OAKLAND ATHLETICS (37-26) VS. KANSAS CITY ROYALS (29-31)

THURSDAY, JUNE 10, 2021 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:40 PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight, six of the last seven and nine of the last 13 games to improve to a season-high 11 games over .500 at 37-26 (.587)...that is the fourth best record in the American League...have not been 12 games over .500 since finishing the 2020 season 36-24...are in first place in the AL West for the 20th consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 50 of the last 51 days...have a one-game lead over second place Houston for the fourth consecutive day...have spent 48 days alone in first place, two days tied for first, one day in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 9-1 against American League Central teams (4-0 vs. Detroit, 5-1 vs. Minnesota)...are batting .253 (80-for-316) and are averaging 5.9 runs per game (59 runs in 10 games) against teams from the Central compared to .228 with an average of 4.1 runs per game against all other teams...have a 2.93 ERA (18 er in 86.0 ip) against the Central, 4.04 against everyone else...went 25-8 against the AL Central in 2019 after going 26-8 in 2018...are now 74-21 (.779) against AL Central foes dating back to June 23, 2017.

PITCHING: A's pitchers logged their third shutout in the last 12 games yesterday and have a 2.34 ERA (28 er in 107.2 ip) and .220 (28-for-396) opponents batting average over that span...that has dropped the overall ERA to a season-low 3.87, which ranks fifth in the American League...now have seven shutouts, which is tied for second in the AL...have the fifth lowest opponents on-base percentage (.307) and OPS (.390)...have issued the second fewest walks (170) and have the second fewest home runs (61), but have yielded the second most hits (533)...are third in fewest pitches per inning (16.1) and tied for third in most wild pitches (33).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have not allowed a run in four of the last 13 games and are 7-3 with a 2.36 ERA (21 er in 80.0 ip) over that span...have surrendered just four home runs while tossing a pair of complete game shutouts over that stretch...are 24-22 with a 3.92 ERA (154 er in 353.1 ip) for the season...the wins are tied for third most in the American League and the losses are fifth most...lead the majors in innings pitched (353.1) and are tied with the White Sox for the most complete games (3)...the complete games are the most by an A's team since 2015 (5).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-0 on this nine-game homestand against Arizona (2-0), Kansas City (four games) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...went 3-4 on the last homestand against Seattle (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-2) and are now 19-17 (.528) at home compared to 18-9 (.667) on the road...the 36 home games are the most in the majors...are tied for the second best road record in the majors...went 4-2 on the last road trip to Seattle (2-1) and Colorado (2-1) and have now won eight road series, lost none and split one...the season-opening streak of nine consecutive road series without a loss is the longest such streak in Athletics history (previous: won the first eight road series in 1988).

MORE HOME AND AWAY: The A's are batting .198 (34-for-172) with five doubles, a triple and no home runs over the last six home games...the streak of six consecutive home games without a home run is one short of the Oakland record of seven (four times, last: May 6-24, 2018)...however, have a 4-2 record over that span as the pitching staff has a 1.17 ERA (7 er in 54.0 ip) and .168 (32-for-191) opponents batting average while allowing two home runs...are now batting .213 with a .682 OPS and 3.9 runs per game at home compared to .255 with a .771 OPS and 4.9 runs per game on the road...have the second lowest home batting average in the American League and the second highest road batting average and road OPS.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .280 (67-for-239) in the month of June, including .373 (25-for-67) with runners in scoring position...are now hitting .261 (117-for-448) with RISP overall, which is fifth best in the American League...lead the AL in hit by pitches (33), are tied for second in sacrifice flies (21), rank fourth in home runs (77) and walks (226), tied for fourth in triples (10), fifth in extra base hits (192) and tied for fifth in doubles (105)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (13) and plate appearances (57), are tied for the lead in home runs (2), rank second in RBI (10) and third in extra base hits (3)...the A's are 4-for-9 (.444) with two walks and eight RBI with the bases loaded in June after hitting .167 with four walks and 22 RBI with the bases full over the first two months of the season...rank last in the AL with a .231 (9-for-39) average with the bases loaded for the season.

