



## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (27-19) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (19-26)

SATURDAY, MAY 22, 2021 — ANGEL STADIUM — 7:07 PDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Moved back into first place in the American League West with last night's win after dropping back-to-back contests with Houston and falling out of first place for the first time since April 19...had 30 consecutive days with at least a share of first, including 27 straight alone in first...lead the Astros by ½ game...have lost more than two straight just once and that was the A's season-opening six-game losing streak...are 27-13 (.675) since the six-game streak and 27-19 (.587) overall, which is tied for the third best record in the American League...are 13-12 since the 13-game winning streak...have spent 29 days alone in first place this year, two days tied for first, one day in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** The A's are 2-2 in this stretch of 16 games in 16 days, all against American League West competition...are 4-7 (.364) against the West with all 10 of their 11 games coming against Houston...have the fewest intradivision games in the majors and the sixth worst record...are 23-12 (.657) in interdivision games...faced the Angels the first time in game 46 last night after already finishing the season series with Baltimore, Tampa Bay and Minnesota...will face the Mariners for the first time in game 49 on Monday and the Rangers for the first time in game 74 on June 21.

**CLOSE CALLS (AND NOT SO CLOSE):** The A's won 8-4 last night and are now 9-14 (.391) in games decided by four runs or more, which is the sixth worst record in the majors...however, are 18-5 (.783) in games decided by three runs or fewer, which is the best record in the majors...also have the best record in games decided by two runs or fewer (14-5, .737) and one-run games (11-4, .733)...have outscored the opposition 95-72 in games decided by three runs or fewer (+23) but have been outscored 136-99 in the other games (-37)...have an overall run differential of -14...lead the majors with five walk-off wins and are 8-1 in games decided in the last at bat...are 2-0 in extra innings and are 8-1 in extra innings over the last two years.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's conclude a stretch of four series in four different cities with this three-game road trip to Los Angeles...went 1-2 on a three-game homestand against Houston to start the week after going 4-2 on the last road trip to Boston (2-1) and Minnesota (2-1)...are 13-6 (.684) on the road compared to 14-13 (.519) at home...have the third best road record in the American League where they have won five series, lost none and split one...the 19 road games are tied with the Cubs, Padres and Rockies for the fewest in the majors...return home following the game Sunday for a seven-game homestand against Seattle (three games) and Los Angeles-AL (four games)...have a 3.49 ERA (64 er in 165.0 ip) on the road, which is second lowest in the AL, compared to 4.82 (129 er in 241.0 ip) at home, which is fourth highest...are in a stretch where they are scheduled to play 20 of 29 games at home and 35 of 44 in the Pacific Time Zone...are 11-9 over that span, including 6-7 at home.

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .241 (151-for-625) in May after hitting .214 (185-for-865) in April...are hitting .226 overall, which is third lowest in the American League...however, lead the AL in hit by pitches (26) and home runs (63), rank fourth in walks (160) and fifth in extra base hits (139) and fewest strikeouts (413)...A's pinch hitters are 10-for-36 (.278) with two home runs, seven RBI and two walks...lead the AL in pinch hits, home runs and plate appearances (38) and rank second in RBI...went 1-for-18 with runners in scoring position in the three-game series against Houston and are hitting .183 (13-for-71) with RISP over the last nine games...are batting .200 (5-for-25) with the bases loaded, which is the lowest batting average in the AL and seventh lowest in the majors...A's designated hitters are batting .205 (31-for-151), which is second lowest in the AL (Tigers, .175).

**PITCHING:** The A's allowed 21 runs on 42 hits in the three-game series against Houston and now have a 5.53 ERA (43 er in 70.0 ip) and .305 (87-for-285) opponents batting average over the last eight games...now have a .256 opponents average for the season, which is third highest in the American League...however, have the second fewest walks (127) and rank eighth in opponents OPS (.726)...are tied for the most wild pitches (27), tied for third in shutouts (4) and have the fourth fewest strikeouts (379).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 16-17 with a 4.39 ERA (122 er in 250.0 ip)...the wins are tied for third most in the American League but the losses are tied for third most...lead the AL and rank third in the majors in innings pitched (250.0)...have tossed eight innings or fewer in each of the last 222 games, which is the longest such streak in

Athletics history...have not had a pitcher toss more than eight innings since Frankie Montas on May 17, 2019 at Detroit (8.2)...rank second in the AL in fewest walks per nine innings (2.38)...have walked two batters or fewer in 34 of the last 35 games, including an Oakland record 26 consecutive games from April 13-May 11.

**BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen has allowed at least two runs in each of the last six games (18 er in 19.2 ip, 8.24 ERA)...yielded at least three runs in each of the first five games (7.43 ERA) and had a 2.70 ERA in 35 games in 2021 (April 6-May 14)...now has a 4.10 ERA for the season, which is sixth highest in the American League...has converted 12-of-16 (75.0%) save opportunities, which is the third best percentage in the AL...Lou Trivino has six saves and Jake Diekman has five and the A's are one of four teams in the majors with two pitchers with five or more saves (San Francisco, Seattle, Cleveland)...has allowed just six home runs over the A's last 38 games after surrendering seven over the first eight...the 13 home runs are the fewest in the AL and tied for third fewest in the majors...has two losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has allowed 23-of-56 (41.1%) inherited runners to score, which is the third highest percentage in the AL...has the highest batting average (.315), on-base percentage (.403) and slugging percentage (.573) against first batters faced in the AL.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** A's opponents have been successful is 16-of-22 (72.7%) stolen base attempts, which is the fourth lowest percentage in the American League...the A's are tied for the third fewest double plays turned (33)...A's outfielders have three assists (all by Laureano), which is tied for second fewest.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's faced a lefty last night after facing a right-handed starting pitcher in each of the previous seven games. Prior to that they faced left-handers in 13 of the previous 18 contests...are 12-6 (.667) in games in which the opponent starts a left-hander compared to 15-13 (.535) against right-handers...Ramón Laureano has the A's team lead with 11 home runs and Oakland is one of seven teams with two players with 10 or more home runs...are 22-4 when out-homering the opposition, 3-13 when they are out-homered...the A's average time of game is 3:04, which is tied for third quickest in the majors...are 2-8 in replay challenges.

**THE INJURED LIST:** The A's have used the injured list 12 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have six players on the IL (Fiers, Luzardo, Moreland, Puk, Rosenthal, Wendelken).

**A's vs. ANGELS:** The two clubs met for the first time in 2021 last night and the A's will square off against the Angels in 15 of their next 61 games...the A's won the season series last year 6-4 after going 13-6 against the Angels in 2019...have won back-to-back season series for the first time since winning three straight from 2011-13...went 5-2 in Oakland last year and 1-2 in Anaheim...have won 14 of the last 19 games and 27 of the last 41...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 457-386 against the Angels...that includes 241-182 in Oakland and 216-204 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 506-463 against the Angels.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Ramón Laureano** went 4-for-4 with three runs scored last night to tie career highs in both categories...leads Major League center fielders in home runs (11) and ranks second in RBI (20)...leads all ML batters with eight home runs in May...**Mark Canha** leads the majors in hit by pitches (9) and ranks third in the American League in runs (35)...**Chad Pinder** has played in six of seven games since being reinstated from the IL and is batting .300 (6-for-20) with three doubles and a home run over that span.

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1968** Jim Nash homers, pitches a five hit-shutout and strikes out 10 in the A's 2-0 win over Cleveland...the home run is the 5000th in the history of the A's franchise...in **1996** Geronimo Berroa hits three solo home runs and is 4 for 4 in the A's 5-1 win at New York...he would add another three-homer game later in the season to tie a major league record with two three-homer games...in **1997** George Williams, Matt Stairs and Mark McGwire deliver consecutive pinch hit singles in the A's 10-7 loss at Texas, tying the major league record for consecutive pinch hits in an inning...in **2004** Reggie Jackson becomes the third player in Oakland history to have his number retired when the A's honor him by retiring number 9.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (3-2, 3.88 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season...is 3-0 with a 3.43 ERA (16 er in 42.0 ip) and .219 (34-for-155) opponents batting average over his last seven starts after going 0-2 with a 5.56 ERA and .289 opponents average over his first two starts...the three-game winning streak matches the second longest of his career...his best is a five-game streak from Aug. 11, 2019 to Aug. 12, 2020...the A's are 6-3 (.667) in his starting assignments and are 29-16 (.644) when he starts over the last three years.

