



OAKLAND ATHLETICS (32-25) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (28-28)

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their three-game losing streak last night and are now 4-6 over the last 10 games...are 18-18 dating back to April 25 after starting the year 14-7...are 32-25 (.561) overall, which is the fourth best record in the American League...are in first place in the AL West for the 12th consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 42 of the last 43 days...have a ½-game lead over second place Houston...have spent 40 days alone in first place, two days tied for first, one day in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

MELVIN, LA RUSSA AND MACK: Bob Melvin won his 799th game as manager of the A's last night to set the Oakland record for games won by a manager...broke the previous mark of 798 held by Tony La Russa...now has the second most wins in Athletics history to Connie Mack, who won 3,582 games as manager of the Philadelphia A's from 1901-50...Melvin began his managerial career in Seattle in 2003 and has 1,292 career wins as manager with the Mariners (2003-04), Diamondbacks (2005-09) and A's (2011-present)...he has the longest uninterrupted tenure by a manager with his current team.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's conclude a stretch of 16 games in 16 days, all against American League West competition, tonight...are 7-8 over that span and are 9-13 (.409) against the West for the season compared to 23-12 (.657) in interdivision games...have the fourth worst intradivision record in the AL and the 22 games are tied for third fewest...have a 4.67 ERA (102 er in 196.2 ip) against the AL West and a 3.65 ERA (125 er in 308.0 ip) against all other teams.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have split the first two games of this series with Seattle...have won six road series, lost none and split one and the season-opening streak of seven consecutive road series without a loss is second longest in Oakland history...won the first eight road series in 1988...are 1-1 on this six-game, seven-day road trip to Seattle (1-1) and Colorado (three games)...went 2-1 on the last road trip to Los Angeles (AL) and are 15-8 (.652) on the road, which is the second best road record in the majors to Tampa Bay (20-8, .714)...the 23 road games are tied with the Astros, Braves and Nationals for the fewest in the majors...went 3-4 on the last homestand against Seattle (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-2) and are 17-17 (.500) at home...are batting .248 (196-for-789) with 111 runs scored (4.8 per game) and 33 home runs in 23 games on the road compared to .213 with 132 runs scored (3.9 per game) and 39 home runs in 34 games on the road...have the fourth best road batting average in the American League and the second lowest home batting average.

OFFENSE: The A's homered twice last night to snap a five-game homerless streak, which was their longest over the last five years...had a season-high tying 13 hits last night (third time, last: May 21 at Los Angeles-AL) and scored 12 runs, which was just their second double-digit effort of the season (13, April 21 vs. Minnesota)...lead the American League in hit by pitches (32), rank third in home runs (72) and sacrifice flies (18), fourth in walks (206) and extra base hits (173) and tied for fourth in triples (8)...have the fourth most grounded into double plays (44), the fifth lowest batting average (.228) and the fifth most strikeouts (508)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (11) and plate appearances (50), are tied for the lead in home runs (2), RBI (9) and extra base hits (3) and tied for third in walks (5)...the A's are 24-5 when out-homering the opposition, 3-16 when they are out-homered.

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.47 ERA (15 er in 54.2 ip) over the last six games but have six unearned runs and a 3-3 record over that span...are tied for the second fewest walks in the American League (157) and have the fourth fewest home runs (58), but have yielded the second most hits (490)...rank third in shutouts (5) and fewest pitches per inning (16.3)...have the second most wild pitches (31).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have compiled a 3.61 ERA (42 er in 104.2 ip) over the last 18 games but have a 4-6 record over that span...are 19-21 with a 4.17 ERA (146 er in 315.1 ip) for the season...the wins and losses are both tied for third most in the American League...are tied for second in the AL in complete games (2) and have 315.1 innings pitched, which is the most in the majors ahead of the Dodgers (311.1)...the two complete games match the most by an A's team over the last seven years.