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen is 2-1 with four saves, one blown save, a 2.05 ERA (10 er in 44.0 ip) and .216 (35-for-162) opponents batting average over the last 15 games...has stranded all eight of its inherited runners over that span...

is 16-for-22 (72.7%) in save opportunities, which is the third best percentage in the American League...are tied for fifth in saves...has four losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has allowed 17 home runs, which are the fewest in the AL and tied for third fewest in the majors...have issued the second fewest walks in the AL (76)...has allowed 25-of-68 (36.8%) inherited runners to score, which is the fifth highest percentage in the AL...has the highest batting average (.282) and slugging percentage (.485) against first batters faced in the AL and the third highest on-base percentage (.364).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have the fourth fewest errors in the American League (32)...are tied for third in fewest double plays (45)...A's outfielders have four assists, which is tied for second fewest.

CLOSE CALLS (AND NOT SO CLOSE): The A's are 22-11 (.667) in games decided by three runs or fewer, which is the best record in the majors...however, are 15-15 (.500) in games decided by four runs or more...have lost each of their last three one-run games but are 11-7 (.611) for the season, which is the fourth best record in the American League...have five walk-off wins, which is tied with the Rockies and the Yankees for the most in the majors...are 8-3 in games decided in the last at bat...are 2-1 in extra inning games and are now 8-2 in extra innings over the last two years...are tied for the Major League lead in wins when trailing after six innings (6).

THIS AND THAT: The A's used the same lineup in both games against Arizona, which was just the second time they have used the same lineup in back-to-back games (April 29-30)...have used 60 different lineups over the first 63 games...have out-scored the opposition 43-19 (+24) in June after being outscored 242-231 (-11) in April and May...are 16-8 (.667) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher, which is the second best record in the American League...are 21-18 (.538) when the opponent starts a right-hander...are 24-13 (.649) at night, which is tied for second best in the AL, compared to 13-13 (.500) during the day...are 28-8 (.778) when scoring first, which is second best in the AL...are 27-5 when out-homering the opposition, 4-16 when they are out-homered...are 8-0 following a day off and are the only undefeated team in the majors following a day off...have a 14-6 record in the first game of a series...went 16-11 in April and 15-14 in May and now have nine consecutive months with a winning record (min. 10 games).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 14 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have four players on the IL (Fiers, Laureano Rosenthal, Wendelken)...began the year with two players on the IL but have had at least four every day since the fifth game of the season.

