OAKLAND ATHLETICS (29-22) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (22-27)

THURSDAY, MAY 27, 2021 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:40 PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their three-game losing streak yesterday, which was just the second losing streak longer than two games this year (6, April 1-6)...are 3-3 over the last six games and 15-15 since the 13-game winning streak...are 29-16 (.644) since starting the season 0-6...are 29-22 (.569) overall, which is the fifth best record in the American League...are in first place in the American League West for the sixth consecutive day and have a one game lead over second place Houston...have held at least a share of first for 36 of the last 37 days...have spent 34 days alone in first place, two days tied for first, one day in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

CLOSE CALLS (AND NOT SO CLOSE): The A's won 6-3 yesterday and are now 19-8 (.704) in games decided by three runs or fewer, which is the best record in the majors...are 10-14 (.417) in games decided by four runs or more...have outscored the opposition 111-89 in games decided by three runs or fewer (+22) but have been outscored 138-105 in games decided by four runs or more (-33)...have an overall run differential of -11 and had a positive mark just once this year (+5 on April 24)...are 11-6 (.647) in one-run games, which is the second best mark in the majors to the Mariners (10-5, .667)...the 17 one-run decisions are the most in the American League and tied for third most in the majors...lead the majors with five walk-off wins and are 8-2 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with the Mariners and Angels for the most wins in the majors when trailing after seven innings (4)...are 2-0 in extra innings and are 8-1 in extra innings over the last two years.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 4-5 in this stretch of 16 games in 16 days, all against American League West competition...are 6-10 (.375) against the West and 23-12 (.657) in interdivision games...the intradivision record is third worst in the AL and the 16 intradivision games are tied with the Mariners for second fewest in the majors (Nationals, 15)...have a 5.51 ERA (87 er in 142.0 ip) against the AL West and a 3.65 ERA (125 er in 308.0 ip) against all other teams.

A's IN MAY: The A's are 13-11 (.542) in the month of May after going 16-11 (.593) in April...are batting .242 (190-for-785) with a .774 OPS in May after hitting .214 with a .679 OPS in April...are fourth in the American League in OPS in May after ranking 10th in April...are tied for the AL lead in home runs (37) and extra base hits (86) in May, tied for second in doubles (46), rank third in slugging (.450) and tied for third in walks (88)...are tied for the fewest stolen bases (3) and ranking second in April (19)...have a 4.39 ERA (104 er in 213.0 ip) in May after posting a 4.10 ERA in April...the bullpen is 5-3 with seven saves, five blown saves and a 4.71 ERA (41 er in 78.1 ip) in May after going 6-0 with six saves, no blown saves and a 3.74 ERA in April.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .251 (100-for-399) with 58 runs scored (4.8 per game) and 23 home runs over the last 12 games...lead the American League in hit by pitches (29), rank second in home runs (70), fourth in walks (180) and extra base hits (157) and tied for fourth in triples (8)...have the third lowest batting average (.227)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (11) and plate appearances (44), are tied for the lead in home runs (2) and RBI (8) and tied for fourth in walks (4)...A's designated hitters are batting .206 (35-for-170), which is fourth lowest in the AL...are tied for the second fewest RBI (20) and tied for the third fewest home runs (6)...the A's are batting .179 (5-for-29) with the bases loaded, which is the lowest batting average in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors...the A's are 24-5 when out-homering the opposition, 3-14 when they are out-homered.

PITCHING: The A's have a 5.01 ERA (54 er in 97.0 ip) and .277 (106-for-382) opponents batting average over the last 11 games...have a .254 opponents batting average for the season, which is fourth highest in the American League...however, have walked just 142 batters, which is third fewest...rank eighth in opponents OPS (.719) and ERA (4.24)...are second in most wild pitches (29), third in fewest pitches per inning (16.4) and tied for third in shutouts (4).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 18-19 with a 4.27 ERA (133 er in 280.1 ip)...the wins are third most in the American League but the losses are tied for third most...have 280.1 innings pitched, which is second most in the majors to the Dodgers (283.1)...have tossed eight innings or fewer in each of the last 227 games, which is the longest such streak in Athletics history... have not had a pitcher toss more than eight innings since Frankie Montas on May 17, 2019 at Detroit (8.2).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has one save, four blown saves, a 7.02 ERA (26 er in 33.1 ip) and .300 (39-for-130) opponents batting average over the last 11 games...converted 13-of-14 saves with a 2.32 ERA and .201 opponents average over the previous 29 contests...is 13-for-18 (72.2%) in save opportunities, which is the third best percentage in the American League...has three losses,

