## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (31-23) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (23-29)

SUNDAY, MAY 30, 2021 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 1:07 PDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Had their three-game winning streak snapped yesterday... are 15-14 (.517) since the 13-game winning streak and are 31-17 (.646) since starting the season 0-6...are 31-23 (.574) overall, which is the fourth best record in the American League...are eight games over .500, which is one short of the season high of nine (three times, last: May 28)...are in first place in the AL West for the ninth consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 39 of the last 40 days...have a season-high tying 2½ game lead over second place Houston...have spent 37 days alone in first place, two days tied for first, one day in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

**MELVIN, LA RUSSA AND MACK:** Bob Melvin won his 798th game as manager of the A's Friday night, which ties Tony La Russa's record for most wins as manager of the Oakland A's...Melvin and La Russa are tied for the second most wins by a manager in franchise history to Connie Mack, who won 3,582 games as manager of the Philadelphia A's from 1901-50.

**ONE-THIRD OF THE SEASON:** The A's played their 54th game of the season yesterday, which is the one-third mark of the season...are 31-23 and are on pace for 93 wins...A's batters have been hit by a pitch 30 times and are on pace for 90, which would break the Athletics record of 88 set in 2001...are batting .227, which is currently third lowest in franchise history (.224 in 1908, .225 in 2020)...A's pitchers have 451 strikeouts and are on pace for 1353, which would break the A's record of 1299 set in 2019...with 32 wild pitches, are on pace for 96 (A's record is 86 in 2018)...have two complete games, which already matches the most by an A's team over the last seven years...have committed just 27 errors, which would be 81 over 162 games...the A's record for fewest errors in a full season is 80 in 2019...individually, Mark Canha has scored 40 runs, which is on pace for 120...the Oakland record is 123 by Reggie Jackson (1969) and Marcus Semien (2019)...Chris Bassitt has 74 strikeouts and is on pace for 222...the only pitcher in Oakland history with more than 205 strikeouts in a season is Vida Blue (301 in 1971).

**A'S IN MAY:** The A's are 15-12 (.556) in the month of May and have clinched their third consecutive winning May (16-10 in 2019, 15-14 in 2018)...this is the A's ninth consecutive month with a winning record (min. 10 games)...are batting .240 (208-for-868) with a .752 OPS in May after hitting .214 with a .679 OPS in April...rank third in the American League in walks in May (101) and tied for third in home runs (37)...have the fewest stolen bases (3) after ranking second in steals in April (19)...A's pitchers have the second fewest walks in May (69) but also have the second fewest strikeouts (218).

**AGAINST THE WEST:** The A's are 6-6 in this stretch of 16 games in 16 days, all against American League West competition...are 8-11 (.421) against the West and 23-12 (.657) in interdivision games...the 19 intradivision games are tied with the Mariners for second fewest in the AL (Red Sox, 18)...have a 4.69 ERA (88 er in 169.0 ip) against the AL West and a 3.65 ERA (125 er in 308.0 ip) against all other teams.

**OFFENSE:** The A's have gone back-to-back games without an extra base hit for the first time since Sept. 11-12, 2014...the Oakland record is three (four times, last: Aug. 5-8, 1980)...are now batting .223 (10-for-31) with 19 runs scored, seven doubles and two runs in six games on the homestand after hitting .295 with 19 runs, seven doubles, two triples and nine home runs in three games on the last road trip...are hitting .227 overall, which is fourth lowest in the American League...however, lead the AL in hit by pitches (30), are tied for second in home runs (70), rank fourth in walks (193), tied for fourth in triples (8) and fifth in extra base hits (158)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (11) and plate appearances (48), are tied for the lead in home runs (2), RBI (9) and extra base hits (3) and tied for second in walks (5)...the A's are 24-5 when out-homering the opposition, 3-14 when they are out-homered.

**PITCHING:** The A's have allowed just one earned run over the last three games (27.0 ip, 0.33 ERA), which has dropped the overall ERA to a season-low tying 4.02...have the third fewest walks in the American League (148) and have allowed the fourth fewest home runs (54), but have yielded the second most hits (463)...rank second in most wild pitches (32) and are third in shutouts (5) and fewest pitches per inning (16.2).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have allowed just one earned run in the last four games (28.1 ip, 0.32 ERA) and have not allowed a home run in the last five games (33.0 ip)...are 19-20 with a 4.00 ERA (134 er in 301.2 ip) for the season...the wins are third most in the American League but the losses are tied for third most...are tied for second in the AL in complete games (2) and have 301.2 innings pitched, which is the most in the majors.

**BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen has two saves, four blown saves, a 6.05 ERA (26 er in 38.2 ip) and .282 (42-for-149) opponents batting average over the A's last 14 games...converted 12-of-13 saves with a 2.32 ERA and .201 opponents average over the previous 29 contests...is 14-for-19 (73.7%) in save opportunities, which is the third best percentage in the American League...has three losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has allowed just seven home runs over the A's last 44 games after surrendering seven over the first eight...the 14 home runs are the fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors...has allowed 25-of-66 (37.9%) inherited runners to score, which is the fifth highest percentage in the AL...has the highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.514) and the second highest batting average (.286) and on-base percentage (.374).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's committed one error yesterday, which led to four unearned runs in a 4-0 loss...it was the first time the A's did not allow an earned run and lost since July 25, 2017 against Toronto, a 4-1 loss...have committed an error in back-to-back games after making just two over the previous 11...are tied for the fourth fewest errors in the American League (27) and have the third best fielding percentage (.986)...have the fourth fewest double plays (38)...A's outfielders have three assists (all by Laureano), which is tied with the Angels for the fewest.

**CLOSE CALLS (AND NOT SO CLOSE):** The A's are 20-8 (.714) in games decided by three runs or fewer, which is the best record in the majors...are 11-15 (.423) in games decided by four runs or more...have outscored the opposition 114-90 in games decided by three runs or fewer (+24) but have been outscored 142-110 in games decided by four runs or more (-32)...have an overall run differential of -8 and had a positive mark just once this year (+5 on April 24)...are 11-6 (.647) in one-run games, which is the second best mark in the majors to the Mariners (12-5, .706)...the 17 one-run decisions are tied with the Mariners for the most in the American League and tied for fifth most in the majors...lead the majors with five walk-off wins and are 8-2 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with the Mariners and Angels for the most wins in the majors when trailing after seven innings (4)...are 2-0 in extra innings and are 8-1 in extra innings over the last two years.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 3-3 on this seven-game homestand against Seattle (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1)...went 1-2 on the last homestand against Houston and are 17-16 (.515) at home...the 33 home games are four more than any team in the majors (Red Sox, 29)...today's game concludes a stretch where the A's will play 20 of 29 games at home...are 15-13 over that span, including 9-10 at home...leave following the game today for a six-game road trip to Seattle (three games) and Colorado (three games)...went 2-1 on the last road trip to Los Angeles (AL) and are 14-7 (.667) on the road, which is the third best road record in the American League and the majors...have won six road series, lost none and split one...have a 4.30 ERA (141 er in 295.0 ip) at home, compared to 3.56 ERA (72 er in 182.0 ip) on the road, which is the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors.

**A'S vs. ANGELS:** The A's lead the season series 4-2...have won two of the first three games in Oakland after taking two of three at Anaheim last weekend...won the season series last year 6-4 after going 13-6 against the Angels in 2019...have won back-to-back season series for the first time since winning three straight from 2011-13...have won 18 of the last 24 games and 30 of the last 46...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 460-388 against the Angels...that includes 242-183 in Oakland and 218-205 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 509-464 against the Angels.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Seth Brown** ranks second among Major League rookies in home runs (8) and fifth in RBI (21)...**Mark Canha** leads the majors in hit by pitches (11)...ranks second in the American League in runs scored (40), fifth in on-base percentage (.395) and tied for sixth in walks (31)...**Matt Olson** is tied for sixth in the AL in home runs (13) and tied for seventh in extra base hits (24)...**Yusmeiro Petit** has seven wins, which are second most by an A's pitcher before the end of May over the last 17 years (Hill, 8 in 2016).

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1932** Al Simmons and Jimmy Dykes hit two home runs each and Lefty Grove tosses a six-hitter in a 13-2 win over Washington...in **1982** Rickey Henderson has three hits, three RBI and four stolen bases in the second game of a doubleheader as the A's defeat Detroit, 10-3...in **1988** Dave Henderson homers to lead off the bottom of the 14th inning as the A's defeat the New York Yankees, 3-2.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (3-6, 3.92 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his 11th start of the season...is 0-3 with a 5.24 ERA (13 er in 22.1 ip) and .293 (27-for-92) opponents batting average over his last four starts...the three-game losing streak is one short of his career high of four (May 22, 2019-April 8, 2021)...went 0-2 with a 7.45 ERA and .293 opponents average over his first two starts this year and was 3-1 with a 1.42 ERA and .232 opponents average in four starts in between (April 17-May 4)...his six losses are tied for second most in the American League.

**DON'T WALK:** Has walked two batters or fewer in each of his 10 starts, including seven starts with one walk and one start with no walks...has issued just 11 free passes in 57.1 innings and his average of 1.73 walks per nine innings is fourth lowest in the American League...has walked one batter or fewer in 10 of his 13 career starts and has walked just 25 batters in 102.2 career innings (2.19 per nine innings).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .235 (40-for-170) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .362 (21-for-58) against left-handers...the mark against lefties is second highest in the majors (Hendricks, CHC .366) and his .901 OPS is fifth highest...however, has allowed five of his six home runs and issued 10 of his 11 walks to righties...his career splits are .247 (73-for-296) with a .712 OPS against right-handers, .383 (44-for-115) with a .959 OPS against lefties...has a .246 (42-for-171) average against a batter the first two times through the order, .333 (19-for-57) after that.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** Is 0-4 with a 7.91 ERA (17 er in 19.1 ip) and .349 (30-for-86) opponents batting average in four starts against American League West competition, 3-2 with a 1.89 ERA (8 er in 38.0 ip) and .218 (31-for-142) opponents average in six starts against everyone else.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 0-5 with a 6.00 ERA (18 er in 27.0 ip) in five starts on four days rest, 3-0 with a 1.04 ERA (3 er in 26.0 ip) in four starts on five days rest or more.