**STRIKEOUTS:** Struck out four batters in 5.0 innings in his last start after fanning at least seven in each of his previous five starts (42 so in 32.0 ip, 11.81 per nine innings)...now has 57 strikeouts for the season, which ranks seventh in the American League...has a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.07, which is 10th best in the AL.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed five home runs, all to left-handed hitters...has surrendered 23 of his 32 home runs over the last three years to lefties...has not allowed a home run to a right-handed hitter since Aug. 12, 2020 (Rendon, LAA)...opponents are batting .286 (20-for-70) the first time through the order, .208 (27-for-130) after that...has a .143 opponents batting average with two strikes, which is 11th lowest in the American League.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 3-0 with a 2.90 ERA (10 er in 31.0 ip) in five starts on five days rest compared to 0-1 with a 5.29 ERA (10 er in 17.0 ip) in three starts on four days rest...now has an eight-game winning streak when starting on five days rest dating back to July 19, 2019...has a 2.83 ERA (24 er in 76.1 ip) in 13 starts over that span.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 0-2 with a 4.07 ERA (11 er in 24.1 ip) in four starts at home compared to 3-0 with a 3.72 ERA (12 er in 29.0 ip) in five starts on the road...now has a 9-12 career record in the Coliseum, but has a 2.62 ERA (62 er in 212.2 ip), which is fifth lowest in Coliseum history among pitchers with 200 or more innings pitched.

**THIS AND THAT:** Hit two batters in his last start and now has seven for the season, which is tied for the most in the majors...ranks ninth in the American League in innings pitched (53.1)...has received two runs of support or fewer in four of his nine starts and is 0-2 in those starts...is 18-1 in 30 career starts with three runs of support or more, 4-22 in 45 starts with two runs of support or fewer...has walked one batter or fewer in five of his nine starts this year...has yielded four hits or fewer four times...does not have a complete game in 75 career starts...70 of those starts have come with Oakland, which is the second longest streak of consecutive starts with no complete games in Oakland history (113, Barry Zito, Aug. 22, 2003-Sept. 28, 2006).

**POST-TOMMY JOHN:** Did not pitch in the majors in 2017 following May 6, 2016 "Tommy John" surgery...is 20-12 with a 3.39 ERA (116 er in 308.0 ip) and is averaging 8.59 strikeouts per nine innings (294 so in 308.0 ip) in 58 games (51 starts) since the surgery...was 2-11 with a 4.13 ERA and 6.77 strikeouts per nine innings in 29 games (23 starts) before the surgery.

**2021 HIGHLIGHTS:** Was the A's Opening Day starting pitcher and took the loss in an 8-1 decision to Houston on April 1 in Oakland...became the A's 14th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 16 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill, Graveman twice, Fiers, Montas)...allowed a run in the fourth inning to snap a 16.2-inning scoreless streak during the regular season and a 27.1-inning home scoreless streak, which was ninth longest in Oakland history...lost his second start on April 6, a 5-1 loss to Los Angeles (NL) on April 6 in Oakland when he allowed a season-high four runs on a season-high nine hits in 6.0 innings...allowed two home runs in the third, which were his first home runs in the Coliseum since Aug. 24, 2019...that snapped a 10-game, 55.1-inning, 229-batter homerless streak in Oakland...that ran his record to 0-2 with a 5.56 ERA...then allowed exactly two runs in each of his next six starts to become the second pitcher in Athletic history to allow exactly two runs in six consecutive games...joins Bob Davis of the Kansas City A's, who did it all in relief from Aug. 8-26, 1960...went 3-0 with a 2.92 ERA over that stretch which ran from April 12 to May 11...allowed just two hits in 5.0 innings for the win on April 12 at Arizona, which matched his fewest hits ever in a start...the innings pitched are a season low and he walked a season-high five batters...tied an Oakland record with three hit batters April 29 at Tampa Bay (12th time, last: Fiers, June 22, 2019, also against Tampa Bay)...tossed a season-high 7.0 innings May 5 against Toronto and did not walk a batter, but had a no decision in the A's 9-4 loss...left with a 3-2 lead but Trivino allowed five runs in the eighth inning for the blown save...struck out a season-high 10 batters in a season-high tying 7.0 innings in a 3-2 win at Boston on May 11...it was his third career game of 10 or more strikeouts...did not walk a batter, the second time he has fanned 10 or more without issuing a free pass...is one of nine pitchers in Oakland history with two such games.

**LAST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 7-6 win at Minnesota last Sunday...allowed a season-high tying four runs...Oakland scored a run in the second but he allowed three runs in the bottom of the second on a three-run

home run by Kepler...Kepler added a sacrifice fly in the third but Oakland scored four times in the fifth to take a 5-4 lead...was relieved by Smith to start the sixth but Diekman allowed two runs in the eighth for the blown save.