which is the fewest in the majors...has allowed just seven home runs over the A's last 42 games after surrendering seven over the first eight...the 14 home runs are the fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors...has allowed 25-of-63 (39.7%) inherited runners to score, which is the fourth highest percentage in the AL...has the highest batting average (.296), on-base percentage (.386) and slugging percentage (.533) against first batters faced in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have made just one error in the last six games and two in the last 10 and now have a .986 fielding percentage, which is fourth best in the American League...however, have -19 defensive runs saved, which is second fewest (Angels, -24)...are tied for the third fewest double plays (35)...A's outfielders have three assists (all by Laureano), which is tied for the fewest.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's snapped their four-game home losing streak and are now 1-2 on this seven-game homestand against Seattle (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (four games)...went 1-2 on the last homestand against Houston and are 15-15 (.500) at home...the 30 home games are the most in the majors...this homestand concludes a stretch where the A's will play 20 of 29 games at home...are 13-12 over that span, including 7-9 at home...leave following the game Sunday for a six-game road trip to Seattle (three games) and Colorado (three games)...went 2-1 on the last road trip to Los Angeles (AL) and are 14-7 (.667) on the road, which is the third best road record in the American League and the majors...have won six road series, lost none and split one...have a 4.70 ERA (140 er in 268.0 ip) at home, which is fourth highest in the AL, compared to 3.56 ERA (72 er in 182.0 ip) on the road, which is second lowest.

TEAMMATES: The A's are one of three teams in the majors (Rangers, Rockies) with four pitchers with 10 or more starts (Bassitt, Irivn, Manaea, Montas)... Matt Olson (13), Ramón Laureano (11) and Mark Canha (10) have hit at least 10 home runs and the A's are one of six teams with three players with 10 or more home runs (Angels, Braves, Blue Jays, Reds, Red Sox)...Lou Trivino has six saves and Jake Diekman has five and the A's are one of four teams with two pitchers with five or more saves (San Francisco, Seattle, Cleveland)...Yusmeiro Petit has six wins and Frankie Montas has five and the A's are one of seven teams with two five-game winners (Cubs, Indians, Red Sox, Dodgers, White Sox, Giants).

MELVIN, LA RUSSA AND MACK: Bob Melvin has compiled a 796-710 (.529) record as manager of the A's and needs two more wins to tie Tony La Russa's record most wins as manager of the Oakland A's (798)...has the third most wins by a manager in franchise history to Connie Mack, who won 3,582 games as manager of the Philadelphia A's from 1901-50.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 12 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have five players on the IL (Fiers, Luzardo, Puk, Rosenthal, Wendelken).

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's lead the season series 2-1 after taking two of three at Anaheim last weekend...won the season series last year 6-4 after going 13-6 against the Angels in 2019...have won back-to-back season series for the first time since winning three straight from 2011-13...went 5-2 in Oakland last year and 1-2 in Anaheim...have won 16 of the last 21 games and 28 of the last 43...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 458-387 against the Angels...that includes 240-182 in Oakland and 218-205 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 507-464 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Seth Brown has eight home runs, which is second most among Major League rookies (Garcia, TEX 15)...Mark Canha leads the majors in runs scored (40) and hit by pitches (10)...Ramón Laureano is batting .306 (26-for-85) with eight home runs and 13 RBI in 23 games in May...the home runs match his most ever in a month (July, 2019) and rank third in the American League in May...Matt Olson is tied for fifth in the AL in home runs (13), ranks ninth in slugging (.564) and OPS (.912) and tied for ninth in extra base hits (23).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In 1956 Art Ditmar scatters 10 hits and shuts out the Tigers 5-0 in the second game of a doubleheader...in 1984 Rickey Henderson is 3 for 3 with three stolen bases in the A's 7-1 win over New York...in 1985 Dwayne Murphy leads off the bottom of the 10th inning with a home run to lift the A's to a 2-1 win over the New York Yankees.

