



OAKLAND ATHLETICS (28-19) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (19-27)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight games to take a 1½-game lead in the American League West, after dropping back-to-back contests with Houston and falling out of first place for the first time since April 19...had 30 consecutive days with at least a share of first, including 27 straight alone in first...lead the Astros by 1½ games...have lost more than two straight just once and that was the A's season-opening six-game losing streak...are 28-13 (.683) since the six-game streak and 28-19 (.596) overall, which is tied for the second best record in the American League...are 14-12 since the 13-game winning streak...have spent 30 days alone in first place this year, two days tied for first, one day in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 3-2 in this stretch of 16 games in 16 days, all against American League West competition...are 5-7 (.417) against the West with 10 of their 12 games coming against Houston...have the fewest intradivision games in the majors and the ninth worst record...are 23-12 (.657) in interdivision games...faced the Angels the first time in game 46 last night after already finishing the season series with Baltimore, Tampa Bay and Minnesota...will face the Mariners for the first time in game 49 on Monday and the Rangers for the first time in game 74 on June 21.

CLOSE CALLS (AND NOT SO CLOSE): The A's won 6-2 last night and are now 10-14 (.417) in games decided by four runs or more, which is the 10th worst record in the majors...however, are 18-5 (.783) in games decided by three runs or fewer, which is the best record in the majors...also have the best record in games decided by two runs or fewer (14-5, .737) and one-run games (11-4, .733)...have outscored the opposition 95-72 in games decided by three runs or fewer (+23) but have been outscored 138-103 in the other games (-35)...have an overall run differential of -10...lead the majors with five walk-off wins and are 8-1 in games decided in the last at bat...are 2-0 in extra innings and are 8-1 in extra innings over the last two years.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's conclude a stretch of four series in four different cities with this three-game road trip to Los Angeles (2-0)...went 1-2 on a three-game homestand against Houston to start the week after going 4-2 on the last road trip to Boston (2-1) and Minnesota (2-1)...are 14-6 (.700) on the road compared to 14-13 (.519) at home...have the third best road record in the majors, where they have won six series, lost none and split one...the 20 road games are tied with the Braves, Cubs and Royals for the third fewest in the majors...return home following the game Sunday for a seven-game homestand against Seattle (three games) and Los Angeles-AL (four games)...have a 3.41 ERA (66 er in 174.0 ip) on the road, which is lowest in the AL, compared to 4.82 (129 er in 241.0 ip) at home, which is fourth highest...are in a stretch where they are scheduled to play 20 of 29 games at home and 35 of 44 in the Pacific Time Zone...are 12-9 over that span, including 6-7 at home.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .243 (160-for-659) in May after hitting .214 (185-for-865) in April...are hitting .226 overall, which is third lowest in the American League...however, lead the AL in hit by pitches (27) and home runs (66), rank fourth in walks (164) and extra base hits (146), and are tied for fifth fewest strikeouts (416)...A's pinch hitters are 10-for-38 (.263) with two home runs, seven RBI and two walks...lead the AL in pinch hits, home runs and plate appearances (38) and rank second in RBI...went 1-for-18 with runners in scoring position in the three-game series against Houston and are hitting .177 (14-for-79) with RISP over the last 10 games...are batting .192 (5-for-26) with the bases loaded, which is the lowest batting average in the AL and sixth lowest in the majors...A's designated hitters are batting .206 (32-for-155), which is fourth lowest in the AL.

PITCHING: The A's allowed 21 runs on 42 hits in the three-game series against Houston and now have a 5.13 ERA (45 er in 79.0 ip) and .290 (92-for-317) opponents batting average over the last nine games...now have a .254 opponents average for the season, which is fourth highest in the American League...however, have the second fewest walks (128) and have the seventh lowest opponents OPS (.721)...have the second most wild pitches (27), are tied for third in shutouts (4) and are tied for the fourth fewest strikeouts (389).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 17-17 with a 4.39 ERA (124 er in 257.2 ip)...the wins are tied for third most in the American League but the losses are tied for fourth most...lead the AL and rank third in the majors in innings pitched (257.2)...have tossed eight innings or fewer in each of the last

223 games, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history...have not had a pitcher toss more than eight innings since Frankie Montas on May 17, 2019 at Detroit (8.2)...rank second in the AL in fewest walks per nine innings (2.34)...have walked two batters or fewer in 35 of the last 36 games, including an Oakland record 26 consecutive games from April 13-May 11.

