OAKLAND ATHLETICS (37-27) VS. KANSAS CITY ROYALS (30-31)

ABOUT THE A'S: Are 6-2 (.750) in June, which is tied with the Angels and Brewers for the best record in the majors...are 37-27 (.578) overall, which is the fourth best record in the American League...are 10 games over .500, which is one short of the season high of 11 (37-26 on June 9)...are in first place in the AL West for the 21st consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 51 of the last 52 days...have a one-game lead over second place Houston for the fifth consecutive day...have spent 49 days alone in first place, two days tied for first, one day in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-1 on this nine-game homestand against Arizona (2-0), Kansas City (0-1) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...went 3-4 on the last homestand against Seattle (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-2) and are now 19-18 (.514) at home compared to 18-9 (.667) on the road...the 37 home games are the most in the majors...are tied for the second best road record in the majors...went 4-2 on the last road trip to Seattle (2-1) and Colorado (2-1) and have now won eight road series, lost none and split one...the season-opening streak of nine consecutive road series without a loss is the longest such streak in Athletics history (previous: won the first eight road series in 1988).

HOME AND AWAY BATTING: The A's are batting .159 (27-for-170) with 15 runs scored (2.5 per game) and six extra base hits (four doubles, one triple, one home run) over the last six home games...are now hitting .210 with a .674 OPS and 3.8 runs per game at home compared to .255 with a .771 OPS and 4.9 runs per game on the road...have the second lowest home batting average in the American League and the second highest road batting average and road OPS.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 9-2 against American League Central teams (4-0 vs. Detroit, 5-1 vs. Minnesota, 0-1 vs. Kansas City)...are batting .241 (83-for-345) and are averaging 5.5 runs per game (60 runs in 11 games) against teams from the Central compared to .228 with an average of 4.1 runs per game against all other teams...have a 3.13 ERA (33 er in 95.0 ip) against the Central, 4.04 against everyone else...went 25-8 against the AL Central in 2019 after going 26-8 in 2018...are now 74-22 (.771) against AL Central foes dating back to June 23, 2017.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .261 (70-for-268) in the month of June, including .373 (25-for-67) with runners in scoring position...are now hitting .261 (117-for-448) with RISP overall, which is fifth best in the American League...lead the AL in hit by pitches (33), are tied for second in sacrifice flies (21), rank fourth in home runs (78) and walks (227) and tied for fourth in triples (10) and extra base hits (193)...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (13) and plate appearances (57), are tied for the lead in home runs (2), rank second in RBI (10) and third in extra base hits (3)...the A's are 4-for-9 (.444) with two walks and eight RBI with the bases loaded in June after hitting .167 with four walks and 22 RBI with the bases full over the first two months of the season...rank last in the AL with a .231 (9-for-39) average with the bases loaded for the season...A's designated hitters are batting .214 (44-for-206), which is second lowest in the AL...have the second fewest RBI (23) and are tied for the fourth fewest home runs (8).

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.55 ERA (33 er in 116.2 ip), .225 (97-for-432) opponents batting average and three shutouts over the last 13 games...that has lowered the season ERA to 3.89, which is fifth best in the American League...also have the fifth lowest opponents on-base percentage (.306), slugging percentage (.392) and OPS (.698)...are tied for the fewest walks (170) and tied for the second fewest home runs (63), but have yielded the second most hits (543)...are tied for second in shutouts (7), rank third in fewest pitches per inning (16.1) and tied for third in most wild pitches (33).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 7-4 with a 2.40 ERA (23 er in 86.1 ip) over the last 14 games...have surrendered just four home runs while tossing a pair of complete game shutouts over that stretch...are 24-23 with a 3.90 ERA (156 er in 359.2 ip) for the season...the wins and losses are tied for third most in the American League...lead the majors in innings pitched (359.2) and are tied with the White Sox for the most complete games (3)...the complete games are the most by an A's team since 2015 (5).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen is 2-1 with four saves, one blown save and a 2.51 ERA (13 er in 46.2 ip) over the last 16 games...has stranded all nine of its inherited runners over that span...is 16-for-22 (72.7%) in save opportunities, which is tied with New York for the second best percentage in the American League to Cleveland (18-for-21, 85.7%)...has four losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has allowed 19 home runs, which are the fewest in the AL and fourth fewest in the majors...have issued the second fewest walks in the AL (76)...has allowed 25-of-69 (36.2%) inherited runners to score, which is

the fifth highest percentage in the AL...has the highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.476), the second highest batting average (.277) and fourth highest on-base percentage (.358).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have the fourth fewest errors in the American League (33)...also have the fourth fewest double plays (46)...A's outfielders have four assists, which is tied for second fewest.