A's vs. ROYALS: The A's and Royals meet for the first time since Sept. 18, 2019, a span of 631 days...Oakland won the season series in 2019, 5-2...it was their second consecutive season series win and third in four years...won two of three in Oakland and three of four in Kansas City...have won 19 of their last 26 games against the Royals and have outscored Kansas City 161-83 over that span (6.2 runs per game to 3.2 runs)...all-time, the A's are 327-267 (.551) against the Royals...the only American League team the A's have a better record against is Tampa Bay (.589)...are 177-119 in Oakland and 150-148 in Kansas City.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Elvis Andrus is batting .291 (25-for-86) over his last 29 games dating back to May 7 after hitting .143 over his first 31 contests...**Mark Canha** leads the majors in runs scored (49) and hit by pitches (12)...is tied for fourth in the American League in triples (3), tied for seventh in games (61) and ranks eighth in on-base percentage (.384)...**Sean Murphy** has 30 RBI as a catcher, which are the most among Major League catchers...**Matt Olson** ranks fifth in the American League in slugging (.571), fifth in OPS (.937), tied for fifth in home runs (15) and extra base hits (30), tied for sixth in sacrifice flies (4), tied for eighth in doubles (15) and 10th in RBI (41)...**Lou Trivino** has not allowed an earned run in his last 11 games (11.1 ip).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1979** Jim Essian hits an inside-the-park grand slam in the A's 12-1 win against Toronto...in **1992** Mark McGwire hits his 200th career home run off Chris Bosio in the A's 5-2 win at Milwaukee...he becomes the third Oakland Athletic to reach the 200 mark, joining Reggie Jackson and Jose Canseco...in **1997** Damon Mashore has three assists at Detroit to set an Oakland record for assists by an outfielder...in **2017** the A's set an Oakland record for hits in a doubleheader with 32 against Tampa Bay...Yonder Alonso had seven hits, to become the second Oakland player with seven hits in one day.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Frankie Montas (6-5, 4.52 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 2-3 with a 3.25 ERA (10 er in 27.2 ip) over his last five starts after going 4-2 with a 5.50 ERA over his first seven starts...picked up his sixth win of the season in his last start, which is tied for seventh in the American League...the six wins are second most in his career (9 in 2019)...is tied for 10th with a career-high tying five losses...has career highs in runs (36) and home runs (11).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .198 (19-for-96) opponents batting average the first time through the order, .350 (36-for-103) the second time and .262 (17-for-65) with six of his 11 home runs after that...opposing left-handed hitters have struck out 42 times in 127 at bats against him (one per 3.02 at bats) compared to 23 strikeouts in 137 at bats by right-handed hitters (one per 5.96 at bats)...has a .397 (27-for-68) opponents batting average against the opponents one and two hitters but has held the three, four and five hitters to a .223 (21-for-94) average.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: Is 2-0 with a 3.94 ERA (7 er in 16.0 ip) in three starts against American League Central teams this year and is now 4-0 with a 2.64 ERA (9 er in 30.2 ip) over his last five starts against the Central dating back to May 17, 2019...is 7-3 with a 4.03 ERA (37 er in 82.2 ip) in 22 career appearances against the AL Central.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 4-1 with a 3.10 ERA (10 er in 29.0 ip) and .609 OPS in five starts on five days rest, 2-3 with a 4.22 ERA (15 er in 32.0 ip) and .875 OPS in six starts on four days rest...has allowed eight of his 11 home runs when pitching on four days rest.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-1 with a 3.13 ERA (8 er in 23.0 ip) in three starts on the road compared to 3-3 with a 5.31 ERA (24 er in 40.2 ip) in seven starts at home...last year, he went 2-1 with a 2.56 ERA in six starts at home, 1-4 with a 10.13 ERA in five starts on the road.

THIS AND THAT: Has allowed 13 of his 36 runs and 25 of his 72 hits in the third inning for a 10.03 ERA (13 er in 11.2 ip) and .417 (25-for-60) opponents batting average...has allowed just one run in the fourth inning (11.0 ip, 0.82 ERA) and opponents are 7-for-41 (.171)...has tossed six innings or fewer in all 12 of his starts...has walked two batters or fewer 10 times...the A's are 7-5 (.583) in his starting assignments.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Took the loss in his first start on April 5 against Los Angeles (NL)...allowed a season-high seven runs in a season-low 2.2 innings and walked a season-high three batters...tossed 90 pitches, which were the most by an A's pitcher in an outing of fewer than three innings since pitch counts were tracked beginning in 1988...the loss extended his losing streak to a career-high three games dating back to Sept. 13, 2020...then picked up the win in each of his next two starts and allowed just one run on eight hits in 12.0 innings...won 7-3 at Houston on April 10 and then combined with Romo, Diekmann and Wendelken on a four-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 victory over Detroit on April 16...tossed 6.0 innings in each start, which is his season high (six times)...allowed six runs on a season-high nine hits in 4.0 innings against Minnesota on April 21 but had a no decision in the A's 13-12, 10-inning win...allowed three home runs in a start for the second time in his career (Sept. 22, 2020 vs. Los Angeles-NL)...had a season-high 105 pitches in a 4-3 loss at Tampa Bay on April 27...finished April 20-2 with a 6.20 ERA in five starts...then went 3-3 with a 3.18 ERA in six starts in May...the three wins matched his most ever in a month and he had 38 strikeouts, which tied for eighth in the American League...won each of his first three starts in May and posted a 3.12 ERA over that stretch from May 3-14...then went 0-3 with a 3.24 ERA over his next three starts from May 19-29...the losing streak matched his career high...struck out 11 batters in 6.0 innings in a 4-2 loss to Seattle on May 24...it was his fourth career games of 10 or more strikeouts and the second highest single-game total of his career to his 13 against the Mariners in the final game of the 2020 season...walked a season-high tying three.