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has allowed at least two runs in six of the last seven games (18 er in 21.0 ip, 7.71 ERA)...yielded at least three runs in each of the first five games (7.43 ERA) and had a 2.70 ERA in 35 games in between (April 6-May 14)...now has a 4.06 ERA for the season, which is seventh highest in the American League...has converted 12-of-16 (75.0%) save opportunities, which is the third best percentage in the AL...Lou Trivino has six saves and Jake Diekman has five and the A's are one of four teams in the majors with two pitchers with five or more saves (San Francisco, Seattle, Cleveland)...has allowed just six home runs over the A's last 39 games after surrendering seven over the first eight...the 13 home runs are the fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors...has two losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has allowed 23-of-57 (40.4%) inherited runners to score, which is the third highest percentage in the AL...has the highest batting average (.308), on-base percentage (.391) and slugging percentage (.544) against first batters faced in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: A's opponents have been successful in 17-of-23 (73.9%) stolen base attempts, which is the sixth lowest percentage in the American League...the A's have the third fewest double plays turned (33)...A's outfielders have three assists (all by Laureano), which is tied for second fewest.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have faced a lefty in back-to-back contests after facing a right-handed starting pitcher in each of their previous seven games...prior to that they faced left-handers in 13 of the previous 18 contests...are 13-6 (.684) in games in which the opponent starts a left-hander compared to 15-13 (.535) against right-handers...Ramón Laureano and Matt Olson share the A's team lead with 11 home runs apiece and Oakland is one of six teams with two players with 11 or more home runs...are 23-4 when out-homer the opposition, 3-13 when they are out-homered...the A's average time of game is 3:04, which is tied for third quickest in the majors...are 2-8 in replay challenges.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 12 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have six players on the IL (Fiers, Luzardo, Moreland, Puk, Rosenthal, Wendelken).

A's vs. ANGELS: The two clubs met for the first time in 2021 Friday night and the A's will square off against the Angels in 14 of their next 60 games...the A's won the season series last year 6-4 after going 13-6 against the Angels in 2019...have won three-straight season series for the first time since winning three straight from 2011-13...went 5-2 in Oakland last year and 1-2 in Anaheim...have won 15 of the last 20 games and 28 of the last 42...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 458-386 against the Angels...that includes 241-182 in Oakland and 217-204 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 507-463 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Sean Manaea needs just five strikeouts to reach 500 in his career...Ramón Laureano is tied for the lead among Major League center fielders in home runs (11) and ranks second in RBI (20)...ranks second among ML batters with eight home runs in May...Mark Canha leads the majors in hit by pitches (10) and is tied for second in the American League in runs (36)...A's pitchers are one strikeout shy of 50,000 in Oakland history...Chad Pinder has played in seven of eight games since being reinstated from the IL and is batting .292 (7-for-24) with a home run and three RBI over that span.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1901 Nap Lajoie receives the American League's first ever intentional walk with the bases loaded in a game against Chicago...in 1983 it takes 17 innings and 5 hours and 17 minutes, but the A's defeat the Milwaukee Brewers 5-4 on Rickey Henderson's two out single in the 17th...Oakland leads 3-0 entering the ninth before the Brewers score four times...Davey Lopes hits his second home run of the game in the bottom of the ninth to send the game into extra innings...in 2009 Jason Giambi homers off Arizona's Dan Haren in the fourth inning to become the 44th player in major league history to hit 400 home runs.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (3-2, 4.41 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season...has allowed 10 hits in each of his last two starts and is 0-1 with an 11.25 ERA (10 er in 8.0 ip) and .465 (20-for-43) opponents batting average over that span...is the first A's pitcher to yield 10 hits in back-to-back starts since Kendall Graveman in 2016 (April 25-May 2)...has allowed 56 hits for the season, which is tied for fourth most in the American League...allowed five runs on six hits in 4.2 innings for the loss in his first start this year and was 3-0 with a 2.23 ERA and .219 opponents batting average in six starts in between.