FOUR-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 4-0 with a 3.26 ERA (18 er in 49.2 ip) and .213 (39-for-183) opponents batting average over his last eight starts after going 0-2 with a 5.56 ERA and .289 opponents average over his first two starts...the four-game winning streak is one short of his career high of five from Aug. 11, 2019 to Aug. 12, 2020...has left with the lead in two of his four no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks sixth in the American League in strikeouts (65), seventh in innings pitched (61.0) and eighth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.33)...has allowed five home runs and his average of 0.74 home runs per nine innings is ninth lowest in the AL...is tied for the Major League lead in hit by pitches (7)...is averaging 15.0 pitches per inning, which is third lowest in the AL...is scheduled to make his 11th start today, which will tie him for the AL lead.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed five home runs, all to left-handed hitters...has surrendered 23 of his 32 home runs over the last three years to lefties...has not allowed a home run to a right-handed hitter since Aug. 12, 2020 (Rendon, LAA)...has a .269 (21-for-78) opponents batting average the first time through the order, .175 (14-for-80) the second time and .243 (17-for-70) after that...has a .120 (3-for-25) batting average against the opponents number one hitter in the order but has issued six of his 15 walks to that batter (.313 on-base percentage)

HOME AND AWAY: Is 0-2 with a 4.07 ERA (11 er in 24.1 ip) in four starts at home compared to 4-0 with a 3.44 ERA (14 er in 36.2 ip) in six starts on the road... now has a 9-12 career record in the Coliseum, but has a 2.62 ERA (62 er in 212.2 ip), which is fifth lowest in Coliseum history among pitchers with 200 or more innings pitched.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 0-1 with a 5.29 ERA (10 er in 17.0 ip) in three

starts on four days rest compared to 4-0 with a 2.79 ERA (12 er in 38.2 ip) in six starts on five days rest...now has a nine-game winning streak when starting on five days rest dating back to July 19, 2019...has a 2.79 ERA (26 er in 84.0 ip) in 14 starts over that span...according to TruMedia, the longest winning streak in starts on five days rest in Oakland history is 10 by Mike Fiers (May 7-Aug. 27, 2019) and Mark Mulder (June 18, 2002-July 10, 2003).

THIS AND THAT: Has a career record of 23-23 and with a win today, would be over .500 for the first time in his career...the A's are 7-3 (.700) in his starting assignments this year and are 30-16 (.652) when he starts over the last three years...has walked one batter or fewer in six of his 10 starts this year... has yielded five hits or fewer six times...has received two runs of support or fewer in four of his 10 starts and is 0-2 in those starts...is 19-1 in 31 career starts with three runs of support or more, 4-22 in 45 starts with two runs of support or fewer...does not have a complete game in 76 career starts...71 of those starts have come with Oakland, which is the second longest streak of consecutive starts with no complete games in Oakland history (113, Barry Zito, Aug. 22, 2003-Sept. 28, 2006).

POST-TOMMY JOHN: Did not pitch in the majors in 2017 following May 6, 2016 "Tommy John" surgery...is 21-12 with a 3.36 ERA (118 er in 315.2 ip) and is averaging 8.61 strikeouts per nine innings (302 so in 315.2 ip) in 59 games (52 starts) since the surgery...was 2-11 with a 4.13 ERA and 6.77 strikeouts per nine innings in 29 games (23 starts) before the surgery.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Was the A's Opening Day starting pitcher and took the loss in an 8-1 decision to Houston on April 1 in Oakland...became the A's 14th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 16 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill, Graveman twice, Fiers, Montas)...allowed a run in the fourth inning to snap a 16.2-inning scoreless streak during the regular season and a 27.1-inning home scoreless streak, which was ninth longest in Oakland history...lost his second start on April 6, a 5-1 loss to Los Angeles (NL) on April 6 in Oakland when he allowed a season-high four runs on a season-high nine hits in 6.0 innings...allowed two home runs in the third, which were his first home runs in the Coliseum since Aug. 24, 2019...that snapped a 10-game, 55.1-inning, 229-batter homerless streak in Oakland...that ran his record to 0-2 with a 5.56 ERA...then allowed exactly two runs in each of his next six starts to become the second pitcher in Athletic history to allow exactly two runs in six consecutive games...joins Bob Davis of the Kansas City A's, who did it all in relief from Aug. 8-26, 1960...went 3-0 with a 2.92 ERA over that stretch which ran from April 12 to May 11...allowed just two hits in 5.0 innings for the win on April 12 at Arizona, which matched his fewest hits ever in a start...the innings pitched are a season low and he walked a season-high five batters... tied an Oakland record with three hit batters April 29 at Tampa Bay (12th time, last: Fiers, June 22, 2019, also against Tampa Bay)...left his start on May 5 against Toronto with a 3-2 lead but ended up win a no decision in the A's

