## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (33-25) VS. COLORADO ROCKIES (23-34)

FRIDAY, JUNE 4, 2021 — COORS FIELD — 6:40 MDT

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Won two of three at Seattle to start the road trip and are 5-3 over the last eight games...are 19-18 dating back to April 25 after starting the year 14-7...are 33-25 (.569) overall, which is the fourth best record in the American League...are eight games over .500, which is one short of the season high of nine (three times, last: May 28)...are in first place in the AL West for the 14th consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 44 of the last 45 days...have a one-game lead over second place Houston...have spent 42 days alone in first place, two days tied for first, one day in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

**GO THE DISTANCE:** Sean Manaea tossed the A's third complete game of the season on Wednesday, a four-hit shutout...the three complete games are tied with the White Sox for the most in the majors and are the most by an A's team since 2015 (5)...A's starting pitchers have 324.1 innings pitched, which is the most in the majors ahead of the Dodgers (317.1)...starters are 5-3 with a 2.23 ERA (18 er in 72.2 ip) and .207 (55-for-266) opponents batting average over the last eight games, which includes two shutouts...are 20-21 with a 4.05 ERA (146 er in 324.1 ip) for the season...the wins are tied for third most in the American league and the losses are fourth most.

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** The A's are 3-2 in interleague play (2-0 vs. Arizona, 1-2 vs. Los Angeles)...in addition to this two-game series at Colorado, the A's will also travel to San Francisco (June 25-27) and San Diego (July 27-28)...will host Arizona (June 8-9), San Diego (Aug. 3-4) and San Francisco (Aug. 20-22)...went 10-10 (.500) in interleague play last year and finished with a .500 record or better against the National League for the third consecutive season and 17th time in 24 years of interleague play...are 241-208 (.537) all-time in interleague games, which is fourth best in Major League history.

**PITCHERS HITTING:** A's pitchers went 0-for-4 with three strikeouts in two games at Arizona earlier this year...are now batting .092 (40-for-433) with four doubles, 13 RBI, 14 walks and 201 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is second lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .078)...the last home run by an A's pitcher in the regular season was by Blue Moon Odom on Sept. 4, 1972 against California (Ken Holtzman homered in Game 4 of the 1974 World Series)...that is the longest active pitcher homerless drought by any team...Odom also had the last triple on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...the last extra base hit was by Joe Kennedy, a double on June 12, 2007 at Houston.

**IN THE PINCH:** A's pinch hitters lead the American League in hits (11) and plate appearances (50), are tied for the lead in home runs (2), rank second in RBI (9), tied for second in extra base hits (3) and tied for third in walks (5).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's won two of three at Seattle to start the road trip and have now won seven road series, lost none and split one...the season-opening streak of eight consecutive road series without a loss matches the longest such streak in Athletics history...won the first eight road series in 1988...are 2-1 on this six-game, seven-day road trip to Seattle (2-1) and Colorado (three games)...went 2-1 on the last road trip to Los Angeles (AL) and are 16-8 (.667) on the road, which is the second best road record in the majors to Tampa Bay (21-9, .700)...the 24 road games are third fewest in the majors (Astros and Braves, 23)...return home following the game on Sunday for a nine-game homestand against Arizona (two games), Kansas City (four games) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...went 3-4 on the last homestand against Seattle (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-2) and are 17-17 (.500) at home...have the fourth best road batting average in the American League (.249) and the second lowest home batting average (.213).

**OFFENSE:** The A's hit .292 (33-for-113) with 23 runs, 12 doubles and three home runs in the three-game series at Seattle after batting .209 with 21 runs, 10 doubles and two home runs in seven games on the last homestand...lead the American League in hit by pitches (32), rank third in home runs (73), fourth in walks (207), extra base hits (176) and sacrifice flies (18) and tied for fourth in triples (8).

**PITCHING:** The A's had their second shutout in the last seven games on Wednesday and now have six for the season, which is tied for second most in the American League (Yankees, 8)...have a 2.12 ERA (15 er in 63.2 ip) over the last seven games, which has dropped the season ERA under 4.00 for the first time this year (3.98)...are tied for the fewest walks in the AL (159) and have the fourth fewest home runs (58), but have yielded the second most hits (494).

