OAKLAND ATHLETICS (30-22) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (22-28)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight after losing three in a row...are 30-22 (.577), which is the fifth best record in the American League...are eight games over .500 which is one short of the season high of nine (twice, last: 28-19 on May 22)...are 14-13 since the 13-game winning streak but are 30-16 (.652) since starting the season 0-6...are in first place in the AL West for the seventh consecutive day and have a 1½ game lead over second place Houston...that is one short of the season high of 2½ (last on May 12)...have held at least a share of first for 37 of the last 38 days...have spent 35 days alone in first place, two days tied for first, one day in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

GO THE DISTANCE: Chris Bassitt tossed a nine-inning shutout last night...it ended Athletics record streaks of 227 consecutive games of eight innings or fewer and 236 consecutive games of fewer than nine innings from their starting pitchers...had not had a pitcher toss more than eight innings since Frankie Montas on May 17, 2019 at Detroit (8.2) and had not had a nine-inning complete game since the no-hitter by Mike Fiers on May 7, 2019 against Cincinnati...the A's now have two complete games, which is tied for second most in the American League...A's starters have a Major League leading 289.1 innings pitched for the season...are 19-19 with a 4.14 ERA (133 er in 289.1 ip)...the wins are third most in the AL but the losses are tied for third most.

A'S IN MAY: The A's are 14-11 (.560) in the month of May and need one more win to clinch their third consecutive winning May (16-10 in 2019, 15-14 in 2018)...it would give the A's nine consecutive months with a winning record (min. 10 games)...are batting .245 (200-for-816) with a .774 OPS in May after hitting .214 with a .679 OPS in April...are fourth in the American League in OPS in May after ranking 10th in April...are tied for the AL lead in extra base hits in May (87), rank second in doubles (47), tied for second in home runs (37) and third in slugging (.446) and walks (94)...are tied for the fewest stolen bases (3) after ranking second in April (19)...A's pitchers are tied for the fewest walks in May (64) but also have the third fewest strikeouts (197).

MELVIN, LA RUSSA AND MACK: Bob Melvin has compiled a 797-710 (.529) record as manager of the A's and needs one more win to tie Tony La Russa's record for most wins as manager of the Oakland A's (798)...has the third most wins by a manager in franchise history to Connie Mack, who won 3,582 games as manager of the Philadelphia A's from 1901-50.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 5-5 in this stretch of 16 games in 16 days, all against American League West competition...are 7-10 (.412) against the West and 23-12 (.657) in interdivision games...the intradivision record is fourth worst in the AL and the 17 intradivision games are tied with the Mariners for second fewest in the majors (Nationals, 15)...have a 5.19 ERA (87 er in 151.0 ip) against the AL West and a 3.65 ERA (125 er in 308.0 ip) against all other teams.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .260 (103-for-396) over the last 12 games, which has boosted their overall batting average to a season-high .229...have the fourth lowest batting average in the American League...however, lead the AL in hit by pitches (29), rank second in home runs (70), fourth in walks (186) and extra base hits (158) and tied for fourth in triples (8)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (11), RBI (9) and plate appearances (46), are tied for the lead in home runs (2) and extra base hits (3) and tied for second in walks (5)...the A's are batting .172 (5-for-29) with the bases loaded, which is the lowest batting average in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors...the A's are 24-5 when out-homering the opposition, 3-14 when they are out-homered.

