OAKLAND ATHLETICS (38-27) VS. KANSAS CITY ROYALS (30-32)

ABOUT THE A'S: Are 7-2 (.778) in June, which is tied with the Angels and Brewers for the best record in the majors...are 38-27 (.585) overall, which is the fourth best record in the American League and sixth best in the majors...are a season-high tying 11 games over .500 for the second time (37-26 on June 9)...have not been 12 games over .500 since finishing the 2020 season 36-24...are in first place in the AL West for the 22nd consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 52 of the last 53 days...have a one-game lead over second place Houston for the sixth consecutive day...have spent 50 days alone in first place, two days tied for first, one day in second, one day tied for second, three days in third, two days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

WALK-OFFS AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: The A's had their Major League leading sixth walk-off win last night...it was the 89th walk-off win in the Bob Melvin era, which are the most in the majors over that span...are 9-3 in games decided in the last at bat...are 12-7 (.632) in one-run games, which is the fourth best record in the American League...the 19 one-run games are second most in the AL to the Twins (20)...are 23-11 (.676) in games decided by three runs or fewer, which is the best record in the majors...however, are 15-16 (.484) in games decided by four runs or more...are 2-1 in extra inning games and are now 8-2 in extra innings over the last two years...are tied for the Major League lead in wins when trailing after six innings (6).

UNLUCKY SEVEN: The A's have allowed a total of seven runs over the first six innings of the last eight games for a 1.31 ERA (7 er in 48.0 ip) and .187 (32-for-171) opponents batting average...have yielded 10 runs in the seventh inning over that span for a 9.00 ERA (8 er in 8.0 ip) and .368 (14-for-38) opponents average...have also allowed five runs in the eighth inning (5 er in 8.0 ip, 5.63 ERA) but have not allowed a run in the ninth (7.0 ip).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-1 on this nine-game homestand against Arizona (2-0), Kansas City (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...went 3-4 on the last homestand against Seattle (1-2) and Los Angeles-AL (2-2) and are now 20-18 (.526) at home compared to 18-9 (.667) on the road...the 38 home games are the most in the majors...are tied for the second best road record in the majors...went 4-2 on the last road trip to Seattle (2-1) and Colorado (2-1) and have now won eight road series, lost none and split one...the season-opening streak of nine consecutive road series without a loss is the longest such streak in Athletics history (previous: won the first eight road series in 1988).

HOME AND AWAY BATTING: The A's are batting .172 (35-for-203) with 19 runs scored (2.7 per game) and 11 extra base hits (eight doubles, one triple, two home runs) over the last seven home games...are now hitting .211 with a .676 OPS and 3.8 runs per game at home compared to .255 with a .771 OPS and 4.9 runs per game on the road...have the third lowest home batting average in the American League and the second highest road batting average and road OPS.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: The A's are 10-2 against American League Central teams (4-0 vs. Detroit, 5-1 vs. Minnesota, 1-1 vs. Kansas City)...are batting .241 (91-for-378) and are averaging 5.3 runs per game (64 runs in 12 games) against teams from the Central compared to .228 with an average of 4.1 runs per game against all other teams...have a 3.03 ERA (35 er in 104.0 ip) against the Central, 4.04 against everyone else...went 25-8 against the AL Central in 2019 after going 26-8 in 2018...are now 75-22 (.773) against AL Central foes dating back to June 23, 2017.

OFFENSE: The A's lead the American League in hit by pitches (33), are tied for second in sacrifice flies (21), rank fourth in walks (229) and extra base hits (198), tied for fourth in home runs (79) and triples (10) and fifth in doubles (109)...are batting 384 (28-for-73) with runners in scoring position in June and are hitting .264 (120-for-454) with RISP overall, which is fourth best in the AL...A's pinch hitters lead the AL in hits (13) and plate appearances (57), are tied for the lead in home runs (2), rank second in RBI (10) and third in extra base hits (3)...the A's are 4-for-9 (.444) with two walks and eight RBI with the bases loaded in June after hitting .167 with four walks and 22 RBI with the bases full over the first two months of the season...rank last in the AL with a .231 (9-for-39) average with the bases loaded for the season.