CLOSE CALLS (AND NOT SO CLOSE): The A's are 22-11 (.667) in games decided by three runs or fewer, which is the best record in the majors...however, are 15-16 (.484) in games decided by four runs or more...have lost each of their last three one-run games but are 11-7 (.611) for the season, which is the fourth best record in the American League...have five walk-off wins, which is tied with the Rockies and the Yankees for the most in the majors...are 8-3 in games decided in the last at bat...are 2-1 in extra inning games and are now 8-2 in extra innings over the last two years...are tied for the Major League lead in wins when trailing after six innings (6).

TEAMMATES: Cole Irvin is scheduled to make his 13th start today and the A's will become the first team in the majors with four pitchers with 13 or more starts...have used just seven starting pitchers this year, which is tied with the Reds and White Sox for second fewest in the majors to the Red Sox (6)...the A's are one of four teams (White Sox, Dodgers, Rays) with four five-game winners...are one of three teams (Indians, Giants) with two pitchers with six or more saves.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 24-14 (.632) in night games compared to 13-13 (.500) during the day...are tied for the second best record at night in the American League...are 16-9 (.640) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 21-18 (.538) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is second best in the AL...are 27-5 when out-homering the opposition, 4-17 when they are out-homered...are 28-9 (.757) when scoring first, which is second best in the AL...are 8-0 following a day off and are the only undefeated team in the majors following a day off...have used 61 different lineups over the first 64 games...have out-scored the opposition 44-25 (+19) in June after being outscored 242-231 (-11) in April and May...went 16-11 in April and 15-14 in May and now have nine consecutive months with a winning record (min. 10 games).

THE INJURED LIST: The A's have used the injured list 14 times this year...used it just eight times last year, which was second fewest in the majors to Cleveland (4), and 18 times in 2019, which tied for second fewest...currently have four players on the IL (Fiers, Laureano Rosenthal, Wendelken)...began the year with two players on the IL but have had at least four every day since the fifth game of the season.

A's vs. ROYALS: The A's lost the first meeting of 2021 last night...won the season series in 2019, 5-2...it was their second consecutive season series win and third in four years...won two of three in Oakland and three of four in Kansas City...have won 19 of their last 27 games against the Royals and have outscored Kansas City 162-89 over that span (6.0 runs per game to 3.3 runs)...all-time, the A's are 327-268 (.550) against the Royals...the only American League team the A's have a better record against is Tampa Bay (.589)...are 177-120 in Oakland and 150-148 in Kansas City.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha leads the majors in runs scored (49) and hit by pitches (12)...is tied for fourth in the American League in triples (3), ranks seventh in games (62) and ninth in on-base percentage (.378)...**Sean Murphy** has 30 RBI as a catcher, which are the most among Major League catchers...**Matt Olson** ranks third in the American League in slugging (.568), fifth in OPS (.933), tied for fifth in home runs (15) and extra base hits (30), tied for sixth in sacrifice flies (4), tied for eighth in doubles (15) and tied for 10th in RBI (41)...**Lou Trivino** has not allowed an earned run in his last 11 games (11.1 ip).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1978**, at the age of 18 years, 246 days, Mike Morgan becomes the youngest pitcher to start a game for the Oakland A's...he goes the distance, allowing 10 hits against Baltimore, but takes the loss in a 3-0 decision...Morgan's honor is short lived as Tim Conroy, at the age of 18 years, 81 days, gets a start 12 days later...in **1995** Mark McGwire hits three home runs in the A's 8-1 win at Boston after hitting two home runs the day before...his five home runs in consecutive games tied a major league record which he already shared...in **1999** Miguel Tejada hits three home runs in a game against Los Angeles to tie the Athletics record...he is the only Athletics shortstop to hit three home runs in a game.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Cole Irvin (4-7, 3.89 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Allowed one run in 6.0 innings to defeat Colorado in his last start on Saturday and snap his losing streak at a career-high tying four games (also May 22, 2019-April 8, 2021)...compiled a 5.40 ERA and .284 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which spanned five starts...it was the longest losing streak by an A's starting pitcher over the last three years... is tied for the American League lead in losses (7).

