OAKLAND ATHLETICS (35-25) VS. COLORADO ROCKIES (23-36)

SUNDAY, JUNE 6, 2021 - COORS FIELD - 1:10 MDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Took the first two tames of this three-game set at Coors Field after winning two of three at Seattle to start the road trip and are 7-3 over the last 10 games...are 21-18 dating back to April 25 after starting the year 14-7...are 35-25 (.583) overall, which is the fourth best record in the American League...are 10 games over .500, which is a season high...are in first place in the AL West for the 16th consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 46 of the last 47 days...have a two-game lead over second place Houston...have spent 44 days alone in first place, two days tied for first, one day in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

GO THE DISTANCE: Sean Manaea tossed the A's third complete game of the season on Wednesday, a four-hit shutout...the three complete games are tied with the White Sox for the most in the majors and are the most by an A's team since 2015 (5)...A's starting pitchers have 335.1 innings pitched, which is the most in the majors ahead of the Dodgers (326.1)...starters are 7-3 with a 2.37 ERA (22 er in 83.2 ip) and .216 (67-for-310) opponents batting average over the last 10 games, which includes two shutouts...are 23-21 with a 4.03 ERA (150 er in 335.1 ip) for the season...the wins are tied for third most in the American league and the losses are tied for fourth most.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 5-2 in interleague play (2-0 vs. Arizona, 1-2 vs. Los Angeles, 2-0 vs. Colorado)...in addition to this three-game series at Colorado, the A's will also travel to San Francisco (June 25-27) and San Diego (July 27-28)...will host Arizona (June 8-9), San Diego (Aug. 3-4) and San Francisco (Aug. 20-22)...went 10-10 (.500) in interleague play last year and finished with a .500 record or better against the Na-

tional League for the third consecutive season and 17th time in 24 years of interleague play...are 243-208 (.539) all-time in interleague games, which is fourth best in Major League history.

PITCHERS HITTING: A's starter Cole Irvin went 1-for-2 last night, recording Oakland's first pitcher hit since Aug. 14, 2019 when Homer Bailey went 2-for-3 in San Francisco...A's pitchers are now batting .094 (41-for-437) with four doubles, 13 RBI, 14 walks and 202 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is second lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .078)...the last home run by an A's pitcher in the regular season was by Blue Moon Odom on Sept. 4, 1972 against California (Ken Holtzman homered in Game 4 of the 1974 World Series)...that is the longest active pitcher homerless drought by any team...Odom also had the last triple on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...the last extra base hit was by Joe Kennedy, a double on June 12, 2007 at Houston.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters lead the American League in hits (11) and plate appearances (54), are tied for the lead in home runs (2), rank second in RBI (9), tied for second in extra base hits (3), tied for third in walks (5), and rank fifth in OPS (.671).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's won the first two games of this three-game set in Colorado after winning two of three at Seattle to start the road trip and have now won eight road series, lost none and split one...the season-opening streak of nine consecutive road series without a loss is the longest such streak in Athletics history...won the first eight road series in 1988...are 4-1 on this six-game, seven-day road trip to Seattle (2-1) and Colorado (2-0)... went 2-1 on the last road trip to Los Angeles (AL) and are 18-8 (.692) on the road, which is the best road record in the majors...the 26 road games are third fewest in the majors...return home following the game on Sunday for a nine-game homestand against Arizona (two games), Kansas City (four games) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...went 3-4 on the last homestand against Seattle (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-2) and are 17-17 (.500) at home.

OFFENSE: The A's have hit .308 (57-for-185) with 38 runs, 18 doubles and seven home runs so far on the road trip after batting .209 with 21 runs, 10 doubles and two home runs in seven games on the last homestand...lead the American League in hit by pitches (33), rank third in home runs (77), fourth in walks (215), third in extra base hits (187) and sacrifice flies (20) and tied for fourth in triples (9).

