and .330 opponents average in five starts on the road...surrendered just two home runs in 31.2 innings in Oakland compared to eight in 21.1 innings on the road...made eight of his 11 starts during the day, which tied for the most in the majors...was 2-4 with a 6.16 ERA during the day, 1-1 with a 4.20 ERA at night...the A's were 6-5 (.545) in his starting assignments...had two starts of seven innings and five starts of fewer than five innings...went 2-2 with a 2.83 ERA in six starts on four days rest, 1-3 with an 11.00 ERA in five starts on five days rest or more...received two runs of support or fewer in nine of his 11 starts...had 10 of his 28 runs of support in one start on Aug. 3 at Seattle and had a 4.75 RSA for the season...won both of his starts with support of three or more runs and is now 16-1 in 20 career starts with at least three runs of support.

<b>LHP Cole Irvin (3-4, 3.02 ERA):</b> Is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season...is 3-2 with a 1.89 ERA and .218 opponents batting average over his last six starts after going 0-2 with a 7.45 ERA and .293 opponents average over his first two starts...has a 3.02 ERA overall, which ranks 10th in the American League...however, his four losses are tied for third most...walked two batters in his last start after issuing one free pass or fewer in each of his first seven starts...has issued just eight free passes in 47.2 innings and his average of 1.51 walks per nine innings is third lowest in the AL...has a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.88, which also ranks sixth...has allowed just five runs over the first four inning of a game for a 1.41 ERA, which is second lowest in the AL...had a no decision in his last start, a 5-4 loss at Minnesota last Saturday (6.2 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 2 so)...is 0-2 with a 7.45 ERA (9.2 ip, 12 h, 8 r, 8 er, 2 bb, 5 so, 2 hr) in two career starts against Houston, both this year.

- Blew his second save of the season Sunday...earned his fifth save of the season Wednesday night, which surpasses his career high of four with Texas in 2016.
- Has a 2.40 ERA (4 er in 15.0 ip) and .193 (11-for-57) opponents batting average over his last 16 games dating back to April 10.
- Has struck out at least one batter in 14 of his last 15 games (22 so in 13.2 ip) and has 26 for the season, which is tied for sixth among American League relievers...is tied for second in first batter strikeouts (9).
- Has yielded a .186 (8-for-43) average against right-handed hitters compared to .308 (8-for-26) against left-handers...has issued five of his seven walks to righties.
- Allowed home runs in back-to-back games May 15-16...had not allowed a home run in his previous 17 appearances this season...allowed just one home run in 21 appearances in 2020.
- Has allowed three earned runs over 3.0 innings against Houston this season...for his career, is 3-0 with three saves and a 1.54 ERA (6 er in 35.0 ip) in 41 outings against the Astros.

*Last Year: Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)*

- Has allowed a .222 (2-for-9) average against left-handed hitters, .407 (11-for-27) against right-handers.
