



## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (26-18) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (25-18)

THURSDAY, MAY 20, 2021 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 12:37 PDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have split the first two games of this series after winning two of three in each of the previous three series...are 10-6 over the last 16 games but are 12-11 over the last 23...are 26-18 (.591) overall, which is tied with the Red Sox for the second best record in the American League to the White Sox (26-16/.619)...the eight games over .500 are one short of the season high of nine (26-17 on May 18)...are in first place in the AL West and lead the second place Astros by ½ game...have held at least a share of first in the West for each of the last 30 days and have been alone in first for each of the last 27...have not been out of first since April 19 when they were tied for second...have spent 28 days alone in first place this year, two days tied for first, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth...started the season 0-6 but are 26-12 (.684) since then...went from sole possession of last on April 11 to sole possession of first on April 21.

**CLOSE CALLS (AND NOT SO CLOSE):** The A's lost 8-1 last night and are now 8-13 (.381) in games decided by four runs or more, which is the fifth worst record in the majors...however, are 18-5 (.783) in games decided by three runs or fewer, which is the best record in the majors...also have the best record in games decided by two runs or fewer (14-5, .737) and one-run games (11-4, .733)...have outscored the opposition 95-72 in games decided by three runs or fewer (+23) but have been outscored 124-87 in the other games (-37)...have an overall run differential of -14...lead the majors with five walk-off wins and are 8-1 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with the Mariners and Angels for the most wins in the majors when trailing after seven innings (4)...are 2-0 in extra innings and are 8-1 in extra innings over the last two years.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** The A's are 1-1 in this stretch of 16 games in 16 days, all against American League West competition...have played just nine of their first 44 games against divisional foes, all against Houston (3-6), and have the fewest intradivision games in the majors...the Astros have played 29 of their 43 games against AL West teams (20-9) and are tied for the most intradivision games in the majors...following today's game, the A's will face Houston just three times over the next 108 games...face the Angels the first time in game 46 tomorrow, the Mariners for the first time in game 49 next Monday and the Rangers for the first time in game 74 on June 21.

**THE LONG BALL:** Ramón Laureano and Matt Olson are tied for the A's team lead with 10 home runs and Oakland is one of six teams with two players with 10 or more home runs...the A's have hit nine home runs in the last five games and have 56 for the season, which is tied for third in the American League...are 21-3 when out-homer the opposition, 3-13 when they are out-homered.

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .235 (130-for-554) in May after hitting .214 (185-for-865) in April...are hitting .222 overall, which is third lowest in the American League...however, lead the AL in hit by pitches (25), are tied for third in home runs (56), rank fourth in walks (150) and fifth in extra base hits (126), stolen bases (22) and fewest strikeouts (396)...have four stolen bases over the last 25 games after stealing 18 bases over the first 19 contests.

**IN THE PINCH:** A's pinch hitters are 10-for-36 (.278) with two home runs, seven RBI and two walks...lead the American League in pinch hits, home runs, RBI and plate appearances (38)...went 3-for-29 (.103) with three RBI in the pinch last year.

**PITCHING:** The A's have allowed 33 runs in the last six games (32 er in 52.0 ip, 5.54 ERA) and have a .311 (66-for-212) opponents batting average over that span...have allowed a .255 batting average for the season, which is third highest in the American League...have issued the third fewest walks (122) and are tied for third in shutouts (4)...are tied for the most wild pitches (27).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 16-16 with a 4.32 ERA (115 er in 239.1 ip)...the wins are tied for third most in the American League but the losses are tied for second most...lead the AL and rank fourth in the majors in innings pitched (239.1)...have tossed eight innings or fewer in each of the last 220 games, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history...have not had a pitcher toss more than eight innings since Frankie Montas on May 17, 2019 at Detroit (8.2)...rank third in the AL in fewest walks per nine innings (2.37)...have walked two batters or fewer in 32 of the last 33 games, including an Oakland record 26 consecutive games from April 13-May 11.

**BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen has allowed at least two runs in each of the last four games (14 er in 12.1 ip, 10.22 ERA) and is 2-1 with two blown saves over that span...is now 3-2 with three saves, three blown saves and a 5.40 ERA (26 er in 43.1 ip) over the last 13 games dating back to May 5 after going 7-0