PITCHING: The A's had their second shutout in the last seven games on Wednesday and now have six for the season, which is tied for second most in the American League (Yankees, 8)...have a 2.53 ERA (23 er in 81.2 ip) over the last nine games, which has dropped the season ERA under 4.00 for the first time this year (3.98)...have the fewest walks in the AL (162) and have

allowed the third fewest home runs (60), but have yielded the second most hits (517).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has three saves and five blown saves over the last 20 games after converting 12 of its first 13 save opportunities...is 15-for-21 (71.4%) for the season...has four losses, which is the fewest in the majors... has a 2.25 ERA (9 er in 36.0 ip) over the last 12 games and has stranded all eight of its inherited runners over that stretch...has allowed just 10 home runs over the last 52 games after surrendering seven over the first eight... the 17 home runs are the fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors... has allowed 25-of-68 (36.8%) inherited runners to score, which is the fifth highest percentage in the AL...has the second highest batting average (.284) and on-base percentage (.371) and the highest slugging percentage (.497) against first batters faced in the American League.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed six errors over the last eight games, which has led to six unearned runs...have the fourth fewest errors in the American League (31)...tied for the third fewest double plays (44)...A's outfielders have four assists (3, Laureano; 1, Canha), which is tied for second fewest.

CLOSE CALLS (AND NOT SO CLOSE): The A's are 21-10 (.677) in games decided by three runs or fewer, which is the best record in the majors...however, are 14-15 (.483) in games decided by four runs or more...have lost each of their last three one-run games but are 11-7 (.611) for the season...are 8-3 in games decided in the last at bat...are 2-1 in extra inning games and are now 8-2 in extra innings over the last two years.

THIS AND THAT: The A's had their seventh off day of the season on Thursday... are 7-0 following a day off and are the only undefeated team in the majors following a day off...have an off day scheduled for tomorrow before a twogame set at the Coliseum against the Diamondbacks...beat Colorado 6-3 last night and out-scored Seattle 18-6 over the final two games and now have a run differential of +8 for the season...it marks just the second time this year the A's have a positive run differential...were at +5 on April 24, which was the A's 13th consecutive win...are 27-5 when out-homering the opposition, 3-16 when they are out-homered...Bob Melvin won his 799th game as manager of the A's Tuesday night at Seattle to set the Oakland record for games won by a manager...broke the previous mark of 798 wins held by White Sox manager Tony La Russa.

A's IN MAY: The A's finished May with a 15-14 record, which marked their third consecutive winning May (16-10 in 2019, 15-14 in 2018)...it was the A's ninth consecutive month with a winning record (min. 10 games)...batted .237 with a .741 OPS in May after hitting .214 with a .679 OPS in April...tied for third in the American League in doubles (55) and hit by pitches (12) in May, ranked fourth in walks (108) and fifth in home runs (37)...had the fewest stolen bases (4) after ranking second in steals in April (19)...the stolen bases were the fewest in Oakland history in the month of May (previous: 5 in 2018)...A's pitchers had the fewest walks in the AL in May (75), ranked third in fewest strikeouts (232), tied for third in fewest home runs (25) and fourth in opponents OPS (.675) and on-base percentage (.300)...the strikeouts set an Oakland record for the month of May (previous: 230 in 2015).

A's vs. ROCKIES: The A's won each of the first two games of this three-game set in Colorado...lost three of four to Colorado last year for their second consecutive season series loss...have now lost seven of their 11 season series to Colorado, but have clinched this road series with wins in the first two games...split two games in Colorado last year and were swept in a two-game series in Oakland...have lost seven of the last 11 games, including four of the last seven at Coors Field, but have won each of the last two...are 18-19 all-time, which includes 9-7 in Oakland and 9-12 in Denver.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha leads the majors in hit by pitches (12) and runs scored (47)... ranks third in the AL in on-base percentage (.394) and tied for seventh in walks (34)...*Matt Olson* ranks third in the AL in OPS (.950), tied for fourth in home runs (15), is fourth in slugging (.582) and is sixth in extra base hits (29).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1990** Rickey Henderson's collects his 1000th hit in Oakland uniform...he finished his career with the A's with an Oakland record 1640 hits...in **2003** the A's return to Philadelphia for the first time in 49 years as Oakland defeats the Philadelphia Phillies in interleague play, 7-4...Miguel Tejada collects four hits, including an Oakland record tying three doubles.