**BULLPEN:** The A's bullpen has two saves and five blown saves over the last 18 games after converting 12 of its first 13 save opportunities...is 14-for-20 (70.0%) for the season, which is the third best save percentage in the American League...has four losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has a 1.55 ERA (5 er in 29.0 ip) and .183 (19-for-104) opponents batting average over the last 10 games and has stranded all seven of its inherited runners over that stretch...has allowed just eight home runs over the last 50 games after surrendering seven over the first eight...the 15 home runs are the fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors...has allowed 25-of-67 (37.3%) inherited runners to score, which is the fifth highest percentage in the AL...has the highest batting average (.298) and slugging percentage (.500) against first batters faced in the AL and the second highest on-base percentage (.374).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed five errors over the last six games, which has led to six unearned runs...are tied for the fourth fewest errors in the American League (30)...have the third fewest double plays (42)...A's outfielders have three assists (all by Laureano), which is tied with the Angels for the fewest.

**CLOSE CALLS (AND NOT SO CLOSE):** The A's are 20-10 (.667) in games decided by three runs or fewer, which is the best record in the majors...however, are 13-15 (.464) in games decided by four runs or more...have lost each of their last three one-run games but are 11-7 (.611) for the season, which is the fourth best record in the American League...the 18 one-run games are tied with the Mariners and Twins for the most in the AL...have five walk-off wins, which is tied with the Rockies and the Yankees for the most in the majors...are 8-3 in games decided in the last at bat...are 2-1 in extra inning games and are now 8-2 in extra innings over the last two years.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's had their seventh off day of the season yesterday...are 6-0 following a day off and are the only undefeated team in the majors following a day off...out-scored Seattle 18-6 over the final two games and now have a run differential of +1 for the season...it marks just the second time this year the A's have a positive run differential...were at +5 on April 24, which was the A's 13th consecutive win...are 25-5 when out-homering the opposition, 3-16 when they are out-homered...Bob Melvin won his 799th game as manager of the A's Tuesday night at Seattle to set the Oakland record for games won by a manager...broke the previous mark of 798 held by Tony La Russa.

**A'S IN MAY:** The A's finished May with a 15-14 record, which marked their third consecutive winning May (16-10 in 2019, 15-14 in 2018)...it was the A's ninth consecutive month with a winning record (min. 10 games)...batted .237 with a .741 OPS in May after hitting .214 with a .679 OPS in April...tied for third in the American League in doubles (55) and hit by pitches (12) in May, ranked fourth in walks (108) and fifth in home runs (37)...had the fewest stolen bases (4) after ranking second in steals in April (19)...the stolen bases were the fewest in Oakland history in the month of May (previous: 5 in 2018)...A's pitchers had the fewest walks in the AL in May (75), ranked third in fewest strikeouts (232), tied for third in fewest home runs (25) and fourth in opponents OPS (.675) and on-base percentage (.300)...the strikeouts set an Oakland record for the month of May (previous: 230 in 2015).

**A'S vs. ROCKIES:** The A's lost three of four to Colorado last year for their second consecutive season series loss...have now lost seven of their 11 season series to Colorado...split two games in Colorado last year and were swept in a two-game series in Oakland...have lost seven of the last nine games, including four of the last five at Coors Field...are 16-19 all-time, which includes 9-7 in Oakland and 7-12 in Denver.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Mark Canha** leads the majors in hit by pitches (12) and is tied for the American League lead in runs scored (44)...ranks sixth in the AL in on-base percentage (.382) and tied for ninth in walks (32)...**Matt Olson** ranks fourth in the AL in OPS (.931), tied for fourth in home runs (14), fifth in slugging (.570) and tied for sixth in extra base hits (27).

### THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1971** the A's take a 3-0 lead into the bottom of the ninth at Washington before the Senators score three times to send the game into extra innings...the A's finally win with two runs in the top of the 21st inning to win the longest game (by innings) in Oakland history...in **1972** Catfish Hunter pitches a two-hit shutout in the first game of a double-header at Baltimore for his 100th career victory...in **2007** Mark Ellis hits for the cycle in the A's 5-4, 11-inning win over Boston...he completes the cycle with a single in the 10th inning and Eric Chavez wins the game with a walk-off home run in the 11th.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (5-5, 4.45 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his 12th start of the season, which is the second most of his career (16 in 2019)...was charged with his fifth loss of the season in his last start, which matches his career high from last year...has five wins, which matches his second best total (9 in 2019)...is tied for ninth in the American League in wins and losses...has surrendered 11 home runs, which is a career-high and tied for fifth most in the AL.

**THREE-GAME LOSING STREAK:** Went 0-3 with a 3.24 ERA (6 er in 16.2 ip) over his last three starts in May and the three-game losing streak matches his career high (Sept. 13, 2020 to April 5, 2021)...was 3-0 with a 3.12 ERA over his first three starts in the month and 3-3 with a 3.18 ERA in six starts overall in May...was 2-2 with a 6.20 ERA in five starts in April...his three wins in May match his most ever in a month...struck out 38 in May, which tied for eighth most in the American League.

**INTERLEAGUE PLAY:** Took the loss in his only interleague start this year on April 5 against the Dodgers (2.2 ip, 7 h, 7 r, 7 er, 3 bb, 4 so) and now has a five-game losing streak against the National League...has a 10.27 ERA (27 er in 23.2 ip) and .373 (38-for-102) opponents batting average over that six start span, which dates back to July 29, 2018...is now 2-5 with an 8.38 ERA (36 er in 38.2 ip) in 11 career games (eight starts) in interleague play...is 21-14 with a 3.68 ERA (115 er in 281.0 ip) in 70 games (43 starts) against American League competition.

**WITH THE BAT:** Went 0-for-1 with a walk in 2019 and is now 0-for-6 with a walk and five strikeouts in his career as a hitter...never batted as a minor leaguer.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 2-1 with a 2.50 ERA (5 er in 18.0 ip) and .239 (17-for-71) opponents batting average in three starts on the road compared to 3-3 with a 5.31 ERA (24 er in 40.2 ip) and .285 (49-for-172) opponents batting average in seven starts at home...last year, he went 2-1 with a 2.56 ERA in six starts at home, 1-4 with a 10.13 ERA in five starts on the road.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 3-1 with a 2.63 ERA (7 er in 24.0 ip) in four starts on five days rest, 2-3 with a 4.22 ERA (15 er in 32.0 ip) in six starts on four days rest.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Opposing left-handed hitters have struck out 42 times in 122 at bats against him compared to 21 strikeouts in 121 at bats by right-handed hitters...has a .205 (18-for-88) opponents batting average the first time through the order, .330 (31-for-94) the second time and .279 (17-for-61) with six of his 11 home runs after that.

**THIS AND THAT:** Has allowed 11 of his 33 runs and 22 of his 66 hits in the third inning for a 9.28 ERA (11 er in 10.2 ip) and .407 (22-for-54) opponents batting average...has not allowed a run in the fourth inning (10.0 ip) and opponents are 5-for-36 (.139)...has tossed six innings or fewer in all 11 of his starts...has walked two batters or fewer nine times...the A's are 6-5 (.545) in his starting assignments.

**2021 HIGHLIGHTS:** Took the loss in his first start on April 5 against Los Angeles (NL)...allowed a season-high seven runs in a season-low 2.2 innings and walked a season-high three batters...tossed 90 pitches, which were the most by an A's pitcher in an outing of fewer than three innings since pitch counts were tracked beginning in 1988...the loss extended his losing streak to a career-high three games dating back to Sept. 13, 2020...then picked up the win in each of his next two starts and allowed just one run on eight hits in 12.0 innings...won 7-3 at Houston on April 10 and then combined with Romo, Diekmann and Wendelken on a four-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 victory over Detroit on April 16...tossed 6.0 innings in each start, which is his season high (six times)...allowed six runs on a season-high nine hits in 4.0 innings against Minnesota on April 21 but had a no decision in the A's 13-12, 10-inning win...allowed three home runs in a start for the second time in his career (Sept. 22, 2020 vs. Los Angeles-NL)...had a season-high 105 pitches in a 4-3 loss at Tampa Bay on April 27...won each of his first three starts in May and posted a 3.12 ERA over that stretch from May 3-14...struck out 11 batters in 6.0 innings in a 4-2 loss to Seattle on May 24...it was his fourth career games of 10 or more strikeouts and the second highest single-game total of his career to his 13 against the Mariners in the final game of the 2020 season...walked a season-high tying three

