## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (28-21) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (22-26)

TUESDAY, MAY 25, 2021 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:40 PDT

LHP COLE IRVIN (3-5, 3.59) VS. RHP LOGAN GILBERT (0-2, 9.45)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have lost two straight and four of the last six games...have lost more than two in a row just once this year and that was the season-opening six-game losing streak...are 14-14 since the 13-game winning streak but are 28-15 (.651) since starting the season 0-6...are 28-21 (.571) overall, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are in first place in the AL West for the fourth consecutive day and have a one game lead over second place Houston...have held at least a share of first for 34 of the last 35 days...have spent 32 days alone in first place, two days tied for first, one day in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

**TEAMMATES:** Cole Irvin is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season tonight and the A's will become the first team in the majors with four pitchers with 10 or more starts (Bassitt, Manaea, Montas)...Mark Canha hit his 10th home run of the season last night to become the third Athletic with 10 or more home runs (Olson, Laureano)...the A's are one of three teams with three players with 10 or more home runs (Reds, Red Sox)...Lou Trivino has six saves and Jake Diekman has five and the A's are one of four teams in the majors with two pitchers with five or more saves (San Francisco, Seattle, Cleveland)...Yusmeiro Petit has six wins and Frankie Montas has five and the A's are one of four teams with two five-game winners (Red Sox, Dodgers, White Sox).

**THE WHIFF:** The A's pitching staff has struck out 10 or more batters in each of the last four games, which matches the longest such streak in Athletics history (July 27-30, 2017 and April 15-18, 2021)...have 44 strikeouts in 35.0 innings over that span...have 411 strikeouts for the season and are on pace for 1,359, which would break the franchise record for strikeouts (1,299 in 2019)...however, rank ninth in the American League in strikeouts.

**THE LONG BALL:** The A's have homered in each of the last five games (13 home runs total) and have 22 home runs in the last 10 games...have 69 for the season, which is second most in the majors to Atlanta (78)...are 23-5 when out-homering the opposition, 3-14 when they are out-homered.

**OFFENSE:** The A's are hitting .241 (174-for-723) in May after batting .214 in April...have the third lowest batting average in the American League (.226) but lead the league in home runs (69) and hit by pitches (27)...also rank third in extra base hits (151), fourth in walks (172) and tied for fourth in triples (8)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (11) and plate appearances (44), are tied for the lead in home runs (2) and RBI (8) and tied for third in walks (4)...A's designated hitters are batting .207 (34-for-164), which is fourth lowest in the AL...are tied for the second fewest RBI (19) and tied for the third fewest home runs (6)...the A's are batting .185 (5-for-27) with the bases loaded, which is the lowest batting average in the AL and tied for fourth lowest in the majors.

**PITCHING:** The A's have allowed a .254 opponents batting average, which is fourth highest in the American League...however, have walked just 137 batters, which is second fewest...rank seventh in opponents OPS (.724) and ninth in ERA (4.27)...are second in most wild pitches (28), third in fewest pitches per inning (16.4) and tied for third in shutouts (4).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 17-18 with a 4.32 ERA (129 er in 268.2 ip)...the wins and losses are both tied for third most in the American League...have 268.2 innings pitched, which is second most in the majors to the Dodgers (269.2)...have tossed eight innings or fewer in each of the last 225 games, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history...have not had a pitcher toss more than eight innings since Frankie Montas on May 17, 2019 at Detroit (8.2).

**BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen has no saves, four blown saves, a 7.67 ERA (23 er in 27.0 ip) and .314 (33-for-105) opponents batting average over the last nine games...converted 13-of-14 saves with a 2.32 ERA and .201 opponents average over the previous 29 contests...is 12-for-17 (70.6%) in save opportunities, which is the third best percentage in the American League...has three losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has allowed just seven home runs over the A's last 40 games after surrendering seven over the first eight...the 14 home runs are the fewest in the AL and tied for third fewest in the majors...has allowed 25-of-60 (41.7%) inherited runners to score, which is the second highest percentage in the AL...has the highest batting average (.300), on-base percentage (.388) and slugging percentage (.546) against first batters faced in the AL.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have not committed an error in the last four games and have made just one over the last eight contests...rank third in the American League in fielding percentage (.986) but have -19 defensive runs saved, which is third fewest...have turned the third fewest double plays (34)...opponents have been successful is 17-of-23 (73.9%) stolen base at-

tempts, which is tied for the fourth lowest percentage...A's outfielders have three assists (all by Laureano), which is tied for the fewest.