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has two saves and five blown saves over the last 17 games after converting 12 of its first 13 save opportunities...is 14-for-20 (70.0%) for the season, which is the third best save percentage in the American League and the majors...has three losses over the last 17 games but just four for the season, which is still the fewest in the majors...has a 1.55 ERA (5 er in 29.0 ip) and .183 (19-for-104) opponents batting average over the last nine games and has stranded all seven of its inherited runners over that

stretch...has allowed just eight home runs over the last 49 games after surrendering seven over the first eight...the 15 home runs are the fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors...has allowed 25-of-67 (37.3%) inherited runners to score, which is the fifth highest percentage in the AL...has the highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.500) and the second highest batting average (.287) and on-base percentage (.374).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed four errors over the last five games, which has led to six unearned runs...have the fourth fewest errors in the American League (29)...have the third fewest double plays (39)...A's outfielders have three assists (all by Laureano), which is tied with the Angels for the fewest.

CLOSE CALLS (AND NOT SO CLOSE): The A's trailed 4-2 after six innings last night but scored 10 times in their final three at bats to win 12-6...it was their sixth win when trailing after six innings, which is tied with the Angels for the most in the majors...are now 12-15 (.444) in games decided by four runs or more compared to 20-10 (.667) in games decided by three runs or fewer, which is the best record in the majors...have lost each of their last three one-run games but are 11-7 (.611) for the season, which is the fourth best record in the American League...the 18 one-run games are tied with the Mariners for the most in the AL...are 2-1 in extra inning games and are now 8-2 in extra innings over the last two years...had their first walk-off loss of the season Monday...have five walk-off wins, which is the most in the majors...are 8-3 in games decided in the last at bat.

NO NO-NO'S: Matt Olson homered to lead off the second inning yesterday to extend the A's streak of consecutive games with one or more hits to 4,662...that is the longest active streak in the majors and it ties the Washington Senators (June 23, 1917-Sept. 9, 1947) for the third longest streak in American League history...the Yankees have the second longest streak (5,027 from Sept. 21, 1958-July 8, 1990) and the AL record is 5,550 by Kansas City (May 16, 1973-May 18, 2008)...the A's were last no-hit on July 13, 1991 when four Baltimore Orioles pitchers combined on a no-hitter (Milacki, Flanagan, Williamson, Olson)...there have been 83 no-hitters of nine or more innings since then.

A'S IN MAY: The A's finished May with a 15-14 record, which marked their third consecutive winning May (16-10 in 2019, 15-14 in 2018)...it was the A's ninth consecutive month with a winning record (min. 10 games)...batted .237 with a .741 OPS in May after hitting .214 with a .679 OPS in April...tied for third in the American League in doubles (55) and hit by pitches (12) in May, ranked fourth in walks (108) and fifth in home runs (37)...had the fewest stolen bases (4) after ranking second in steals in April (19)...had the most grounded into double plays (30)...the stolen bases were the fewest in Oakland history in the month of May (previous: 5 in 2018)...A's pitchers had the fewest walks in the AL in May (75), ranked third in fewest strikeouts (232), tied for third in fewest home runs (25) and fourth in opponents OPS (.675) and on-base percentage (.300)...the strikeouts set an Oakland record for the month of May (previous: 230 in 2015) and were third most in any month (246 in Sept. 2013, 233 in April 2021).

A'S vs. MARINERS: The A's are 2-3 against the Mariners...have split the first two games in Seattle after losing two of three in Oakland last week...won the season series last year, 6-4...went 2-2 in Oakland and 4-2 in Seattle...were 10-9 in 2019 and have won back-to-back season series against the Mariners for the first time since winning three straight from 2004-06...are 18-16 against Seattle over the last three years but are 64-84 dating back to the start of the 2013 season...all-time, the A's are 368-308 against the Mariners...that includes 198-138 in Oakland, 169-167 in Seattle and 1-3 in Tokyo...are 93-103 at T-Mobile Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha leads the majors in hit by pitches (12)...ranks second in the American League in runs scored (43), seventh in on-base percentage (.375) and tied for eighth in walks (32)...**Matt Olson** is tied for fourth in the AL in home runs (14), ranks sixth in slugging (.560), tied for sixth in extra base hits (26) and ninth in OPS (.914).

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (3-2, 3.86 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 12th start of the season...has allowed five runs in 17.2 innings over his last three starts (2.55 ERA), all no decisions, after allowing seven runs in 2.0 innings on May 13 at Boston...has six no decisions, which is tied for third most in the American League.

