ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three straight after losing three in a row...it is the first time the A's have won more than two consecutive games since May 2-4 when they also won three straight...are a season-high tying nine games over .500 for the third time this year and also have a season-high tying 2½-game lead in the American League West...are 31-22 (.585), which is the fourth best record in the AL...are 15-13 (.536) since the 13-game winning streak and are 31-16 (.660) since starting the season 0-6...are in first place in the AL West for the eighth consecutive day...have held at least a share of first for 38 of the last 39 days...have spent 36 days alone in first place, two days tied for first, one day in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

MELVIN, LA RUSSA AND MACK: Bob Melvin won his 798th game as manager of the A's last night, which ties Tony La Russa's record for most wins as manager of the Oakland A's...Melvin and La Russa are tied for the second most wins by a manager in franchise history to Connie Mack, who won 3,582 games as manager of the Philadelphia A's from 1901-50.

ONE-THIRD OF THE SEASON: The A's are scheduled to play their 54th game of the season today, which is the one-third mark of the season...are 31-22 and are on pace for 94 wins...A's batters have been hit by a pitch 30 times and are on pace for 91, which would break the Athletics record of 88 set in 2001...are batting .229, which is currently third lowest in franchise history (.224 in 1908, .225 in 2020)...A's pitchers have 440 strikeouts and are on pace for 1344, which would break the A's record of 1299 set in 2019...with 29 wild pitches, are on pace for 88 (A's record is 86 in 2018)...have two complete games, which already matches the most by an A's team over the last seven years...have committed just 26 errors, which would be 79 over 162 games...the A's record for fewest errors in a full season is 80 in 2019...individually, Mark Canha has scored 40 runs, which is on pace for 122...the Oakland record is 123 by Reggie Jackson (1969) and Marcus Semien (2019)...Chris Bassitt has 74 strikeouts and is on pace for 226...the only pitcher in Oakland history with more than 205 strikeouts in a season is Vida Blue (301 in 1971).

A'S IN MAY: The A's are 15-11 (.577) in the month of May and have clinched their third consecutive winning May (16-10 in 2019, 15-14 in 2018)...this is the A's ninth consecutive month with a winning record (min. 10 games)...are batting .244 (205-for-841) with a .767 OPS in May after hitting .214 with a .679 OPS in April...are fourth in the American League in OPS in May after ranking 10th in April...rank third in the AL in walks in May (99), tied for third in extra base hits (87) and home runs (37) and fourth in slugging (.429)...are tied for the fewest stolen bases (3) after ranking second in April (19)...A's pitchers are tied for the fewest walks in May (67) but are tied for the second fewest strikeouts (207).

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are 6-5 in this stretch of 16 games in 16 days, all against American League West competition...are 8-10 (.444) against the West and 23-12 (.657) in interdivision games...the 18 intradivision games are tied with the Mariners and Red Sox for second fewest in the majors (Nationals, 15)...have a 4.95 ERA (88 er in 160.0 ip) against the AL West and a 3.65 ERA (125 er in 308.0 ip) against all other teams.

OFFENSE: Last night, the A's had their first game with a sacrifice hit, sacrifice fly and no extra base hits since Sept. 25, 2013, also against the Angels...it was just the second time over the last 29 years they won such a game (Aug. 22, 2009 vs. Detroit)...are batting .257 (108-for-421) over the last 13 games, which has boosted their overall batting average to a season-high .229...have the fourth lowest batting average in the American League...however, lead the AL in hit by pitches (30), rank second in home runs (70), fourth in walks (191) and extra base hits (158) and tied for fourth in triples (8)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (11), RBI (9) and plate appearances (46), are tied for the lead in home runs (2) and extra base hits (3) and tied for second in walks (5)...the A's are 24-5 when out-homering the opposition, 3-14 when they are out-homered.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed one run over the last two games and now have a 2.90 ERA (20 er in 62.0 ip) over the last seven contests...have the third fewest walks in the American League (146) and have allowed the fourth fewest home runs (54), but have yielded the second most hits (454)...rank second in most wild pitches (29) and are third in shutouts (5) and fewest pitches per inning (16.2).

STARTING PITCHING: Sean Manaea allowed a run in the seventh inning last night to snap a 22.2-inning scoreless streak by A's starting pitchers...starters now have a 2.35 ERA (12 er in 46.0 ip) over the last seven games...are 19-19 with a 4.07 ERA (134 er in 296.0 ip) for the season...the wins are third most in the American League but the losses are tied for third most...are tied for second in the AL in complete games (2) and have 296.0 innings pitched, which is the most in the majors.

