OAKLAND ATHLETICS (36-26) VS. ARIZONA DIAMONDBACKS (20-42)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won five of the last six games and eight of the last 12 and are a season-high tying 10 games over .500 for the second time this year (35-25 on June 5)...are 22-19 dating back to April 25 after starting the year 14-7...are 36-26 (.581) overall, which is the fourth best record in the American League...are in first place in the AL West for the 19th consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 49 of the last 50 days...have a one-game lead over second place Houston...have spent 47 days alone in first place, two days tied for first, one day in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 6-3 (.667) in interleague play, which is the seventh best record in the majors...have 10 games remaining after today...will travel to San Francisco (June 25-27) and San Diego (July 27-28) and host San Diego (Aug. 3-4) and San Francisco (Aug. 20-22)...went 10-10 (.500) in interleague play last year and finished with a .500 record or better against the National League for the third consecutive season and 17th time in 24 years of interleague play...are 244-209 (.539) all-time in interleague games, which is fourth best in Major League history.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 18-17 (.514) at home compared to 18-9 (.667) on the road...are tied for the second best road record in the majors...the 35 home games are the most in the majors...are 1-0 on this nine-game homestand against Arizona (1-0), Kansas City (four games) and Los Angeles-AL (three games) after going 3-4 on the last homestand against Seattle (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-2)...went 4-2 on the last road trip to Seattle (2-1) and Colorado (2-1) and have now won eight road series, lost none and split one...the season-opening streak of nine consecutive road series without a loss is the longest such streak in Athletics history (previous: won the first eight road series in 1988)...are batting .213 (230-for-1081) with a .683 OPS at home where they are averaging 3.9 runs per game (137 r in 35 g)...are hitting .255 with a .771 OPS and are averaging 4.9 runs per game on the road...have the second lowest home batting average in the American League and the second highest road batting average...have a 4.23 ERA (147 er in 313.0 ip) at home, 3.55 on the road...have the lowest road ERA in the AL.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .289 (61-for-211) with 16 doubles, a triple, seven home runs and 39 runs scored over the first six games of June (6.5 runs per game)...are 4-for-9 (.444) with two walks and eight RBI with the bases loaded this month after hitting .167 with four walks and 22 RBI with the bases loaded over the first two months of the season...rank last in the American League with a .231 (9-for-39) average with the bases loaded for the season...are 23-for-61 (.377) with runners in scoring position in June and are batting .260 (115-for-442) for the season, which is fourth best in the AL...lead the AL in hit by pitches (33), rank third in sacrifice flies (20), tied for third in extra base hits (190), fourth in home runs (77) and walks (221) and tied for fifth in triples (9)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (13) and plate appearances (57), are tied for the lead in home runs (2) and RBI (10), rank third in extra base hits (3) and tied for fourth in walks (5).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 2.55 ERA (28 er in 98.2 ip) over the last 11 games, which has dropped the overall ERA to a season-low 3.94...have issued the fewest walks in the American League (166) and have the second fewest home runs (61), but have yielded the second most hits (531)...rank third in shutouts (6) and fewest pitches per inning (16.1)...are tied for the third most wild pitches (33).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 6-3 with a 2.43 ERA (20 er in 74.0 ip) over the last 12 games...have surrendered just four home runs while tossing a pair of shutouts over that span...are 23-22 with a 3.99 ERA (154 er in 347.1 ip) for the season...the wins are tied for third most in the American League and the losses are tied for fourth most...lead the majors in innings pitched (347.1) and are tied with the White Sox for the most complete games (3)...the complete games are the most by an A's team since 2015 (5).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has four saves and five blown saves over the last 21 games after converting 12 of its first 13 save opportunities...is 16-for-22 (72.7%) for the season, which is the third best save percentage in the American League...has four losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has a 2.20 ERA (10 er in 41.0 ip) and has stranded all eight of its inherited runners over the last 14 games...has allowed 17 home runs, which are the fewest in the AL and tied for third fewest in the majors...have issued the second fewest walks in the AL (74)...has allowed 25-of-68 (36.8%) inherited runners to score,

which is the fifth highest percentage in the AL...has the highest batting average (.288) and slugging percentage (.494) against first batters faced in the AL and the second highest on-base percentage (.370).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have the fourth fewest errors in the American League (31)...are tied for third in fewest double plays (45)...A's outfielders have four assists, which is tied for second fewest.

