OAKLAND ATHLETICS (34-25) VS. COLORADO ROCKIES (23-35)

ABOUT THE A'S: Took game one of the series last night at Coors Field after winning two of three at Seattle to start the road trip and are 6-3 over the last nine games...are 20-18 dating back to April 25 after starting the year 14-7...are 34-25 (.576) overall, which is the fourth best record in the American League...are nine games over .500, which matches the season high of nine (three times, last: May 28)...are in first place in the AL West for the 15th consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 45 of the last 46 days...have a one-game lead over second place Houston...have spent 43 days alone in first place, two days tied for first, one day in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

GO THE DISTANCE: Sean Manaea tossed the A's third complete game of the season on Wednesday, a four-hit shutout...the three complete games are tied with the White Sox for the most in the majors and are the most by an A's team since 2015 (5)...A's starting pitchers have 329.1 innings pitched, which is the most in the majors ahead of the Dodgers (322.1)...starters are 6-3 with a 2.43 ERA (21 er in 77.2 ip) and .213 (61-for-287) opponents batting average over the last nine games, which includes two shutouts...are 21-21 with a 4.07 ERA (149 er in 329.1 ip) for the season...the wins are tied for third most in the American league and the losses are tied for fourth most.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 4-2 in interleague play (2-0 vs. Arizona, 1-2 vs. Los Angeles, 1-0 vs. Colorado)...in addition to this three-game series at Colorado, the A's will also travel to San Francisco (June 25-27) and San Diego (July 27-28)...will host Arizona (June 8-9), San Diego (Aug. 3-4) and San Francisco (Aug. 20-22)...went 10-10 (.500) in interleague play last year and finished with a .500 record or better against the Na-

tional League for the third consecutive season and 17th time in 24 years of interleague play...are 242-208 (.538) all-time in interleague games, which is fourth best in Major League history.

PITCHERS HITTING: A's starter Frankie Montas went 0-for-2 last night after going 0-for-4 with three strikeouts in two games at Arizona earlier this year... are now batting .092 (40-for-435) with four doubles, 13 RBI, 14 walks and 202 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is second lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .078)...the last home run by an A's pitcher in the regular season was by Blue Moon Odom on Sept. 4, 1972 against California (Ken Holtzman homered in Game 4 of the 1974 World Series)...that is the longest active pitcher homerless drought by any team...Odom also had the last triple on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston... the last extra base hit was by Joe Kennedy, a double on June 12, 2007 at

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters lead the American League in hits (11) and plate appearances (52), are tied for the lead in home runs (2), rank second in RBI (9), tied for second in extra base hits (3), tied for third in walks (5), and rank fourth in OPS (.699).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's won game one of this three-game set in Colorado after winning two of three at Seattle to start the road trip and have now won seven road series, lost none and split one...the season-opening streak of eight consecutive road series without a loss matches the longest such streak in Athletics history...won the first eight road series in 1988...are 3-1 on this six-game, seven-day road trip to Seattle (2-1) and Colorado (1-0)... went 2-1 on the last road trip to Los Angeles (AL) and are 17-8 (.680) on the road, which is the best road record in the majors...the 25 road games are third fewest in the majors...return home following the game on Sunday for a nine-game homestand against Arizona (two games), Kansas City (four games) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...went 3-4 on the last homestand against Seattle (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-2) and are 17-17 (.500) at home... have the second best road batting average in the American League (.253) and the second lowest home batting average (.213).

OFFENSE: The A's have hit .300 (45-for-150) with 32 runs, 17 doubles and five home runs so far on the road trip after batting .209 with 21 runs, 10 doubles and two home runs in seven games on the last homestand...lead the American League in hit by pitches (32), rank third in home runs (75), fourth in walks (213), tied for third in extra base hits (183) and sacrifice flies (19) and tied for fifth in triples (8).