DON'T WALK: Has walked two batters or fewer in each of his 12 starts, including eight starts with one walk and two starts with no walks...has issued just 12 free passes in 69.1 innings and his average of 1.56 walks per nine innings is third lowest in the American League...is averaging the third fewest strikeouts per nine innings (6.49), but ranks 10th in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.17)...has walked one batter or fewer in 12 of his 15 career starts and has walked just 26 batters in 114.2 career innings (2.04 per nine innings).

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has allowed a .246 (49-for-199) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .320 (24-for-75) against left-handers...the mark against lefties is second highest in the AL (Keuchel, CWS .321) and his .831 OPS is fifth highest...however, has allowed five of his seven home runs and issued 11 of his 12 walks to righties...his career splits are .252 (82-for-325) with a .712 OPS against right-handers, .356 (47-for-132) with a .913 OPS against lefties

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 4-0 with a 1.13 ERA (4 er in 32.0 ip) in five starts on five days rest or more, 0-6 with a 6.00 ERA (22 er in 33.0 ip) in six starts on four days rest.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-5 with a 4.73 ERA (21 er in 40.0 ip) in seven starts at home compared to 2-2 with a 2.76 ERA (9 er in 29.1 ip) in five starts at home...is tied for the American League lead in home losses (Shoemaker, MIN and Montas, OAK) and has the seventh lowest road ERA.

THIS AND THAT: Is averaging 15.0 pitches per nine innings, which is sixth fewest in the American League...is 4-1 in six starts with more than two runs of support, 0-6 in five starts with support of two runs or fewer...has a season RSA of 4.02 (31 rs in 69.1 ip)...has allowed one run or fewer in five of his 12 starts...the A's lost in his only no decision and are 4-8 (.333) in his starting assignments.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and lost each of his first two starts, allowing four runs in each contest for a 7.45 ERA...tossed 4.1 innings in his first start on April 3 against Houston, which was the shortest start of his career...also faced the Astros in his second start on April 8 but did not pitch again until April 17 against Detroit when he combined with Wendelken, Guerra and Weems on a five-hit shutout in a 7-0 win...it was his first win since May 17, 2019 against Colorado and it snapped a career-high four-game losing streak...that began a four-start stretch where he went 3-1 with a 1.42 ERA and .232 opponents batting average through May 4...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in his start against the Tigers and then blanked the Orioles over the first five innings on April 23 for a career-high 11.0 inning scoreless streak...won back-to-back starts on the 17th and 23rd, marking the second time in his career he put together consecutive wins (May 12-17, 2019)...allowed just one run in 11. innings in the two starts...lost on April 28 at Tampa Bay but then picked up his third win on May 4 against Toronto...had career highs in innings pitched (8.0), strikeouts (9) and pitches (102) against the Blue Jays...then went 0-4 with a 5.40 ERA and .284 opponents batting average over his next five starts...the losing streak matched his career high (also May 22, 2019-April 8, 2021)...left with a 4-1 lead on May 15 at Minnesota but the pen allowed four runs in the eighth inning for the blown save...allowed a season-high five runs in an 8-4 loss to Houston on May 20...allowed a career-high 10 hits in 4.2 innings of work in a 4-3 loss to Seattle on May 25...went 1-4 with a 4.46 ERA in six starts in May...tied for second in the American League in losses in May.

LAST START: He snapped his four-game losing streak in the A's 6-3 win at Colorado on Saturday...Oakland scored twice in the first and he allowed a RBI double to Blackmon in the bottom of the first...that would be the only run he would allow in six innings of work as he blanked the Rockies on four hits and a walk over his final five innings.

