



OAKLAND ATHLETICS (31-24) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (27-27)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight and five of the last eight games...are 15-15 (.500) since the 13-game winning streak and are 31-18 (.633) since starting the season 0-6...are 31-24 (.564) overall, which is the fourth best record in the American League...are in first place in the AL West for the 10th consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 40 of the last 41 days...have a 1½ game lead over second place Houston, which is one game short of the season high of 2½...have spent 38 days alone in first place, two days tied for first, one day in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

MELVIN, LA RUSSA AND MACK: Bob Melvin won his 798th game as manager of the A's Friday night, which ties Tony La Russa's record for most wins as manager of the Oakland A's...Melvin and La Russa are tied for the second most wins by a manager in franchise history to Connie Mack, who won 3,582 games as manager of the Philadelphia A's from 1901-50...Melvin began his managerial career in Seattle in 2003 and has 1,291 career wins as manager with the Mariners (2003-04), Diamondbacks (2005-09) and A's (2011-present)...he has the longest uninterrupted tenure by a manager with his current team.

MEMORIAL DAY: The A's have a 28-21 record on Memorial Day since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 20-12 at home and 8-9 on the road...this is the second Memorial Day meeting between the A's and Mariners...the first was on May 25, 2009 in Oakland, a 6-1 A's win.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a six-game, seven-day road trip to Seattle (three games) and Colorado (three games) tonight...went 2-1 on the last road trip to Los Angeles (AL) and are 14-7 (.667) on the road, which is the third best road record in the American League and the majors...the 21 road games are tied with the Nationals for the fewest in the majors...have won six road series, lost none and split one...went 3-4 on the last homestand against Seattle (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-2) and are 17-17 (.500) at home...have a 3.56 ERA (72 er in 182.0 ip) on the road, which is the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors...have a 4.29 ERA at home.

A'S IN MAY: The A's are 15-13 (.536) in the month of May and have clinched their third consecutive winning May (16-10 in 2019, 15-14 in 2018)...this is the A's ninth consecutive month with a winning record (min. 10 games)...are batting .236 (212-for-899) with a .743 OPS in May after hitting .214 with a .679 OPS in April...are tied for third in the American League in walks in May (106) and tied for fourth in home runs (37)...are tied for the fewest stolen bases (4) after ranking second in steals in April (19)...A's pitchers have the fewest walks in the AL in May (71), rank second in fewest strikeouts (223), fourth in opponents on-base percentage (.298) and tied for fourth in saves (8)...the strikeouts are second most in May in Oakland history (230 in 2015).

AGAINST THE WEST: This series with Seattle concludes a stretch of 16 games in 16 days, all against American League West competition...are 6-7 over that span and are 8-12 (.400) against the West for the season compared to 23-12 (.657) in interdivision games...have the fourth worst intradivision record in the AL and the 20 games are tied for second fewest with the Mariners (Red Sox, 18)...have a 4.65 ERA (92 er in 178.0 ip) against the AL West and a 3.65 ERA (125 er in 308.0 ip) against all other teams.

OFFENSE: The A's have gone four consecutive games without a home run for the first time since May 6-9, 2018...homed just twice in six games on the last homestand and batted .209 (43-for-206) with 10 doubles and 21 runs scored (3.0 runs per game)...are hitting .225 overall, which is fourth lowest in the American League...however, lead the AL in hit by pitches (30), rank third in home runs (70), fourth in walks (198) and tied for fourth in triples (8)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (11) and plate appearances (49), are tied for the lead in home runs (2), RBI (9) and extra base hits (3) and tied for second in walks (5)...the A's are 24-5 when out-homer the opposition, 3-15 when they are out-homered.

PITCHING: The A's compiled a 2.29 ERA (16 er in 63.0 ip) on the last homestand, which dropped the overall ERA to a season-low tying 4.02...have the third fewest walks in the American League (150) and the fourth fewest home runs (55), but have yielded the second most hits (471)...rank second in most wild pitches (31) and third in shutouts (5) and fewest pitches per inning (16.2).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have a 1.31 ERA (5 er in 34.1 ip) and .179 (22-for-123) opponents batting average over the last five games and have surrendered just one home run...are 2-2 over the last span and 19-21 with a 4.04 ERA (138 er in 307.2 ip) for the season...the wins are third most in the American League but the losses are tied for third most...are tied for second in the AL in complete games (2) and have 307.2 innings pitched, which

is the most in the majors ahead of the Dodgers (303.0)...the two complete games match the most by an A's team over the last seven years.