PITCHING: The A's had their second shutout in the last seven games on Wednesday and now have six for the season, which is tied for second most in the American League (Yankees, 8)...have a 2.47 ERA (20 er in 72.2 ip) over the last eight games, which has dropped the season ERA under 4.00 for the

first time this year (3.99)...are tied for the fewest walks in the AL (161, NYY) and are tied for the third fewest home runs (59) allowed, but have yielded the second most hits (506).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has two saves and five blown saves over the last 19 games after converting 12 of its first 13 save opportunities...is 14-for-20 (70.0%) for the season, which is the fourth best save percentage in the American League...has four losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has a 1.91 ERA (7 er in 33.0 ip) and .207 (25-for-121) opponents batting average over the last 11 games and has stranded all eight of its inherited runners over that stretch...has allowed just nine home runs over the last 51 games after surrendering seven over the first eight...the 16 home runs are the fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors...has allowed 25-of-68 (36.8%) inherited runners to score, which is the fifth highest percentage in the AL...has the highest batting average (.288) and slugging percentage (.503) against first batters faced in the American League and the second highest on-base percentage (.375).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed six errors over the last seven games, which has led to six unearned runs...have the fourth fewest errors in the American League (31)...have the third fewest double plays (43)...A's outfielders have three assists (all by Laureano), which is tied with the Angels for the fewest.

CLOSE CALLS (AND NOT SO CLOSE): The A's are 20-10 (.667) in games decided by three runs or fewer, which is the best record in the majors...however, are 14-15 (.483) in games decided by four runs or more...have lost each of their last three one-run games but are 11-7 (.611) for the season, which is the fourth best record in the American League...the 18 one-run games are tied with the Mariners and Twins for the most in the AL...have five walk-off wins, which is tied with the Rockies and the Yankees for the most in the majors... are 8-3 in games decided in the last at bat...are 2-1 in extra inning games and are now 8-2 in extra innings over the last two years.

THIS AND THAT: The A's had their seventh off day of the season on Thursday... are 7-0 following a day off and are the only undefeated team in the majors following a day off...beat Colorado 9-5 last night and out-scored Seattle 18-6 over the final two games and now have a run differential of +5 for the season...it marks just the second time this year the A's have a positive run differential...were at +5 on April 24, which was the A's 13th consecutive win...are 26-5 when out-homering the opposition, 3-16 when they are out-homered... Bob Melvin won his 799th game as manager of the A's Tuesday night at Seattle to set the Oakland record for games won by a manager...broke the previous mark of 798 held by Tony La Russa.

A's IN MAY: The A's finished May with a 15-14 record, which marked their third consecutive winning May (16-10 in 2019, 15-14 in 2018)...it was the A's ninth consecutive month with a winning record (min. 10 games)...batted .237 with a .741 OPS in May after hitting .214 with a .679 OPS in April...tied for third in the American League in doubles (55) and hit by pitches (12) in May, ranked fourth in walks (108) and fifth in home runs (37)...had the fewest stolen bases (4) after ranking second in steals in April (19)...the stolen bases were the fewest in Oakland history in the month of May (previous: 5 in 2018)...A's pitchers had the fewest walks in the AL in May (75), ranked third in fewest strikeouts (232), tied for third in fewest home runs (25) and fourth in opponents OPS (.675) and on-base percentage (.300)...the strikeouts set an Oakland record for the month of May (previous: 230 in 2015).

A's vs. ROCKIES: The A's took game one against Colorado last night...lost three of four to Colorado last year for their second consecutive season series loss... have now lost seven of their 11 season series to Colorado...split two games in Colorado last year and were swept in a two-game series in Oakland...have lost seven of the last 10 games, including four of the last six at Coors Field... are 17-19 all-time, which includes 9-7 in Oakland and 8-12 in Denver.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha leads the majors in hit by pitches (12) and runs scored (46)... ranks fifth in the AL in on-base percentage (.390) and tied for seventh in walks (34)...*Matt Olson* ranks fifth in the AL in OPS (.933), tied for fifth in home runs (14), fourth in slugging (.571) and tied for sixth in extra base hits (28).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1983** Rickey Henderson homers off Cleveland's Bud Anderson in the second game of a double header for the 2000th home run in Oakland A's history...in **2004** Tim Hudson tosses a complete game eight-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win against Toronto, snapping the A's major league record tying streak of seven consecutive no decisions by a starter.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (3-7, 4.12 ERA)

FOUR-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-4 with a 5.40 ERA (28.1 ip, 33 h, 18 r, 17 er, 6 bb, 11 so, 4 hr) and .284 (33-for-116) opponents batting average over his last five starts...the losing streak is an A's season-high and it matches the longest losing streak of his career (May 22, 2019-April 8, 2021)...it is the longest losing streak by an A's starting pitcher over the last three years...now has seven losses for the season, which is tied for the most in the American League (Skubal, DET; Shoemaker, MIN).