with nine saves, no blown saves and a 3.50 ERA over the first 31 contests...has a 4.06 ERA overall, which is fifth highest in the American League...has converted 12-of-15 (80.0%) save opportunities, which is the third best percentage in the AL...is tied for fourth in saves...Lou Trivino has six saves and Jake Diekman has five and the A's are one of three teams in the majors with two pitchers with five or more saves (San Francisco, Seattle, Cleveland)...has allowed just six home runs over the A's last 36 games after surrendering seven over the first eight...the 13 home runs are the fewest in the AL and fourth fewest in the majors...has two losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has allowed 23-of-56 (41.1%) inherited runners to score, which is the third highest percentage in the AL...has the highest batting average (.306), on-base percentage (.388) and slugging percentage (.562) against first batters faced in the AL.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have gone three consecutive games without an error after making nine errors over the previous nine games...have turned the fourth fewest double plays in the American League (31)...opponents have been successful is 16-of-22 (72.7%) stolen base attempts, which is the fifth lowest percentage in the AL...have -17 defensive runs saved, which is second fewest in the AL (Angels, -30)...A's outfielders have three assists (all by Laureano), which is tied for third fewest in the AL.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 1-1 on this three-game homestand against Houston...leave following the game today for a three-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL before returning home for a seven-game homestand against Seattle (three games) and Los Angeles-AL (four games) starting next Monday...are in a stretch where they are scheduled to play 20 of 29 games at home and 35 of 44 in the Pacific Time Zone...are 10-8 over that span, including 6-6 at home...went 5-5 on the last homestand against Baltimore (1-2), Toronto (2-2) and Tampa Bay (2-1) and are 14-12 (.538) at home...went 4-2 on the last road trip to Boston (2-1) and Minnesota (2-1) and have won five road series, lost none and split one...are 12-6 (.667) on the road, which is tied for the second best road record in the American League...have a 4.73 ERA (122 er in 232.0 ip) at home, which is fourth highest in the AL, compared to 3.46 (60 er in 156.0 ip) on the road, which is second lowest.

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** The A's are scheduled to face a right-handed starting pitcher for the seventh consecutive game today after squaring off against left-handers in 13 of the previous 18 contests...are 11-6 (.647) in games in which the opponent starts a left-hander compared to 15-12 (.556) against right-handers...are batting .239 (116-for-486) with a .747 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .213 (199-for-933) with a .675 OPS against right-handers.

**THE INJURED LIST:** The A's have used the injured list 12 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have six players on the IL (Fiers, Luzardo, Moreland, Puk, Rosenthal, Wendelken).

**A's vs. ASTROS:** The A's are 3-6 against the Astros...are 1-5 in Oakland and 2-1 in Houston...won the season series last year, 7-3...it was their first season series win since going 11-8 in 2014...went 7-1 in Oakland and 0-2 in Houston...the seven wins at home matched the A's most against the Astros (7-3 in 2013)...then lost to the Astros in the ALDS, 3 games to 1...are now 47-67 (.412) against Houston over the last seven years after winning each of their first four season series against the Astros (31-13)...are 78-80 all-time, including 43-40 in Oakland and 35-40 in Houston.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Elvis Andrus** extended his hitting streak to nine games yesterday, which matches the A's season high (Chapman and Olson)...is 10-for-29 (.345) during the streak...**Mark Canha** leads the majors in hit by pitches (9) and ranks third in the American League in runs (33)...**Ramón Laureano** leads Major League center fielders in home runs (10) and RBI (20)...leads all ML batters with seven home runs in May...**Matt Olson** is tied for the AL lead in go-ahead home runs (5), home runs by a first baseman (10) and home runs at home (7).

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1977** Wayne Gross has five RBI and Earl Williams drives in four as the A's defeat Seattle 14-5...in **2005** Keith Ginter has one hit in one official at bat but drives in five runs on a three-run home run and two sacrifice flies in the A's 8-4 win at San Francisco...in **2011** Mark Ellis singles in the second inning off San Francisco's Ryan Vogelsong for his 1000<sup>th</sup> career hit to become the 12<sup>th</sup> player in Oakland history to collect 1000 hits.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (3-4, 3.02 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season...is 3-2 with a 1.89 ERA (8 er in 38.0 ip) and .218 (31-for-142) opponents batting average over his last six starts after going 0-2 with a 7.45 ERA and .293 opponents average over his first two starts, both against Houston...has a 3.02 ERA overall, which ranks ninth in the American League...however, his four losses are tied for fourth most...has allowed one run or fewer in four of his eight starts.

**DON'T WALK:** Walked two batters in his last start after issuing one free pass or fewer in each of his first seven starts...has issued just eight free passes in 47.2 innings and his average of 1.51 walks per nine innings is third lowest in the American League...has a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.88, which ranks sixth...has walked one batter or fewer in nine of his 11 career starts and has walked just 22 batters in 93.0 career innings (2.13 per nine innings).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .218 (31-for-142) batting average and .610 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .293 (12-for-41) and a .789 OPS against left-handers...his career splits are .239 (64-for-268) with a .693 OPS against righties, .357 (35-for-98) with a .923 OPS against lefties...has allowed four of his five home runs and issued seven of his eight walks to righties...four of the five home runs have been solo shots...has a .204 (28-for-137) average against a batter the first two times through the order, .326 (15-for-46) after that.

**BY INNING:** Has allowed just five runs over the first four inning of a game for a 1.41 ERA (5 er in 32.0 ip), which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors over that part of the game...has yielded seven runs in the fifth inning and five in the sixth and has a 6.32 ERA (11 er in 15.2 ip) from the fifth inning on, which is fourth highest in the AL...has a .200 (23-for-115) opponents batting in innings 1-4, a .294 (20-for-68) mark from the fifth inning on.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 3-0 with a 1.04 ERA (3 er in 26.0 ip) in four starts on five days rest or more, 0-3 with a 4.67 ERA (9 er in 17.1 ip) in three starts on four days rest.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Is 3-1 in five starts with more than one run of support, 0-3 in three starts with support of one run or fewer...has a season RSA of 3.78 (20 rs in 47.2 ip).