DON'T WALK: Has walked two batters or fewer in each of his last eight starts (6 bb in 44.1 ip, 1.22 per nine innings)...has three starts with no walks and four others with one...is averaging 1.65 walks per nine innings for the season, which is third lowest in the American League...ranks fifth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (5.33)...over the last four years, he has walked two batters or fewer in 46 of his 52 starts (17 with no walks, 21 with one)...has 56 walks in 293.0 innings over that span, an average of 1.72 per nine innings.

AGAINST LEFT-HANDERS: Allowed four hits to a left-handed hitter in his last start after surrendering just four hits to lefties over his first eight starts...now has a .157 (8-for-51) opponents batting average against left-handed hitters, which is fifth lowest in the American League...has a .327 (48-for-147) mark against right-handers.

APRIL AND MAY: Is 0-1 with a 6.64 ERA (15 er in 20.1 ip) in four starts in the month of May after going 3-1 with a 2.83 ERA in five starts in April...is now 5-9 with a 5.96 ERA (68 er in 102.2 ip) in 19 career starts in May compared to 8-4 with a 2.97 ERA in 16 starts in April...his May ERA is his highest for any month (5.22 in August).

INNING BY INNING: Has a 5.88 ERA (17 er in 26.0 ip) and .306 (34-for-111) opponents batting average over the first three innings of his starts, a 2.74 ERA (7 er in 23.0 ip) and .253 (22-for-87) average from the fourth inning on...last year, he had a 2.56 ERA and .233 opponents batting average over the first three innings of his starts compared to a 7.59 ERA and .319 opponents average from the fourth inning on.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-1 with a 3.75 ERA (15 er in 36.0 ip) and .255 (36-for-141) opponents batting average in six starts at home compared to 1-1 with a 6.23 ERA (9 er in 13.0 ip) and .387 (20-for-57) opponents batting average in three starts on the road...over the last two years, he is 5-2 with a 3.82 ERA (26 er in 61.1 ip) in 11 starts in Oakland, 2-3 with a 5.40 ERA (25 er in 41.2 ip) in nine starts on the road...is 23-14 in his career in the Coliseum compared to 19-19 on the road.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 1-0 with a 1.71 ERA (5 er in 26.1 ip) in four starts on four days rest compared to 2-1 with a 7.00 ERA (14 er in 18.0 ip) in four starts on five days rest...over the last three years, he is 5-1 with a 2.98 ERA (22 er in 66.1 ip) in 12 starts on four days rest, 3-2 with a 6.11 ERA (19 er in 28.0 ip) in six starts on five days rest

THIS AND THAT: Has received one run of support or fewer in four of his eight starts and is 0-2 in those starts...is 3-0 in five starts with two runs of support or more...has allowed one run in two of his four no decisions and had one run of support in each of those two starts...has allowed one run or fewer in four of his nine starts...the A's have won the game in each of his four no decisions and are 7-2 (.778) in his starting assignments...are 18-7 (.720) when he starts over the last three years.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Tossed a season-high 101 pitches in his first start on April 4 against Houston and allowed five runs on six hits in 4.2 innings for the loss...then went 3-0 with a 1.50 ERA over his next four starts...picked up his first win of the season in the 100th game of his career, an 8-4 victory over Detroit on April 15...tossed a six-hit, seven-inning shutout in the A's 7-0 win over Minnesota in the first game of the doubleheader April 20...it was the 11th complete game shutout of fewer than eight innings in Oakland history (last: Mike Minor, Sept. 14, 2020 at Seattle)...it was his second career complete game and shutout, with the other being his no-hitter on April 21, 2018 against Boston...the start was the 100th of his career and he became the 25th pitcher in Oakland history to make 100 starts...won his third consecutive start in the A's 2-1 victory at Tampa Bay on April 26...walked two batters in 5.0 innings, his only outing this year with more than one walk...struck out a career-high tying 10 batters in a season-high 7.1 innings on May 7 against Tampa Bay, but had a no decision in the A's 2-1 win...it was his fourth career 10-strikeout game, his first since Sept. 8, 2019 against Detroit...retired each of the first 18 batters he faced before walking Arozarena to start the seventh...then retired the next three before Brosseau led off the eighth inning with a double...allowed a season-high seven runs on a season-high 10 hits in a season-low 2.0 innings for the loss at Boston on May 13...has allowed seven or more runs in a start three times in his career, all at Fenway Park (8 on May 10, 2016; 7 on Sept. 12, 2017).