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has two saves, four blown saves, a 6.56 ERA (26 er in 35.2 ip) and .285 (39-for-137) opponents batting average over the A's last 13 games...converted 12-of-13 saves with a 2.32 ERA and .201 opponents average over the previous 29 contests...is 14-for-19 (73.7%) in save opportunities, which is the third best percentage in the American League...has three losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has allowed just seven home runs over the A's last 43 games after surrendering seven over the first eight...the 14 home runs are the fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors...has allowed 25-of-64 (39.1%) inherited runners to score, which is the fifth highest percentage in the AL...has the highest batting average (.292), on-base percentage (.381) and slugging percentage (.526) against first batters faced in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have made just three errors in the last 12 games and now have a .986 fielding percentage, which is fourth best in the American League...have the fourth fewest double plays (37)...A's outfielders have three assists (all by Laureano), which is tied with the Angels for the fewest...have allowed the fourth fewest stolen bases (17).

CLOSE CALLS (AND NOT SO CLOSE): The A's are 20-8 (.714) in games decided by three runs or fewer, which is the best record in the majors...are 11-14 (.440) in games decided by four runs or more...have outscored the opposition 114-90 in games decided by three runs or fewer (+24) but have been outscored 138-110 in games decided by four runs or more (-28)...have an overall run differential of -4 and had a positive mark just once this year (+5 on April 24)...are 11-6 (.647) in one-run games, which is the second best mark in the majors to the Mariners (11-5, .688)...the 17 one-run decisions are the most in the American League and fifth most in the majors...lead the majors with five walk-off wins and are 8-2 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with the Mariners and Angels for the most wins in the majors when trailing after seven innings (4)...are 2-0 in extra innings and are 8-1 in extra innings over the last two years.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-2 on this seven-game homestand against Seattle (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-0)...went 1-2 on the last homestand against Houston and are 17-15 (.531) at home...the 32 home games are four more than any team in the majors (Red Sox, Rockies and Padres, 28)...this homestand concludes a stretch where the A's will play 20 of 29 games at home...are 15-12 over that span, including 9-9 at home...leave following the game tomorrow for a six-game road trip to Seattle (three games) and Colorado (three games)...went 2-1 on the last road trip to Los Angeles (AL) and are 14-7 (.667) on the road, which is the third best road record in the American League and the majors...have won six road series, lost none and split one...have a 4.44 ERA (141 er in 286.0 ip) at home, which is fifth highest in the AL, compared to 3.56 ERA (72 er in 182.0 ip) on the road, which is second lowest.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 13 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have five players on the IL (Fiers, Guduan, Luzardo, Rosenthal, Wendelken)...began the year with two players on the IL but have had at least four every day since the fifth game of the season.

A'S vs. ANGELS: The A's lead the season series 4-1...have won the first two games in Oakland after taking two of three at Anaheim last weekend...won the season series last year 6-4 after going 13-6 against the Angels in 2019...have won back-to-back season series for the first time since winning three straight from 2011-13...have won 18 of the last 23 games and 30 of the last 45...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 460-387 against the Angels...that includes 242-182 in Oakland and 218-205 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 509-464 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Seth Brown has eight home runs, which is second most among Major League rookies (Garcia, TEX 16)...**Mark Canha** leads the majors in hit by pitches (11)...ranks second in the American League in runs scored (40), fifth in on-base percentage (.402) and tied for sixth in walks (31)...**Matt Olson** is tied for fifth in the American League in home runs (13), tied for sixth in extra base hits (24) and ranks 10th in slugging (.556) and OPS (.900)...**Yusmeiro Petit** has seven wins, which are second most by an A's pitcher before the end of May over the last 17 years (Hill, 8 in 2016).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1909** Frank Baker hits the first home run at Shibe Park...in **1990** Rickey Henderson breaks Ty Cobb's AL stolen base record with his 893rd career steal...in **2000** Randy Velarde turns the 10th regular season unassisted triple play in major league history but the A's lose at New York, 4-1.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (5-4, 4.92 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 11th start of the season, which matches the second most of his career (16 in 2019)...his five wins and four losses also match the second most of his career (9 wins in 2019, 5 losses in 2020)...is tied for sixth in the American League in wins...has surrendered 11 home runs, which is a career-high and tied for third most in the AL.

