## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (28-22) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (23-26)

WEDNESDAY, MAY 26, 2021 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 12:37 PDT

RHP JAMES KAPRIELIAN (1-0, 2.53) VS. RHP ROBERT DUGGER (0-0, 4.15)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have lost the first two games of this series and have been swept just once this year, the season-opening four-game series with Houston...have now lost three straight games, which is the second longest losing streak this year to the season-opening six-game losing streak...have lost five of the last seven games and are now 14-15 since the 13-game winning streak...are 28-16 (.636) since starting the season 0-6...are in first place in the American League West for the fifth consecutive day and have a one game lead over second place Houston...have held at least a share of first for 35 of the last 36 days...have spent 33 days alone in first place, two days tied for first, one day in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

**CLOSE CALLS (AND NOT SO CLOSE):** The A's lost 4-3 last night to fall to 11-6 (.647) in one-run games...that is now the second best record in the majors to the Mariners (10-5, .667)...the 17 one-run decisions are the most in the American League and tied for third most in the majors...are 18-8 (.692) in games decided by three runs or fewer, which is the best record in the majors, but are 10-14 (.417) in games decided by four runs or more, which is tied for eighth worst...have outscored the opposition 105-86 in games decided by three runs or fewer (+19) but have been outscored 138-105 in games decided by four runs or more (-33)...have an overall run differential of -14 and had a positive mark just once this year (+5 on April 24)...lead the majors with five walk-off wins and are 8-2 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with the Mariners and Angels for the most wins in the majors when trailing after seven innings (4)...are 2-0 in extra innings and are 8-1 in extra innings over the last two years.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** The A's are 3-5 in this stretch of 16 games in 16 days, all against American League West competition...are 5-10 (.333) against the West and 23-12 (.657) in interdivision games...the intradivision record is the worst in the AL and third worst in the majors...the 15 intradivision games are tied with the Mariners and Nationals for the fewest in the majors...faced Seattle for the first time Monday night...have already finished the season series with Baltimore, Tampa Bay and Minnesota...10 of the A's 15 games against the West have come against Houston...played the Angels for the first time over the weekend and will not face the Rangers until game 74 on June 21.

**OFFENSE:** The A's are hitting .240 (182-for-758) in May after batting .214 in April...have the third lowest batting average in the American League (.226) but lead the league in hit by pitches (28), rank second in home runs (69), fourth in extra base hits (155) and walks (174) and tied for fourth in triples (8)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (11) and plate appearances (44), are tied for the lead in home runs (2) and RBI (8) and tied for third in walks (4)...A's designated hitters are batting .208 (35-for-168), which is third lowest in the AL...have the third fewest RBI (20) and are tied for the third fewest home runs (6)...the A's are batting .185 (5-for-27) with the bases loaded, which is the lowest batting average in the AL and tied for fourth lowest in the majors...the A's are 23-5 when out-homer the opposition, 3-14 when they are out-homered.

**PITCHING:** The A's have allowed a .255 opponents batting average, which is third highest in the American League...however, have walked just 139 batters, which is tied for second fewest...rank seventh in opponents OPS (.723) and eighth in ERA (4.27)...are second in most wild pitches (29), third in fewest pitches per inning (16.3) and tied for third in shutouts (4).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 1-4 with a 4.45 ERA (28 er in 56.2 ip) over the last 10 games...went 0-7 with a 7.05 ERA over the first nine games and were 16-8 with a 3.66 ERA in 31 games in between (April 10-May 14)...are 17-19 with a 4.38 ERA (133 er in 273.1 ip) overall...the losses are third most in the American League but the wins are tied for third most...have 273.1 innings pitched, which is second most in the majors to the Dodgers (277.1)...have tossed eight innings or fewer in each of the last 226 games, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history...have not had a pitcher toss more than eight innings since Frankie Montas on May 17, 2019 at Detroit (8.2).

**BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen has no saves, four blown saves, a 6.61 ERA (23 er in 31.1 ip) and .286 (34-for-119) opponents batting average over the last 10 games...converted 13-of-14 saves with a 2.32 ERA and .201 opponents average over the previous 29 contests...is 12-for-17 (70.6%) in save opportunities, which is the third best percentage in the American League...has three losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has allowed just seven home runs over the A's last 41 games after surrendering seven over the first eight...the 14 home runs are the fewest in the AL and tied for third fewest in the majors...has allowed 25-of-62 (40.3%) inherited runners to score, which is the third