PITCHING: The A's had their fifth shutout of the season last night, which is third most in the American League...it was the first since April 20 as the first four shutouts came over a five-game stretch from April 16-20...now have a 3.58 ERA (136 er in 342.0 ip) dating back to April 16...have the third fewest walks in the AL (143) but the second most hits (448)...have the fourth fewest home runs (54)...rank second in most wild pitches (29) and are averaging the third fewest pitches per inning (16.3).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has one save, four blown saves, a 7.02 ERA (26 er in 33.1 ip) and .300 (39-for-130) opponents batting average over the A's last 12 games...converted 13-of-14 saves with a 2.32 ERA and .201 opponents average over the previous 29 contests...is 13-for-18 (72.2%) in save opportunities, which is the third best percentage in the American League...has three losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has allowed just seven home runs over the A's last 42 games after surrendering seven over the first eight...the 14 home runs are the fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors...has allowed 25-of-63 (39.7%) inherited runners to score, which is the fourth highest percentage in the AL...has the highest batting average (.296), on-base percentage (.386) and slugging percentage (.533) against first batters faced in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have made just one error in the last seven games and two in the last 11 and now have a .986 fielding percentage, which is fourth best in the American League...have the third fewest double plays (35)...A's outfielders have three assists (all by Laureano), which is tied for the fewest.

CLOSE CALLS (AND NOT SO CLOSE): The A's are 19-8 (.704) in games decided by three runs or fewer, which is the best record in the majors...are 11-14 (.440) in games decided by four runs or more...have outscored the opposition 111-89 in games decided by three runs or fewer (+22) but have been outscored 138-110 in games decided by four runs or more (-28)...have an overall run differential of -6 and had a positive mark just once this year (+5 on April 24)...are 11-6 (.647) in one-run games, which is the second best mark in the majors to the Mariners (10-5, .667)...the 17 one-run decisions are the most in the American League and fifth most in the majors...lead the majors with five walk-off wins and are 8-2 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with the Mariners and Angels for the most wins in the majors when trailing after seven innings (4)...are 2-0 in extra innings and are 8-1 in extra innings over the last two years.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-2 on this seven-game homestand against Seattle (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (1-0)...went 1-2 on the last homestand against Houston and are 16-15 (.516) at home...the 31 home games are three more than any team in the majors (Rockies and Padres, 28)...this homestand concludes a stretch where the A's will play 20 of 29 games at home...are 14-12 over that span, including 8-9 at home...leave following the game Sunday for a six-game road trip to Seattle (three games) and Colorado (three games)...went 2-1 on the last road trip to Los Angeles (AL) and are 14-7 (.667) on the road, which is the third best road record in the American League and the majors...have won six road series, lost none and split one...have a 4.55 ERA (140 er in 277.0 ip) at home, which is fourth highest in the AL, compared to 3.56 ERA (72 er in 182.0 ip) on the road, which is the lowest in the AL and fifth lowest in the majors.

TEAMMATES: Chris Bassitt won his fifth game of the season last night, which ties him with Frankie Montas for second most on the A's (Petit, 6)...the A's are one of three teams in the majors with three pitchers with five or more wins (Red Sox, Dodgers)...are one of three teams (Rangers, Rockies) with four pitchers with 10 or more starts (Bassitt, Irvin, Manaea, Montas) and one of four (Giants, Mariners, Indians) with two pitchers with five or more saves (Diekman, Trivino)...are one of six teams (Angels, Braves, Blue Jays, Reds, Red Sox) with three players with 10 or more home runs (Canha, Laureano, Olson).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's placed Reymin Guduan on the injured list today and have now used the IL 13 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have five players on the IL (Fiers, Guduan, Luzardo, Rosenthal, Wendelken)...began the year with two players on the IL but have had at least four every day since the fifth game of the season.

A'S vs. ANGELS: The A's lead the season series 3-1...won the first game in Oakland last night after taking two of three at Anaheim last weekend...won the season series last year 6-4 after going 13-6 against the Angels in 2019...have won back-to-back season series for the first time since winning three straight from 2011-13...have won 17 of the last 22 games and 29 of the last 44...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 459-387 against the Angels...that includes 241-182 in Oakland and 218-205 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 508-464 against the Angels.