**THIS AND THAT:** Is averaging 15.2 pitches per nine innings, which is seventh fewest in the American League...has a 3.15 ERA (14 er in 40.0 ip) over the first four innings of a game and a 5.94 ERA (11 er in 16.2 ip) from the fifth inning on...has eight strikeouts in 22.1 innings over his last four starts after striking out a season-high nine in 8.0 innings on May 4 against Toronto...is 3-1 in five starts with more than two runs of support, 0-5 in four starts with support of two runs or fewer...has a season RSA of 3.77 (24 rs in 57.1 ip)...the A's lost in his only no decisions and are 3-7 (.300) in his starting assignments.

**2021 HIGHLIGHTS:** Was on the A's Opening Day roster and lost each of his first two starts, allowing four runs in each contest for a 7.45 ERA...tossed 4.1 innings in his first start on April 3 against Houston, which was the shortest start of his career...also faced the Astros in his second start on April 8 but did not pitch again until April 17 against Detroit when he combined with Wendelken, Guerra and Weems on a five-hit shutout in a 7-0 win...it was his first win since May 17, 2019 against Colorado and it snapped a career-high four-game losing streak...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings against the Tigers and then blanked the Orioles over the first five innings on April 23 for a career-high 11.0 inning scoreless streak...won back-to-back starts on the 17th and 23rd, marking the second time in his career he put together consecutive wins (May 12-17, 2019)...allowed just one run in 11. innings in the two starts...lost on April 28 at Tampa Bay but then picked up his third win on May 4 against Toronto...had career highs in innings pitched (8.0), strikeouts (9) and pitches (102) against the Blue Jays...is 0-3 with a 5.24 ERA (13 er in 22.1 ip) in four starts since then...left with a 4-1 lead on May 15 at Minnesota but the pen allowed four runs in the eighth inning for the blown save...allowed a season-high five runs in an 8-4 loss to Houston on May 20.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss to Seattle on Tuesday in Oakland...allowed a career-high 10 hits in 4.2 innings of work...yielded two runs in the first inning on RBI singles by France and Crawford...the A's tied the game with two runs in the second but he allowed two runs in the third on a RBI double by Murphy and a RBI single by Kelenic...was relieved by Smith with runners on first and second and two outs in the fifth and the A's trailing 4-2.

**2020 RECAP:** Had two stints with Philadelphia and was 0-1 with a 17.18 ERA in three relief appearances...opponents went 11-for-21 (.524) but he walked just one and struck out four in 3.2 innings...allowed a .438 (7-for-16) average against right-handed hitters compared to .800 (4-for-5) against left-handers...was 2-0 with a 4.50 ERA in four spring training appearances...was optioned to Lehigh Valley March 26 but was recalled on July 23 and was on the Phillies Opening Day roster...made his 2020 debut on July 26 against Miami and allowed four runs on five hits in an inning of relief and was the losing pitcher in an 11-6 decision...tossed a scoreless inning of relief Aug. 9 against Atlanta but was optioned to Philadelphia's alternate site on Aug. 9...was recalled for a second time Aug. 20, pitched the next day at Atlanta (1.2 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 3 so) and was optioned Aug. 22...did not pitch the remainder of the season.

<b>RHP James Kaprielian (2-0, 1.53 ERA):</b> Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas May 12 and is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season and his career...has picked up the win in two of his three starts and allowed two runs or fewer in all three outings...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 6-3 A's win over Seattle last Wednesday in Oakland (7.0 ip, 2 h, 2 bb, 4 so)...is 1-0 with a 2.08 ERA (8.2 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 7 so, 1 hr) in two career appearances, including one start, against Seattle...made one start with Triple-A Las Vegas and was the losing pitcher on Opening Day, May 6 against Sacramento (4.2 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...made his ML debut last year and had two relief appearances over five stints with Oakland...compiled a 7.36 ERA and .267 opponents batting average...his debut came after pitching in just 27 games over his first five professional seasons due to elbow problems... missed most of 2016 with an elbow injury and then had "Tommy John" surgery in 2017.

- Has yielded a .180 (9-for-50) average against right-handed hitters compared to .276 (8-for-31) against left-handers...has issued six of his nine walks to righties.

- Was reinstated from the injured list today...was placed on the IL May 2 with a fractured hand...pitched 1.2 scoreless innings in a rehab assignment with Triple-A Las Vegas (1.2 ip, h, so).
- Opened the season in the starting rotation and went 1-3 with a 5.79 ERA (18 er in 28.0 ip) in six starts before being placed on the IL.
- Compiled a 5.59 ERA (6 er in 9.2 ip) in three relief outings in 2020 but overall has a 3.32 ERA (8 er in 21.2 ip) with a save and 23 strikeouts in nine career appearances out of the bullpen.
- Has faced the Angels twice in his career, pitching 4.0 scoreless innings in relief.