DITCHING DOORABLES

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: James Kaprielian (2-0, 2.95 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas May 12 and is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season and his career...allowed four runs on five hits in 3.2 innings in his last start, a no decision, after yielding three runs on 10 hits in 17.2 innings over his three starts, which included a pair of wins...has held right-handed hitters to a .150 (6-for-40) batting average... opponents are 2-for-18 (.111) with runners in scoring position.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Has made one career interleague appearance and it came in relief in his Major League debut on Aug. 16 of last year at San Francisco (2.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...relieved Fiers to start the seventh inning with the A's leading 13-2 and allowed a home run to the first batter he faced (Crawford)...walked the next batter (Dubon) before retiring each of the final six batters he faced.

WITH THE BAT: Has never batted as a professional...did not have an at bat in college for UCLA.

FIRST START: He earned his first Major League win in his first career start in the A's 4-1 victory at Boston on May 12...allowed a Gonzalez double, a Verdugo walk and a Martinez RBI singe to the first three batters he faced...that would be the only run he would allow in five innings of work as he blanked the Red Sox on two hits and a walk over his final four innings.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 8-4 win at Los Angeles (AL) on May 21...Oakland scored once in the third and he allowed a solo home run to Iglesias in the bottom of the third...the A's then scored twice in the top of the sixth and he struck out the first two batters in the bottom of the sixth before allowing a solo home run to Walsh...was relieved by Petit following the home run with the A's leading 3-2 and Petit allowed a run for the blown save.

THIRD START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-3 win over Seattle on May 26 in Oakland...did not allow a run in 7.0 innings, which matched his longest outing as a professional...also tossed 7.0 innings for Single-A Tampa at Charlotte on April 16, 2016, his second professional appearance...allowed two hits and two walks against the Mariners...retired each of the first eight batters and each of the final 10.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 10-inning loss at Seattle on Monday...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed four runs in the fourth inning... surrendered a three-run home run to Walton and a RBI double to Lewis...was relieved by Guerra with two outs in the fourth and a runner on second...Oakland scored once in the fifth and twice in the eighth to get him off the hook.

loaded situation in the third inning with the A's trailing 4-1 and allowed all three runs to score...was on the Taxi Squad for the postseason...was rated as the A's number 10 prospect by *Baseball America* following the season..

CAREER NOTES: Made his Major League debut with Oakland in 2020 after pitching in just 27 games over his first five professional seasons due to elbow problems...compiled a 7.36 ERA and .267 opponents batting average in two relief appearances with the A's...is 6-6 with a 3.00 ERA (34 er in 102.0 ip) in 28 games, including 23 starts, as a minor leaguer...has 116 strikeouts in 102.0 innings (10.24 per nine innings)...was the New York Yankees first round draft pick in 2015 but pitched in just eight games over his first four years as a professional...missed most of 2016 with an elbow injury and then missed the entire 2017 and 2018 seasons following April 18, 2017 "Tommy John" surgery...was traded to the A's at the 2017 trading deadline in the Sonny Gray deal and is the last remaining player from that deal that also netted the A's Dustin Fowler and Jorge Mateo...pitched for Scottsdale in the Arizona Fall League in 2015. was rated by *Baseball America* as the Yankees No. 4 prospect following the 2015 season and No. 10 following 2020.

TUESDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Chris Bassitt (5-2, 3.53 ERA): Is 5-0 with a 3.16 ERA and .204 opponents batting average over his last 10 starts after going 0-2 with a 5.56 ERA and .289 opponents average over his first two starts...the five-game winning streak matches his career high (Aug. 11, 2019 to Aug. 12, 2020)...ranks tied for fifth in the American League in strikeouts (80), seventh in opponents OPS (.631), eighth in opponents slugging percentage (.353), fifth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.71), sixth in innings pitched (74.0), 14th in ERA (3.53), tied for 13th in wins (5) and 11th in opponents batting average (.218) and on-base percentage (.278)...had a no decision in his last start, a 12-6 A's win at Seattle on Tuesday (4.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 6 so, 1 hr)...is 1-0 with a 4.35 ERA (10.1 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 5 er, 8 bb, 7 so, 1 hr) in two career starts against the Diamondbacks... the win came in his only start this year, a 9-5 A's win on April 12 in Arizona (5.0 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 5 bb, 4 so).

- Has a .167 opponents batting average, which breaks down to .054 (2for-37) against left-handed hitters compared to .255 (12-for-47) against right-handers...has issued all nine of his walks and yielded both of his home runs to righties for a .773 OPS...has a .108 OPS against lefties, which is the lowest mark in the majors among pitchers who have faced at least 10 lefties.
