OAKLAND ATHLETICS (28-20) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (21-26)

MONDAY, MAY 24, 2021 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:40 PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Won two of three at Los Angeles (AL) over the weekend and are now 9-6 over the last 15 games...are 14-13 since the 13-game winning streak but are 28-14 (.667) since starting the season 0-6...are 28-20 (.583) overall, which is the fourth best record in the American League...are eight games over .500, which is one short of the season high of nine (twice, last: 28-19 on May 23)...are in first place in the AL West for the third consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 33 of the last 34 days...have spent 31 days alone in first place this year, two days tied for first, one day in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 3-3 in this stretch of 16 games in 16 days, all against American League West competition...are 5-8 (.385) against the West and 23-12 (.657) in interdivision games...the 13 intradivision games are tied with the Mariners for the fewest in the majors...will face Seattle for the first time tonight...have already finished the season series with Baltimore, Tampa Bay and Minnesota...10 of the A's 13 games against the West have come against Houston...played the Angels for the first time over the weekend and will not face the Rangers until game 74 on June 21.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit at least two home runs in each of the last four games (12 home runs total) and have 21 home runs in the last nine games...have 68 for the season, which is second most in the majors to Atlanta (78)...are 23-5 when out-homering the opposition, 3-13 when they are out-homered.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a seven-game homestand against Seattle (three games) and Los Angeles-AL (four games) tonight...this homestand concludes a stretch where the A's will play 20 of 29 games at home...are 12-10 over that span, including 6-7 at home...went 1-2 on the last homestand against Houston and are now 14-13 (.519) at home...the 27 home games are the most in the American League and tied for third most in the majors...went 2-1 on the last road trip to Los Angeles (AL) and are now 14-7 (.667) on the road, which is the third best road record in the AL and the majors...have won six road series, lost none and split one...have a 4.82 ERA (129 er in 241.0 ip) at home, which is fourth highest in the AL, compared to 3.56 ERA (72 er in 182.0 ip) on the road, which is the lowest in the AL.

CLOSE CALLS (AND NOT SO CLOSE): The A's lost 6-5 yesterday to fall to 11-5 (.688) in one-run games...that is still the best record in the majors...the 16 one-run decisions are the most in the American League...also have the best record in games decided by two runs or fewer (14-6, .700) and three runs or fewer (18-6, .750)...however, are 10-14 (.417) in games decided by four runs or more...have outscored the opposition 100-78 in games decided by three runs or fewer (+22) but have been outscored 138-105 in games decided by four runs or more (-33)...have an overall run differential of -11 and have had a positive mark just once this year (+5 on April 24)...lead the majors with five walk-off wins and are 8-2 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with the Mariners and Angels for the most wins in the majors when trailing after seven innings (4)...are 2-0 in extra innings and are 8-1 in extra innings over the last two years.

OFFENSE: The A's collected 31 hits in the three-game series at Los Angeles (AL) to lift the team batting average five points to .227...are hitting .244 (169-for-693) in May after batting .214 in April...have the third lowest batting average in the American League but lead the league in home runs (68) and hit by pitches (27)...also rank third in extra base hits (149), fourth in walks (168), tied for fourth in triples (8) and fifth in fewest strikeouts (427)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (10) and plate appearances (42), are tied for the lead in home runs (2) and rank second in RBI (7)...A's designated hitters are batting .206 (33-for-160), which is third lowest in the AL...are tied for the second fewest RBI (19) and tied for the third fewest home runs (6)...the A's are batting .167 (5-for-27) with the bases loaded, which is the lowest batting average in the AL and tied for fourth lowest in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed a .255 opponents batting average, which is fourth highest in the American League...however, have walked just 133 batters, which is second fewest...rank seventh in opponents OPS (.723) and ninth in ERA (4.28)...are tied for second in most wild pitches (27), rank third in fewest pitches per inning (16.4) and tied for third in shutouts (4).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have a 3.63 ERA (21 er in 52.0 ip) over the last nine games but are 2-2 over that span...are 17-17 with a 4.28 ERA (125 er in 262.2 ip) overall...the wins are tied for third most in the American League but the losses are tied for fourth most...lead the AL and rank third in the majors in innings pitched (262.2)...have tossed eight innings or fewer in each of the last 224 games, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history...have not had a pitcher toss more than eight innings since Frankie

Montas on May 17, 2019 at Detroit (8.2)...rank second in the AL in fewest walks per nine innings (2.36)...have walked two batters or fewer in 36 of the last 37 games, including an Oakland record 26 consecutive games from April 13-May 11.