SUPPORT: Allowed one run in his last start against Los Angeles (AL), the sixth time he has allowed one run or fewer in his 11 starts...had a no decision in that start against the Angels and it was the fourth time in his six no decisions that he allowed just one run...has received one run of support in three of his six no decisions and the bullpen blew the save in one other no decision...the A's are 5-1 in his no decisions and are 8-3 (.727) in his starting assignments...are 19-8 (.704) when he starts over the last three years...has received one run of support or fewer in five of his 11 starts and is 0-2 in those starts...is 3-0 in six starts with two runs of support or more.

DON'T WALK: Walked a season-high tying three batters in his last start (also April 4 vs. Houston)...has three starts with no walks and four others with one...is averaging 2.08 walks per nine innings, which is tied for 10th lowest in the American League...ranks seventh in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.43)...over the last four years, he has walked two batters or fewer in 47 of his 54 starts (17 with no walks, 21 with one)...has 61 walks in 305.0 innings over that span, an average of 1.80 per nine innings.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held left-handed hitters to a .153 (9-for-59) batting average, which is fourth lowest in the American League...has a .317 (57-for-180) mark against right-handers...has allowed 66 hits, which is tied for third most in the AL.

APRIL AND MAY: Went 0-1 with a 4.78 ERA (17 er in 32.0 ip) and .300 (39-for-130) opponents batting average in six starts in May after going 3-1 with a 2.83 ERA and .248 opponents batting average in five starts in April...is now 5-9 with a 5.51 ERA in 21 career starts in May compared to 8-4 with a 2.97 ERA in 16 starts in April...his May ERA is his highest for any month (5.22 in August)...is 8-2 with a 3.27 ERA (31 er in 85.1 ip) in 14 career starts in June.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 1-0 with a 1.66 ERA (7 er in 38.0 ip) in six starts on four days rest compared to 2-1 with a 7.00 ERA (14 er in 18.0 ip) in four starts on five days rest...over the last three years, he is 5-1 with a 2.77 ERA (24 er in 78.0 ip) in 14 starts on four days rest, 3-2 with a 6.11 ERA (19 er in 28.0 ip) in six starts on five days rest.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-1 with a 3.38 ERA (16 er in 42.2 ip) and .256 (42-for-164) opponents batting average in seven starts at home compared to 1-1 with a 5.00 ERA (10 er in 18.0 ip) and .320 (24-for-75) opponents batting average in four starts on the road...over the last two years, he is 5-2 with a 3.57 ERA (27 er in 68.0 ip) in 12 starts in Oakland, 2-3 with a 5.01 ERA (26 er in 46.2 ip) in 10 starts on the road...is 23-14 in his career in the Coliseum compared to 19-19 on the road.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 5.32 ERA (13 er in 22.0 ip) over the first two innings of his two starts, a 3.60 ERA (8 er in 20.0 ip) in innings three and four and a 2.41 ERA (5 er in 18.2 ip) from the fifth inning on.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Tossed a season-high 101 pitches in his first start on April 4 against Houston and allowed five runs on six hits and a season-high three walks in 4.2 innings for the loss...then went 3-0 with a 1.50 ERA over his next four starts...picked up his first win of the season in the 100th game of his career, an 8-4 victory over Detroit on April 15...tossed a six-hit, seven-inning shutout in the A's 7-0 win over Minnesota in the first game of the double-header April 20...it was the 11th complete game shutout of fewer than eight innings in Oakland history (last: Mike Minor, Sept. 14, 2020 at Seattle)...it was his second career complete game and shutout, with the other being his no-hitter on April 21, 2018 against Boston...the start was the 100th of his career and he became the 25th pitcher in Oakland history to make 100 starts...struck out a career-high tying 10 batters in a season-high 7.1 innings on May 7 against Tampa Bay, but had a no decision in the A's 2-1 win...it was his fourth career 10-strikeout game, his first since Sept. 8, 2019 against Detroit...retired each of the first 18 batters he faced before walking Arozarena to start the seventh...then retired the next three before Brosseau led off the eighth inning with a double...allowed a season-high seven runs on a season-high 10 hits in a season-low 2.0 innings for the loss at Boston on May 13...has allowed seven or more runs in a start three times in his career, all at Fenway Park (8 on May 10, 2016; 7 on Sept. 12, 2017)...also allowed 10 hits in his next start on May 18 against Houston to become the first A's pitcher to yield 10 hits in back-to-back starts since Kendall Graveman in 2016 (April 25-May 2)...had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Los Angeles (AL) on May 23...left with a 4-1 lead but the bullpen blew the save...struck out Justin Upton to lead off the game for the 50,000 strikeout in Oakland history...fanned Taylor Ward to end the fourth inning for his 500th career strikeout.