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.51 ERA (35 er in 125.2 ip), .226 (106-for-468) opponents batting average and three shutouts over the last 14 games...that has dropped the overall ERA to a season-low 3.86, which is fifth best in the American League...also have the fifth lowest opponents on-base percentage (.306), slugging percentage (.392) and OPS (.698)...have the second fewest walks (171) and third fewest home runs (65), but are tied for the second

most hits (552)...are tied for second in shutouts (7), rank third in fewest pitches per inning (16.1) and tied for fourth in most wild pitches (33).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have not allowed a run over the first six innings in each of the last three games...are 7-4 with a 2.34 ERA (24 er in 92.1 ip) over the last 15 games...are 24-23 with a 3.86 ERA (157 er in 365.2 ip) for the season...the wins are tied for third most in the American League and the losses are tied for fourth...lead the majors in innings pitched (365.2) and are tied with the White Sox for the most complete games (3)...the complete games are the most by an A's team since 2015 (5).

BULLPEN: The A's bullpen has four saves and six blown saves over the last 25 games dating back to May 15...has converted 16-of-23 (69.6%) save opportunities for the season, which is the fourth best percentage in the American League...has four losses, which is the fewest in the majors...has allowed 20 home runs, which are the fewest in the AL and tied for fourth fewest in the majors...have issued the second fewest walks in the AL (77)...has allowed 26-of-72 (36.1%) inherited runners to score, which is the fifth highest percentage in the AL...has the highest slugging percentage against first batters faced in the AL (.473), the second highest batting average (.278) and fourth highest on-base percentage (.358).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have the fourth fewest errors in the American League (34)...are tied for the fourth fewest double plays (47)...A's outfielders have five assists, which is third fewest.

TEAMMATES: The A's are the only team in the majors with four pitchers with 13 or more starts...have used just seven starting pitchers this year, which is tied with the Reds and White Sox for second fewest in the majors to the Red Sox (6)...the A's are one of four teams (White Sox, Dodgers, Rays) with four five-game winners...are one of three teams (Indians, Giants) with two pitchers with six or more saves.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 25-14 (.641) in night games compared to 13-13 (.500) during the day...have the second best record at night in the American League...are 16-9 (.640) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 22-18 (.550) when they start a right-hander...the mark against lefties is tied for second best in the AL...are 27-5 when out-homer the opposition, 5-17 when they are out-homered...are 29-9 (.763) when scoring first, which is second best in the AL...are 8-0 following a day off and are the only undefeated team in the majors following a day off...have used 62 different lineups over the first 65 games...have out-scored the opposition 48-28 (+20) in June after being outscored 242-231 (-11) in April and May...went 16-11 in April and 15-14 in May and now have nine consecutive months with a winning record (min. 10 games).

A's vs. ROYALS: The A's have split the first two games of 2021 after winning the season series in 2019, 5-2...it was their second consecutive season series win and third in four years...won two of three in Oakland and three of four in Kansas City...have won 20 of their last 28 games against the Royals and have out-scored Kansas City 166-92 over that span (5.9 runs per game to 3.3 runs)...all-time, the A's are 328-268 (.550) against the Royals...the only American League team the A's have a better record against is Tampa Bay (.589)...are 178-120 in Oakland and 150-148 in Kansas City.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Mark Canha leads the majors in hit by pitches (12)...is tied for the American League lead in runs scored (49), tied for fourth in triples (3), ranks seventh in games (63) and 10th in on-base percentage (.373)...**Sean Murphy** has 30 RBI as a catcher, which is tied with Perez (KC) for the most among Major League catchers...**Matt Olson** ranks third in the AL in slugging (.560), sixth in extra base hits (30), tied for sixth in home runs (15) and sacrifice flies (4), seventh in OPS (.923) and tied for ninth in doubles (15)...**Lou Trivino** has not allowed an earned run in his last 12 games (12.2 ip).