highest percentage in the AL...has the highest batting average (.293), on-base percentage (.385) and slugging percentage (.534) against first batters faced in the AL.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's had their four-game errorless streak snapped last night and have made just two errors over the last nine games...rank fourth in the American League in fielding percentage (.986) but have -21 defensive runs saved, which is second fewest (Angels, -24)...are tied for the third fewest double plays (35)...opponents have been successful is 17-of-23 (73.9%) stolen base attempts, which is tied for the fourth lowest percentage...A's outfielders have three assists (all by Laureano), which is tied for the fewest.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 0-2 on this seven-game homestand against Seattle (0-2) and Los Angeles-AL (four games) and now have a four-game losing streak at home...went 1-2 on the last homestand against Houston and are now 14-15 (.483) at home...the 29 home games are the most in the majors...this homestand concludes a stretch where the A's will play 20 of 29 games at home...are 12-12 over that span, including 6-9 at home...went 2-1 on the last road trip to Los Angeles (AL) and are now 14-7 (.667) on the road, which is the third best road record in the American League and the majors...have won six road series, lost none and split one...have a 4.76 ERA (137 er in 259.0 ip) at home, which is fourth highest in the AL, compared to 3.56 ERA (72 er in 182.0 ip) on the road, which is second lowest.

**TEAMMATES:** Cole Irvin made his 10th start of the season last night and the A's are the only team in the majors with four pitchers with 10 or more starts (Bassitt, Manaea, Montas)...Matt Olson (12), Ramón Laureano (11) and Mark Canha (10) have hit at least 10 home runs and the A's are one of three teams with three players with 10 or more home runs (Reds, Red Sox)...Lou Trivino has six saves and Jake Diekman has five and the A's are one of four teams with two pitchers with five or more saves (San Francisco, Seattle, Cleveland)...Yusmeiro Petit has six wins and Frankie Montas has five and the A's are one of five teams with two five-game winners (Red Sox, Dodgers, White Sox, Giants).

**MELVIN, LA RUSSA AND MACK:** Bob Melvin has compiled a 795-710 (.528) record as manager of the A's and needs three more wins to tie Tony La Russa's record most wins as manager of the Oakland A's (798)...has the third most wins by a manager in franchise history to Connie Mack, who won 3,582 games as manager of the Philadelphia A's from 1901-50.

**THE INJURED LIST:** The A's have used the injured list 12 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have six players on the IL (Fiers, Luzardo, Moreland, Puk, Rosenthal, Wendelken).

**A's vs. MARINERS:** The A's have lost the first two meetings of 2021...have not been swept by the Mariners in a series of three or more games since Sept 1-3, 2017 at Seattle...have not been swept in a series of three or more games in Oakland since Sept. 9-11, 2016...won the season series last year, 6-4...went 2-2 in Oakland and 4-2 in Seattle...were 10-9 in 2019 and have won back-to-back season series against the Mariners for the first time since winning three straight from 2004-06...are 16-15 against Seattle over the last three years but are 62-83 dating back to the start of the 2013 season...all-time, the A's are 366-307 against the Mariners...that includes 197-138 in Oakland, 168-166 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 92-102 at T-Mobile Park.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Seth Brown** has eight home runs, which is second most among Major League rookies (Garcia, TEX 15)...**Mark Canha** leads the majors in hit by pitches (10) and is tied for second in the American League in runs (38)...**Ramón Laureano** is batting .301 (25-for-83) with eight home runs and 12 RBI in 22 games in May...the home runs match his most ever in a month (July, 2019) and rank third in the American League in May...**Matt Olson** is tied for the AL lead in go-ahead home runs (6) and ranks second in home runs by a first baseman (12).

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: James Kaprielian (1-0, 2.53 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas May 12 and is scheduled to make his third start of the season and his career...it will be the fifth appearance of his career as he had two relief appearances last year.

**FIRST START:** He earned his first Major League win in his first career start in the A's 4-1 victory at Boston on May 12...allowed a Gonzalez double, a Verdugo walk and a Martinez RBI single to the first three batters he faced...that would be the only run he would allow in five innings of work as he blanked the Red Sox on two hits and a walk over his final four innings.

**LAST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 8-4 win at Los Angeles (AL) on Friday...Oakland scored once in the third and he allowed a solo home run to Iglesias in the bottom of the third...the A's then scored twice in the top of the sixth and he struck out the first two batters in the bottom of the sixth before allowing a solo home run to Walsh...was relieved by Petit following the home run with the A's leading 3-2 and Petit allowed a run for the blown save.

**KAPRIELIAN vs. SEATTLE:** Has faced the Mariners once in his career and it came in relief on Sept. 26 of last year in Oakland (1.2 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so, 1 hr)...relieved Blackburn with one out in the third inning and the bases loaded...allowed all three runs to score on a White RBI single, a Bishop walk and a Strange-Gordon two-run single...also surrendered a leadoff home run to Seager in the fourth.

**WITH LAS VEGAS:** He made one start with Triple-A Las Vegas and went 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA...was the Opening Day starter May 6 at Las Vegas and was the losing pitcher in an 8-1 loss to Sacramento...allowed a RBI single to Thairo Estrada in the third...was relieved by Matt Blackham in the fifth inning with a runner on third and two outs and the Aviators trailing 1-0...Blackham allowed that runner to score plus one of his own.

