



OAKLAND ATHLETICS (31-25) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (28-27)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three straight and six of the last nine games...the three-game losing streak matches the A's second longest of the season to the season-opening six-game losing streak...are now 17-18 dating back to April 25 after starting the year 14-7...are 31-25 (.554) overall, which is the fourth best record in the American League...are in first place in the AL West for the 11th consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 41 of the last 42 days...have a ½-game lead over second place Houston...have spent 39 days alone in first place, two days tied for first, one day in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

MELVIN, LA RUSSA AND MACK: Bob Melvin won his 798th game as manager of the A's Friday, which ties Tony La Russa's record for most wins as manager of the Oakland A's...Melvin and La Russa are tied for the second most wins by a manager in franchise history to Connie Mack, who won 3,582 games as manager of the Philadelphia A's from 1901-50...Melvin began his managerial career in Seattle in 2003 and has 1,291 career wins as manager with the Mariners (2003-04), Diamondbacks (2005-09) and A's (2011-present)...he has the longest uninterrupted tenure by a manager with his current team.

A'S IN MAY: The A's finished May with a 15-14 record, which marked their third consecutive winning May (16-10 in 2019, 15-14 in 2018)...it was the A's ninth consecutive month with a winning record (min. 10 games)...batted .237 with a .741 OPS in May after hitting .214 with a .679 OPS in April...tied for third in the American League in doubles (55) and hit by pitches (12) in May, ranked fourth in walks (108) and fifth in home runs (37)...had the fewest stolen bases (4) after ranking second in steals in April (19)...had the most grounded into double plays (30)...the stolen bases were the fewest in Oakland history in the month of May (previous: 5 in 2018)...A's pitchers had the fewest walks in the AL in May (75), ranked third in fewest strikeouts (232), tied for third in fewest home runs (25) and fourth in opponents OPS (.675) and on-base percentage (.300)...the strikeouts set an Oakland record for the month of May (previous: 230 in 2015) and were third most in any month (246 in Sept. 2013, 233 in April 2021).

AGAINST THE WEST: This series with Seattle concludes a stretch of 16 games in 16 days, all against American League West competition...are 6-8 over that span and are 8-13 (.381) against the West for the season compared to 23-12 (.657) in interdivision games...have the fourth worst intradivision record in the AL and the 21 games are tied with the Mariners and Blue Jays for second fewest (Red Sox, 18)...have a 4.60 ERA (96 er in 187.2 ip) against the AL West and a 3.65 ERA (125 er in 308.0 ip) against all other teams.

OFFENSE: The A's have gone five consecutive games without a home run, which is their longest homerless drought over the last five years...it is their longest since a six-game streak from Aug. 29-Sept. 4, 2016...are batting .217 (53-for-244) with 15 doubles, two home runs and 26 runs scored over the last eight games (3.3 runs per game)...lead the American League in hit by pitches (31), rank third in home runs (70), tied for third in sacrifice flies (17), fourth in walks (200) and extra base hits (166) and tied for fourth in triples (8)...have the fourth lowest batting average (.226) and fourth most grounded into double plays (44)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (11) and plate appearances (50), are tied for the lead in home runs (2), RBI (9) and extra base hits (3) and tied for third in walks (5)...the A's are 24-5 when out-homering the opposition, 3-16 when they are out-homered.

PITCHING: The A's have a 1.77 ERA (9 er in 45.2 ip) over the last five games but have six unearned runs and a 2-3 record over that span...now have a 4.01 ERA overall, which is a season low...have the third fewest walks in the American League (154) and the fourth fewest home runs (56), but have yielded the second most hits (479)...rank third in shutouts (5) and fewest pitches per inning (16.2)...have the second most wild pitches (31).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have compiled a 3.40 ERA (38 er in 100.2 ip) over the last 17 games but have a 4-6 record over that span...are 19-21 with a 4.10 ERA (142 er in 311.1 ip) for the season...the wins are third most in the American League but the losses are tied for third most...are tied for second in the AL in complete games (2) and have 311.1 innings pitched, which is the most in the majors ahead of the Dodgers (309.2)...the two complete games match the most by an A's team over the last seven years.

