



OAKLAND ATHLETICS (35-26) VS. ARIZONA DIAMONDBACKS (20-41)

ABOUT THE A'S: Had their four-game winning streak snapped on Sunday and are now 7-4 over the last 11 games...are 21-19 dating back to April 25 after starting the year 14-7...are 35-26 (.574) overall, which is the fourth best record in the American League...are nine games over .500, which is one short of the season high of 10 (35-25 on June 5)...are in first place in the AL West for the 18th consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 48 of the last 49 days...have a one-game lead over second place Houston...have spent 46 days alone in first place, two days tied for first, one day in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 5-3 (.625) in interleague play, which is tied for the seventh best record in the majors...have 12 games remaining, including this two-game series with Arizona...will travel to San Francisco (June 25-27) and San Diego (July 27-28) and host San Diego (Aug. 3-4) and San Francisco (Aug. 20-22)...went 10-10 (.500) in interleague play last year and finished with a .500 record or better against the National League for the third consecutive season and 17th time in 24 years of interleague play...are 243-209 (.538) all-time in interleague games, which is fourth best in Major League history.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 17-17 (.500) at home compared to 18-9 (.667) on the road...are tied for the second best road record in the majors...are tied with Atlanta and Colorado for the most home games in the majors...begin a nine-game homestand against Arizona (two games), Kansas City (four games) and Los Angeles-AL (three games) tonight...went 3-4 on the last homestand against Seattle (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-2)...went 4-2 on the last road trip to Seattle (2-1) and Colorado (2-1) and have now won eight road series, lost none and split one...the season-opening streak of nine consecutive road series without a loss is the longest such streak in Athletics history (previous: won the first eight road series in 1988)...are batting .213 (224-for-1051) with a .688 OPS at home where they are averaging 3.9 runs per game (132 r in 34 g)...are hitting .255 with a .771 OPS and are averaging 4.9 runs per game on the road...have the second lowest home batting average in the American League and the second highest road batting average...have a 4.29 ERA (145 er in 304.0 ip) at home, 3.55 on the road...have the lowest road ERA in the AL.

OFF DAYS AND FIRST GAMES OF SERIES: The A's had their eighth off day of the season yesterday...are 7-0 following a day off and are the only undefeated team in the majors following a day off...have a 3.25 ERA (22 er in 61.0 ip) following a day off and are batting .259 (59-for-228) with 45 runs scored (6.4 runs per game)...overall, have a 13-6 record in the first game of a series.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .304 (55-for-181) with 16 doubles, a triple, seven home runs and 34 runs scored over the first five games of June (6.8 runs per game)...overall, lead the American League in hit by pitches (33), rank third in home runs (77), extra base hits (190) and sacrifice flies (20), fourth in walks (216) and doubles (104) and tied for fourth in triples (9)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (12) and plate appearances (56), are tied for the lead in home runs (2), rank second in RBI (9), third in extra base hits (3) and tied for third in walks (5).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.61 ERA (26 er in 89.2 ip) over the last 10 games, which has dropped the overall ERA to a season-low 3.97...are tied with the White Sox for the fewest walks in the American League (165) and have the third fewest home runs (60), but have yielded the second most hits (526)...rank third in shutouts (6).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 5-3 with a 2.55 ERA (18 er in 67.0 ip) over the last 11 games...have surrendered just three home runs while tossing a pair of shutouts over that span...are 22-22 with a 4.02 ERA (152 er in 340.1 ip) for the season...the wins are tied for third most in the American league and the losses are fourth most...lead the majors in innings pitched (340.1) and are tied with the White Sox for the most complete games (3)...the complete games are the most by an A's team since 2015 (5).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has three saves and five blown saves over the last 21 games after converting 12 of its first 13 save opportunities...is 15-for-21 (71.4%) for the season, which is the third best save percentage in the American League...has four losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has a 2.31 ERA (10 er in 39.0 ip) and has stranded all eight of its inherited runners over

the last 13 games...has allowed 17 home runs, which are the fewest in the AL and tied for third fewest in the majors...have issued the second fewest walks in the AL (74)...has allowed 25-of-68 (36.8%) inherited runners to score, which is the fifth highest percentage in the AL...has the highest batting average (.291) and slugging percentage (.500) against first batters faced in the AL and the second highest on-base percentage (.374).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have the fourth fewest errors in the American League (31)...are tied for third in fewest double plays (45)...A's outfielders have four assists, which is tied for second fewest.