CLOSE CALLS (AND NOT SO CLOSE): The A's are 22-11 (.667) in games decided by three runs or fewer, which is the best record in the majors...however, are 14-15 (.483) in games decided by four runs or more...have lost each of their last three one-run games but are 11-7 (.611) for the season, which is the fourth best record in the American League...have five walk-off wins, which is tied with the Rockies and the Yankees for the most in the majors...are 8-3 in games decided in the last at bat...are 2-1 in extra inning games and are now 8-2 in extra innings over the last two years...are tied for the Major League lead in wins when trailing after six innings (6) and seven innings (4).

THIS AND THAT: The A's have used a different lineup in each of the last 36 games and 60 of 62 games this year...have out-scored the opposition 39-19 (+20) in June after being outscored 242-231 (-11) in April and May...are 16-8 (.667) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher, which is the second best record in the American League...are 20-18 (.526) when the opponent starts a right-hander...are 24-13 (.649) at night, which is second best in the AL, compared to 12-13 (.480) during the day...are 27-8 (.771) when scoring first, which is second best in the AL...are 27-5 when out-homer the opposition, 4-16 when they are out-homered...are 8-0 following a day off and are the only undefeated team in the majors following a day off...have a 14-6 record in the first game of a series.

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 14 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have four players on the IL (Fiers, Laureano Rosenthal, Wendelken)...began the year with two players on the IL but have had at least four every day since the fifth game of the season.

A'S IN MAY: The A's finished May with a 15-14 record, which marked their third consecutive winning May (16-10 in 2019, 15-14 in 2018)...it was the A's ninth consecutive month with a winning record (min. 10 games)...batted .237 with a .741 OPS in May after hitting .214 with a .679 OPS in April...tied for third in the American League in doubles (55) and hit by pitches (12) in May, ranked fourth in walks (108) and fifth in home runs (37)...A's pitchers had the fewest walks in the AL in May (75), tied for third in fewest home runs (25) and ranked fourth in opponents OPS (.675) and on-base percentage (.300)...the strikeouts set an Oakland record for the month of May.

A'S vs. DIAMONDBACKS: The A's lead the season series 3-0...won the first game in Oakland last night after sweeping a two-game series in Arizona, April 12-13...have swept the season series from the Diamondbacks once and that was in 2001 when they went 3-0...split four games last year with the A's losing both games in Phoenix on Aug. 17 and 18 and then winning two straight in Oakland on Aug. 19 and 20...have a five-game winning streak, which is their longest ever against the Diamondbacks...have won five straight and eight of the last 10 in Oakland...the A's are 22-18 all-time against the Diamondbacks...are 12-9 in Oakland and 10-9 in Arizona.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Elvis Andrus is batting .298 (25-for-84) over his last 28 games dating back to May 7 after hitting .143 over his first 31 contests...**Mark Canha** leads the majors in hit by pitches (12)...leads the American League in runs scored (47), is tied for seventh in games (60), ranks eighth in on-base percentage (.382) and 10th in walks (34)...**Sean Murphy** has 30 RBI as a catcher, which are the most among Major League catchers...**Matt Olson** ranks third in the American League in slugging (.567), tied for fourth in home runs (15), sixth in OPS (.930), tied for sixth in extra base hits (29) and tied for 10th in RBI (40)...**Lou Trivino** has not allowed an earned run in his last 10 games (10.1 ip).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1973** Ken Holtzman tosses a two-hit shutout to improve to 11-3 in the A's 4-0 win over Detroit...in **1990** Dave Stewart tosses a four-hitter as the A's shutout Kansas City, 5-0...in **1991** Jim "Catfish" Hunter becomes the first player in Oakland history to have his number retired when the A's honor the Hall of Famer by retiring number 27.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (4-2, 3.36 ERA)

LAST THREE STARTS: Has allowed one run or fewer in each of his last three starts and is 1-0 with a 0.87 ERA (2 er in 20.2 ip) and .200 (14-for-70) opponents batting average over that span...that follows a four-start stretch where he went 0-1 with a 6.64 ERA and .326 opponents batting average.

GO THE DISTANCE: Had his second complete game and shutout of the season in his last start last a week ago today at Seattle...is the only pitcher in the majors with two shutouts and is one of two with two complete games (Marquez, COL)...is the first A's pitcher with two complete games in a season since Kendall Graveman in 2016 (2) and the first with two shutouts since Sonny Gray in 2015 (2)...has three of the A's seven complete games and shutouts over the last four years.