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has two saves and five blown saves over the last 16 games after converting 12 of its first 13 save opportunities...is 14-for-20 (70.0%) for the season, which is the third best save percentage in the American League...has three losses over the last 16 games but just four for the season, which is still the fewest in the majors...has a 1.13 ERA (3 er in 24.0 ip) and .167 (14-for-84) opponents batting average over the last eight games and has stranded all seven of its inherited runners over that stretch...has allowed just seven home runs over the last 48 games after surrendering seven

over the first eight...the 14 home runs are the fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors...has allowed 25-of-67 (37.3%) inherited runners to score, which is the fifth highest percentage in the AL...has the highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.500) and the second highest batting average (.284) and on-base percentage (.368).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed one error in each of the last four games, which has led to six unearned runs...have the fourth fewest errors in the American League (29)...have the third fewest double plays (39)...A's outfielders have three assists (all by Laureano), which is tied with the Angels for the fewest.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on this six-game, seven-day road trip to Seattle (0-1) and Colorado (three games)...went 2-1 on the last road trip to Los Angeles (AL) and are 14-8 (.636) on the road, which is the third best road record in the American League and the majors...the 22 road games are tied with the Nationals for the fewest in the majors...have won six road series, lost none and split one...went 3-4 on the last homestand against Seattle (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-2) and are 17-17 (.500) at home...have a 3.57 ERA (76 er in 191.2 ip) on the road, which is second lowest in the AL, compared to a 4.29 ERA at home.

CLOSE CALLS (AND NOT SO CLOSE): The A's lost 6-5 in 10 innings yesterday and have now lost each of their last three one-run games...are 11-7 (.611) in one-run games, which is the fourth best record in the American League...the 18 one-run games are tied with the Mariners for the most...dropped to 2-1 in extra inning games and are now 8-2 in extra innings over the last two years...had their first walk-off loss of the season yesterday...have five walk-off wins, which is the most in the majors...are 8-3 in games decided in the last at bat...are 20-10 (.667) in games decided by three runs or fewer, which is the best record in the majors, but are 11-15 (.423) in games decided by four runs or more...are tied with the Mariners and Angels for the most wins in the majors when trailing after seven innings (4).

NO NO-NO'S: Mitch Moreland singled in the second inning yesterday to extend the A's streak of consecutive games with one or more hits to 4,661...that is the longest active streak in the majors and fourth longest in American League history...need a hit today to tie the Washington Senators (June 23, 1917-Sept. 9, 1947) for the third longest streak...the AL record is 5,550 by Kansas City (May 16, 1973-May 18, 2008)...the A's were last no-hit on July 13, 1991 when four Baltimore Orioles pitchers combined on a no-hitter (Milacki, Flanagan, Williamson, Olson)...there have been 83 no-hitters of nine or more innings since then.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's placed Ramón Laureano on the injured list today and have now used the IL 14 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have five players on the IL (Fiers, Guduan, Laureano Rosenthal, Wendelken)...began the year with two players on the IL but have had at least four every day since the fifth game of the season.

A'S vs. MARINERS: The A's are 1-3 against the Mariners...lost the first game in Seattle last night after losing two of three in Oakland last week...won the season series last year, 6-4...went 2-2 in Oakland and 4-2 in Seattle...were 10-9 in 2019 and have won back-to-back season series against the Mariners for the first time since winning three straight from 2004-06...are 17-16 against Seattle over the last three years but are 63-84 dating back to the start of the 2013 season...all-time, the A's are 367-308 against the Mariners...that includes 198-138 in Oakland, 168-167 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 92-103 at T-Mobile Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha leads the majors in hit by pitches (12)...ranks second in the American League in runs scored (42), sixth in on-base percentage (.387) and tied for seventh in walks (32)...**Matt Olson** is tied for sixth in the AL in home runs (13), tied for seventh in extra base hits (25) and ranks 10th in OPS (.893) and slugging (.545).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1932** Max Bishop hits a two-run home run in the bottom of the 16th inning in the first game of a doubleheader against New York after the Yankees score once in top of the inning...Lefty Grove pitches eight innings of relief in the A's 8-7 win...in **2006** Barry Zito strikes out Lew Ford in the sixth inning to become the fourth pitcher in Oakland history and the eighth in Athletics history with 1000 career strikeouts...in **2018** the A's shutout the Royals at Kansas City 16-0 to tie the Athletics record for margin of victory in a shutout...Matt Olson and Dustin Fowler both homered twice for the A's.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (5-2, 3.21 ERA)

FIVE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 5-0 with a 2.76 ERA (18 er in 58.2 ip) and .193 (41-for-212) opponents batting average over his last nine starts after going 0-2 with a 5.56 ERA and .289 opponents average over his first two starts...the five-game winning streak matches his career high (Aug. 11, 2019 to Aug. 12, 2020)...has left with the lead in two of his four no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save.