CLOSE CALLS (AND NOT SO CLOSE): The A's are 21-11 (.656) in games decided by three runs or fewer, which is the best record in the majors...however, are 14-15 (.483) in games decided by four runs or more...have lost each of their last three one-run games but are 11-7 (.611) for the season, which is the fourth best record in the American League...have five walk-off wins, which is tied with the Rockies and the Yankees for the most in the majors...are 8-3 in games decided in the last at bat...are 2-1 in extra inning games and are now 8-2 in extra innings over the last two years...are tied for the Major League lead in wins when trailing after six innings (6) and seven innings (4).

THIS AND THAT: The A's have out-scored the opposition 34-17 (+17) in June after being outscored 242-231 (-11) in April and May...are 16-8 (.667) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher, which is tied for the second best record in the American League...are 19-18 (.514) when the opponent starts a right-hander...are 23-13 (.639) at night, which is third best in the AL, compared to 12-13 (.480) during the day...are 27-8 (.771) when scoring first, which is second best in the AL...are 27-5 when out-homering the opposition, 3-16 when they are out-homered...Bob Melvin won his 799th game as manager of the A's a week ago tonight at Seattle to set the Oakland record for games won by a manager...broke the previous mark of 798 held by Tony La Russa.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 14 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have five players on the IL (Fiers, Guduan, Laureano Rosenthal, Wendelken)...began the year with two players on the IL but have had at least four every day since the fifth game of the season.

A'S IN MAY: The A's finished May with a 15-14 record, which marked their third consecutive winning May (16-10 in 2019, 15-14 in 2018)...it was the A's ninth consecutive month with a winning record (min. 10 games)...batted .237 with a .741 OPS in May after hitting .214 with a .679 OPS in April...tied for third in the American League in doubles (55) and hit by pitches (12) in May, ranked fourth in walks (108) and fifth in home runs (37)...A's pitchers had the fewest walks in the AL in May (75), tied for third in fewest home runs (25) and ranked fourth in opponents OPS (.675) and on-base percentage (.300)...the strikeouts set an Oakland record for the month of May.

A'S vs. DIAMONDBACKS: The A's lead the season series 2-0 after sweeping a two-game series in Arizona, April 12-13...split four games last year with the A's losing both games in Phoenix on Aug. 17 and 18 and then winning two straight in Oakland on Aug. 19 and 20...have a four-game winning streak, which is their longest ever against the Diamondbacks...have won four straight and seven of the last nine in Oakland...the A's are 21-18 all-time against the Diamondbacks...are 11-9 in Oakland and 10-9 in Arizona.

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1933** Jimmie Foxx homers in his first three at bats in the A's 14-10 win over New York...he had homered in his last at bat the day before to give him four consecutive home runs...in **1965** Rick Monday is chosen by the Kansas City A's as the first player ever taken in baseball's free agent draft...in **1975** Ken Holtzman one-hits the Detroit Tigers in the A's 4-0 win...Claudell Washington homers twice and drives in all four Oakland runs...in **2008** Mark Ellis hits the fifth walk-off grand slam in Oakland history to lift the A's to a 7-3 win over Los Angeles in 12 innings.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Chris Bassitt (5-2, 3.53 ERA)