THIS DATE IN ATHLETICS HISTORY

In **1938** Bob Johnson has three home runs and a single and drives in all the A's runs in an 8-3 win over St. Louis in the first game of a doubleheader... in **1975** Billy Williams hits his 400th career home run in a 9-7 A's loss at Milwaukee...in **1990** Rickey Henderson steals third base against Texas, his 900th career steal...in that game, Dennis Eckersley walks his first batter of the season, snapping a string of 52.0 innings and 186 hitters without a walk...in **2009** Jack Hannahan commits his first error of the season, snapping a 72-game errorless streak dating back to August 10, 2008, which is an Oakland record for a third baseman.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: James Kaprielian (2-1, 3.08 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Las Vegas May 12 and is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season and his career...is 0-1 with a 6.23 ERA (6 er in 8.2 ip) and .303 (10-for-33) opponents batting average over his last two starts after going 2-0 with a 1.53 ERA and .156 opponents batting average over his first three starts...has allowed two runs or fewer in four of his five starts.

THIS AND THAT: Has held right-handed hitters to a .146 (7-for-48) batting average compared to .265 (13-for-49) against left-handers...opponents are 3-for-22 (.136) with runners in scoring position...has a .128 (5-for-39) opponents average the first time through the lineup, .316 (12-for-38) the second time and .150 (3-for-20) after that...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings for the win in his only start in the Coliseum on May 26...is 1-1 with a 4.19 ERA in four starts on the road.

FIRST START: He earned his first Major League win in his first career start in the A's 4-1 victory at Boston on May 12...allowed a Gonzalez double, a Verdugo walk and a Martinez RBI single to the first three batters he faced...that would be the only run he would allow in five innings of work as he blanked the Red Sox on two hits and a walk over his final four innings.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 8-4 win at Los Angeles (AL) on May 21...Oakland scored once in the third and he allowed a solo home run to Iglesias in the bottom of the third...the A's then scored twice in the top of the sixth and he struck out the first two batters in the bottom of the sixth before allowing a solo home run to Walsh...was relieved by Petit following the home run with the A's leading 3-2 and Petit allowed a run for the blown save.

THIRD START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-3 win over Seattle on May 26 in Oakland...did not allow a run in 7.0 innings, which matched his longest outing as a professional...also tossed 7.0 innings for Single-A Tampa at Charlotte on April 16, 2016, his second professional appearance...allowed two hits and two walks against the Mariners...retired each of the first eight batters and each of the final 10.

FOURTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 10-inning loss at Seattle on May 31...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed four runs in the fourth inning...surrendered a three-run home run to Walton and a RBI double to Lewis...was relieved by Guerra with two outs in the fourth and a runner on second...Oakland scored once in the fifth and twice in the eighth to get him off the hook.

LAST START: He was charged with the first loss of his career in a 3-1 decision at Colorado last Sunday...allowed a RBI single to Tapia in the third inning and a sacrifice fly to Rodgers in the fourth...those were the only two runs he would allow in five innings of work but Marquez limited the A's to a run in six innings of work.

he faced...struck out Solano to end the seventh inning for his first strikeout... was optioned on Aug. 19...was recalled as the 29th man for doubleheaders on Sept. 8 and Sept. 14 but did not pitch...recalled for his fifth stint on Sept. 24 and made one appearance in the second game of the Sept. 26 doubleheader against Seattle (1.2 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...inherited a bases loaded situation in the third inning with the A's trailing 4-1 and allowed all three runs to score...was on the Taxi Squad for the postseason...was rated as the A's number 10 prospect by *Baseball America* following the season..

CAREER NOTES: Made his Major League debut with Oakland in 2020 after pitching in just 27 games over his first five professional seasons due to elbow problems...compiled a 7.36 ERA and .267 opponents batting average in two relief appearances with the A's...is 6-6 with a 3.00 ERA (34 er in 102.0 ip) in 28 games, including 23 starts, as a minor leaguer...has 116 strikeouts in 102.0 innings (10.24 per nine innings)...was the New York Yankees first round draft pick in 2015 but pitched in just eight games over his first four years as a professional...missed most of 2016 with an elbow injury and then missed the entire 2017 and 2018 seasons following April 18, 2017 "Tommy John" surgery...was traded to the A's at the 2017 trading deadline in the Sonny Gray deal and is the last remaining player from that deal that also netted the A's Dustin Fowler and Jorge Mateo...pitched for Scottsdale in the Arizona Fall League in 2016...was rated by *Baseball America* as the Yankees No. 4 prospect following the 2015 season and No. 5 following 2016...was the A's No. 8 prospect after the 2017 season and No. 10 following 2020.