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen was charged with its third loss of the season yesterday, which is still the fewest in the majors...has no saves, four blown saves, an 8.63 ERA (23 er in 24.0 ip) and .344 (33-for-96) opponents batting average over the last eight games...converted 13-of-14 saves with a 2.32 ERA and .201 opponents average over the previous 29 contests...now has a 4.27 ERA for the season, which is fifth highest in the American League...is 12-for-17 (70.6%) in save opportunities, which is the fourth best percentage in the AL...Lou Trivino has six saves and Jake Diekman has five and the A's are one of four teams in the majors with two pitchers with five or more saves (San Francisco, Seattle, Cleveland)...has allowed just seven home runs over the A's last 38 games after surrendering seven over the first eight...the 14 home runs are the fewest in the AL and tied for third fewest in the majors...has allowed 25-of-60 (41.7%) inherited runners to score, which is the second highest percentage (.393) and slugging percentage (.555) against first batters faced in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's did not commit an error in the three-game series at Los Angeles (AL) and have made just one error over the last seven games... rank fourth in the American League in fielding percentage (.985) but have -23 defensive runs saved, which is second fewest (Angels, -28)...have turned the third fewest double plays (34)...opponents have been successful is 17-of-23 (73.9%) stolen base attempts, which is the fifth lowest percentage...A's outfielders have three assists (all by Laureano), which is tied for the fewest.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher for the third time in the last four games tonight...have won each of the last three games in which the opponent starts a lefty and are 13-6 (.684) against southpaws for the season, which is third best in the American League...are 15-14 (.517) when the opponent starts a right-hander...are batting .243 with a .767 OPS against left-handed pitchers compared to .219 with a .705 OPS against right-handers.

MELVIN, LA RUSSA AND MACK: Bob Melvin has compiled a 795-708 (.529) record as manager of the A's and needs three more wins to tie Tony La Russa's record most wins as manager of the Oakland A's (798)...has the third most wins by a manager in franchise history to Connie Mack, who won 3,582 games as manager of the Philadelphia A's from 1901-50.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 12 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have six players on the IL (Fiers, Luzardo, Moreland, Puk, Rosenthal, Wendelken).

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's won the season series last year, 6-4...went 2-2 in Oakland and 4-2 in Seattle...were 10-9 in 2019 and have won back-to-back season series against the Mariners for the first time since winning three straight from 2004-06...have won 16 of their last 25 games but are 62-81 (.434) against Seattle dating back to the start of the 2013 season...all-time, the A's are 366-305 against the Mariners...that includes 197-136 in Oakland, 168-166 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 92-102 at T-Mobile Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Seth Brown has homered in three consecutive games for the first time in his career...has eight home runs for the season, which is second most among Major League rookies (Garcia, TEX 14)...*Mark Canha* leads the majors in hit by pitches (10) and ranks third in the American League in runs (37)...*Ramón Laureano* is batting .303 (23-for-76) with eight home runs and 12 RBI in 20 games in May...the home runs match his most ever in a month (July, 2019) and are tied for second in the American League in May (Garcia, TEX 9)...*Matt Olson* leads the AL in go-ahead home runs (6) and is tied for the lead in home runs by a first baseman (12).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1976** Bert Campaneris sets an Oakland record when he steals five bases in the A's 12-7 win against Minnesota...the A's stole seven bases in the game and an American League record 341 for the season...in **1994** Brent Gates singles in his first four at bats against Seattle after going 4 for 4 the day before to establish an Oakland record with eight consecutive hits... in **1995** Dennis Eckersley pitches the ninth inning in the A's 5-3 win over Baltimore to become the sixth reliever in major league history to reach 300 saves.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (5-3, 4.79 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season...is tied for fourth in the American League with five wins...is 3-1 with a 3.22 ERA (8 er in 22.1 ip) in four starts in May after going 2-2 with a 6.20 ERA in five starts in April...his three wins in May match his most ever in a month...is now 7-1 with a 2.88 ERA (23 er in 71.2 ip) in 19 career appearances, including 10 starts, in May...the A's are 6-3 (.667) in his starting assignments.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-2 with a 6.21 ERA (20 er in 29.0 ip) and .298 (37-for-124) opponents batting average in six starts at home compared to 2-1 with a 2.50 ERA (5 er in 18.0 ip) and .225 (16-for-71) opponents batting average in three starts on the road...last year, he went 2-1 with a 2.56 ERA in six starts at home, 1-4 with a 10.13 ERA in five starts on the road.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 1-1 with a 2.45 ERA (3 er in 11.0 ip) in two starts against American League West teams...was 3-2 with a 3.61 ERA and .236 opponents batting average in eight starts against AL West competition last year, 0-3 with a 13.50 ERA and .391 opponents average in three starts against everyone else...is now 11-6 with a 3.61 ERA (58 er in 144.2 ip) in 35 career games against AL West foes, 12-11 with a 4.90 ERA (89 er in 163.1 ip) in 44 games against all other teams.