FIVE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 5-0 with a 3.16 ERA (22 er in 62.2 ip) and .204 (47-for-230) opponents batting average over his last 10 starts after going 0-2 with a 5.56 ERA and .289 opponents average over his first two starts...the five-game winning streak matches his career high (Aug. 11, 2019 to Aug. 12, 2020)...has left with the lead in two of his five no decisions only to have the bullpen blow the save.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks fifth in the American League in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.71), tied for fifth in strikeouts (80), sixth in innings pitched (74.0), seventh in opponents OPS (.631) and opponents slugging percentage (.353) and tied for 10th in opponents batting average (.218)...has allowed six home runs and his average of 0.73 home runs per nine innings is tied for eighth lowest in the AL...is tied for the AL lead in hit by pitches (7) and ranks seventh in fewest pitches per inning (15.0)...is scheduled to make his 13th start today, which will tie him for the AL lead.

INTERLEAGUE: Is 1-1 with a 4.91 ERA (11.0 ip, 11 h, 6 r, 6 er, 6 bb, 8 so) in two interleague starts this year after going 1-0 with a 2.25 ERA in two starts against the National League last year...is now 2-4 with a 3.36 ERA (27 er in 72.1 ip) in 13 career interleague starts.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 4-0 with a 3.98 ERA (18 er in 40.2 ip) in seven starts on the road compared to 1-2 with a 2.97 ERA (11 er in 33.1 ip) in five starts home...is tied for third in the American League in road wins...has a 10-12 career record in the Coliseum, but has a 2.52 ERA (62 er in 221.2 ip), which is fifth lowest in Coliseum history among pitchers with 200 or more innings pitched.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed six home runs, all to left-handed hitters...has surrendered 24 of his 33 home runs over the last three years to lefties...has not allowed a home run to a right-handed hitter since Aug. 12, 2020 (Rendon, LAA)...has a .132 opponents batting average with two strikes, which is seventh lowest in the American League...has a .156 (5-for-32) batting average against the opponents number one hitter in the order but has issued six of his 17 walks to that batter (.308 on-base percentage).

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on six days rest today...is 1-1 with a 4.20 ERA (14 er in 30.0 ip) in four starts on four days rest compared to 4-0 with a 2.79 ERA (12 er in 38.2 ip) in six starts on five days rest...now has a nine-game winning streak when starting on five days rest dating back to July 19, 2019...has a 2.79 ERA (26 er in 84.0 ip) in 14 starts over that span...according to TruMedia, the longest winning streak in starts on five days rest in Oakland history is 10 by Mike Fiers (May 7-Aug. 27, 2019) and Mark Mulder (June 18, 2002-July 10, 2003).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 9-3 (.750) in his starting assignments and are 32-16 (.667) when he starts over the last three years...has walked one batter or fewer in eight of his 12 starts this year...has yielded five hits or fewer seven times...has six starts with eight or more strikeouts...has received two runs of support or fewer in five of his 12 starts and is 0-2 in those starts...is 20-1 in 32 career starts with three runs of support or more, 4-22 in 46 starts with two runs of support or fewer...his win on May 27 improved his career record to 24-23, which is the first time in his career he has been over .500.

POST-TOMMY JOHN: Did not pitch in the majors in 2017 following May 6, 2016 "Tommy John" surgery...is 22-12 with a 3.34 ERA (122 er in 328.2 ip) and is averaging 8.68 strikeouts per nine innings (317 so in 328.2 ip) in 61 games (54 starts) since the surgery...was 2-11 with a 4.13 ERA and 6.77 strikeouts per nine innings in 29 games (23 starts) before the surgery.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Was the A's Opening Day starting pitcher and took the loss in an 8-1 decision to Houston on April 1 in Oakland...became the A's 14th different Opening Day starting pitcher over the last 16 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill, Graveman twice, Fiers, Montas)...allowed a run in the fourth inning to snap a 16.2-inning scoreless streak during the regular season and a 27.1-inning home scoreless streak, which was ninth longest in Oakland history...lost his second start on April 6, a 5-1 loss to Los Angeles (NL) on April 6 in Oakland when he allowed a season-high four runs on a season-high nine hits in 6.0 innings...allowed two home runs in the third, which were his first home runs in the Coliseum since Aug. 24, 2019...that snapped a 10-game, 55.1-inning, 229-batter homerless streak in Oakland...that ran his record to 0-2 with a 5.56 ERA...then allowed exactly two runs in each of his next six starts to become the second pitcher in Athletic history to allow exactly two runs in