GO THE DISTANCE: Tossed his first career complete game in his last start last Thursday against Los Angeles (AL), a two-hit shutout...it came in his 77th career start, his 72nd with the A's...the 71 consecutive starts without a complete game is the second longest streak in Athletics history (113, Barry Zito, Aug. 22, 2003-Sept. 28, 2006).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks sixth in the American League in strikeouts (74), opponents OPS (.603), opponents slugging percentage (.331) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.63), tied for sixth in innings pitched (70.0), eighth in ERA (3.21), tied for eighth in wins (5) and ninth in opponents batting average (.210) and on-base percentage (.272)...has allowed five home runs and his average of 0.64 home runs per nine innings is sixth lowest in the AL...leads the AL in hit by pitches (7) ranks second in fewest pitches per inning (14.7)...is scheduled to make his 12th start today, which will tie him for the AL lead.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed five home runs, all to left-handed hitters...has surrendered 23 of his 32 home runs over the last three years to lefties...has not allowed a home run to a right-handed hitter since Aug. 12, 2020 (Rendon, LAA)...has a .135 opponents batting average with two strikes, which is ninth lowest in the American League...opponents are hitting .189 (10-for-53) with runners in scoring position, which is also ninth lowest in the AL...has a .253 (22-for-87) opponents batting average the first time through the order, .159 (14-for-88) the second time and .220 (18-for-82) after that...has a .138 (4-for-29) batting average against the opponents number one hitter in the order but has issued six of his 16 walks to that batter (.306 on-base percentage).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-0 with a 3.44 ERA (14 er in 36.2 ip) in six starts on the road compared to 1-2 with a 2.97 ERA (11 er in 33.1 ip) in five starts home...is tied for second in the American League in road wins...has a 10-12 career record in the Coliseum, but has a 2.52 ERA (62 er in 221.2 ip), which is fifth lowest in Coliseum history among pitchers with 200 or more innings pitched.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 1-1 with a 3.46 ERA (10 er in 26.0 ip) in three starts on four days rest compared to 4-0 with a 2.79 ERA (12 er in 38.2 ip) in six starts on five days rest...now has a nine-game winning streak when starting on five days rest dating back to July 19, 2019...has a 2.79 ERA (26 er in 84.0 ip) in 14 starts over that span...according to TruMedia, the longest winning streak in starts on five days rest in Oakland history is 10 by Mike Fiers (May 7-Aug. 27, 2019) and Mark Mulder (June 18, 2002-July 10, 2003).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 8-3 (.727) in his starting assignments and are 31-16 (.660) when he starts over the last three years...has walked one batter or fewer in seven of his 11 starts this year...has yielded five hits or fewer seven times...has six starts with eight or more strikeouts...has received two runs of support or fewer in four of his 11 starts and is 0-2 in those starts...is 20-1 in 32 career starts with three runs of support or more, 4-22 in 45 starts with two runs of support or fewer...his win in his last start improved his career record to 24-23, which is the first time in his career he has been over .500.

POST-TOMMY JOHN: Did not pitch in the majors in 2017 following May 6, 2016 "Tommy John" surgery...is 22-12 with a 3.27 ERA (118 er in 324.2 ip) and is averaging 8.62 strikeouts per nine innings (311 so in 324.2 ip) in 60 games (53 starts) since the surgery...was 2-11 with a 4.13 ERA and 6.77 strikeouts per nine innings in 29 games (23 starts) before the surgery.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Was the A's Opening Day starting pitcher and took the loss in an 8-1 decision to Houston on April 1 in Oakland...became the A's 14th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 16 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill, Graveman twice, Fiers, Montas)...allowed a run in the fourth inning to snap a 16.2-inning scoreless streak during the regular season and a 27.1-inning home scoreless streak, which was ninth longest in Oakland history...lost his second start on April 6, a 5-1 loss to Los Angeles (NL) on April 6 in Oakland when he allowed a season-high four runs on a season-high nine hits in 6.0 innings...allowed two home runs in the third, which were his first home runs in the Coliseum since Aug. 24, 2019...that snapped a 10-game, 55.1-inning, 229-batter homerless streak in Oakland...that ran his record to 0-2 with a 5.56 ERA...then allowed exactly two runs in each of his next six starts to become the second pitcher in Athletic history to allow exactly two runs in six consecutive games...joins Bob Davis of the Kansas City A's, who did it all in re-