THIS AND THAT: Has a .208 (15-for-72) average against batters the first time through the order, .338 (26-for-77) the second time and .261 (12-for-46) with five of his nine home runs after that...six of the nine home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...six have been hit by right-handed hitters...has allowed nine of his 25 runs in the third inning (9 er in 8.2 ip, 9.35 ERA)...has tossed six innings or fewer in all nine of his starts...has walked two batters or fewer eight times.

2021 *HIGHLIGHTS:* Took the loss in his first start on April 5 against Los Angeles (NL)...allowed a season-high seven runs in a season-low 2.2 innings and walked a season-high three batters...tossed 90 pitches, which were the most by an A's pitcher in an outing of fewer than three innings since pitch counts were tracked beginning in 1988...the loss extended his losing streak to a career-high three games dating back to Sept. 13, 2020...then picked up the win in each of his next two starts and allowed just one run on eight hits in 12.0 innings...won 7-3 at Houston on April 10 and then combined with Romo, Diekman and Wendelken on a four-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 victory over Detroit on April 16...struck out a season-high seven against the Tigers... tossed 6.0 innings in each start, which is his season high (five times)...allowed six runs on a season-high nine hits in 4.0 innings against Minnesota on April 21 but had a no decision in the A's 13-12, 10-inning win...allowed three home runs in a start for the second time in his career (Sept. 22, 2020 vs. Los Angeles-NL)...had a season-high 105 pitches in a 4-3 loss at Tampa Bay on April 27...won each of his first three starts in May and posted a 3.12 ERA over that stretch from May 3-14.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-1 loss to Houston last Wednesday in Oakland...allowed a home run to Altuve to start the game and Correa added a RBI single later in the inning...then blanked the Astros on four hits and a walk over his final four innings...was relieved by Guerra to start the sixth with the A's trailing 2-1.

2020 RECAP: Was off to a strong start as he was 2-1 with a 1.57 ERA, .175 opponents batting average and no home runs over his first four starts...was scratched from his scheduled start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness and went 1-4 with an 8.70 ERA, .321 opponents average and 10 home runs over his final seven starts ... went 3-5 with a 5.60 ERA in 11 starts overall...his ERA was eighth highest in the majors among pitchers with at least 50 innings pitched...had career highs in losses (5) and earned runs (33) and matched his high in home runs (10), runs (35) and walks (23)...led the A's in strikeouts (60), losses, runs, home runs and walks...his opponents batting average broke down to .198 (22-for-111) against right-handed hitters compared to .350 (35-for-100) against left-handers...surrendered six of his 10 home runs and issued 15 of his 23 walks to lefties for a 1.061 OPS (.572 against right-handers)...had a .306 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .264 the second time and .205 after that...allowed a .133 average with two strikes...was 2-1 with a 2.56 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in six starts in Oakland, 1-4 with a 10.13 ERA and .330 opponents average in five starts on the road...surrendered just two home runs in 31.2 innings in Oakland compared to eight in 21.1 innings on the road... made eight of his 11 starts during the day, which tied for the most in the majors...was 2-4 with a 6.16 ERA during the day, 1-1 with a 4.20 ERA at night... the A's were 6-5 (.545) in his starting assignments...had two starts of seven innings and five starts of fewer than five innings...went 2-2 with a 2.83 ERA in six starts on four days rest, 1-3 with an 11.00 ERA in five starts on five days rest or more...received two runs of support or fewer in nine of his 11 starts...had 10 of his 28 runs of support in one start on Aug. 3 at Seattle and had a 4.75 RSA for the season...won both of his starts with support of three or more runs and is now 16-1 in 20 career starts with at least three runs of support.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Cole Irvin (3-5, 3.59 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season...has made three of those starts against Houston and is 0-3 with a 7.98 ERA and .317 in those games...is 3-2 with a 1.89 ERA and .218 opponents batting average in his other six starts...has five losses, which is tied for second most in the American League, but has a 3.59 ERA, which is 15th lowest... has walked two batters in each of his last two starts after issuing one free pass or fewer in each of his first seven starts...has issued just 10 free passes in 52.2 innings and his average of 1.71 walks per nine innings is fifth lowest in the AL...has a 2.50 ERA and .226 opponents average over the first four innings of a game and a 5.94 ERA and .292 opponents average from the fifth inning on...was the losing pitcher in his last start, an 8-4 A's loss to Houston last Thursday here in Oakland (5.0 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 1 so)...has never faced the Mariners in his career.