**CLOSE CALLS (AND NOT SO CLOSE):** The A's lost 4-2 last night and are now 14-7 (.667) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is the third best record in the majors...have the best record in one-run games (11-5, .688) and the 16 one-run decisions are the most in the American League...also have the best record in games decided by three runs or fewer (18-6, .750) but are 10-14 (.417) in games decided by four runs or more...have outscored the opposition 102-82 in games decided by three runs or fewer (+20) but have been outscored 138-105 in games decided by four runs or more (-33)...have an overall run differential of -13 and had a positive mark just once this year (+5 on April 24)...lead the majors with five walk-off wins and are 8-2 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with the Mariners and Angels for the most wins in the majors when trailing after seven innings (4)...are 2-0 in extra innings and are 8-1 in extra innings over the last two years.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 0-1 on this seven-game homestand against Seattle (0-1) and Los Angeles-AL (four games)...this homestand concludes a stretch where the A's will play 20 of 29 games at home...are 12-11 over that span, including 6-8 at home...went 1-2 on the last homestand against Houston and are now 14-14 (.500) at home...the 28 home games are tied with the Rockies and Padres for the most in the majors...went 2-1 on the last road trip to Los Angeles (AL) and are now 14-7 (.667) on the road, which is the third best road record in the AL and the majors...have won six road series, lost none and split one...have a 4.79 ERA (133 er in 250.0 ip) at home, which is fourth highest in the AL, compared to 3.56 ERA (72 er in 182.0 ip) on the road, which is the lowest in the AL.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** The A's are 3-4 in this stretch of 16 games in 16 days, all against American League West competition...are 5-9 (.357) against the West and 23-12 (.657) in interdivision games...the 14 intradivision games are tied with the Mariners for the fewest in the majors...faced Seattle for the first time last night...have already finished the season series with Baltimore, Tampa Bay and Minnesota...10 of the A's 14 games against the West have come against Houston...played the Angels for the first time over the weekend and will not face the Rangers until game 74 on June 21.

**MELVIN, LA RUSSA AND MACK:** Bob Melvin has compiled a 795-709 (.529) record as manager of the A's and needs three more wins to tie Tony La Russa's record most wins as manager of the Oakland A's (798)...has the third most wins by a manager in franchise history to Connie Mack, who won 3,582 games as manager of the Philadelphia A's from 1901-50.

**THE INJURED LIST:** The A's have used the injured list 12 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have six players on the IL (Fiers, Luzardo, Moreland, Puk, Rosenthal, Wendelken).

**A's vs. MARINERS:** The A's lost the first meeting of 2021 last night after winning the season series last year, 6-4...went 2-2 in Oakland and 4-2 in Seattle...were 10-9 in 2019 and have won back-to-back season series against the Mariners for the first time since winning three straight from 2004-06...have won 16 of their last 26 games but are 62-82 (.431) against Seattle dating back to the start of the 2013 season...all-time, the A's are 366-306 against the Mariners...that includes 197-137 in Oakland, 168-166 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 92-102 at T-Mobile Park.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Seth Brown** has eight home runs, which is second most among Major League rookies (Garcia, TEX 14)...**Mark Canha** leads the majors in hit by pitches (10) and is tied for the American League lead in runs (38)...**Ramón Laureano** is batting .304 (24-for-79) with eight home runs and 12 RBI in 20 games in May...the home runs match his most ever in a month (July, 2019) and are tied for second in the AL in May (Garcia, TEX 9)...**Matt Olson** leads the AL in go-ahead home runs (6) and is tied for the lead in home runs by a first baseman (12).

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1931** the A's win their 17<sup>th</sup> consecutive game in a 16-4 win over the Yankees in the second game of a doubleheader at Philadelphia...the winning streak remained a franchise record until 2002 when the A's won a then-American League record 20 consecutive games...in **1975** Gene Tenace connects for the 6000th home run in the history of the Athletics franchise in the A's 6-3 win in the first game of a doubleheader at Cleveland...in **2015** Jesse Hahn tosses a four-hit shutout against Detroit to become the first Athletic with a Memorial Day shutout since 1947.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (3-5, 3.59 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his 10th start of the season...has made three of those starts against Houston and is 0-3 with a 7.98 ERA (13 er in 14.2 ip) and .317 (20-for-63) in those games...is 3-2 with a 1.89 ERA (8 er in 38.0 ip) and .218 (31-for-142) opponents batting average in his other six starts...has five losses, which is tied for second most in the American League, but has a 3.59 ERA, which is 15th lowest...has allowed one run or fewer in four of his nine starts.