SUPPORT: Has allowed one run or fewer in seven of his 12 starts but is 3-0 with four no decisions in those starts...has six no decisions overall, which is tied for fifth most in the American League...has received one run of support in three of his six no decisions and the bullpen blew the save in one other no decision...the A's are 5-1 in his no decisions and are 9-3 (.750) in his starting assignments...are 20-8 (.714) when he starts over the last three years...has received one run of support or fewer in five of his 12 starts and is 0-2 in those starts...is 4-0 in seven starts with two runs of support or more.

DON'T WALK: Has walked seven batters in his last three starts (20.2 ip) after walking just nine over his first nine starts (49.0 ip)...has three starts with no walks and four others with one...is averaging 2.07 walks per nine innings...has 70 strikeouts and ranks ninth in the American League in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.38)...over the last four years, he has walked two batters or fewer in 49 of his 55 starts (17 with no walks, 21 with one)...has 63 walks in 314.0 innings over that span, an average of 1.81 per nine innings.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held left-handed hitters to a .127 (9-for-71) batting average, which is third lowest in the American League...has a .310 (61-for-197) mark against right-handers, which is second highest...has a .439 OPS against lefties, .778 against righties.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is scheduled to make his first interleague start of the season...went 2-1 with a 3.33 ERA (10 er in 27.0 ip) in five interleague starts last year...is now 5-8 with a 4.03 ERA (46 er in 102.2 ip) in 19 career starts against the National League compared to 38-25 with a 3.74 ERA (214 er in 514.2 ip) in 90 games against the American League.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 4.88 ERA (13 er in 24.0 ip) over the first two innings of his two starts, a 3.28 ERA (8 er in 22.0 ip) in innings three and four and a 1.90 ERA (5 er in 23.2 ip) from the fifth inning on.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on six days rest for the first time this year today...is 2-0 with a 1.34 ERA (7 er in 47.0 ip) in seven starts on four days rest compared to 2-1 with a 7.00 ERA (14 er in 18.0 ip) in four starts on five days rest...over the last three years, he is 6-1 with a 2.48 ERA (24 er in 87.0 ip) in 15 starts on four days rest, 3-2 with a 6.11 ERA (19 er in 28.0 ip) in six starts on five days rest.

BY MONTH: Tossed a shutout in his first start in June and is now 9-2 with a 2.96 ERA (31 er in 94.1 ip) in 15 career starts in June...went 0-1 with a 4.78 ERA and .300 opponents batting average in six starts in May after going 3-1 with a 2.83 ERA and .248 opponents batting average in five starts in April...is 5-9 with a 5.51 ERA in 21 career starts in May compared to 8-4 with a 2.97 ERA in 16 starts in April...his May ERA is his highest for any month (5.22 in August)

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Allowed five runs on six hits and a season-high three walks in 4.2 innings for the loss in his first start on April 4 against Houston...then went 3-0 with a 1.50 ERA over his next four starts...picked up his first win of the season in the 100th game of his career, an 8-4 victory over Detroit on April 15...tossed a six-hit, seven-inning shutout in the A's 7-0 win over Minnesota in the first game of the doubleheader April 20...it was the 11th complete game shutout of fewer than eight innings in Oakland history (last: Mike Minor, Sept. 14, 2020 at Seattle)...it was his second career complete game and shutout, with the other being his no-hitter on April 21, 2018 against Boston...the start was the 100th of his career and he became the 25th pitcher in Oakland history to make 100 starts...struck out a career-high tying 10 batters on May 7 against Tampa Bay, but had a no decision in the A's 2-1 win...it was his fourth career 10-strikeout game, his first since Sept. 8, 2019 against Detroit...retired each of the first 18 batters he faced before walking Arozarena to start the seventh...then retired the next three before Brosseau led off the eighth inning with a double...allowed a season-high seven runs on a season-high 10 hits in a season-low 2.0 innings for the loss at Boston on May 13...has allowed seven or more runs in a start three times in his career, all at Fenway Park (8 on May 10, 2016; 7 on Sept. 12, 2017)...also allowed 10 hits in his next start on May 18 against Houston to become the first A's pitcher to yield 10 hits in back-to-back starts since Kendall Graveman in 2016 (April 25-May 2)...had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss

at Los Angeles (AL) on May 23...left with a 4-1 lead but the bullpen blew the save...struck out Justin Upton to lead off the game for the 50,000 strikeout in Oakland history...fanned Taylor Ward to end the fourth inning for his 500th career strikeout...walked a season-high tying three batters May 28 against Los Angeles (AL).