six consecutive games...joins Bob Davis of the Kansas City A's, who did it all in relief from Aug. 8-26, 1960...went 3-0 with a 2.92 ERA over that stretch which ran from April 12 to May 11...allowed just two hits in 5.0 innings for the win on April 12 at Arizona but walked a season-high five batters...tied an Oakland record with three hit batters April 29 at Tampa Bay (12th time, last: Fiers, June 22, 2019, also against Tampa Bay)...left his start on May 5 against Toronto with a 3-2 lead but ended up win a no decision in the A's 9-4 loss...Trivino allowed five runs in the eighth inning for the blown save...it was the first of two times he left with a lead only to have the bullpen blow the save (also May 16 at Minnesota)...struck out a season-high 10 batters in a 3-2 win at Boston on May 11...it was his third career game of 10 or more strikeouts...did not walk a batter, the second time he has fanned 10 or more without issuing a free pass...is one of nine pitchers in Oakland history with two such games...allowed a season-high tying four runs in a no decision at Minnesota on May 16...tossed his first career complete game and shutout May 27 against Los Angeles (AL), a two-hitter in the A's 5-0 win...had a season-high 114 pitches, struck out nine and walked one...it came in his 77th career start, his 72nd with the A's...the 71 consecutive starts without a complete games is the second longest streak in Athletics history (113, Barry Zito, Aug. 22, 2003-Sept. 28, 2006)...finished May with a 3-0 record, a 2.52 ERA and .175 opponents batting average in five starts...struck out 38 and walked just four in 35.2 innings.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 12-6 win at Seattle a week ago today...allowed a season-high tying four runs in a season-low 4.0 innings...had a 1-0 lead when he yielded three straight RBI doubles to Haniger, Seager and France in the third inning...also allowed a solo home run to Trammell in the fourth and was relieved by Luzardo to start the fifth with the A's trailing 4-2.

five walks...had a 3-0 lead when he issued consecutive one-out walks in the third...Calhoun followed with a RBI single and Cabrera added a sacrifice fly...those were the only two runs he would allow in five innings of work...had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss at Arizona on Aug. 17, 2020...allowed a solo home run to Peralta in the third and two more runs in the sixth on an Escobar RBI fielders choice and a Kelly RBI single...was relieved by Petit with one out and a runner on first in the sixth inning with the A's trailing 3-0...Oakland then scored once in the seventh and twice in the eighth to get him off the hook.

LHP Sean Manaea (4-2, 3.36 ERA): Has allowed one run or fewer in each of his last three starts and is 1-0 with a 0.87 ERA and .200 opponents batting average over that span...has allowed one run or fewer in seven of his 12 starts but is 3-0 with four no decisions in those starts...has six no decisions overall, which is tied for fourth most in the American League...the A's are 9-3 (.750) in his starting assignments...has held left-handed hitters to a .127 batting average, which is third lowest in the AL...tossed a four-hit shutout in his last start, a 6-0 A's win at Seattle last Wednesday (2 bb, 8 so)...it was his second complete game and shutout of the season...is the only pitcher in the majors with two shutouts and is one of two with two complete games (Marquez, COL)...is 1-1 with a 7.00 ERA (9.0 ip, 13 h, 7 r, 7 er, 2 bb, 6 so) in two career starts against Arizona...the win came in his only start last year, a 5-1 A's win in Oakland on Aug. 20 (5.1 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 4 so).