**DON'T WALK:** Has walked two batters in each of his last two starts after issuing one free pass or fewer in each of his first seven starts...has issued just 10 free passes in 52.2 innings and his average of 1.71 walks per nine innings is tied for fifth lowest in the American League...has walked one batter or fewer in nine of his 12 career starts and has walked just 24 batters in 95.0 career innings (2.17 per nine innings).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .231 (36-for-156) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .306 (15-for-49) against left-handers...however, has allowed five of his six home runs and issued nine of his 10 walks to righties ...has a .227 (35-for-154) average against a batter the first two times through the order, .314 (16-for-51) after that.

**BY INNING:** Has a 2.50 ERA (10 er in 36.0 ip) and .226 (30-for-133) opponents average over the first four innings of a game and a 5.94 ERA (11 er in 16.2 ip) and .292 (21-for-72) opponents average from the fifth inning on.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 3-0 with a 1.04 ERA (3 er in 26.0 ip) in four starts on five days rest or more, 0-4 with a 5.64 ERA (14 er in 22.1 ip) in four starts on four days rest.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Is 3-1 in five starts with more than two runs of support, 0-4 in four starts with support of two runs or fewer...has a season RSA of 3.76 (22 rs in 52.2 ip).

**2021 HIGHLIGHTS:** Was on the A's Opening Day roster and lost each of his first two starts, allowing four runs in each contest for a 7.45 ERA...tossed 4.1 innings in his first start on April 3 against Houston, which was the shortest start of his career...also faced the Astros in his second start on April 8 but did not pitch again until April 17 against Detroit when he combined with Wendelken, Guerra and Weems on a five-hit shutout in a 7-0 win...it was his first win since May 17, 2019 against Colorado and it snapped a career-high four-game losing streak...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings against the Tigers and then blanked the Orioles over the first five innings on April 23 for a career-high 11.0 inning scoreless streak...allowed just one run in 5.1 innings at Baltimore but yielded a season-high eight hits...won back-to-back starts on the 17th and 23rd, marking the second time in his career he put together consecutive wins (May 12-17, 2019)...allowed just one run in 11. innings in the two starts...lost on April 28 at Tampa Bay but then picked up his third win on May 4 against Toronto...had career highs in innings pitched (8.0), strikeouts (9) and pitches (102) against the Blue Jays...is 0-2 with a 4.58 ERA (9 er in 17.2 ip) in three starts since then...left with a 4-1 lead on May 15 at Minnesota but the pen allowed four runs in the eighth inning for the blown save.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-4 loss to Houston last Thursday in Oakland...allowed a season-high five runs on a season-high tying eight hits in 5.0 innings of work...the A's scored a run in the first, but he allowed three runs in the third inning on a Maldonado RBI double and back-to-back RBI singles by Brantley and Bregman...Oakland got one of those runs back in the bottom of the third but Maldonado hit a two-run home run in the fourth.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
<b>RHP James Kaprielian (1-0, 2.53 ERA):</b> Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas May 12 and is scheduled to make his third start of the season and his career...it will be the fifth appearance of his career...had a no decision in his last start, an 8-4 A's win at Los Angeles (AL) last Friday (5.2 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 9 so)...has faced the Mariners once and it came in relief last year on Sept. 26 in Oakland (1.2 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so, 1 hr)...made one start with Triple-A Las Vegas and was the losing pitcher on Opening Day, May 6 against Sacramento (4.2 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...made his ML debut last year and had two relief appearances over five stints with Oakland...compiled a 7.36 ERA and .267 opponents batting average...his debut came after pitching in just 27 games over his first five professional seasons due to elbow problems... missed most of 2016 with an elbow injury and then missed the entire 2017 and 2018 seasons following April 18, 2017 "Tommy John" surgery.

left-handers...was 2-0 with a 4.50 ERA in four spring training appearances... was optioned to Lehigh Valley March 26 but was recalled on July 23 and was on the Phillies Opening Day roster...made his 2020 debut on July 26 against Miami and allowed four runs on five hits in an inning of relief and was the losing pitcher in an 11-6 decision...tossed a scoreless inning of relief Aug. 9 against Atlanta but was optioned to Philadelphia's alternate site on Aug. 9...was recalled for a second time Aug. 20, pitched the next day at Atlanta (1.2 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 3 so) and was optioned Aug. 22...did not pitch the remainder of the season.