LAST START: He had his third straight no decision in the A's 3-1 win over Los Angeles (AL) last Friday in Oakland...walked a season-high tying three bat-

ters...blanked the Angels on four hits and three walks over the first six innings...the A's scored their first run in the sixth inning but he allowed a RBI single to Fletcher in the seventh and left with two outs in the seventh and the scored tied 1-1...Oakland scored twice in the bottom of the seventh for the win.

MANAEA vs. SEATTLE: Is 6-5 with a 3.84 ERA (72.2 ip, 60 h, 33 r, 31 er, 21 bb, 55 so, 6 hr) in 12 career starts...is 3-0 with a 3.65 ERA (10 er in 24.2 ip) in four starts in Oakland and 3-5 with a 3.94 ERA (21 er in 48.0 ip) in eight starts in Seattle...was the losing pitcher in his only start last year year, a 5-3 A's loss at Seattle on July 31...retired each of the first nine batters before allowing three runs (two earned) in the fourth inning on a Seager two-run double and an error...put runners on first and third with one out in the fifth and was relieved by Wendelken, who allowed both runners to score (one earned).

2020 RECAP: Went 4-3 with a 4.50 ERA in 11 starts...the ERA was the highest of his career as was his .270 opponents batting average...his .427 slugging percentage matched his high...went 4-1 with a 2.65 ERA and .234 opponents batting average over his final six starts dating back to Aug. 20...the wins tied for fourth most in the majors over that span...went 0-2 with a 7.65 ERA and .325 opponents average over his first five starts...tied for the team lead in starts...walked just eight batters in 54.0 innings, an average of 1.33 walks per nine innings...that was the lowest mark of his career and was sixth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 50 or more innings pitched...struck out 45 for a career-best 5.63 strikeout-to-walk ratio...had five starts without a walk, five with one and three in his other...had a 2.56 ERA and .233 opponents batting average over the first three innings of his starts compared to a 7.59 ERA and .319 opponents average from the fourth inning on...his .270 opponents batting average broke down to .250 (13-for-52) against left-handed hitters compared to .277 (44-for-159) against right-handers...issued seven of eight walks to righties...had a .204 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .327 with seven of his eight walks after that...had a .281 batting average against batters leading off an inning but issued just one walk (.293 on-base percentage)...yielded a .222 average with the bases empty, .373 with runners on...went 2-1 with a 3.32 ERA and .182 opponents batting average in four starts during the day, 2-2 with a 5.29 ERA and .321 opponent average in seven starts at night...was 3-1 with a 3.91 ERA and .232 opponents batting average in five starts in Oakland, 1-2 with a 5.02 ERA and .302 opponents average in five starts on the road...was charged with five unearned runs, which tied for eighth most in the majors...was 0-3 in four starts with two runs of support or fewer, 4-0 in seven starts with three or more...is now 5-31 in 53 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 37-2 in 54 starts with support of three or more.

RHP Frankie Montas (5-5, 4.45 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 12th start of the season...was charged with his fifth loss of the season in his last start, which matches his career high from last year...has five wins, which matches his second best total (9 in 2019)...is tied for eighth in the American League in losses and tied for ninth in wins...has surrendered 11 home runs, which is a career-high and tied for fifth most in the AL...is 0-3 with a 3.24 ERA over his last three starts, which matches the longest losing streak of his career...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 4-0 A's loss to Los Angeles (AL) last Saturday in Oakland (5.2 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 0 er, 1 bb, 7 so)...is 0-2 with a 4.82 ERA (9.1 ip, 13 h, 5 r, 5 er, 4 b, 9 so, 1 hr) in two career two starts against Colorado...was the losing pitcher in his only start last year, a 5-1 A's loss in Oakland on July 29 (5.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...has a five-game losing streak in interleague play and is now 2-5 with an 8.38 ERA in 11 games in his career.