9-4 loss...Trivino allowed five runs in the eighth inning for the blown save...it was the first of two times he left with a lead only to have the bullpen blow the save (also May 16 at Minnesota)...struck out a season-high 10 batters in a 3-2 win at Boston on May 11...it was his third career game of 10 or more strikeouts...did not walk a batter, the second time he has fanned 10 or more without issuing a free pass...is one of nine pitchers in Oakland history with two such games...allowed a season-high tying four runs in a no decision at Minnesota on May 16.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-2 win at Los Angeles (AL) last Saturday...tossed a season-high 7.2 innings...shutout the Angels on two hits and a walk over the first seven innings and had a 6-0 lead entering the bottom of the eighth...allowed two runs on three hits in the eighth inning, including a RBI triple by Ohtani, and was relieved by Petit with two outs in the eighth.

2020 RECAP: Spent the entire season on the active roster for the first time in his six-year career and went 5-2 with a 2.29 ERA in 11 starts...his ERA ranked second among pitchers in the West divisions (Lamet, SD 2.09) and sixth in the majors...it was fifth lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 10 starts...also tied for fifth in the West divisions in winning percentage (.714), ranked seventh in opponents OPS (.659), batting average (.233) and slugging percentage (.371), tied for seventh in wins and eighth in on-base percentage (.288)...had career lows in ERA and opponents on-base percentage...walked 17 batters in 63.0 innings for a career-low 2.43 walks per nine innings...struck out 55 for a career-best 3.24 strikeout-to-walk ratio...led the A's in innings pitched and tied for the lead in games started...received five votes (two third, one fourth, two fifth) in American League Cy Young balloting...went 1-0 with a 1.08 ERA over his first three starts, 1-2 with a 5.95 ERA over his next four starts and 3-0 with a 0.34 ERA over his final four starts... allowed a .233 opponents batting average, which broke down to .223 (31for-139) with a .590 OPS against right-handed hitters compared to .248 (25-for-101) with a .755 OPS against left-handers...yielded four of his six home runs to lefties...walked just one batter to lead off an inning and held opponents to a .203 (13-for-64) batting average and .227 on-base percentage in that situation...the on-base percentage was sixth lowest in the majors...five of his six home runs came with the bases empty.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Sean Manaea (3-2, 4.17 ERA): Is 0-1 with a 5.68 ERA and .308 opponents batting average in five starts in May after going 3-1 with a 2.83 ERA and .248 opponents batting average in five starts in April...is averaging 1.83 walks per nine innings, which is sixth lowest in the American League...held left-handed hitters to a .151 batting average, which is seventh lowest in the AL...has allowed 60 hits, which is tied for third most in the AL...is scheduled to start on four days rest tomorrow...is 1-0 with a 1.72 ERA in five starts on four days rest compared to 2-1 with a 7.00 ERA in four starts on five days rest...had a no decision in his last start, a 6-5 A's loss at Los Angeles (AL) last Sunday (5.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 6 so)...it was the fifth time this year he allowed one run or fewer but it was his fifth no decision and his third no decision when allowing just one run...is 2-4 with a 4.82 ERA (56.0 ip, 54 h, 32 r, 30 er, 17 bb, 40 so, 9 hr) in 11 career starts against the Angels.