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-5 win over Houston last Tuesday in Oakland...allowed a season-high 10 hits for the second consecutive start but did not walk a batter...allowed a two-run double to Alvarez in the first but the A's scored once in the bottom of the first...yielded a lead-off home run to Tucker in the fourth but the A's scored single runs in the fourth and sixth innings to tie the game...was relieved by Smith to start the seventh with the score tied 3-3.

2020 RECAP: Went 4-3 with a 4.50 ERA in 11 starts...the ERA was the highest of his career as was his .270 opponents batting average...his .427 slugging percentage matched his high...went 4-1 with a 2.65 ERA and .234 opponents batting average over his final six starts dating back to Aug. 20...the wins tied for fourth most in the majors over that span...went 0-2 with a 7.65 ERA and .325 opponents average over his first five starts...tied for the team lead in starts...walked just eight batters in 54.0 innings, an average of 1.33 walks per nine innings...that was the lowest mark of his career and was sixth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 50 or more innings pitched...struck out 45 for a career-best 5.63 strikeout-to-walk ratio...had five starts without a walk, five with one and three in his other...had a 2.56 ERA and .233 opponents batting average over the first three innings of his starts compared to a 7.59 ERA and .319 opponents average from the fourth inning on...his .270 opponents batting average broke down to .250 (13-for-52) against left-handed hitters compared to .277 (44-for-159) against right-handers...issued seven of eight walks to righties...had a .204 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .327 with seven of his eight walks after that...had a .281 batting average against batters leading off an inning but issued just one walk (.293 on-base percentage)...yielded a .222 average with the bases empty, .373 with runners on...went 2-1 with a 3.32 ERA and .182 opponents batting average in four starts during the day, 2-2 with a 5.29 ERA and .321 opponent average in seven starts at night...was 3-1 with a 3.91 ERA and .232 opponents batting average in five starts in Oakland, 1-2 with a 5.02 ERA and .302 opponents average in five starts on the road...was 0-3 in four starts with two runs of support or fewer, 4-0 in seven starts with three or more...is now 5-31 in 52 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 37-2 in 53 starts with support of three or more.

RHP Frankie Montas (5-3, 4.79 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season...is tied for fourth in the American League with five wins...is 3-1 with a 3.22 ERA in four starts in May after going 2-2 with a 6.20 ERA in five starts in April...his three wins in May match his most ever in a month...is now 7-1 with a 2.88 ERA in 19 career appearances, including 10 starts, in May...the A's are 6-3 (.667) in his starting assignments...is 3-2 with a 6.21 ERA and .298 opponents batting average in six starts at home compared to 2-1 with a 2.50 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in three starts on the road...was the losing pitcher in his last start, an 8-1 A's loss to Houston last Wednesday in Oakland (5.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 6 so)...is 2-1 with a 2.76 ERA (29.1 ip, 24 h, 14 r, 9 er, 10 bb, 42 so, 3 hr) in seven career appearances, including four starts against Seattle...was 1-0 with a 0.69 ERA (13.0 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 1 er, 6 bb, 22 so, 0 hr) in two starts last year.