**LAST START:** He lost his third consecutive start in the A's 4-0 loss to Los Angeles (AL) last Saturday in Oakland...blanked the Angels on two hits over the first four innings but then allowed four runs in the fourth inning, all unearned...the last A's pitcher with at least four unearned runs in a game was Montas on April 29, 2019 against Boston (6)...the A's were shutout on three hits by Cobb, Watson and Iglesias.

he allowed a RBI single to Wolters in the second inning...also surrendered a sacrifice fly to Hampson in the fourth and was relieved by Luzardo to start the sixth with the A's trailing 2-1...also took the loss in a 3-2 decision at Colorado on July 29, 2018...allowed a two-run home run to Murphy in the second inning and a RBI double to McMahon in the third...was relieved by Petit with one out in the fifth inning and the A's trailing 3-1.

**2020 RECAP:** Was off to a strong start as he was 2-1 with a 1.57 ERA, .175 opponents batting average and no home runs over his first four starts...was scratched from his scheduled start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness and went 1-4 with an 8.70 ERA, .321 opponents average and 10 home runs over his final seven starts...went 3-5 with a 5.60 ERA in 11 starts overall...his ERA was eighth highest in the majors among pitchers with at least 50 innings pitched...had career highs in losses (5) and earned runs (33) and matched his high in home runs (10), runs (35) and walks (23)...led the A's in strikeouts (60), losses, runs, home runs and walks...his opponents batting average broke down to .198 (22-for-111) against right-handed hitters compared to .350 (35-for-100) against left-handers...surrendered six of his 10 home runs and issued 15 of his 23 walks to lefties for a 1.061 OPS (.572 against right-handers)...had a .306 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .264 the second time and .205 after that...allowed a .133 average with two strikes...was 2-1 with a 2.56 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in six starts in Oakland, 1-4 with a 10.13 ERA and .330 opponents average in five starts on the road...surrendered just two home runs in 31.2 innings in Oakland compared to eight in 21.1 innings on the road...made eight of his 11 starts during the day, which tied for the most in the majors...was 2-4 with a 6.16 ERA during the day, 1-1 with a 4.20 ERA at night...the A's were 6-5 (.545) in his starting assignments...had two starts of seven innings and five starts of fewer than five innings...went 2-2 with a 2.83 ERA in six starts on four days rest, 1-3 with an 11.00 ERA in five starts on five days rest or more...received two runs of support or fewer in nine of his 11 starts...had 10 of his 28 runs of support in one start on Aug. 3 at Seattle and had a 4.75 RSA for the season...won both of his starts with support of three or more runs and is now 16-1 in 20 career starts with at least three runs of support.

**LHP Cole Irvin (3-7, 4.12 ERA):** Is 0-4 with a 5.40 ERA and .284 opponents batting average over his last five starts...the losing streak is an A's season-high and it matches the longest losing streak of his career (May 22, 2019-April 8, 2021)...it is the longest losing streak by an A's starting pitcher over the last three years...now has seven losses for the season, which is tied for the most in the American League (Skubal, DET)...has walked two batters or fewer in each of his 11 starts, including seven starts with one walk and two starts with no walks...has issued just 11 free passes in 63.1 innings and his average of 1.56 walks per nine innings is third lowest in the AL...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 4-2 A's loss to Los Angeles (AL) last Sunday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 0 bb, 3 so)...was the winning pitcher in his only career appearance against Colorado, a start at Philadelphia on May 17, 2019 in the Phillies 5-4 win (6.0 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 2 so).