**BASSITT vs. LOS ANGELES:** Is 3-3 with a 5.15 ERA (36.2 ip, 42 h, 27 r, 21 er, 8 bb, 37 so, 5 hr) in nine career appearances, including seven starts...is 2-1 with an 6.75 ERA (12 er in 16.0 ip) in four games in Anaheim and 1-2 with a 3.92 ERA (9 er in 20.2 ip) in five games in Oakland...is 3-3 with a 5.56 ERA (21 er in 34.0 ip) in his seven starts...went 1-1 with a 3.52 ERA (15.1 ip, 16 h, 8 r, 6

er, 3 bb, 15 so, 2 hr) in three starts last year...the no decision came on July 27 in Oakland when he combined with five A's relievers on a nine-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win...tossed 4.0 innings and did not qualify for the win...allowed five of the hits and walked a batter but ended up stranding five base runners (also had a GDP)...was relieved by Smith to start the fifth inning with the A's leading 3-0...the win came in an 8-4 victory at Los Angeles on Aug. 22...Oakland scored a run in the first but he allowed a solo home run to Trout in the bottom of the first...the A's came back with two in the second but he allowed two in the third on a La Stella RBI single and a Trout sacrifice fly...had a 5-3 lead when he allowed a two-out home run to Rendon in the sixth...was relieved by Diekman following the home run...then took the loss in a 4-3 decision in Oakland on Aug. 22...allowed a run to score on a fielders choice in the first inning and then allowed three runs, one earned, in the second...one of the runs scored on a Matt Chapman error and Trout added a two-run double...retired 10 of the last 12 batters he faced and left after 5.2 innings trailing 4-3.

**2020 RECAP:** Spent the entire season on the active roster for the first time in his six-year career and went 5-2 with a 2.29 ERA in 11 starts...his ERA ranked second among pitchers in the West divisions (Lamet, SD 2.09) and sixth in the majors...it was fifth lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 10 starts...also tied for fifth in the West divisions in winning percentage (.714), ranked seventh in opponents OPS (.659), batting average (.233) and slugging percentage (.371), tied for seventh in wins and eighth in on-base percentage (.288)...had career lows in ERA and opponents on-base percentage...walked 17 batters in 63.0 innings for a career-low 2.43 walks per nine innings...struck out 55 for a career-best 3.24 strikeout-to-walk ratio...led the A's in innings pitched and tied for the lead in games started...received five votes (two third, one fourth, two fifth) in American League Cy Young balloting...went 1-0 with a 1.08 ERA over his first three starts, 1-2 with a 5.95 ERA over his next four starts and 3-0 with a 0.34 ERA over his final four starts...allowed a .233 opponents batting average, which broke down to .223 (31-for-139) with a .590 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .248 (25-for-101) with a .755 OPS against left-handers...yielded four of his six home runs to lefties...walked just one batter to lead off an inning and held opponents to a .203 (13-for-64) batting average and .227 on-base percentage in that situation...the on-base percentage was sixth lowest in the majors...five of his six home runs came with the bases empty.

### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**LHP Sean Manaea (3-2, 4.41 ERA):** Is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season...has allowed 10 hits in each of his last two starts and is 0-1 with an 11.25 ERA and .465 opponents batting average over that span...allowed five runs on six hits in 4.2 innings for the loss in his first start this year and was 3-0 with a 2.23 ERA and .219 opponents batting average in six starts in between...is averaging 1.65 walks per nine innings for the season, which is third lowest in the American League...ranks fourth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (5.33)...has a .157 opponents batting average against left-handed hitters, which is fourth lowest in the AL...had a no decision in his last start, a 6-5 A's win over Houston last Tuesday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 10 h, 3 r, 3 er, 0 bb, 3 so)...is 2-4 with a 5.12 ERA (51.0 ip, 50 h, 31 r, 29 er, 15 bb, 34 so, 9 hr) in 10 career starts against Los Angeles (AL)...was 0-1 with a 9.82 ERA (7.1 ip, 12 h, 8 r, 8 er, 3 bb, 4 so, 2 hr) in two starts last year.

- Was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas yesterday.
- Was a non-roster invitee with Cincinnati this spring and made the Reds Opening Day roster...compiled an 11.12 ERA in six relief appearances before he was designated for assignment on April 17.
- Signed a minor league deal with Oakland on April 29 and was assigned to Las Vegas.
- Was originally selected by Los Angeles (AL) in the first round of the 2010 First-Year Player Draft and made his Major League debut with the Angels in 2014...went 17-13 with nine saves and a 3.70 ERA in 285 games, including seven starts, in seven seasons with Los Angeles from 2014-20.