DON'T WALK: Has walked two batters or fewer in each of his 11 starts, including seven starts with one walk and two starts with no walks...has issued just 11 free passes in 63.1 innings and his average of 1.56 walks per nine innings is third lowest in the American League...has walked one batter or fewer in 11 of his 14 career starts and has walked just 25 batters in 108.2 career innings (2.07 per nine innings).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .241 (45-for-187) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .338 (22-for-65) against left-handers...the mark against lefties is second highest in the majors (Hendricks, CHC .342) and his .881 OPS is third highest...however, has allowed five of his seven home runs and issued 10 of his 11 walks to righties...his career splits are .249 (78-for-313) with a .708 OPS against right-handers, .369 (45-for-122) with a .946 OPS against lefties...opponents are hitting .305 (18-for-59) with runners in scoring position.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is scheduled to make his first interleague start of the season...went 1-0 with a 1.93 ERA (9.1 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 6 so) in three games, including one start, in interleague play with Philadelphia in 2019.

WITH THE BAT: Is 1-for-6 (.167) with two walks (.375 on-base percentage), a run scored and two strikeouts in his career as a hitter, all with Philadelphia in 2019...had a .158 (6-for-38) average with three doubles, a RBI, three walks and 10 strikeouts as a minor leaguer.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 3-0 with a 1.04 ERA (3 er in 26.0 ip) in four starts on five days rest or more, 0-6 with a 6.00 ERA (22 er in 33.0 ip) in six starts on four days rest.

THIS AND THAT: Is averaging 15.1 pitches per inning pitched, which is seventh fewest in the American League...has the fourth fewest strikeouts per nine innings (6.39)...has 11 strikeouts in 28.1 innings over his last five starts after striking out a season-high nine in 8.0 innings on May 4 against Toronto...is 3-1 in five starts with more than two runs of support, 0-6 in five starts with support of two runs or fewer...has a season RSA of 3.69 (26 rs in 63.1 ip)...the A's lost in his only no decisions and are 3-8 (.273) in his starting assignments.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and lost each of his first two starts, allowing four runs in each contest for a 7.45 ERA...tossed 4.1 innings in his first start on April 3 against Houston, which was the shortest start of his career...also faced the Astros in his second start on April 8 but did not pitch again until April 17 against Detroit when he combined with Wendelken, Guerra and Weems on a five-hit shutout in a 7-0 win...it was his first win since May 17, 2019 against Colorado and it snapped a career-high fourgame losing streak...that began a four-start stretch where he went 3-1 with a 1.42 ERA and .232 opponents batting average through May 4...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in his start against the Tigers and then blanked the Orioles over the first five innings on April 23 for a career-high 11.0 inning scoreless streak...won back-to-back starts on the 17th and 23rd, marking the second time in his career he put together consecutive wins (May 12-17, 2019)...allowed just one run in 11. innings in the two starts...lost on April 28 at Tampa Bay but then picked up his third win on May 4 against Toronto...had career highs in innings pitched (8.0), strikeouts (9) and pitches (102) against the Blue Jays...is 0-4 with a 5.40 ERA (17 er in 28.1 ip) in five starts since then... left with a 4-1 lead on May 15 at Minnesota but the pen allowed four runs in the eighth inning for the blown save...allowed a season-high five runs in an 8-4 loss to Houston on May 20...allowed a career-high 10 hits in 4.2 innings of work in a 4-3 loss to Seattle on May 25...went 1-4 with a 4.46 ERA in six starts in May...tied for second in the American League in losses in May.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-2 loss to Los Angeles (AL) last Sunday in Oakland...allowed four runs in the second inning on a leadoff home run by Walsh, a two-run double by Fletcher an a RBI single by Gosselin...those were the only runs he would allow in six innings of work...retired each of the final nine batters and 14 of the last 15.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP James Kaprielian (2-0, 2.95 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas May 12 and is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season and his career... allowed four runs on five hits in 3.2 innings in his last start, a no decision, after yielding three runs on 10 hits in 17.2 innings over his three starts, which included a pair of wins...has held right-handed hitters to a .150 batting average...opponents are 2-for-18 with runners in scoring position...had a no decision in his last start, a 6-5 A's loss in 10 innings at Seattle on Monday (3.2 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 3 so)...has never faced the Rockies in his career...has never batted as a professional or in college...made his Major League debut with Oakland in 2020 after pitching in just 27 games over his first five professional seasons due to elbow problems...missed most of 2016 with an elbow injury and then missed the entire 2017 and 2018 seasons following April 18, 2017 "Tommy John" surgery.