lief from Aug. 8-26, 1960...went 3-0 with a 2.92 ERA over that stretch which ran from April 12 to May 11...allowed just two hits in 5.0 innings for the win on April 12 at Arizona...the innings pitched are a season low and he walked a season-high five batters...tied an Oakland record with three hit batters April 29 at Tampa Bay (12th time, last: Fiers, June 22, 2019, also against Tampa Bay)...left his start on May 5 against Toronto with a 3-2 lead but ended up win a no decision in the A's 9-4 loss...Trivino allowed five runs in the eighth inning for the blown save...it was the first of two times he left with a lead only to have the bullpen blow the save (also May 16 at Minnesota)...struck out a season-high 10 batters in a 3-2 win at Boston on May 11...it was his third career game of 10 or more strikeouts...did not walk a batter, the second time he has fanned 10 or more without issuing a free pass...is one of nine pitchers in Oakland history with two such games...allowed a season-high tying four runs in a no decision at Minnesota on May 16...then won each of his final two starts in May and finished the month with a 3-0 record, a 2.52 ERA and .175 opponents batting average in five starts...struck out 38 and walked just four in 35.2 innings.

LAST START: He tossed his first career complete game and shutout, a two-hitter in the A's 5-0 win over Los Angeles (AL) last Thursday in Oakland...tossed a season-high 114 pitches, struck out nine and walked one...allowed a one-out single to Lagares in the third and walked Ohtani to start the fourth...then retired 16 straight before Upton doubled with one out in the ninth.

BASSITT vs. SEATTLE: Is 1-4 with a 3.56 ERA (48.0 ip, 41 h, 21 r, 19 er, 23 bb, 33 so, 2 hr) in 10 career appearances, including eight starts...is 1-2 with a 4.55 ERA (15 er in 29.2 ip) in seven games in Seattle and 0-2 with a 2.45 ERA (5 er in 18.1 ip) in three starts in Oakland...went 1-0 with a 0.71 ERA (12.2 ip, 8 h, 1 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 13 so, 0 hr) in two starts last year...the win came in a 3-2 A's victory in Seattle on Aug. 2...allowed a

RBI single to Vogelbach in the first inning but then blanked the Mariners on two hits over his final 4.2 innings...retired 10 straight at one point...Oakland scored three times in the fifth to take a 3-1 lead and he was relieved by McFarland with two outs in the sixth...had a no decision in the A's 3-1, 10-inning win on Sept. 25 in Oakland...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings and allowed five hits without walking a batter...yielded singles to Crawford and Seager in the first but then retired 12 straight...allowed back-to-back singles to Odom and Crawford with one out in the sixth, which was the only time the Mariners got a runner into scoring position.

2020 RECAP: Spent the entire season on the active roster for the first time in his six-year career and went 5-2 with a 2.29 ERA in 11 starts...his ERA ranked second among pitchers in the West divisions (Lamet, SD 2.09) and sixth in the majors...it was fifth lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with at least 10 starts...also tied for fifth in the West divisions in winning percentage (.714), ranked seventh in opponents OPS (.659), batting average (.233) and slugging percentage (.371), tied for seventh in wins and eighth in on-base percentage (.288)...had career lows in ERA and opponents on-base percentage.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Sean Manaea (3-2, 3.86 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 12th start of the season...has allowed five runs in 17.2 innings over his last three starts (2.55 ERA), all no decisions, after allowing seven runs in 2.0 innings on May 13 at Boston...has six no decisions, which is tied for third most in the American League...four of his no decisions have come in his six starts in which he has allowed one run or fewer...held left-handed hitters to a .153 batting average, which is fourth lowest in the AL...is averaging 2.08 walks per nine innings, which is tied for ninth lowest...ranks seventh in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.43)...had a no decision in his last start, a 3-1 A's win over Los Angeles (AL) last Friday in Oakland (6.2 ip, 6 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 8 so)...is 6-5 with a 3.84 ERA (72.2 ip, 60 h, 33 r, 31 er, 21 bb, 55 so, 6 hr) in 12 career starts against Seattle...was the losing pitcher in his only start last year year, a 5-3 A's loss at Seattle on July 31 (4.1 ip, 6 h, 5 r, 3 er, 0 bb, 4 so).