LAST START: He snapped his three-game losing streak in the A's 9-5 win at Colorado last Friday...had a 6-0 lead when he allowed two runs in the third inning on a Daza RBI triple an a Blackmon RBI ground out...allowed another run in the fourth on a Diaz RBI fielders choice...was relieved by Smith to start the sixth inning with the A's leading 7-3.

2020 RECAP: Was off to a strong start as he was 2-1 with a 1.57 ERA, .175 opponents batting average and no home runs over his first four starts...was scratched from his scheduled start on Aug. 14 at San Francisco with upper back tightness and went 1-4 with an 8.70 ERA, .321 opponents average and 10 home runs over his final seven starts...went 3-5 with a 5.60 ERA in 11 starts overall...his ERA was eighth highest in the majors among pitchers with at least 50 innings pitched...had career highs in losses (5) and earned runs (33) and matched his high in home runs (10), runs (35) and walks (23)...led the A's in strikeouts (60), losses, runs, home runs and walks...his opponents batting average broke down to .198 (22-for-111) against right-handed hitters compared to .350 (35-for-100) against left-handers...surrendered six of his 10 home runs and issued 15 of his 23 walks to lefties for a 1.061 OPS (.572 against right-handers)...had a .306 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .264 the second time and .205 after that...allowed a .133 average with two strikes...was 2-1 with a 2.56 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in six starts in Oakland, 1-4 with a 10.13 ERA and .330 opponents average in five starts on the road...surrendered just two home runs in 31.2 innings in Oakland compared to eight in 21.1 innings on the road...made eight of his 11 starts during the day, which tied for the most in the majors...was 2-4 with a 6.16 ERA during the day, 1-1 with a 4.20 ERA at night...the A's were 6-5 (.545) in his starting assignments...had two starts of seven innings and five starts of fewer than five innings...went 2-2 with a 2.83 ERA in six starts on four days rest, 1-3 with an 11.00 ERA in five starts on five days rest or more...received two runs of support or fewer in nine of his 11 starts...had 10 of his 28 runs of support in one start on Aug. 3 at Seattle and had a 4.75 RSA for the season...won both of his starts with support of three or more runs and is now 17-1 in 21 career starts with at least three runs of support.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
LHP Cole Irvin (4-7, 3.89 ERA): Allowed one run in 6.0 innings to defeat Colorado in his last start on Saturday and snap his losing streak at a career-high tying four games...compiled a 5.40 ERA and .284 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which spanned five starts...is tied for the American League lead in losses (7) and is tied for sixth in most hits (73)...has walked two batters or fewer in each of his 12 starts...has issued just 12 free passes in 69.1 innings and his average of 1.56 walks per nine innings is third lowest in the AL...is scheduled to start on five days rest tomorrow...is 4-0 with a 1.13 ERA in five starts on five days rest or more...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 6-3 A's win at Colorado on Saturday (6.0 ip, 6 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...has faced the Royals once in his career and it came in his Major League debut on May 12, 2019 at Kansas City...was the starting pitcher in the Phillies 6-1 win (7.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 5 so).

- Was a non-roster invitee with Cincinnati this spring and made the Reds Opening Day roster...compiled an 11.12 ERA in six relief appearances before he was designated for assignment on April 17...signed a minor league deal with Oakland on April 29 and was assigned to Las Vegas...had a save and did not allow a run in four games with the Aviators (5.0 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 5 so).

Last Year: Compiled a 2.45 ERA and .196 opponents batting average in 11 relief appearances with the Angels...missed 25 games while on the injured list from Aug. 4-30 with a right adductor strain.

- Has yielded three home runs over his last 10 games and 9.1 innings after allowing three home runs over his previous 124 games and 112.0 innings from June 26, 2018 to May 12, 2021.
- Has held right-handed hitters to a .172 (10-for-58) average but they have hit all three of the home runs he has allowed.