Seth Brown has eight home runs, which is second most among Major League rookies (Garcia, TEX 16)...**Mark Canha** leads the majors in hit by pitches (10)...ranks second in the American League in runs scored (40), fifth in on-base percentage (.400) and eighth in walks (30)...**Jake Diekman** and **Lou Trivino** have six saves each, which is tied for 10th in the AL...**Matt Olson** is tied for fifth in the AL in home runs (13), tied for sixth in extra base hits (24) and ranks 10th in slugging (.563) and OPS (.908)

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1972** George Hendrick hits his first Major League home run, a walk-off shot in the A's 5-4 win over Chicago...in **1980** Dwayne Murphy and Wayne Gross both steal home in the first inning of a 6-3 win over Kansas City at the Coliseum...the A's stole seven bases in the game...in **1996** Mark McGwire hits the 9000th home run in the history of the Athletics franchise in the A's 6-2 win over Boston.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (3-2, 4.17 ERA)

APRIL AND MAY: Is 0-1 with a 5.68 ERA (16 er in 25.1 ip) and .308 (16-for-107) opponents batting average in five starts in May after going 3-1 with a 2.83 ERA and .248 opponents batting average in five starts in April...is now 5-9 with a 5.77 ERA (69 er in 107.2 ip) in 20 career starts in May compared to 8-4 with a 2.97 ERA in 16 starts in April...his May ERA is his highest for any month (5.22 in August).

DON'T WALK: Has walked two batters or fewer in each of his last nine starts... has three starts with no walks and four others with one...is averaging 1.83 walks per nine innings, which is seventh lowest in the American League... ranks fifth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.91)...over the last four years, he has walked two batters or fewer in 47 of his 53 starts (17 with no walks, 21 with one)...has 58 walks in 298.1 innings over that span, an average of 1.75 per nine innings.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held left-handed hitters to a .151 (8-for-53) batting average, which is sixth lowest in the American League...has a .319 (52-for-163) mark against right-handers...has allowed 60 hits, which is tied for third most in the AL.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 1-0 with a 1.72 ERA (6 er in 31.1 ip) in five starts on four days rest compared to 2-1 with a 7.00 ERA (14 er in 18.0 ip) in four starts on five days rest...over the last three years, he is 5-1 with a 2.90 ERA (23 er in 71.1 ip) in 13 starts on four days rest, 3-2 with a 6.11 ERA (19 er in 28.0 ip) in six starts on five days rest.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-1 with a 3.75 ERA (15 er in 36.0 ip) and .255 (36-for-141) opponents batting average in six starts at home compared to 1-1 with a 5.00 ERA (10 er in 18.0 ip) and .320 (24-for-75) opponents batting average in four starts on the road...over the last two years, he is 5-2 with a 3.82 ERA (26 er in 61.1 ip) in 11 starts in Oakland, 2-3 with a 5.01 ERA (26 er in 46.2 ip) in 10 starts on the road...is 23-14 in his career in the Coliseum compared to 19-19 on the road.

SUPPORT: Allowed one run in his last start at Los Angeles (AL), the fifth time he has allowed one run or fewer in his 10 starts...had his fifth no decision in that start against the Angels and it was his third no decision when allowing just one run...has received one run of support in two of his five no decisions and the bullpen blew the save in one other no decision...the A's are 4-1 in his no decisions and are 7-3 (.700) in his starting assignments...are 18-8 (.692) when he starts over the last three years...has received one run of support or fewer in four of his 10 starts and is 0-2 in those starts...is 3-0 in six starts with two runs of support or more.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 5.85 ERA (13 er in 20.0 ip) over the first two innings of his two starts, a 4.00 ERA (8 er in 18.0 ip) in innings three and four and a 2.25 ERA (4 er in 16.0 ip) from the fifth inning on