LAST START: He tossed a four-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win at Seattle a week ago today...it was his third career complete game and shutout, his second this year...logged a season-high 111 pitches, which are his most in a game over the last four years...blanked the Mariners on one walk over the first four innings and did not allow a hit until Murphy singled to lead off the fifth...loaded the bases in the fifth inning, but that was the only time Seattle would get a runner in scoring position.

MANAEA vs. ARIZONA: Is 1-1 with a 7.00 ERA (9.0 ip, 13 h, 7 r, 7 er, 2 bb, 6 so) in two career starts...the win came in his only start last year, a 5-1 A's win in Oakland on Aug. 20...blanks over the Diamondbacks on three hits over the first four innings and had a 3-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Escobar in the fifth...was relieved by Wendelken with one out and a runner on first base in the sixth with the A's leading 3-1...the loss came in a 7-2 decision in Oakland on May 25, 2018...allowed a solo home run to Ahmed in the first and a two-run double to Murphy in the third...Oakland came back with a run in the bottom of the third but he allowed three runs in the fourth on an Ahmed RBI single and a Goldschmidt two-run triple...was relieved by Pagán with two outs in the fourth and the A's trailing 6-1.

2020 RECAP: Went 4-3 with a 4.50 ERA in 11 starts...the ERA was the highest of his career as was his .270 opponents batting average...his .427 slugging percentage matched his high...went 4-1 with a 2.65 ERA and .234 opponents batting average over his final six starts dating back to Aug. 20...the wins tied for fourth most in the majors over that span...went 0-2 with a 7.65 ERA and .325 opponents average over his first five starts...tied for the team lead in starts...walked just eight batters in 54.0 innings, an average of 1.33 walks per nine innings...that was the lowest mark of his career and was sixth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 50 or more innings pitched...struck out 45 for a career-best 5.63 strikeout-to-walk ratio...had five starts without a walk, five with one and three in his other...had a 2.56 ERA and .233 opponents batting average over the first three innings of his starts compared to a 7.59 ERA and .319 opponents average from the fourth inning on...his .270 opponents batting average broke down to .250 (13-for-52) against left-handed hitters compared to .277 (44-for-159) against right-handers...issued seven of eight walks to righties...had a .204 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .327 with seven of his eight walks after that.

RHP Frankie Montas (6-5, 4.52 ERA): Is 2-3 with a 3.25 ERA over his last five starts after going 4-2 with a 5.50 ERA over his first seven starts...picked up his sixth win of the season in his last start, which is tied for sixth in the American League...has a .198 opponents batting average the first time through the order, .350 the second time and .262 with six of his 11 home runs after that...is 2-0 with a 3.94 ERA in three starts against AL Central teams this year and is now 4-0 with a 2.64 ERA over his last five starts against the Central...is 7-3 with a 4.03 ERA in 22 career appearances against the AL Central...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 9-5 A's win at Colorado last Friday (5.0 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 2 so)...is 2-0 with a 1.62 ERA (16.2 ip, 14 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 8 so, 2 hr) in three career appearances, including two starts, against Kansas City...last faced the Royals on June 8, 2018, a win in the A's 7-2 victory in Oakland (7.2 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 5 so).

- Hit safely in both games against Arizona earlier this year (3-for-9, .333) and is a .300 (24-for-80) career hitter against the Diamondbacks.
- Is 7-for-18 (.389) in six interleague games...has a .186 batting average against American League teams.
- Is 1-for-9 (.111) with a walk as a pinch hitter and ranks fourth in the AL in pinch plate appearances (10).
- Has not committed an error and now has a 233-game errorless streak, which is the longest in Athletics history by an outfielder...his last error was on July 24, 2018 at Texas.

Last Year: Batted .226 with five home runs and 29 RBI in 45 games in his third season with Oakland and the sixth of his career...the batting average was a career low but his average of 5.48 at bats per RBI was the best mark of his career and he hit .304 with RISP.