2020 RECAP: Had two stints with Philadelphia and was 0-1 with a 17.18 ERA in three relief appearances...opponents went 11-for-21 (.524) but he walked just one and struck out four in 3.2 innings...allowed a .438 (7-for-16) average against right-handed hitters compared to .800 (4-for-5) against left-handers...was 2-0 with a 4.50 ERA in four spring training appearances... was optioned to Lehigh Valley March 26 but was recalled on July 23 and was on the Phillies Opening Day roster...made his 2020 debut on July 26 against Miami and allowed four runs on five hits in an inning of relief and was the losing pitcher in an 11-6 decision...tossed a scoreless inning of relief Aug. 9 against Atlanta but was optioned to Philadelphia's alternate site on Aug. 9...was recalled for a second time Aug. 20, pitched the next day at Atlanta (1.2 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 3 so) and was optioned Aug. 22...did not pitch the remainder of the season.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP James Kaprielian (2-1, 3.08 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas May 12 and is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season and his career...is 0-1 with a 6.23 ERA and .303 opponents batting average over his last two starts after going 2-0 with a 1.53 ERA and .156 opponents batting average over his first three starts...has allowed two runs or fewer in four of his five starts...has held right-handed hitters to a .146 batting average...opponents are 3-for-22 (.136) with runners in scoring position...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 3-1 A's loss at Colorado last Sunday (5.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 6 so)...has never faced the Royals in his career...made his Major League debut with Oakland in 2020 after pitching in just 27 games over his first five professional seasons due to elbow problems...missed most of 2016 with an elbow injury and then missed the entire 2017 and 2018 seasons following April 18, 2017 "Tommy John" surgery.

- Was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas May 21 and has pitched four times with the A's (5.1 ip, 5 h, 2 bb, 3 so).
- Has faced the Royals 10 times in his career and is 2-0 with 9.1 scoreless innings pitched in 10 appearances, including seven strikeouts and two walks.
- Was a non-roster invitee with Cincinnati this spring and made the Reds Opening Day roster...compiled an 11.12 ERA in six relief appearances before he was designated for assignment on April 17...signed a minor league deal with Oakland on April 29 and was assigned to Las Vegas...had a save and did not allow a run in four games with the Aviators (5.0 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 5 so).

Last Year: Compiled a 2.45 ERA and .196 opponents batting average in 11 relief appearances with the Angels...missed 25 games while on the injured list from Aug. 4-30 with a right adductor strain.

- Has a loss, a save, two blown saves and a 4.82 ERA (9.1 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 5 er, 5 bb, 8 so, 3 hr) over his last nine games after going 2-0 with five saves, no blown saves and a 2.12 ERA over his first 17 contests.
- Has yielded three home runs over his last 10 games and 9.1 innings after allowing three home runs over his previous 124 games and 112.0 innings from June 26, 2018 to May 12, 2021.
- Has held right-handed hitters to a .172 (10-for-58) average but they have hit all three of the home runs he has allowed.
- Has a 6.75 ERA (5 er in 6.2 ip) in seven outings on no days rest, a 0.95 ERA (2 er in 19.0 ip) in 19 appearances on one day of rest or more.
- Has faced the Royals 13 times in his career and owns a 2.61 ERA (3 er, 10.1 ip) with one save, 13 strikeouts, and four walks.
- Has six saves, which surpasses his career high of four with Texas in 2016.
- Was acquired by the A's from the Royals on July 27, 2019 for Dairon Blanco and Ismael Aquino.

- Pitched 2.1 scoreless innings May 31 in his 99th career appearance...it was his sixth outing this year of at least two innings and four of those have been scoreless.
- Has not allowed a run in his last three games (4.2 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 5 so).
- Has a .167 opponents batting average, which breaks down to .054 (2-for-37) against left-handed hitters compared to .255 (12-for-47) against right-handers...has issued all nine of his walks and yielded both of his home runs to righties for a .773 OPS...has a .108 OPS against lefties, which is the lowest mark in the majors among pitchers who have faced at least 10 lefties.
- Opponents are 2-for-17 (.118) with runners in scoring position.
- Has faced the Royals three times in his career, allowing one earned run in 3.0 innings pitched (3.00 ERA) with two strikeouts and one walk...last faced Kansas City on April 14, 2017.
- Was selected from the A's alternate site April 8.