- Signed a minor league deal with Oakland on April 29 and was assigned to Las Vegas.
- Is 3-1 with three saves and a 2.13 ERA (6 er in 25.1 ip) in 25 career games against Seattle...has walked eight while striking out 32 batters, and has allowed just one run to the Mariners since 2018 (18.0 ip, 0.50 ERA).
- Did not allow a run in four relief appearances and 5.0 innings with Las Vegas...his complete 2021 stats:

- Was charged with the blown save in back-to-back games at Minnesota but has had two scoreless appearances since...has allowed four runs over his last seven appearances (6.0 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 9 so, 2 hr, 6.00 ERA)... had a 1.93 ERA over his first 14 contests.
- Is tied for sixth among American League relievers in strikeouts (29)...is tied for fourth in first batter strikeouts (9).
- Has yielded a .170 (8-for-47) average against right-handed hitters compared to .276 (8-for-29) against left-handers...has issued five of his eight walks to righties.
- Has faced Seattle 37 times in his career, logging a 3.30 ERA (11 er, 30.0 ip) with 41 strikeouts and 22 walks...threw four scoreless innings against the Mariners last season.
- Has five saves, which surpasses his career high of four with Texas in 2016.
- Allowed home runs in back-to-back games May 15-16...had not allowed a home run in his previous 17 appearances this season...allowed just one home run in 21 appearances in 2020.

- Was reinstated from the injured list April 20 and has pitched seven times since his return (10.2 ip, 10 h, 3 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 5 so, 1.74 ERA).
- Left-handed hitters are 0-for-11 against him since his return and they are batting .133 (2-for-15) for the season...has a .459 (17-for-37) average against right-handers.
- Has tossed 2.0 innings in four of his last six appearances.
- Has faced Seattle five times in his career, going 1-0 with a 9.00 ERA (3 er, 3.0 ip).
- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and allowed eight runs on nine hits in 2.2 innings over three appearances before he was placed on the IL April 6 with a sprained left thumb sustained while covering first base.

**Last Year:** Was a non-roster invitee with the Los Angeles Dodgers and had a loss and a 3.00 ERA in six spring training appearances...was not added to the Dodgers 60-man player pool and did not pitch in 2020.

- Has a 3.92 ERA (9 er in 20.2 ip) on the season but nine of his 14 outings have been scoreless.
- Has held left-handed hitters to a .069 (2-for-29) batting average compared to .256 (11-for-43) against right-handers...has issued all eight of his walks and yielded both of his home runs to righties for a .784 OPS...has a .138 OPS against lefties.
- Opponents are 2-for-15 with runners in scoring position.
- Has pitched at least two innings in five of his 14 appearances, including 3.0 scoreless innings twice.
- Has faced the Mariners 11 times in his career, going 2-0 with a 1.93 ERA (3 er, 14.0 ip) including 10 strikeouts and two walks.
- Was selected from the A's alternate site April 8.

**Saves/Opportunities:** 1-2

**Inherited Runners/Scored:** 14/4    **First Hitters:** 6-20, 3 bb

- Allowed three runs last Saturday at Minnesota to snap his 16.1-inning scoreless streak...that fell 0.2 innings short of his career high of 17.0 from Aug. 20-Sept. 20, 2017...opponents were 10-for-57 (.175) with two walks during the streak and he stranded all six of his inherited runners.

- Leads the American League in games pitched (24) and is tied for first with six wins (Cole, NYY; Civale, CLE)...leads AL relievers in innings pitched (26.0).
- Has a .135 (5-for-37) opponents batting average against left-handed hitters, .276 (16-for-58) against right-handers.
- Has allowed a .261 (12-for-46) average with the bases empty, .184 (9-for-49) with runners on base.

**Last Year:** Compiled a career-low 1.66 ERA in a team-leading 26 relief appearances...opponents hit .232 and he walked just five batters for a .273 on-base percentage...yielded four runs, three of which scored on solo home runs.