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has two saves, four blown saves, a 5.62 ERA (26 er in 41.2 ip) and .275 (44-for-160) opponents batting average over the A's last 15 games...converted 12-of-13 saves with a 2.32 ERA and .201 opponents average over the previous 29 contests...is 14-for-19 (73.7%) in save opportunities, which is the third best percentage in the American League...has three losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has allowed just seven home runs over the A's last 45 games after surrendering seven over the first eight...the 14 home runs are the fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors...has allowed 25-of-66 (37.9%) inherited runners to score, which is the fifth highest percentage in the AL...has the highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.510) and the second highest batting average (.287) and on-base percentage (.373).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed one error in each of the last three games after making just two over the previous 11...have the fifth fewest errors in the American League (28) and the third best fielding percentage (.985)...have the third fewest double plays (38)...A's outfielders have three assists (all by Laureano), which is tied with the Angels for the fewest.

CLOSE CALLS (AND NOT SO CLOSE): The A's are 20-9 (.690) in games decided by three runs or fewer, which is the best record in the majors...are 11-15 (.423) in games decided by four runs or more...have outscored the opposition 116-94 in games decided by three runs or fewer (+22) but have been outscored 142-110 in games decided by four runs or more (-32)...have an overall run differential of -10 and had a positive mark just once this year (+5 on April 24)...are 11-6 (.647) in one-run games, which is the second best mark in the majors to the Mariners (12-5, .706)...the 17 one-run decisions are tied with the Mariners for the most in the American League and tied for fifth most in the majors...lead the majors with five walk-off wins and are one of five teams without a walk-off loss (Brewers, Cardinals, Reds, Pirates)...are 8-2 in games decided in the last at bat...are tied with the Mariners and Angels for the most wins in the majors when trailing after seven innings (4)...are 2-0 in extra innings and are 8-1 in extra innings over the last two years.

TEAMMATES: The A's are one of four teams in the majors (Dodgers, Red Sox, White Sox) with three pitchers with five or more wins (Bassitt, Montas, Petit)...are one of four teams (Giants, Indians, Mariners) with two pitchers with five or more saves (Diekman, Trivino)...are one of six teams (Cubs, Dodgers, Rangers, Red Sox, Rockies) with four pitchers with 10 or more starts (Bassitt, Irvin, Manaea, Montas)...are one of six teams (Angels, Braves, Blue Jays, Reds, Red Sox) with three players with 10 or more home runs (Canha, Laureano, Olson).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 13 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have four players on the IL (Fiers, Guduan, Rosenthal, Wendelken)...began the year with two players on the IL but have had at least four every day since the fifth game of the season.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's are 1-2 against the Mariners after losing two of three in Oakland last week...won the season series last year, 6-4...went 2-2 in Oakland and 4-2 in Seattle...were 10-9 in 2019 and have won back-to-back season series against the Mariners for the first time since winning three straight from 2004-06...are 17-15 against Seattle over the last three years but are 63-83 dating back to the start of the 2013 season...all-time, the A's are 367-307 against the Mariners...that includes 198-138 in Oakland, 168-166 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 92-102 at T-Mobile Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Seth Brown ranks second among Major League rookies in home runs (8) and tied for sixth in RBI (21)...**Mark Canha** leads the majors in hit by pitches (11)...ranks second in the American League in runs scored (41), eighth in on-base percentage (.386) and tied for ninth in walks (31)...**Matt Olson** is tied for sixth in the AL in home runs (13) and tied for eighth in extra base hits (24)...**Yusmeiro Petit** has seven wins, which are second most by an A's pitcher before the end of May over the last 17 years (Hill, 8 in 2016).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1987** Mark McGwire homers twice in the A's 9-5 loss at New York...the two homers give McGwire 15 in May, an Oakland record for homers in one month...he would go on to hit what was then an Oakland record 49 home runs en route to Rookie of the Year honors...in **2006** Bobby Crosby hits a solo home run in the fourth inning of the A's 7-0 victory over Kansas City, the 6000th home run in Oakland history.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: James Kaprielian (2-0, 1.53 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas May 12 and is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season and his career...has picked up the win in two of his three starts and allowed two runs or fewer in all three outings.