**2021 HIGHLIGHTS:** Was on the A's Opening Day roster and lost each of his first two starts, allowing four runs in each contest for a 7.45 ERA...the four runs are a season high (three times)...tossed 4.1 innings in his first start on April 3 against Houston, which was the shortest start of his career...also faced the Astros in his second start on April 8 but did not pitch again until April 17 against Detroit when he combined with Wendelken, Guerra and Weems on a five-hit shutout in a 7-0 win...it was his first win since May 17, 2019 against Colorado and it snapped a career-high four-game losing streak...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings against the Tigers and then blanked the Orioles over the first five innings on April 23 for a career-high 11.0 inning scoreless streak...allowed just one run in 5.1 innings at Baltimore but yielded a season-high eight hits...won back-to-back starts on the 17th and 23rd, marking the second time in his career he put together consecutive wins (May 12-17, 2019)...allowed just one run in 11. innings in the two starts...lost on April 28 at Tampa Bay but then picked up his third win on May 4 against Toronto...had career highs in innings pitched (8.0), strikeouts (9) and pitches (102) against the Blue Jays.

**LAST START:** He had his first no decision of the season in the A's 5-4 loss at Minnesota last Saturday...Oakland scored twice in the top of the first and he allowed a Garlick single and a Donaldson double to start the bottom of the first...then retired 17 of the next 20 batters beginning with a Cruz RBI ground out...had a 4-1 lead when he was relieved by Petit with the bases loaded and two outs in the seventh...Petit escaped that jam but he and Diekmann allowed four runs in the eighth inning for the blown save.

first start since May 22, 2019 with Philadelphia at Chicago (NL)...allowed a RBI single to Tucker in the first but the A's came back to tie the game with a run in the bottom of the first...then allowed a RBI single to Altuve in the second...was relieved by Trivino with runners on first and second and one out in the fifth and Trivino allowed a three-run home run...then lost his next start on April 8 at Houston, 6-2...allowed a leadoff home run to Correa in the second, a RBI double to Correa in the fourth and a solo home run to Alvarez in the sixth...walked the next batter (Correa) and was relieved by Wendelken with a runner on first and one out in the sixth with the A's trailing 3-0...Wendelken allowed Correa to score plus a run of his own.

**2020 RECAP:** Had two stints with Philadelphia and was 0-1 with a 17.18 ERA in three relief appearances...opponents went 11-for-21 (.524) but he walked just one and struck out four in 3.2 innings...allowed a .438 (7-for-16) average against right-handed hitters compared to .800 (4-for-5) against left-handers...was 2-0 with a 4.50 ERA in four spring training appearances...was optioned to Lehigh Valley March 26 but was recalled on July 23 and was on the Phillies Opening Day roster...made his 2020 debut on July 26 against Miami and allowed four runs on five hits in an inning of relief and was the losing pitcher in an 11-6 decision...tossed a scoreless inning of relief Aug. 9 against Atlanta but was optioned to Philadelphia's alternate site on Aug. 9...was recalled for a second time Aug. 20, pitched the next day at Atlanta (1.2 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 3 so) and was optioned Aug. 22...did not pitch the remainder of the season.

### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**RHP James Kaprielian (1-0, 1.80 ERA):** Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas May 12 and made his first career start at Boston that night...earned his first Major League win in the A's 4-1 victory (5.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 6 so)...has not pitched since then...tomorrow will be the fourth appearance and second start of his career, his first against the Angels...made one start with Triple-A Las Vegas and was the losing pitcher on Opening Day, May 6 against Sacramento (4.2 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...made his ML debut last year and had two relief appearances over five stints with Oakland...compiled a 7.36 ERA and .267 opponents batting average...his debut came after pitching in just 27 games over his first five professional seasons due to elbow problems...missed most of 2016 with an elbow injury and then missed the entire 2017 and 2018 seasons following April 18, 2017 "Tommy John" surgery...was traded to the A's at the 2017 trading deadline in the Sonny Gray deal.

- Blew his second save of the season Sunday...earned his fifth save of the season Wednesday night, which surpasses his career high of four with Texas in 2016.
- Has a 2.40 ERA (4 er in 15.0 ip) and .193 (11-for-57) opponents batting average over his last 16 games dating back to April 10.
- Has struck out at least one batter in 14 of his last 15 games (22 so in 13.2 ip) and has 26 for the season, which is tied for eighth among American League relievers...is tied for second in first batter strikeouts (9).
- Has yielded a .186 (8-for-43) average against right-handed hitters compared to .308 (8-for-26) against left-handers...has issued five of his seven walks to righties.
- Allowed home runs in back-to-back games May 15-16...had not allowed a home run in his previous 17 appearances this season...allowed just one home run in 21 appearances in 2020.
- Has allowed three earned runs over 3.0 innings against Houston this season...for his career, is 3-0 with three saves and a 1.54 ERA (6 er in 35.0 ip) in 41 outings against the Astros.

*Last Year: Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)*