APRIL AND MAY: Is 3-2 with a 3.81 ERA (12 er in 28.1 ip) in five starts in May after going 2-2 with a 6.20 ERA in five starts in April...his three wins in May match his most ever in a month...is now 7-2 with a 3.13 ERA (27 er in 77.2 ip) in 20 career appearances, including 11 starts, in May.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .215 (17-for-79) opponents batting average against batters the first time through the order, .337 (29-for-86) the second time and .259 (14-for-54) with six of his 11 home runs after that...has allowed a .411 (23-for-56) batting average to the first and second hitters in the order but has held the three and four hitters to a .189 (10-for-53) average.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-3 with a 6.17 ERA (24 er in 35.0 ip) and .291 (43-for-148) opponents batting average in seven starts at home compared to 2-1 with a 2.50 ERA (5 er in 18.0 ip) and .239 (17-for-71) opponents batting average in three starts on the road...last year, he went 2-1 with a 2.56 ERA in six starts at home, 1-4 with a 10.13 ERA in five starts on the road.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 1-2 with a 3.71 ERA (7 er in 17.0 ip) in three starts against American League West teams...was 3-2 with a 3.61 ERA and .236 opponents batting average in eight starts against AL West competition last year, 0-3 with a 13.50 ERA and .391 opponents average in three starts against everyone else...is now 11-7 with a 3.70 ERA (62 er in 150.2 ip) in 36 career games against AL West foes, 12-11 with a 4.90 ERA (89 er in 163.1 ip) in 44 games against all other teams.

THIS AND THAT: Is 3-1 with a 2.63 ERA (7 er in 24.0 ip) in four starts on five days rest, 2-2 with a 5.13 ERA (15 er in 26.1 ip) in five starts on four days rest...has allowed 11 of his 29 runs and 22 of his 60 hits in the third inning for a 10.24 ERA (11 er in 9.2 ip) and .431 (22-for-51) opponents batting average...has not allowed a run in the fourth inning (9.0 ip) and opponents are 4-for-32 (.125)...has tossed six innings or fewer in all 10 of his starts...has walked two batters or fewer eight times...the A's are 6-4 (.600) in his starting assignments.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Took the loss in his first start on April 5 against Los Angeles (NL)...allowed a season-high seven runs in a season-low 2.2 innings and walked a season-high three batters...tossed 90 pitches, which were the most by an A's pitcher in an outing of fewer than three innings since pitch counts were tracked beginning in 1988...the loss extended his losing streak to a career-high three games dating back to Sept. 13, 2020...then picked up the win in each of his next two starts and allowed just one run on eight hits in 12.0 innings...won 7-3 at Houston on April 10 and then combined with Romo, Diekmann and Wendelken on a four-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 victory over Detroit on April 16...tossed 6.0 innings in each start, which is his season high (six times)...allowed six runs on a season-high nine hits in 4.0 innings against Minnesota on April 21 but had a no decision in the A's 13-12, 10-inning win...allowed three home runs in a start for the second time in his career (Sept. 22, 2020 vs. Los Angeles-NL)...had a season-high 105 pitches in a 4-3 loss at Tampa Bay on April 27...won each of his first three starts in May and posted a 3.12 ERA over that stretch from May 3-14.

LAST START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 4-2 loss to Seattle on Monday in Oakland...struck out 11 batters in 6.0 innings, his fourth career games of 10 or more strikeouts...the strikeouts were second most of his career to his 13 against the Mariners in the final game of the season last year...walked a season-high tying three...allowed a RBI double to Kelenic in the first, a two-run home run to Lewis in the third and a lead off home run to Kelenic in the fifth.

MONTAS vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 2-0 with a 3.50 ERA (36.0 ip, 33 h, 14 r, 14 er, 15 bb, 33 so, 4 hr) in nine career appearances, including six starts...is 1-0 with a 4.15 ERA (10 er in 21.2 ip) in six games in Oakland and 1-0 with a 2.51 ERA (4 er in 14.1 ip) in three appearances in Anaheim...was 0-0 with a 5.19 ERA (8.2 ip, 10 h, 5 r, 5 er, 6 bb, 10 so, 1 hr) in two starts last year, both extra inning A's wins...the first no decision came in a 7-3 A's win in 10 innings in Oakland on Opening Night, July 24...scattered two hits, a walk and hit a batter over the first three innings before allowing his only run in the fourth inning on a Goodwin RBI single...was relieved by Petit to start the fifth inning with the scored tied 1-1...also had a no decision a 5-4, 10-inning win in Oakland on Aug. 23...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a three-run home run to Ohtani in the third...allowed a RBI single to Goodwin in the fifth and was relieved by Wendelken with runners on first and third, two outs in the fifth and the A's trailing 4-2...Oakland scored twice in the sixth to get him off the hook.