**SPRING TRAINING:** Was 0-0 with a 0.00 ERA (3.0 ip, 3 h, 0 bb, 3 so) in two games, one start, this spring...opponents went 3-for-11 (.273) with no walks and a hit by pitch...pitched in relief on Feb. 28 against the Dodgers (1.0 ip, 2 h) and then started against the Angels on March 5 (2.0 ip, 1 h, 3 so)...was optioned to Las Vegas March 15.

**2020 RECAP:** Made his Major League debut and had two relief appearances over five stints with Oakland...compiled a 7.36 ERA and .267 opponents batting average...allowed two home runs in 3.2 innings, walked two and struck out four...was recalled for the first time Aug. 4 but did not pitch before he was optioned back to the A's alternate site on Aug. 6...joined the club a second time Aug. 16 and made his ML debut that day at San Francisco (2.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...relieved Fiers to start the seventh inning with the A's leading 13-2 and allowed a home run to the first batter he faced (Crawford)...walked the next batter (Dubon) before retiring each of the final six batters he faced...struck out Solano to end the seventh inning for his first strikeout...was optioned on Aug. 19...was recalled as the 29th man for doubleheaders on Sept. 8 and Sept. 14 but did not pitch...recalled for his fifth stint on Sept. 24 and made one appearance in the second game of the Sept. 26 doubleheader against Seattle (1.2 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...inherited a bases loaded situation in the third inning with the A's trailing 4-1 and allowed all three runs to score...was on the Taxi Squad for the postseason...was rated as the A's number 10 prospect by *Baseball America* following the season..

**CAREER NOTES:** Made his Major League debut with Oakland in 2020 after pitching in just 27 games over his first five professional seasons due to elbow problems...compiled a 7.36 ERA and .267 opponents batting average in two relief appearances with the A's...is 6-6 with a 3.00 ERA (34 er in 102.0 ip) in 28 games, including 23 starts, as a minor leaguer...has 116 strikeouts in 102.0 innings (10.24 per nine innings)...was the New York Yankees first round draft pick in 2015 but pitched in just eight games over his first four years as a professional...missed most of 2016 with an elbow injury and then missed the entire 2017 and 2018 seasons following April 18, 2017 "Tommy John" surgery...was traded to the A's at the 2017 trading deadline in the Sonny

Gray deal and is the last remaining player from that deal that also netted the A's Dustin Fowler and Jorge Mateo...pitched for Scottsdale in the Arizona Fall League in 2016...was rated by *Baseball America* as the Yankees No. 4 prospect following the 2015 season and No. 5 following 2016...was the A's No. 8 prospect after the 2017 season and No. 10 following 2020.

### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**RHP Chris Bassitt (4-2, 3.69 ERA):** Is 4-0 with a 3.26 ERA and .213 opponents batting average over his last eight starts after going 0-2 with a 5.56 ERA and .289 opponents average over his first two starts...the four-game winning streak is one short of his career high of five from Aug. 11, 2019 to Aug. 12, 2020...ranks fifth in the American League in strikeouts (65) and seventh in innings pitched (61.0) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.33)...has allowed five home runs and his average of 0.74 home runs per nine innings is seventh lowest in the AL...has a 2.62 ERA in his career in the Coliseum, which is fifth lowest in Coliseum history among pitchers with 200 or more innings pitched...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 6-2 A's win at Los Angeles (AL) last Saturday (7.2 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 8 so)...is 4-3 with a 4.67 ERA (44.1 ip, 47 h, 29 r, 23 er, 9 bb, 45 so, 5 hr) in 10 career appearances, including eight starts, against the Angels.

- Was charged with the blown save in back-to-back games at Minnesota but has had two scoreless appearances since...has allowed four runs over his last seven appearances (6.0 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 9 so, 2 hr, 6.00 ERA)... had a 1.93 ERA over his first 14 contests.
- Is tied for seventh among American League relievers in strikeouts (29)...is tied for fourth in first batter strikeouts (9).
- Has yielded a .170 (8-for-47) average against right-handed hitters compared to .276 (8-for-29) against left-handers...has issued five of his eight walks to righties.
- Has faced Seattle 37 times in his career, logging a 3.30 ERA (11 er, 30.0 ip) with 41 strikeouts and 22 walks...threw four scoreless innings against the Mariners last season.
- Has five saves, which surpasses his career high of four with Texas in 2016.

- Allowed three runs last Saturday at Minnesota to snap his 16.1-inning scoreless streak...that fell 0.2 innings short of his career high of 17.0 from Aug. 20-Sept. 20, 2017...opponents were 10-for-57 (.175) with two walks during the streak and he stranded all six of his inherited runners.

- Leads the American League in games pitched (24) and is tied for second with six wins (Civale, CLE, 7)...leads AL relievers in innings pitched (26.0).