RHP Chris Bassitt (6-2, 3.44 ERA):	Extended his winning streak to six games in his last start, which is a new career high...his previous high was five from Aug. 11, 2019 to Aug. 12, 2020...has a 3.10 ERA and .201 opponents batting average during the streak, which spans 11 starts dating back April 12...ranks sixth in the American League in strikeouts (86), strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.78) opponents OPS (.619), opponents slugging percentage (.348) and innings pitched (81.0), tied for seventh in wins (6), eighth in opponents on-base percentage (.271) and ninth in opponents batting average (.214)...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 5-2 A's win over Arizona on Tuesday here in Oakland (7.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 6 so)...is 0-1 with a 3.95 ERA (27.1 ip, 28 h, 14 r, 14 er, 9 bb, 19 so) in five career appearances, all starts, against the Royals...had a no decision in his only start in 2019, a 9-8 A's win at Kansas City on Aug. 29 (4.2 ip, 6 h, 5 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 1 so).

- Was selected from Triple-A Las Vegas May 21 and has pitched four times with the A's (5.1 ip, 5 h, 2 bb, 3 so).
- Has faced the Royals 10 times in his career and is 2-0 with 9.1 scoreless innings pitched in 10 appearances, including seven strikeouts and two walks.
- Was a non-roster invitee with Cincinnati this spring and made the Reds Opening Day roster...compiled an 11.12 ERA in six relief appearances before he was designated for assignment on April 17...signed a minor league deal with Oakland on April 29 and was assigned to Las Vegas...had a save and did not allow a run in four games with the Aviators (5.0 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 5 so).

Last Year: Compiled a 2.45 ERA and .196 opponents batting average in 11 relief appearances with the Angels...missed 25 games while on the injured list from Aug. 4-30 with a right adductor strain.

- Has yielded four home runs over his last 11 games and 10.0 innings after allowing three home runs over his previous 124 games and 112.0 innings from June 26, 2018 to May 12, 2021.
- Has held right-handed hitters to a .180 (11-for-61) average but they have hit all four of the home runs he has allowed.
- Has a 6.75 ERA (5 er in 6.2 ip) in seven outings on no days rest, a 1.37 ERA (3 er in 19.2 ip) in 20 appearances on one day of rest or more.
- Has faced the Royals 14 times in his career and owns a 3.27 ERA (4 er, 11.0 ip) with one save, 14 strikeouts, and five walks.

- Pitched 2.1 scoreless innings May 31 in his 99th career appearance...it was his sixth outing this year of at least two innings and four of those have been scoreless.
- Has not allowed a run in his last three games (4.2 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 5 so).
- Has a .167 opponents batting average, which breaks down to .054 (2-for-37) against left-handed hitters compared to .255 (12-for-47) against right-handers...has issued all nine of his walks and yielded both of his home runs to righties for a .773 OPS...has a .108 OPS against lefties, which is the lowest mark in the majors among pitchers who have faced at least 10 lefties.
- Opponents are 2-for-17 (.118) with runners in scoring position.
- Has faced the Royals three times in his career, allowing one earned run in 3.0 innings pitched (3.00 ERA) with two strikeouts and one walk...last faced Kansas City on April 14, 2017.
- Was selected from the A's alternate site April 8.

Last Year: Was on the Opening Day roster and appeared in nine games for Philadelphia in 2020 and went 1-3 with an 8.59 ERA (7 er in 7.1 ip)...struck out eight batters and walked two.

44 LHP JESUS LUZARDO

- Was reinstated from the injured list May 30 and has made three relief appearances (7.0 ip, 9 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 9 so, 3 hr, 6.43 ERA).
- Opened the season in the starting rotation and went 1-3 with a 5.79 ERA in six starts before being placed on the 10-day injured list May 2 with a fractured right hand...pitched 1.2 scoreless innings in a rehab assignment with Triple-A Las Vegas on May 27 at Sacramento (1.2 ip, h, so).
- Tossed 3.0 scoreless innings June 1 and has logged at least three innings in six of his 12 career relief appearances...is 1-0 with two saves and a 3.25 ERA (10 er in 27.2 ip) in 13 career appearances out of the bullpen...is 4-5 with a 4.54 ERA in 15 career starts.
