



OAKLAND ATHLETICS (26-19) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (19-25)

ABOUT THE A'S: Lost each of the final two games of the Houston series to fall out of first place in the American League West for the first time since April 19...had 30 consecutive days with at least a share of first, including 27 straight alone in first...trail the Astros by ½ game...have lost consecutive games for the first time since May 5-6...have lost more than two straight just once and that was the A's season-opening six-game losing streak...are 26-13 (.667) since the six-game streak and 26-19 (.578) overall, which is tied for the fourth best record in the American League...are 12-12 since the 13-game winning streak...have spent 28 days alone in first place this year, two days tied for first, one day in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 1-2 in this stretch of 16 games in 16 days, all against American League West competition...are 3-7 (.300) against the West with all 10 games coming against Houston...have the fewest intradivision games in the majors and the second worst record (Rockies, 8-21/.276)...are 23-12 (.657) in interdivision games...face the Angels the first time in game 46 tonight after already finishing the season series with Baltimore, Tampa Bay and Minnesota...will face the Mariners for the first time in game 49 on Monday and the Rangers for the first time in game 74 on June 21.

CLOSE CALLS (AND NOT SO CLOSE): The A's lost 8-4 yesterday and are now 8-14 (.364) in games decided by four runs or more, which is the fourth worst record in the majors...however, are 18-5 (.783) in games decided by three runs or fewer, which is the best record in the majors...also have the best record in games decided by two runs or fewer (14-5, .737) and one-run games (11-4, .733)...have outscored the opposition 95-72 in games decided by three runs or fewer (+23) but have been outscored 132-91 in the other games (-41)...have an overall run differential of -18...lead the majors with five walk-off wins and are 8-1 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with the Mariners and Angels for the most wins in the majors when trailing after seven innings (4)...are 2-0 in extra innings and are 8-1 in extra innings over the last two years.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's conclude a stretch of four series in four different cities with this three-game road trip to Los Angeles...went 1-2 on a three-game homestand against Houston to start the week after going 4-2 on the last road trip to Boston (2-1) and Minnesota (2-1)...are 12-6 (.667) on the road compared to 14-13 (.519) at home...have the third best road record in the American League where they have won five series, lost none and split one...the 18 road games are tied with the Cubs for the fewest in the majors...return home following the game Sunday for a seven-game homestand against Seattle (three games) and Los Angeles-AL (four games)...have a 3.46 ERA (60 er in 156.0 ip) on the road, which is second lowest in the AL, compared to 4.82 (129 er in 241.0 ip) at home, which is fourth highest...are in a stretch where they are scheduled to play 20 of 29 games at home and 35 of 44 in the Pacific Time Zone...are 10-9 over that span, including 6-7 at home.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .235 (138-for-588) in May after hitting .214 (185-for-865) in April...are hitting .222 overall, which is third lowest in the American League...however, lead the AL in hit by pitches (26), are tied for the lead in home runs (59), rank fourth in walks (154) and fifth in extra base hits (131) and fewest strikeouts (406)...A's pinch hitters are 10-for-36 (.278) with two home runs, seven RBI and two walks...lead the AL in pinch hits, home runs, RBI and plate appearances (38)...went 1-for-18 with runners in scoring position in the three-game series against Houston and are hitting .150 (9-for-60) with RISP over the last eight games...are batting .167 (4-for-24) with the bases loaded, which is the lowest batting average in the AL and third lowest in the majors...A's designated hitters are batting .197 (29-for-147), which is second lowest in the AL (Tigers, .173).

PITCHING: The A's allowed 21 runs on 42 hits in the three-game series against Houston and now have a 5.75 ERA (39 er in 61.0 ip) and .317 (80-for-252) opponents batting average over the last seven games...now have a .257 opponents average for the season, which is second highest in the American League...however, the third fewest walks (124) and rank eighth in opponents OPS (.725)...are tied for the most wild pitches (27), tied for third in shutouts (4) and have the fourth fewest strikeouts (367).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 16-17 with a 4.42 ERA (120 er in 244.1 ip)...the wins are tied for third most in the American League but the losses are tied for second most...lead the AL and rank third in the majors in innings pitched (244.1)...have tossed eight

innings or fewer in each of the last 221 games, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history...have not had a pitcher toss more than eight innings since Frankie Montas on May 17, 2019 at Detroit (8.2)...rank third in the AL in fewest walks per nine innings (2.39)...have walked two batters or fewer in 33 of the last 34 games, including an Oakland record 26 consecutive games from April 13-May 11.

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has allowed at least two runs in each of the last five games (16 er in 16.1 ip, 8.82 ERA)...yielded at least three runs in each of the first five games (7.43 ERA) and had a 2.70 ERA in 35 games in between (April 6-May 14)...now has a 4.07 ERA for the season, which is fifth highest in the American League...has converted 12-of-15 (80.0%) save opportunities, which is the third best percentage in the AL...Lou Trivino has six saves and Jake Diekman has five and the A's are one of four teams in the majors with two pitchers with five or more saves (San Francisco, Seattle, Cleveland)...has allowed just six home runs over the A's last 37 games after surrendering seven over the first eight...the 13 home runs are the fewest in the AL and tied for fewest in the majors...has two losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has allowed 23-of-56 (41.1%) inherited runners to score, which is the third highest percentage in the AL...has the highest batting average (.309), on-base percentage (.390) and slugging percentage (.59) against first batters faced in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: A's opponents have been successful is 16-of-22 (72.7%) stolen base attempts, which is the fifth lowest percentage in the American League...the A's have turned the fourth fewest double plays (32)...have -18 defensive runs saved, which is second fewest (Angels, -27)...A's outfielders have three assists (all by Laureano), which is tied for third fewest.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have faced a right-handed starting pitcher in each of the previous seven games after squaring off against left-handers in 13 of the previous 18 contests...are 11-6 (.647) in games in which the opponent starts a left-hander compared to 15-13 (.535) against right-handers...Ramón Laureano and Matt Olson are tied for the A's team lead with 10 home runs and Oakland is one of six teams with two players with 10 or more home runs...are 21-4 when out-homer the opposition, 3-13 when they are out-homered...the A's average time of game is 3:04, which is tied for fifth quickest in the majors...are 2-7 in replay challenges.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 12 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have six players on the IL (Fiers, Luzardo, Moreland, Puk, Rosenthal, Wendelken).