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Tossed a season-high 101 pitches in his first start on April 4 against Houston and allowed five runs on six hits and a season-high three walks in 4.2 innings for the loss...then went 3-0 with a 1.50 ERA over his next four starts...picked up his first win of the season in the 100th game of his career, an 8-4 victory over Detroit on April 15...tossed a six-hit, seven-inning shutout in the A's 7-0 win over Minnesota in the first game of the double-header April 20...it was the 11th complete game shutout of fewer than eight innings in Oakland history (last: Mike Minor, Sept. 14, 2020 at Seattle)...it was his second career complete game and shutout, with the other being his no-hitter on April 21, 2018 against Boston...the start was the 100th of his career and he became the 25th pitcher in Oakland history to make 100 starts...struck out a career-high tying 10 batters in a season-high 7.1 innings on May 7 against Tampa Bay, but had a no decision in the A's 2-1 win...it was his fourth career 10-strikeout game, his first since Sept. 8, 2019 against Detroit...retired each of the first 18 batters he faced before walking Arozarena to start the seventh...then retired the next three before Brosseau led off the eighth inning with a double...allowed a season-high seven runs on a season-high 10 hits in a season-low 2.0 innings for the loss at Boston on May 13...has allowed seven or more runs in a start three times in his career, all at Fenway Park (8 on May 10, 2016; 7 on Sept. 12, 2017)...also allowed 10 hits in his next start on May 18 against Houston to become the first A's pitcher to yield 10 hits in back-to-back starts since Kendall Graveman in 2016 (April 25-May 2).

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Los Angeles last Sunday...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed a run to score on a Walsh ground out in the fourth inning...was relieved by Smith to start the sixth inning with the A's leading 4-1 but the pen allowed a run in the sixth and three in the seventh for the blown save...struck out Justin Upton to lead off the game for the 50,000 strikeout in Oakland history...fanned Taylor Ward to end the fourth inning for his 500th career strikeout

2020 RECAP: Went 4-3 with a 4.50 ERA in 11 starts...the ERA was the highest of his career as was his .270 opponents batting average...his .427 slugging percentage matched his high...went 4-1 with a 2.65 ERA and .234 opponents batting average over his final six starts dating back to Aug. 20...the wins tied for fourth most in the majors over that span...went 0-2 with a 7.65 ERA and .325 opponents average over his first five starts...tied for the team lead in starts...walked just eight batters in 54.0 innings, an average of 1.33 walks per nine innings...that was the lowest mark of his career and was sixth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 50 or more innings pitched...struck out 45 for a career-best 5.63 strikeout-to-walk ratio...had five starts without a walk, five with one and three in his other...had a 2.56 ERA and .233 opponents batting average over the first three innings of his starts compared to a 7.59 ERA and .319 opponents average from the fourth inning on...his .270 opponents batting average broke down to .250 (13-for-52) against left-handed hitters compared to .277 (44-for-159) against right-handers...issued seven of eight walks to righties...had a .204 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .327 with seven of his eight walks after that...had a .281 batting average against batters leading off an inning but issued just one walk (.293 on-base percentage)...yielded a .222 average with the bases empty, .373 with runners on...went 2-1 with a 3.32 ERA and .182 opponents batting average in four starts during the day, 2-2 with a 5.29 ERA and .321 opponent average in seven starts at night...was 3-1 with a 3.91 ERA and .232 opponents batting average in five starts in Oakland, 1-2 with a 5.02 ERA and .302 opponents average in five starts on the road...was charged with five unearned runs, which tied for eighth most in the majors...was 0-3 in four starts with two runs of support or fewer, 4-0 in seven starts with three or more... is now 5-31 in 52 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 37-2 in 54 starts with support of three or more.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Frankie Montas (5-4, 4.92 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 11th start of the season, which matches the second most of his career (16 in 2019)...his five wins and four losses also match the second most of his career (9 wins in 2019, 5 losses in 2020)...is tied for sixth in the American League in wins... has surrendered 11 home runs, which is a career-high and tied for third most in the AL...is 3-2 with a 3.81 ERA in five starts in May after going 2-2 with a 6.20 ERA in five starts in April...has a .215 opponents batting average against batters the first time through the order, .337 the second time and .259 after that...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 4-2 A's loss to Seattle on Monday here in Oakland (6.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 11 so)...is 2-0 with a 3.50 ERA (36.0 ip, 33 h, 14 r, 14 er, 15 bb, 33 so, 4 hr) in nine career appearances, including six starts, against Los Angeles...was 0-0 with a 5.19 ERA (8.2 ip, 10 h, 5 r, 5 er, 6 bb, 10 so, 1 hr) in two starts last year, both extra inning A's wins.