2020 RECAP: Was off to a strong start as he was 2-1 with a 1.57 ERA, .175 opponents batting average and no home runs over his first four starts...was scratched from his scheduled start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness and went 1-4 with an 8.70 ERA, .321 opponents average and 10 home runs over his final seven starts...went 3-5 with a 5.60 ERA in 11 starts overall...his ERA was eighth highest in the majors among pitchers with at least 50 innings pitched...had career highs in losses (5) and earned runs (33) and matched his high in home runs (10), runs (35) and walks (23)...led the A's in strikeouts (60), losses, runs, home runs and walks...his opponents batting average broke down to .198 (22-for-111) against right-handed hitters compared to .350 (35-for-100) against left-handers...surrendered six of his 10 home runs and issued 15 of his 23 walks to lefties for a 1.061 OPS (.572 against right-handers)...had a .306 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .264 the second time and .205 after that...allowed a .133 average with two strikes...was 2-1 with a 2.56 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in six starts in Oakland, 1-4 with a 10.13 ERA and .330 opponents average in five starts on the road...surrendered just two home runs in 31.2 innings in Oakland compared to eight in 21.1 innings on the road...made eight of his 11 starts during the day, which tied for the most in the majors...was 2-4 with a 6.16 ERA during the day, 1-1 with a 4.20 ERA at night...the A's were 6-5 (.545) in his starting assignments...had two starts of seven innings and five starts of fewer than five innings...went 2-2 with a 2.83 ERA in six starts on four days rest, 1-3 with an 11.00 ERA in five starts on five days rest or more...received two runs of support or fewer in nine of his 11 starts...had 10 of his 28 runs of support in one start on Aug. 3 at Seattle and had a 4.75 RSA for the season...won both of his starts with support of three or more runs and is now 16-1 in 20 career starts with at least three runs of support.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
LHP Cole Irvin (3-6, 3.92 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 11th start of the season...is 0-3 with a 5.24 ERA and .293 opponents batting average over his last four starts...the three-game losing streak is one short of his career high of four (May 22, 2019-April 8, 2021)...has six losses, which are tied for second most in the American League...has walked two batters or fewer in each of his 10 starts, including seven starts with one walk and one start with no walks...has issued just 11 free passes in 57.1 innings and his average of 1.73 walks per nine innings is fifth lowest in the AL...has allowed a .235 batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .362 against left-handers...the mark against lefties is second highest in the majors (Hendricks, CHC .366) and his .901 OPS is fourth highest...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 4-3 A's loss to Seattle last Tuesday here in Oakland (4.2 ip, 10 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 2 so)...has never faced the Angels in his career.

- Was charged with the blown save in back-to-back games at Minnesota but has had three scoreless appearances since...has allowed four runs over his last eight appearances (7.1 ip, 8 h, 4 r, 4 er, 4 bb, 9 so, 2 hr, 4.91 ERA)...had a 1.93 ERA over his first 14 contests.
- Is tied for seventh among American League relievers in strikeouts (30)...is tied for second in first batter strikeouts (10).
- Has yielded a .180 (9-for-50) average against right-handed hitters compared to .276 (8-for-31) against left-handers...has issued six of his nine walks to righties.
- Has faced the Angels twice this season, throwing 2.1 scoreless innings with three strikeouts and one walk...has faced them 29 times in his career, going 1-0 with a 2.08 ERA (6 er, 26.0 ip) with 30 strikeouts and 17 walks.
- Has six saves, which surpasses his career high of four with Texas in 2016.
- Allowed home runs in back-to-back games May 15-16...had not allowed a home run in his previous 17 appearances this season...allowed just one home run in 21 appearances in 2020.

Last Year: Allowed just two runs in 21 appearances and only one was earned for a 0.42 ERA...ranked second among Major League relievers in ERA and opponents slugging percentage (.157), fifth in batting average (.114) and seventh in OPS (.410)