FIRST START: He earned his first Major League win in his first career start in the A's 4-1 victory at Boston on May 12...allowed a Gonzalez double, a Verdugo walk and a Martinez RBI single to the first three batters he faced...that would be the only run he would allow in five innings of work as he blanked the Red Sox on two hits and a walk over his final four innings.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 8-4 win at Los Angeles (AL) on May 21...Oakland scored once in the third and he allowed a solo home run to Iglesias in the bottom of the third...the A's then scored twice in the top of the sixth and he struck out the first two batters in the bottom of the sixth before allowing a solo home run to Walsh...was relieved by Petit following the home run with the A's leading 3-2 and Petit allowed a run for the blown save.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-3 win over Seattle last Wednesday in Oakland...did not allow a run in 7.0 innings, which matched his longest outing as a professional...also tossed 7.0 innings for Single-A Tampa at Charlotte on April 16, 2016, his second professional appearance...allowed two hits and two walks against the Mariners...retired each of the first eight batters and each of the final 10.

KAPRIELIAN vs. SEATTLE: Is 1-0 with a 2.08 ERA (8.2 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 7 so, 1 hr) in two career appearances, including one start...the start came in his only appearance this year, a 6-3 A's win last Wednesday in Oakland (see last start)...his other appearance came in relief on Sept. 26 of last year in Oakland (1.2 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so, 1 hr)...relieved Blackburn with one out in the third inning and the bases loaded...allowed all three runs to score on a White RBI single, a Bishop walk and a Strange-Gordon two-run single...also surrendered a leadoff home run to Seager in the fourth.

three runs to score...was on the Taxi Squad for the postseason...was rated as the A's number 10 prospect by *Baseball America* following the season..

CAREER NOTES: Made his Major League debut with Oakland in 2020 after pitching in just 27 games over his first five professional seasons due to elbow problems...compiled a 7.36 ERA and .267 opponents batting average in two relief appearances with the A's...is 6-6 with a 3.00 ERA (34 er in 102.0 ip) in 28 games, including 23 starts, as a minor leaguer...has 116 strikeouts in 102.0 innings (10.24 per nine innings)...was the New York Yankees first round draft pick in 2015 but pitched in just eight games over his first four years as a professional...missed most of 2016 with an elbow injury and then missed the entire 2017 and 2018 seasons following April 18, 2017 "Tommy John" surgery...was traded to the A's at the 2017 trading deadline in the Sonny Gray deal and is the last remaining player from that deal that also netted the A's Dustin Fowler and Jorge Mateo...pitched for Scottsdale in the Arizona Fall League in 2016...was rated by *Baseball America* as the Yankees No. 4 prospect following the 2015 season and No. 5 following 2016...was the A's No. 8 prospect after the 2017 season and No. 10 following 2020.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Chris Bassitt (5-2, 3.21 ERA): Is 5-0 with a 2.76 ERA and .193 opponents batting average over his last nine starts after going 0-2 with a 5.56 ERA and .289 opponents average over his first two starts...the five-game winning streak matches his career high (Aug. 11, 2019 to Aug. 12, 2020)...ranks fifth in the American League in strikeouts (74) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.63), sixth in opponents OPS (.603), tied for sixth in innings pitched (70.0), seventh in slugging percentage (.331), tied for eighth in wins (5), ninth in batting average (.210) and 10th in ERA (3.21) and on-base percentage (.272)...tossed his first career complete game in his last start, a two-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win over Los Angeles (AL) last Thursday in Oakland...is 1-4 with a 3.56 ERA (48.0 ip, 41 h, 21 r, 19 er, 23 bb, 33 so, 2 hr) in 10 career appearances, including eight starts, against Seattle...went 1-0 with a 0.71 ERA (12.2 ip, 8 h, 1 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 13 so, 0 hr) in two starts last year.

- Opened the season in the starting rotation and went 1-3 with a 5.79 ERA in six starts before being placed on the 10-day injured list May 2 with a fractured right hand...pitched 1.2 scoreless innings in a rehab assignment with Triple-A Las Vegas last Thursday at Sacramento (1.2 ip, h, so).
- Compiled a 5.59 ERA (6 er in 9.2 ip) in three relief outings in 2020 but has a 3.18 ERA (8 er in 22.2 ip) with two saves in 10 career appearances out of the bullpen.