A's vs. ANGELS: The two clubs meet for the first time in 2021 tonight and the A's will square off against the Angels in 16 of their next 62 games...the A's won the season series last year 6-4 after going 13-6 against the Angels in 2019...have won back-to-back season series for the first time since winning three straight from 2011-13...went 5-2 in Oakland last year and 1-2 in Anaheim...have won 13 of the last 18 games and 26 of the last 40...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 456-386 against the Angels...that includes 240-182 in Oakland and 216-204 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 505-463 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Elvis Andrus extended his hitting streak to an A's season-high 10 games yesterday...is 11-for-33 (.333) during the streak, which is his 19th career hitting streak of 10 or more games...**Mark Canha** leads the majors in hit by pitches (9) and ranks third in the American League in runs (34)...**Ramón Laureano** leads Major League center fielders in home runs (10) and RBI (20)...is tied for the lead among all ML batters with seven home runs in May...**Matt Olson** is tied for the AL lead in go-ahead home runs (5) and home runs by a first baseman (10).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1928** Jack Quinn tosses a complete game in the A's 4-3, 13-inning win over Washington in the first game of doubleheader...he allows 15 hits and has one of his own, a walk-off single in the bottom of the 13th...in **1930** Max Bishop walks five times in the first game of a doubleheader against New York and adds three more in the second game...in **1974** Reggie Jackson becomes the first Oakland Athletic to reach 200 homers when he hits a two-run homer in the seventh inning of the A's 8-1 win at Minnesota...in **1997** Jose Canseco doubles in the seventh inning of the A's 7-3 win at Texas for his 1000th hit in an Oakland uniform...he becomes the ninth Oakland player to reach 1000 hits.

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas May 12 and made his first career start at Boston that night...has not pitched since then...tonight will be the fourth appearance and second start of his career.

LAST START: He earned his first Major League win in his first career start in the A's 4-1 victory at Boston on May 12...allowed a Gonzalez double, a Verdugo walk and a Martinez RBI single to the first three batters he faced...that would be the only run he would allow in five innings of work as he blanked the Red Sox on two hits and a walk over his final four innings.

WITH LAS VEGAS: He made one start with Triple-A Las Vegas and went 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA...was the Opening Day starter May 6 at Las Vegas and was the losing pitcher in an 8-1 loss to Sacramento...allowed a RBI single to Thairo Estrada in the third...was relieved by Matt Blackham in the fifth inning with a runner on third and two outs and the Aviators trailing 1-0...Blackham allowed that runner to score plus one of his own.

SPRING TRAINING: Was 0-0 with a 0.00 ERA (3.0 ip, 3 h, 0 bb, 3 so) in two games, one start, this spring...opponents went 3-for-11 (.273) with no walks and a hit by pitch...pitched in relief on Feb. 28 against the Dodgers (1.0 ip, 2 h) and then started against the Angels on March 5 (2.0 ip, 1 h, 3 so)...was optioned to Las Vegas March 15.

2020 RECAP: Made his Major League debut and had two relief appearances over five stints with Oakland...compiled a 7.36 ERA and .267 opponents batting average...allowed two home runs in 3.2 innings, walked two and struck out four...was recalled for the first time Aug. 4 but did not pitch before he was optioned back to the A's alternate site on Aug. 6...joined the club a second time Aug. 16 and made his ML debut that day at San Francisco (2.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...relieved Fiers to start the seventh inning with the A's leading 13-2 and allowed a home run to the first batter he faced (Crawford)...walked the next batter (Dubon) before retiring each of the final six batters he faced...struck out Solano to end the seventh inning for his first strikeout...was optioned on Aug. 19...was recalled as the 29th man for doubleheaders on Sept. 8 and Sept. 14 but did not pitch...recalled for his fifth stint on Sept. 24 and made one appearance in the second game of the Sept. 26 doubleheader against Seattle (1.2 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...inherited a bases loaded situation in the third inning with the A's trailing 4-1 and allowed all three runs to score...was on the Taxi Squad for the postseason...was rated as the A's number 10 prospect by *Baseball America* following the season..

CAREER NOTES: Made his Major League debut with Oakland in 2020 after pitching in just 27 games over his first five professional seasons due to elbow problems...compiled a 7.36 ERA and .267 opponents batting average in two relief appearances with the A's...is 6-6 with a 3.00 ERA (34 er in 102.0 ip) in 28 games, including 23 starts, as a minor leaguer...has 116 strikeouts in 102.0 innings (10.24 per nine innings)...was the New York Yankees first round draft pick in 2015 but pitched in just eight games over his first four years as a professional...missed most of 2016 with an elbow injury and then missed the entire 2017 and 2018 seasons following April 18, 2017 "Tommy John" surgery...was traded to the A's at the 2017 trading deadline in the Sonny Gray deal and is the last remaining player from that deal that also netted the A's Dustin Fowler and Jorge Mateo...pitched for Scottsdale in the Arizona Fall League in 2016...was rated by *Baseball America* as the Yankees No. 4 prospect following the 2015 season and No. 5 following 2016...was the A's No. 8 prospect after the 2017 season and No. 10 following 2020.
